

- won't hurt the Kaua'i lad. *E 'eha ana 'oia ia'u*, I will hurt him. *'Eha o ke kua*, backache. *Nāna wale nō ka 'eha, ā koe ke kaikua'ana huhū* (For. 4:37), only he inflicted pain, until [only] the angry older brother was left. **hō.'eha**. To inflict pain or punishment, to hurt, oppress.
- 'ehā**. num. Four; four times. See ex., *hā 1*.
- 'eha.'eha**. Redup. of *'eha*; great pain, agony, tribulation, many small pains; painful. *'Eha'eha ka na'au*, feelings are hurt. **hō.'eha'eha**. Redup. of *hō'eha*; to torment, distress. *Hō'eha'eha na'au*, heart-breaking, tragic.
- ehaha**. vi. To breathe hard, pant. Cf. *hā*, breath.
- 'eha.kō**. n. The Chinese lace-necked, or ring-necked dove (*Streptopelia chinensis*), an early introduction to Hawai'i, said to be named for its call *'eha kō*, prolonged pain.
- 'eha wale**. vs. Easily hurt, sensitive, having feelings easily hurt; to hurt for no reason.
- ē.hē**. interj. Syllables repeated in chants at ends of verses, affording pleasure by repetition or sameness of sound harmonizing with repetition of sameness of drum beat; similar in function to English tra-la-la but different in mood, tending to be more serious. Cf. *ēhā*. *Eia nō 'o Kāwika, ēhē, ka heke a'o nā pua, ēhē* (chant for Ka-lā-kaua), here is David, ah, ah, the greatest of descendants, ah, ah.
- 'ehē**. nvi. A hard, dry cough; to cough. *He kunu 'ehē*, a racking cough.
- 'ehē.'ehē**. Redup. of *'ehē*.
- ehēhe**. interj. Song refrain. (Elbert and Mahoe 67.)
- ehē.hēne**. 1. nvi. To laugh merrily, giggle in glee; laughter. *Ehehene kō 'aka i ka le'ale'a*, your laughter is merry because of joy. 2. interj. Syllables repeated for musical effect at end of verses, similar to *ēhē*.
- 'ehē.hēne**. Var. of *ehehene 2*.
- 'ehē.hēu**. n. Wings. Cf. *'ēheu*.
- ehē.hō'o.pī'i**. n. Carved parallel or undulating lines on a tapa beater and on tapa. (AP.)
- 'ē.hēu**. 1. nvi. Wing, as of bird, kite, or airplane; winged, soaring on wings; to fly, take wings (Kel. 140). Also *'ēkeu, pēkeu*. Cf. *'eheheu, 'ekekeu, pekekeu*. *Ka uhi 'ana mai o nā 'ēheu o ka pō*, the covering of the wings of night [nightfall]. **hō'ē.hēu**. To flap the wings; to lift up or stretch the wings; to undulate the arms in a hula imitating a bird in flight; to flap the arms, shrug the shoulders; to pull up shoulders proudly, hence to be proud. (PCP *ke(e)(f,s)eu*.) 2. n. Rim of a hat. 3. n. Pectoral fin, as of a shark. *Rare*. 4. n. Flipper, as of turtle. *Rare*. 5. (Cap.) See *Ka-ēheu*.
- ehē.'ula**. n. Name recorded for adult stage of *hāpu'u* fish.
- 'ehia**. num. inter. How many, how much, what price; also used with the meaning of no matter how many or much, so very much or many, just a few. *'Ehia ou pāpale?* How many hats have you? *'Ehia o kou pāpale?* How much [money did you pay] for your [own] hat? *'Ehia o kāu pāpale?* How much [money] for your hat? *Hola 'ehia?* What time is it? *'Ehia ka luhi, he mea 'ole ia iāia*, however tired, it doesn't matter to him. *'Ehia nō lā, pau kēlā hana nui*, in just a few days that big project was finished. *'Ehia nō lā 'ana, pau ke kālā*, just a few reckless spendings, the money was gone. *'Ehia ua mea aloha, 'o wau!* Woe is me! *'Ehia mea aloha i ke keiki* (Nak. 104), so much pity for the child. (Gram. 10.4; PNP *efia*.)
- 'ehiku**. num. Seven; seven times.
- 'ehipa**. vs. Somewhat crooked, warped; not in sound mind. *Rare*. (Similar to but perhaps less strong than *hipa* and *hepa*.)
- 'eho**. 1. n. Stone pile (FS 107), especially as used to mark land boundaries; stone image; heap of stones under water (at times fishermen block one end with a net and drive the fish in from the other end), also *umu, imu*; pillar (Kin. 35.20); red-hot stones put inside dressed animals in cooking (also *pōhaku 'eho*). *Lono-ka-'eho* (FS 209), Lono-the-stone [name of the god with eight stone foreheads, vanquished by Kama-pua'a]. (PEP *keff,s)o*.) 2. n. Swelling or ulcerous sore, as caused by friction under the arm, tumor. See *kua'eho*.
- 'eho.'eho**. Redup. of *'eho*, stone pile. (And.)
- E-ho'i-ka-u'i-o-Mānoa-ua-ahiahi**. n. Name of a *lua* stroke. *Lit.*, let the hero of Mānoa return, [it's] evening. (*E*- is sometimes omitted.)
- ehu**. 1. Same as *'ehu 1-4*. See *kēhu*. (PPN *efu*, dust.) 2. Same as *ehuehu 2*, thriving. (PPN *efu*.) **hō'o.ehu**. Caus/sim. 3. n. Water or water mixed with fragrant herbs used in sprinkling or gently rubbing a patient to revive him from fainting. 4. Var. name for *'olapa 2*, *Cheirodendron* trees.
- ēhu. hō'ē.hu**. To drive or shoo away; to stir, as a fire. Cf. *ehuehu 1*.
- 'ehu**. 1. n. Spray, foam, mist. (Many older people say *ehu* for *'ehu 1-4*, which is probably the older form; note lack of glottal stops in such forms as *ehuehu, 'ehuehu, kaiehu, kēhu, kuehu, luehu, puehu*.) See ex., *moi 1*. *Ka 'ehu kēhau* (Kel. 48), the dew spray. *'Ehu moi*, foam of sea where *moi* fish are found. *I ka 'ehu nō o ka lā'au*, in the spray of the war club [of a swift or terrible blow]. *Kū ka 'ehu*, to send spray flying [to lose one's temper]. *Na ke kea ka 'ai, kū ka 'ehu o nā wa'a li'ili'i i ke keiki o Kuai-he-lani* (For. 4:57), the white [pebble] wins, the child of Kuai-he-lani stirs the spray of small canoes [an old *kōnane* game chant]. 2. nvs. Dust; dusty. *Kū ka 'ehu*, the dust rises. *He ala 'ehu*, a dusty path [this might also be interpreted as a faint path: see *'ehu 4*]. (PPN *efu*.) 3. n. Pollen. 4. nvs. Faint, difficult to see; wisp. *Wāwae 'ehu*, faint footprint. *He 'ehu wāwae no ka lani*, a trace of the high chief's steps [rain, rainbow]. 5. nvs. Reddish tinge in hair, of Polynesians and not of Caucasians; one with *'ehu* hair; reddish-brown complexion said to be characteristic of some *'ehu* people; ruddy. (This *'ehu* is invariably pronounced with an initial glottal stop.) Cf. *'e'ehu, 'ehu-'ehu*. *He 'ehu, he nani kona mau maka* (I Sam. 16.12), ruddy and of a beautiful countenance. (PPN *kefu*.)
- 'ehu ahi.ahi**. n. The dust of evening. *Fig.*, twilight, old age.
- 'ehu.'awa**. Same as *'ahu'awa* (*Cyperus javanicus*).
- ehu.ehu**. 1. nvs. Animation varying from fury and storm to power and majesty; violent, furious, powerful, animated; violence, fury, anger, majesty, animation. *Waiho kāhela i ka la'i ā ahiahi ehuehu mai*, lying stretched out in the calm until at evening full of animation. *Ā ka la'i a 'Ehu lā, ehuehu 'oe ē ka lani lā* (song for Ka-lā-kaua), and the calm of 'Ehu, you, o chief, appeared with majesty. *Kū ana 'o Mauna Loa, kuahiwi 'alo ehuehu* (song), stands Mauna Loa, hill resisting storms. 2. vs. Healthy, vigorous. Less used than *ahu-ahu*. 3. n. A kind of rock, used for adzes. (Malo 19.)
- 'ehu.ehu**. Redup. of *'ehu 1-4* (this form was perhaps once *ehuehu* and is sometimes pronounced thus still). *Ku'u hoa i ka 'ehuehu a ka noe*, my companion in the spray of mist. *Ke 'ehuehu nei nā 'ale*, the billows rise in waves [of flaring temper]. *'Ehuehu kai, noho ka moi*, where the sea foams, the *moi* fish lives. (PPN *kefukefu*.)
- 'ehu.'ehu**. Redup. of *'ehu 5*. *'Ehu'ehu nā lihilihi*, reddened eyelash.
- 'ehu hī.nano**. n. *Hīnano*-blossom pollen.
- 'Ehu-kai**. n. Name of a wind of Hālawā, Moloka'i. (For. 5:103.)
- 'ehu kai**. n. Sea spray, foam.
- 'ehu kaka.hiaka**. n. The dust of morning. *Fig.*, dawn, youth, a shower that clears quickly.
- 'ehu kumu uli**. n. Hair black at the roots that shades out to reddish at the tips, said to be characteristic of some *'ehu* people.
- 'ehu lepo**. nvs. Dust; dusty.
- 'ehu pua**. n. Flower pollen.
- 'ehu wai**. n. Spray from water.
- ei**. 1. Var. of *eia*, especially before words beginning with
