

- Kāne [northern limit of the sun, about the middle of the month Kaulua]. *Alanui ma'awe 'ula a Kanaloa*, road of the scarlet footprint of Kanaloa [the western sky]. (PCP *alanui*.)
- ala.nui ā.kea.** n. Avenue, boulevard, wide street.
- ala.nui hele 'ao.'ao,** **ala.nui hele wā.wae.** n. Sidewalk.
- ala.nui-o-nā-hō.kū-ho'o.kele.** n. Pathway of the navigator stars; star course followed by navigators. Probably also *hōkū 'ai 'āina*.
- ala.ō.** 1. vt. To swallow whole, as a fish or shrimp. Also *ala'oma*. *Ke alaō mai nō i nā wahi 'o'opu a me nā wahi 'ōpae*, swallowing whole small 'o'opu fish and shrimps. 2. n. Heiau or temple that had no *lele* altar.
- ala'oki.** n. Road cut, short cut.
- Ala'oli.** n. Name of a Kaua'i wind, said to bring good weather. (For. 5:97.) *Lit.*, happy path.
- ala'olo.** n. Narrow path, lane, alley.
- ala'oma.** Var. of *alaō 1*, and *ala'ume*.
- 'ala-o-Puna.** n. A variety of taro, growing wild, also cultivated dry in Puna, Hawai'i; fragrant when cooked, like *kāi*. Also *welowelo-lā*.
- 'ā.lapa.** nvs. Athletic, active; athlete; an epithet for Kamehameha I; name of a company of Ka-lani-'opu'u's warriors. *Nā 'ālapa e mākaukau ana no ka moko-moko*, the athletes skilled in boxing.
- 'ala.pahi.** nvt. Slander, falsehood, deceit; slanderer; to slander, defame, deceive, lie. *He 'alapahi moe ipo kā nāna*, so it is a lie of his about sleeping with the sweet-heart.
- 'ala.paka.** n 1. Alpaca. *Eng.* 2. Also *alabata*, Alabaster, ointment vase of alabaster. (Luka 7:37.) *Eng.*
- 'ala.pakelo, alabatero.** Same as *'alapaka 2*. (Probably Gr. *alabastros*.)
- ala.pao.** n. Tunnel.
- 'ala.papa.** n. Alfalfa. *Eng.*
- 'ā.lapa pī'i mo'o Kū.** n. Athletic person aspiring to the lineage of Kū (said of Kamehameha).
- 'Ala.pia.** 1. nvs. Arabia, Arabian. *Eng.* 2. (*Not cap.*) n. A heavy cloth resembling serge.
- ala.pī'i.** n. Stairs, steps, ladder, stile, doorstep, ascent, scale (musical). See ex., *'o'opu 1*.
- Ala.pī'i-a-ka-ōpae.** n. *Lua* fighting stroke. *Lit.*, stairway of the shrimp.
- ala.pī'i kū.** n. Steep road or path.
- ala.pī'i lawe 'ōhua.** n. Escalator, moving stairs.
- ala.pī'i mele.** n. Musical scale.
- ala.piko.** n. Belly of a fish, considered choice.
- ala.pine.** vs. 1. Quick, fast. *He 'uleu nā po'e o ke kai, alapine nā lima i ke kaula*, the boys of the sea are spry, quick hands on the lines. 2. Frequent, often. Cf. *ala-pinepine*.
- ala.pine.pine.** Redup. of *alapine 1, 2*.
- ala pō.** n. Night awakening. *ho'āla pō*. A summons sent at night. (GP 10.)
- ala pō'ai.** n. Orbit of the stars, circular road.
- ala.poho.** vt. To gulp, swallow whole.
- ala.poki.** vs. Shipwrecked. *Rare*. Same as *'ōlulo*.
- 'alā po'o malu.** n. Name of a dark basalt. Also *kai 'anu'u*.
- ala.puka.** nvs. Body sores; to have such sores; affected with dry rot, as taro. *Rare*.
- 'ala.pu'u.** n. Small, young, of creatures. *'Alapu'u mo'o*, scalawag of a baby grandchild. *'Alapu'u he'e*, baby squid.
- alau.** vs. Dividing, branching, as of winds and lineages. *He makani alau kō kēia wahi*, the wind here in this spot divides.
- 'alaua.** Var. spelling of *'alawa*, to glance.
- 'alau.ā, 'alauwā.** Same as *'alalauā*, young 'āweoweo fish. *Pupū ke kai i ka 'alauā*, the sea is congested with 'alauā fish [of difficulties; omen of death of royalty].
- 'alaua.hio.** n. Endemic Hawaiian honey creepers (*Loxops maculata*), O'ahu creeper (*L. m. maculata*), endangered; Lā-na'i creeper (*L. m. montana*), presumed extinct; Maui creeper (*L. m. newtoni*); Hawai'i creeper (*L. m. mana*), endangered.
- 'ala.'uka.** nvs. Homely, vile, slovenly, worthless; homeliness, vileness, dregs of society. *He hana 'ino'ino, pupuka, 'ala'uka*, it is wicked, nasty, vile conduct.
- alaula.** n. Light of early dawn, sunset glow. *Lit.*, flaming road. *Ke alaula a Kāne*, the flaming path of Kāne [the eastern sky]. *Ka wehe 'ana o ke alaula, 'oia ka paoa*, the opening of the flaming pathway is the dawn.
- ala.'ula.** n. Red dust in a road, red dust.
- 'ala.'ula.** Same as *'a'ala'ula*, a seaweed (*Codium* spp.).
- ā.lau.lau.** nvt. Clothes, tapa, mats; to envelop, clothe. *Rare*. Cf. *laulau*, wrapper.
- ala 'ū.lili.** n. Sheer trail as for climbing a cliff. Also *hūlili*.
- ala.'ume.** vt. To draw, pull, attract, as a magnet. *Malalo ka huila e niniu ai, ala'ume nā 'ili i ka nui hao* (hula song), the wheels revolve below, the fan belts pull the immensity of the metal.
- 'alau.wā.** Var. spelling of *'alauā*.
- 'alau.wahio.** Var. spelling of *'alauahio*, a bird.
- 'alau.wī.** Same as *'alauahio*.
- 'alawa.** 1. nvt. To glance, look quickly; glance. *'Alawa maka* (Kam. 64:98), to see at a glance; to diagnose by insight. *He 'alawa nā maka i hope e 'ike i ka po'e e hele mai ana*, the eyes glance back to see the people coming along. *hō.'alawa*. Caus/sim. 2. n. A bird (no data).
- ala.wā'a.** n. Canoe course.
- ala.waele.** n. Road, highway. *Lit.*, cleared road.
- ala.wai.** n. Channel, canal.
- ala.wela.** n. Dark lines on stomach of a pregnant woman, converging near the navel. *Lit.*, burned path.
- ala.weo.** Same as *'āheahea 2*, a shrub.
- ala.weo.huna.** Same as *'āheahea 2*, a shrub, *Ni'ihau*.
- ala.wī.** 1. vi. To shriek; shrill. Cf. *wī*, to squeal. *Alawī ka niho no ka pa'akikī i ka hele*, [he'll] shriek through the teeth for being so insistent on going. 2. n. Upland bird, reported to be the young of the 'anianiau, and on Kaua'i, the 'amakihi.
- ala.wiki.** vi. To hurry; quick, fast. Cf. *wiki*. *Mai lohi mai 'oe, e alawiki mai*, don't be slow, be fast.
- ale.** 1. vt. To swallow, engulf, gulp, absorb. *Huaale*, pill. 2. n. Hollow or cavern on the sea floor. (PCP *ale(ale)*.) 3. n. An endemic mountain plant (*Plantago princeps*), 60 cm to 2 m high, rarely branching, stem woody, with long narrow leaves at top; related to the *laukahi*.
- 'ale.** 1. nvt. Wave, crest of a wave, billow; to ripple, form waves, stir; to well, as tears in the eyes; rippling, stirring. See *poale*. Many types of billows are listed below. *'Ale lau loa*, wave long and large. *'Ale po'i*, breaking wave. *'Ale pā pua'a*, pig-pen wave, of a wave striking the side of a canoe. *Ka 'ale wai hau a ke kua*, the snow water wave of the gods [it was believed that the gods made snow]. *hō.'ale*. Caus/sim.; to surge (PH 51). (PCP *kale*.) 2. n. Gust. *Rare*. 3. Also *are*. n. Are, a unit of measure. *Eng.*
- 'alē.** nvs. Marshy; marsh, swamp.
- alea.** 1. Pas/imp. of *ale 1*. 2. n. A fish, said to be short for *hīnālea* or a kind of *hīnālea*. Also *ālealea*.
- 'alea, area.** n. Area. *Eng.*
- 'ale'a.** vs. Sweet-voiced.
- 'ale'aki.** n. A swamping wave, as one striking a canoe broadside from prow to stern. See *'aki 5*.
- ale.ale.** vs. Wounded, pierced; wound, sore. Less common than *pōaleale*.
- 'ale.'ale.** Redup. of *'ale 1*; stirring, moving, undulating, tossing, rippling, full to the brim. *Ā ka wai, ua pīha ā 'ale'ale ke ka'eka'e*, the water is full, the edge is brimful. *hō.'ale.'ale*. To stir up waves, agitate, confuse; to cause tumult. (PCP *kalekale*.)
- ā.lea.lea.** n. 1. A shellfish (*Turbo sandwicensis*); its shell. 2. Same as *alea 2*.
- 'alehe.** n. Snare, noose; to snare. Also *'ahele*.
- alehu.** Same as *pūlehu*, to broil.
- 'ā.lehu.** n. Ashes. (For. 6:482.)
- 'ale.'ihī.** Var. of *'ala'ihī*, a fish.
