

- 'aila palai. n. Frying oil. *Eng.*
- 'aila pua'a. n. Lard, pork grease.
- 'ai lau. 1. vt. To eat a great deal. 2. n. A bundle of cooked taro wrapped in ti leaves.
- 'ai.lea. n. Gasoline (contraction of 'aila, oil, and ea, air).
- 'ā.'i.lepe. Ruffles, folds, gathers about the neck; to make ruffles; to ruffle feathers, as a grouse. (AP.)
- 'ai lepo. v. To eat filth (insulting).
- 'ā.'ili. 1. vi. To struggle for breath; to breathe with convulsions, gasp, pant, twitch, jerk. 2. vt. To pull, as weeds. (Kep. 157.)
- 'a.'ilia. Pas/imp. of 'ā.'ili.
- 'ai.lihi. Same as 'aikapa.
- 'ā.'ili.'ili. Redup. of 'ā.'ili; spasm.
- 'Ai.iki, Airisi. nvs. Irish. *Eng.*
- 'Ai-lima-iki. nv. A method of *lua* fighting; to grab the little finger of an adversary and twist it.
- ai loa, aia i loa. vi. Away off in the distance.
- 'Ai-loli. n. Name of a wind at Kau-pō, Maui. (For. 5:101.) *Lit.*, sea cucumber food.
- 'ai.lolo. 1. nvt. Ceremony usually marking the end of training, so called because the student ate ('ai) a portion of the head, and especially the brains (*lolo*), of a fish, dog, or hog offered to the gods; to partake of the ceremony. *Ua 'ailolo i ka pua'a hiwa*, taking part in the ceremony marking the completion of training by eating a portion of the head of an entirely black pig. *hō.ai.lolo*. Caus/sim. 2. vt. Skilled, adept, expert, trained, proficient. *Ua 'ailolo 'oia i ka hula*, he is trained in the hula.
- 'ailona. hō.'ai.lona. Sign, symbol, representation, insignia, emblem, mark, badge, signal, omen, portent, target, credential, token of recognition, a lot that is cast; title (legal); depth sounding; to mark; to take a depth sounding; to draw lots. Cf. *hailona*, *kila 2*. *Hō'ailona helu*, plural sign or marker, algebra. *Hō'ailona mahele*, measure signature in music. *Hō'ailona kū'auhau*, *hō'ailona no ke kūlana*, family crest or coat of arms. *Hō'ailona mō'i*, badge or emblem of royalty, sceptre. *Hō'ailona pa'i*, printed stamp. *Hō'ailona manawa*, time signature in music. *Hō'ailona lanakila*, emblem or trophy of victory, trophy. *Ka pana 'ana aku i ka hō'ailona* (1 Sam. 20.20), shooting at the mark. (PPN *faka'ilonga*.)
- ai luna, aia i luna. vi. Up there.
- 'ai mā.mā. nv. Light meal, snack; to eat such.
- 'Ai-maunu. n. Name of a wind at Hāna, Maui. (For. 5:101.) *Lit.*, bait eating.
- 'ai.mf.kana. n. Linnet, California house finch, papaya bird (*Carpodacus mexicanus frontalis*), an early introduction to Hawai'i, now well established throughout the Hawaiian Islands. *Lit.*, papaya eater.
- 'ai moku. nv. Ruler of a *moku*, district or island; to rule a *moku*.
- aina. n. Sexual intercourse. (PCP *kainga*.)
- 'aina. 1. n. Meal. Cf. 'aina ahiahi, 'aina awakea, 'aina kakahiaka, and 'ai, to eat. *Hale 'aina*, restaurant. (PNP *kainga*.) 2. Pas/imp. of 'ai 1; eaten, consumed devoured. See ex., *nūpolupolu*. 3. vs. Rejected, as refuse, especially of sugar cane. *Kō 'aina*, sugar-cane refuse or bagasse after juice is extracted. *Ipu 'aina*, slop basin. 4. See 'aina kea, 'aina kea melemele.
- 'ai.nā. nvi. Sore aching; stiffness, as from overexercise.
- 'āina. n. Land, earth. Cf. 'ai, to eat; 'aina, kama'aina. *Kō nā 'āina like 'ole*, belonging to foreign lands, foreign, international. 'Āina ho'oilina, inherited property or estate. *Ua mau ke ea o ka 'āina i ka pono* (motto of Hawai'i), the life of the land is preserved in righteousness. (PEP *kainga*.)
- 'a'ina. n. Crackling, snapping; an explosive sound, sharp report, bang (*rare*), loud prolonged sound, peal (less common than 'u'ina). Cf. 'a'a'ina. *Kani 'a'ina*, to crackle, peal.
- 'aina ahi.ahi. n. Evening meal, supper, dinner.
- 'aina awa.kea. n. Noon meal, lunch.
- 'āina 'ē. n. Foreign land, *Kō nā 'āina 'ē* (Mat. 10.5), of the Gentiles; international. *Ma ka 'āina 'ē*, in a foreign land, abroad.
- 'āina hā.nau. n. Land of one's birth, native land, homeland, birthplace. See *one hānau*.
- 'āina haole. n. Foreign land, mainland United States.
- 'Āina-Hemo.lele. n. Holy Land.
- 'a'ina.hia. Pas/imp. of 'a'ina.
- 'Āina-hō.'ano. n. Holy Land.
- 'āina ho'o.kū.'ono.'ono. n. Homestead, homesteading land. *Lit.*, land for security.
- 'āina ho'o.pula.pula. See *pulapula*.
- 'a'ina.'ina. Redup. of 'a'ina.
- 'aina kaka.hiaka. n. Morning meal, breakfast.
- 'aina kea. n. A good-looking variety of sugar cane, of medium height, striped red and green or yellow, pith white and brown, leaves and leaf sheaths with white markings; used in medicine. Also *pū kea*.
- 'aina kea mele.mele. n. A variety of sugar cane, the yellow mutant of 'aina kea.
- 'aina.kini. n. Navy blue cotton cloth.
- 'aina kō. n. Cane trash, bagasse. Cf. 'aina 3.
- 'āina kū.'ai. n. Land purchased or for sale; land in fee simple.
- 'āina kū.pono. n. Land free from all rent and taxes.
- 'āina lei ali'i. n. Crown lands.
- 'āina makua. n. Fatherland, mainland.
- 'āinana. Short for *maka'āinana*. (For. 6:39.)
- 'āina noho kahu 'ia. n. Trust territory.
- 'āina nui. n. Great power, great land, mainland.
- 'aina 'ole. vs. Not eaten or consumed; without vegetable foods. *He makau 'aina 'ole*, a hook that a fish will not bite.
- 'Āina-'ō.ma'o.ma'o. n. Greenland.
- 'aina pua. n. Poetic name for China. *Lit.*, flower land.
- 'āina.puni.'ole. n. Continent. *Lit.*, land not surrounded.
- 'Āina-wohi. n. Said to be a name for the New Hebrides. (RC 293.) See *Nānā-pua*.
- 'ai.nea. vs. Exhausted by strain and trouble, tired, weary.
- 'ai.nema.nema. vt. To criticize severely, hunt for flaws, split hairs.
- 'ai.niha. nvs. Bad temper; bad tempered, cross. See *niha* and ex., *kāpalaiki*.
- 'ai noa. vt. To eat freely, without observance of taboos.
- 'ā.inu, hō.'ā.inu. Same as *hāinu*, *ho'ohāinu*, to give to drink. *Ka 'ā*.
- 'ai nui. nvi. Principle or staple food; to eat a lot.
- ā.io. Same as *ioio*, grooves.
- 'aiō. 1. n. A wave that rises and falls without breaking; a swell. 2. interj. Heigh-ho. *Eng.*
- 'ā.'i.oe.oe. nvs. Slim-necked; a slim or slender neck. Nickname for wives of early missionaries because their bonnets made their necks appear slim.
- 'ai 'oko'a. n. Cooked unpounded taro. *Lit.*, whole taro. *Kaua'i*. Also *kalo pa'a*.
- a i 'ole. conj. Or. *Ua makemake anei 'oe i kēlā pāpale a i 'ole i kēia?* Do you want this hat or that [one]?
- 'ā.'i'olo.'olo. n. Sagging of the chin and throat, as in old age; double chin; goiter.
- 'ā.'i'o'o.le'a. nvs. Stiff neck. *Fig.*, disobedience, obstinacy; obstinate.
- 'ai pa'a. n. Cooked taro pounded into a hard mass not mixed with water, sometimes preserved in ti-leaf bundles. *Fig.*, a difficult problem. *Lit.*, hard poi.
- 'ā.'i.pahā.ha. n. Mumps. *Lit.*, swollen neck.
- 'ā.'i.pala'ē. n. Scrofula, a scrofulous neck, abscess on neck. Also 'ā.'i'ala'ala.
- 'ai pala maunu. nv. To eat a dab of bait. *Fig.*, to take the leavings of others, to steal another's mate, one who does so; a beggar. *He 'ai pala maunu na ka po'e loa'a* (Kep. 103), an eater of bait dabs belonging to people with possessions [a scavenger, beggar].
- 'ai pala niho. Same as 'ai pala maunu. *Lit.*, to eat tooth tartar.
- 'ā.'i.pau. n. Glandular swelling in the neck, thyroid.
- 'ai pilau. nv. Eater of filth, scavenger; to eat rotten food;
