A decoy stick basket with a wide opening; it was baited, and after the fish were accustomed to coming for food, a trap was substituted. *Ke ao 'ō'ō, ke 'apī wai* (FS 201), the sharp-pointed cloud, the water basket [a cloud full of rain]. **6.** To gather together, as people or things. (And.)

-āpī. hō. 'ā.pī. Stingy; to withhold.

'āpī. 'āpī. **1.** Redup of 'āpī 4; elastic, springy; short of breath. **2.** Redup. of 'āpī 3. **3.** vs. Filled, as a basket; abundant, as a feast. 'Aha'aina ka lani i ka lolo o Kūka-huila-lani, 'āpī'āpī kanalani (For. 6:398), the chief feasts at the lolo ceremony of Kū-the-heavenly-lightning, abundant repletion.

'ā.pī'i. **1.** vs. Curly. **2.** n. Tapa-beater design. **3.** n. A variety of taro in the piko group, having light-colored corms which are good for poi or table taro; red ('ula) and white (kea) forms exist; it is called "curly" ('āpī'i) because of crinkles under the leaf. **4.** n. A ti plant with green, crinkly leaves.

'ā.pī'i.pī'i. **1.** vs. Wavy, crimped, kinky, very curly; tempestuous, as waves. **2.** n. A kind of seaweed that is tough and not eaten much, perhaps *Amansia glomerata*.

'ā.pika.pika. nvs. Having suction cups, as the tentacles of the octopus; suction cups; spotted.

'ā.piki. nvs. Crafty, cunning, mischievous, deceitful, dishonest, naughty, treacherous, peculiar, strange; trickery, treachery, rogue, rascal, mischief-maker, humbug. *Ka mea 'āpiki*, however, but, yet. *Lei 'āpiki*, a name given to the 'ilima lei because it was believed to attract mischievous spirits; some did not wear this lei but others considered it lucky.

'ā.piki.piki. **1.** vs. Troubled, agitated, as the sea. Cf. *kūpikipiki'ō*. **2.** nvt. Fold, pleat; to fold, pleat. (PPN *kapitipiti*.) **3.** vt. To clean taro greens by peeling the stems. *Rare*. **4.** n. A kind of variegated or spotted tapa.

'āpīpa, ābība. n. Abib, a Hebrew month. (Puk. 13.4.) (Heb. *abhibh*.)

'ā.pīpī. vs. United, joined, coupled; double. *He wa'a 'āpīpī*, a double canoe. hō'ā.pīpī. To join, couple.

āpo. **1.** nvt. Circle, circuit, hoop, loop, band, bracelet, hoop-shaped earring, girdle, belt, ring, embrace; to span, reach around, embrace, put an arm around, clasp. Many compounds with āpo are listed below. Cf. *kahaapo*. (PPN *āpo*.) **2.** n. Union of the molar or cheekbone with the temporal bone.

'āpo. **1.** nvt. To catch, grasp, grab, hug, seize and retain, catch, acceptance, admission. *Fig.*, to perceive, understand. Cf. 'ā'āpo, 'āpoa, 'āpo'āpo. *E 'āpo 'ia e nā kila*, covered by patents. (PNP *kapo*.) **2.** n. A variety of sweet potato (no data). (For. 5:664-5.) **3.** n. A variety of taro (no data).

'āpoa. Pas/imp. of 'āpo. *Ua 'āpoa e ka ua nahua o nā pali*, caught by the pelting rain of the cliffs.

āpo 'ā. 'ī. 'ī. lio. n. Dog collar.

āpo. ā. lewa. n. Highest heavens or space. *Rare*.

āpo. āpo. nvt. Hill, as of sweet potatoes; bunch, as of taro; to hill up plants.

'āpo. 'āpo. **1.** Redup. of 'āpo; catching, grasping; attack, fit, heart palpitation, agitation; to have an attack, fit. *Ā lohe a'ela 'o Heloke ke ali'i, 'āpo'āpo a'ela kona 'ō'ili* (Mat. 2.3), when Herod the king heard, his heart was troubled. (PNP *kapokapo*.) **2.** n. Half-grown stage of the āhole, a fish.

'ā.po'e.po'e. vi. To assemble.

'āpo.hā. Same as 'ōkuhe, an 'ō'ōpu, a fish.

āpo hao. n. Iron hoop or band, named for the king's guard under the monarchy.

āpo hele. n. Orbit, as of stars and planets.

'ā.poho. nvs. Depression, hollow, hollowed, pitted.

'ā.poho.poho. **1.** Redup. of 'āpoho. **2.** vi. Pounding, slapping, as the sea. Cf. *poho, 'ūpoho*.

'ā.po'i.po'i. vt. To pounce; to crouch in order to conceal (UL 203); to attempt to conceal an article rather than share it.

'āpo.kaka. n. Apostate. (Latin *apostata*.)

'āpo.kau. Var. of 'āpakau.

'ā.pokē. vt. A short piece; cut, broken off; to cut into short pieces.

'āpōke.kolo, āposetole. n. Apostle. (Gr. *apostolos*.)

'āpōke.lupo, Apokerupa. n. Apocrypha. (Gr. *apocryphos*.)

'āpo.kolo, āpotolo. n. Apostle. *Eng*.

āpo kula (gula). n. Gold bracelet; formerly a gold ring.

'ā.pole. vs. Smooth. Also *molemole*.

'āpo leo. **1.** v. To record a voice. *Mikini 'āpo leo*, recorder. **2.** nv. Magical voice snatching (a sorcerer was believed able to snatch a victim's voice so that he could not chant or sing); to snatch a voice thus.

'ā.pole.pole. Redup. of 'āpole.

āpo lima. n. Bracelet, signet. (Kin. 38.18.)

'ā.pona. vs. Embracing, grasping, catching. Cf. 'āpo 1.

'ā.pono. vi. To approve, confirm, justify, ratify, recommend, commend, consent, accept, endorse, adopt; to pass, as a bill. Cf. *pono*, proper, right. 'Āpono 'ole 'ia, disqualified, not approved or confirmed. hō'ā.pono. To approve, accept, justify, find not guilty in a trial; approved, worthy; approbation, sanction, approval. *Palapala hō'āpono*, credentials, letter of recommendation.

'āpono 'ana. n. Approval (sometimes preceded by *ke*). See ex., *ka'a malalo 2*.

'ā.pono ola. n. Guarantee, assurance. *Nani ka mahalo i nā ku'ikahi, mehe 'āpono ola e pa'a ai ke aupuni*, much impressed by the treaties that seem to assure the security of the nation.

'ā.po'o. nvi. To hide, seek shelter; to gad about, a gadder.

'ā.po'o.po'o. nvs. Hollow, cavity; depressed.

āpo pā.pale. n. Hatband.

āpo pepeī.āo. n. Hoop earring.

'āpō.pō. loc. n. Tomorrow (often preceded by *kēlā*, that; perhaps related to *pō*, night, since the Hawaiian "day" began at nightfall). Sometimes shortened to *pōpō*. (Gram. 8.6.) 'Āpōpō ia lā aku, day after tomorrow. (PEP *aapoopoo*.)

āpo.waena. n. Parentheses. Cf. *kahaapo*.

'āpo.wai. **1.** n. Type of Hawaiian dog with solid grayish-brown body and nose tip and eyes of the same color, believed to love water and consequently offered as a sacrifice to *mo'ō* water spirits. **2.** vs. To be a grayish-brown color, as a horse, perhaps bay.

'āpo.wale. n. A native variety of wet-land taro grown chiefly for poi. *E! loa'a akula ke kalo, 'o ka 'apowale*, O, you get taro, to grasp-foolishly taro [a waste of time, pun on 'āpo wale, to grasp needlessly].

āpu. nvt. **1.** To snap or snatch with the teeth; snatching. *Fig.*, to destroy, ravage, ruin. (PNP *āpu*.) **2.** Same as *apuapu 2*.

'āpu. nv. **1.** Coconut shell cup; to drink (For. 6:471). (PPN *kapu*.) **2.** General name for medical potions, as made of taro, yam, or herbs. *Kalo 'āpu*, taro used as medicine. **3.** A taro cultivar, perhaps related to the 'āpuwai. (TC3.)

'ā.pua. **1.** Same as *pai 5*, a fish trap. *Puka ma ka 'āpuā*, got out of the trap [of one going scot free]. **2.** n. Handle, as of a *laulau* food package; shank knob of a fishhook (also *puapua*); twisted top of a paper sack that may serve as a handle. *Hemo ma ka 'āpuā*, to get away through the handle [to escape]. **3.** nvs. Disloyal, disobedient, rebellious; such a person. 'Āpuā pale leo, to disregard orders; one who does so, as a chief or priest.

'ā.pua kā. 'e'ē. Same as *pai 5*, a fish trap.

'Ā.pua-kea. n. Rain name associated with Ko'olau Poko, O'ahu, said to be named for a beautiful woman, 'Āpuā-kea, changed to rain by the goddess Hi'iaka. See song, Elbert and Mahoe 61.

āpu.āpu. **1.** Redup. of *āpu 1*. **2.** nvt. File, rasp; to smooth or sharpen with a file. **3.** Beard of a fishhook. (And.)
