**a'ua.nē'i.** Var. of *auane'i*.

**au 'ā.pa'a.pa'a.** n. Passing of much time on a piece of land, as an old family.

**au.au.** 1. Same as *au 1*; to walk lightly and swiftly. '*O kāne hānau i ke auau pō 'ele'ele*, man born in the age of darkness. 2. Redup. of *au 3*. **ho'āu.au.** To hasten, hurry, rush, excite to action. 3. Redup of *au 10*. 4. Same as *au 11*. **ho'āu.au.** Same as *ho'āu*.

**a'u.a'u.** n. Small *a'u* fish.

**'au.'au.** 1. vi. To bathe. Cf. '*au 1*, *wai 'au'au*. '*Au'au kai*, to bathe in the sea. '*Au'au wai*, to bathe in fresh water. *Hale 'au'au*, bathhouse. **hō.'au.'au.** To give a bath. (PPN *kaukau*.) 2. n. Stick, stem (as of *ti* plant); spear made of *loulou* palm, with shark teeth on its end; extra ridgepole. 3. Trap, snare, as for catching birds. (And.)

**'au.'aua.** Same as '*ā'aua*, coarse. '*Ili 'au'aua lena*, yellow wrinkled skin.

**'au.'au.kī.** 1. n. Young eel. 2. A fish said to resemble *weke* (no data).

**'au.'au.ko'i.** Same as '*auko'i*, a weed.

**a'u.a'u papa-'ohē.** Same as *a'u-papa-'ohē*. (And.)

**'au.'au.waha.** Redup. of '*auwaha*; furrowed.

**au'awa.** n. Bitter gall. *Fig.*, ingratitude.

**auē.** Same as *ue 3*.

**auē, auwē.** interj. and vi. Oh! Oh dear! Oh boy! Alas! Too bad! Goodness! (Much used to express wonder, fear, scorn, pity, affection; see ex., *hu'ahu'a 1*, Gram. 12.) To groan, moan, grieve, bewail. *Auē noho'i ē!* Goodness! Alas! Oh! *Auē kākou!* Alas for us! Woe betide us! *Auē ho'i au!* Woe is me! *Auē! Nānā aku 'oe iā Lei mā!* Say! You should see Lei and the others! *E auē ana i ke aloha keiki*, grieving for love of the child. (PPN *auē(e)*.)

**auelē.** Same as *au wale*. Rare.

**auē.uē.** n. A calling, crying, humming, buzzing.

**au.hā.** n. 1. Molting, of a chicken. (For. 5:495.) Rare. 2. Outhouse, as for storing canoes; shed, shelter. Rare.

**Au-haele.** n. Name of a star, companion to Hōkū-'ula and Pai-kauhale. Perhaps the three are Sigma, Antares, and Tau Scorpii.

**'au.haka.** nvs. Spindle-legged; spindleshanks; an animal with slender legs.

**Au-haku.** n. Name of a star (no data).

**'au.hau.** 1. nvt. Tax, assessment, levy, charge, tariff, toll, tribute, price; to levy a tax, pay tribute, tax. '*Auhau kino*, '*auhau po'o*, poll tax. *Kū i ka 'auhau*, taxable. '*Auhau helu waiwai*, excise tax. *Hale 'auhau*, building where taxes are collected. *Kou 'auhau*, your tax (that you pay). *Kāu 'auhau*, your tax (that you impose). *Luna 'auhau*, tax collector. *Nā po'e ho'oka'a 'auhau*, taxpayers. *He aha kāu 'auhau no ka pāpale loulou?* What is your price for the *loulou* hat? 2. n. Femur and humerus bones of the human skeleton. 3. n. Stems of plants whose bark can be stripped, such as *wauke* and *olonā*, but not *maile*. *Inā e kua 'ia ka wauke, ā hohole 'ia ka 'auhau, . . .* if the *wauke* is cut and the stems stripped, . . .

**'au.hau.** n. Stalk of a *hau* tree, spear made of *hau* wood. *Ahi 'au hau*, firebrand (of light wood, as *hau*).

**'au.hau.hui.** Var. of *uhau hui*, a prayer.

**'au.hau ma'ulē.** Misplaced or concealed *no'a* stone in the game of *pūhenehene*. (And.)

**'au.hau Pō'alua.** n. Tuesday tax, a term used in 1852, probably an educational tax.

**'au.hau.puka.** nvi. Beggar; to go from door to door asking for charity.

**'au.heā.** 1. inter. Where (in questions). (Gram. 8.5.) 2. idiom. Listen (in commands, common in songs). See ex., '*aumakua 2*. '*Auheā 'oukou* (Laie 473)! Hear ye! '*Auheā wale ana 'oe, ē ka pua o ka lokelani*, now pay attention, O blossom of the rose. (PNP *fea*.) 3. idiom. Sir [formal beginning of a letter].

**'au.heā ho'i.** idiom. Where indeed (with implication of

neglect or indifference)? Where's the interest? Where's the care? '*Auheā ho'i ka hele mai o lākou e kōkua*, they'll never come and help, they don't care.

**'au.hē'e.** vt. To flee from danger; routed, dispersed, defeated. '*Auhe'e pū'iwa*, to flee in fright, stampede. *E 'auhe'e i ka 'ino*, refrain from evil. **hō.'au.hē'e.** To rout, put to flight, flee.

**'au.hē'e.hē'e.** Redup. of '*auhe'e*.

**au.hēle.** vi. To go looking from place to place without any definite course, to drift or sail aimlessly, drifting. *Ma ke auhele o ka hewahewa* (Kel. 99), on the drifting path of error.

**au.hili.** vi. To turn off the course, wander, deviate. *Ua lili ke Akua ia wā no ke auhili 'ia o nā kānaka i ka 'ino* (Kep. 35), God was jealous then because of the turning away of men to wickedness.

**'au.hola.** Same as '*auhuhu*., a shrub.

**au.honua.** n. Ancient age, era, epoch. See *mauliau-honua*. *I ke auhonua hānau o Papa i kēia mau moku*, in the ancient time Papa gave birth to these islands. *I ke auhonua o nā Kaikala*, in the age of the Caesars.

**'au.huhu.** n. A slender, shrubby legume (*Tephrosia purpurea* syn. *T. piscatoria*), 30 to 60 cm high, with small, compound leaves, small white or purplish flowers, and narrow pods, used for poisoning fish. The plant is known from tropical Asia eastward into Polynesia. (Neal 448-9.) Also '*auhola, hola*. Cf. *pōpō 'auhuhu*.

**'Au.huhu-pa'ina.** n. Var. name for the month of Makali'i, a time so dry that the '*auhuhu* plant became brittle (*pa'ina*). See *month*.

**'au.hula'ana.** nvt. To swim around a *hula'ana*, or precipice facing the sea; course or route for swimming here.

**au.huli.** vt. To overturn, overthrow, upset; to till. **ho'āu.huli.** Caus/sim. *Ka ho'āuhuli 'ana*, revolution, upset.

**au.huli.hia.** Pas/imp. of *auhuli*. *Kaua auhulihia*, revolutionary war.

**'aui.** 1. vi. To turn aside, digress, deviate, pass by, decline, bend down. Cf. *auinalā*. *Nā 'aui 'ana*, variations, deviations. **hō.'aui.** Caus/sim. *Ke hō'aui maila ka lā*, the sun is beginning to descend to the west. 2. nvi. To swell and roll, as the sea; to pitch; billow, roller. '*Aui 'ale*, large swell, billow. 3. nvi. Declension, case; to name declensions or conjugations (term devised by Andrews based on Latin *declinare*, to turn aside); never used extensively and not entered in Hitchcock's 1887 English-Hawaiian Dictionary. **hō.'aui.** To conjugate, decline. *Ka hō'aui 'ana*, declension, conjugation. 4. nvi. A hula step: the dancer turns to the side and points out one foot once or several times, drawing the foot well back between each pointing; at the same time the body is tipped, with a lowered hand pointing to the outpointing toes, and the other hand raised in the opposite direction; to dance thus. Cf. *ue*.

**auī, auwī.** interj. Ouch!

**'auia.** Pas/imp. of '*au*.

**'aui.alo.** n. Accusative case. *Lit.*, front case.

**'aui.'aui.** Redup. of '*aui 1*.

**'aui.heā.** n. Vocative case. *Lit.*, calling case.

**'aui.hēle.** n. Case denoting separation, as shown by *mai*, from, ablative.

**'aui.hui.** n. Case denoting association. *Lit.*, joined case.

**'aui.'ia.** n. Agentive case.

**'aui.iki.** n. Genitive or possessive case.

**'aui.kō.ha'i.** n. Possessive case. *Lit.*, case belonging to someone else.

**'aui.kumu.** n. Nominative case.

**'aui.moe.** n. Locative case.

**'auina, auwina.** n. Bending, sloping; descent, slope.

**'auina.lā.** n. Afternoon. *Lit.*, declining sun.

**'auina.pō.** n. Midnight, late night.

**'aui.pa'ewa.** n. Dative case.

**'aui.pili.** n. Possessive case. '*Auipili laulā*, *o*-form of the possessive. '*Auipili pa'a*, *a*-form of the possessive.

**'aui.pō.** Similar to '*auina pō*. (For. 6:420).
