

- 'anau. vi. To move with a jerky motion; to go gadding from place to place. Cf. 'ananau, 'āna'anau. 'Anau noho'i 'oe i kauhale, how you go gadding from house to house.
- ana ua. nv. Rain gauge; to measure rainfall.
- anaua.ni'i. Same as 'anianiau, a honey creeper.
- 'anau hele. vs. To go here and there, gad.
- ana.'uku. n. Mealybug (Coccidae) and scale insects.
- anauna. Same as hanauna, generation.
- 'ā.nau.nau. 1. Same as *naunau* 3, shellfish. 2. n. A small shrubby mustard, called peppergrass (probably a native species, *Lepidium bidentatum* var. *o-waihiense*); the root was used medicinally. (Neal 370.) Also *kūnānā*, *naunau*. 3. n. According to Rock (1913) a large native peppergrass (*Lepidium serra*), with narrower leaves, found only on Kaua'i.
- ana.waena. n. Diameter. *Lit.*, middle measure. *Anawaena loa*, traverse diameter of an ellipse. *Anawaena poko*, conjugate diameter of an ellipse.
- ana wai. n. Water meter.
- ana waina. n. Liquid measure.
- ana wela. nv. Thermometer, measurement of heat; to measure heat.
- ane. n. 1. A dermestid beetle that destroys feathers in feather-work; mites, as in chickens; ringworm; insect-eaten, gnawed. *Lehu ane*, fine ashes. (PPN *ane*.) 2. The breath of life, passing of a breeze. Cf. *aneane*. 3. Pimple, scabies.
- 'ane. 1. Same as 'ane'ane, to draw near. *Ua 'ane hiki mai*, almost here. *Ua 'ane aku i ka manawa*, it is almost time. 2. Var. of 'ana 1, pumice.
- ā.nea. 1. vs. Insipid, tasteless. 2. n. Vibration caused by heat. 3. Pas/imp. of *ane* 1; moth-eaten. *Fig.*, a battered tramp. (PPN *anea*.) 4. vs. Bare, leafless. 5. Pas/imp. of *ane* 2; gentle, as a breeze.
- 'ane.alika, anearika. n. Antarctic. *Eng.*
- ane.ane. nvs. Faint, feeble, exhausted; nauseous dizziness. Cf. *puaaneane*.
- 'ane.'ane. vs. Nearly, almost, scarcely, hardly, not quite, fairly; near. *Ua 'ane'ane ho'i e pa'a*, it is almost finished. 'Ane'ane i ka make, near death.
- ā.nea.nea. Redup. of *ānea*.
- 'ā.ne'e. vi. 1. To move along by jerks, hitch along, sidle. 2. To go where one is not welcome, to wear out a welcome.
- 'ā.ne'e ali'i. n. Parasite or sponger on a chief; royalist (disparaging).
- 'ā.ne'e.ne'e. 1. Redup. of 'āne'e 1, 2. 2. n. Old clothing; small mat that is carried about to sit on.
- ā.nehe. vi. To come upon quietly, move stealthily, poise. *Ānehe akula ia e ku'i*, he stole up quietly to strike a blow. *Ānehe mai nā kānaka e kaua* (FS 71), the people were poised for fighting.
- ā.nehe.nehe. Redup. of *ānehe*.
- ā.neho. Transgression of the law, wrong, fault; to transgress. (And.)
- anei. Part. indicating that a question may be answered by yes or no, always following a word or phrase. (Gram. 7.5.) 'A'ole anei? Isn't it so? Isn't it? *Pelā anei?* Is it that way? Is that so? *E hele ana anei 'oe i ke kaona?* Are you going to town? (PCP *a(a)nei*.)
- 'ane'i. loc. n. Here (usually after *ma-*, *i*, or *kō*: Gram. 8.6.). See ex., *nei* 3, 'ōi. *E ku'u aloha, ma'ane'i mai, ne'ene'e mai nō ā pili* (song), my loved one, come here, sidle up close. 'A'ohe o 'one'i wahine e like me 'oe, ā inā noho'i no 'ane'i aku nei, 'a'ole nō e hele mai i 'ane'i; he kapu o 'ane'i, he make (FS 259), none of the local women are like you, and had [you] been of this place, [you] would not have come here; it is taboo here, death. 2. Part. Doubtful (used idiomatically). Same as *auane'i* 2. (Gram. 7.5.) *He pa'akai 'ane'i e hehe'e ai*, so, like salt that melts [said by one who doesn't mind going into the rain].
- 'Āne.kali.kana, Anegalikana. vs. Anglican. *Eng.*
- 'ane.kaliko. Var. of 'anikelikeko.
- 'Aneke, Anede. n. Andes. *Eng.*
- 'ane.kelo. n. Angle. *Eng.*
- 'ane.kelopa, anetelopa, anekelope. n. Antelope; gazelle (RSV), roebuck (KJV) (1 Nal. 4.23). *Eng.*
- 'aneko, aneto. n. Dill (RSV), anise (KJV). (Mat. 23.23.) (Gr. *anethon*.)
- 'ane.komio, anetomio. Var. of 'anakomia, anatomy. (For. 5:543.)
- 'ā.nela. n. Angel; designation for Hawaiian gods and spirits by those converts to Christianity who had kept some of the old gods. *Eng.* 'Ānela kia'i, guardian angel.
- 'ane.moku. n. Peninsula. *Lit.*, near island (perhaps a translation of French *presqu'île*).
- anena. Same as *alena*, an herb. *Ni'ihau*.
- ā.neo. n. A game; the stone called *hiu* was said to have been used in this game.
- ā.ne'o.ne'o. vi. To itch. Cf. *mane'o*.
- ā.newa. vi. Dizzy, unsteady, as one ill or intoxicated. Cf. *newa*, dizzy.
- ā.newa.newa. Redup. of *ānewa*.
- ani. vt. To beckon, wave; to blow softly, as a breeze; to draw a net over the surface of water; to pass over the surface, as a hand; beckoning. 'Upena ani, draw net. ho'āni. To beckon, wave, signal; to let wind. *Ho'āni pākī*, to threaten to throw at, as a dog. (PPN *angi*.)
- ania. 1. Pas/imp. of *ani*; breezy. See ex., *nāhāhā*. 2. vs. Smooth.
- 'ā.nia. vs. Scorched, singed, parched; hot, as an oven.
- ani.ani. 1. nvs. Mirror, glass; clear, transparent, obvious. Cf. *makaaniani*, *pukaaniani*. Several types of *aniani* are listed below. *Aniani nā hana i ka Naukilo* (song), techniques are clear to the Nautilus. (PPN *ali*.) 2. vs. Cool, refreshing; to blow softly, gently. *Fig.*, to travel swiftly. (PPN *angiangi*.)
- ā.nia.nia. vs. Smooth, calm.
- 'ā.nia.nia. Redup. of 'ānia.
- 'ania.niau. n. A small, bright olive or yellowish-green Hawaiian honey creeper (*Loxops* [formerly *Chlorodrepanis*] *parva*), endemic to Kaua'i, and related to the 'amakihi. The young birds which are confused with young 'amakihi, were reported to have been called *alawī*. The greater 'amakihi (*L. satittirostris*) is presumed extinct.
- ani.ani ho'o.nui 'ike. n. Magnifying glass, microscope, telescope. *Lit.*, glass to enlarge vision.
- Ani.ani-i-ka-lani. n. Name of a star said to be in the Milky Way.
- ani.ani ipu kukui. n. Lamp chimney.
- ani.ani kilohi. n. Mirror looking glass.
- ani.ani kū. n. Standing mirror.
- ani.ani kukui uila. n. Electric-light bulb. *Lit.*, electric-light glass.
- ani.ani nā.nā. n. Mirror, looking glass.
- ani.ani pa'a lima. n. Hand mirror.
- 'ā.niha. vs. Unfriendly, angry, hardhearted, hostile. Cf. *kamaniha*.
- 'ā.niha.niha. 1. Redup. of 'āniha. 2. vi. Nearly, almost. 'Ānihaniha mākou ā pae, loa'a i ka makani, we were almost landing when [we were] caught by the wind.
- 'ā.nihi.nihi. 1. vs. Precarious. Cf. *nihi*. 'Ānihinihi i ke ola, life hanging [as by a thread]. 2. n. Small taro tubers. Less used than 'ōnihinihi.
- 'ā niho loa. n. A small fish (no data).
- 'ani.keli.keko, anikristo, anikeriseto. nvs. Antichrist. Also shortened to 'anekaliko. (Gr. *antichristos*.)
- ā.nini. n. *Eurya sandwicensis*, a native tree or shrub in the tea family. Also *wānini*. (Neal 582.)
- 'anini. 1. vs. Dwarfish, stunted, tiny. *Rare*. 2. vi. To vary, as great and small waves. *Rare*. 3. n. Awning. *Eng.*
- ani pe.'ahi. vi. To wave or beckon, as with the hand, fan.
- 'ā.ni'u.ni'u. n. Root connecting sweet potato to vine.
- ano. 1. nvi. Awe, reverence, peacefulness, sacredness, holiness; feeling of awe, fear, or oppression; weird solitude, oppressive quiet; awestruck, lost in thought.
