ewe. n. Eve. *Eng.*

ēwe. 1. nvi. Sprout, rootlet; lineage, kin; birthplace; family trait; to sprout. Cf. *ēweewe*, *ēwe kapu*, *ēwe lani*. *Hookahi nō o māua ēwe*, we are of the same lineage. *Ēwe hānau o ka 'āina*, natives of the land. *Kū nō ke ēwe*, true to the family traits. *E kolo ana nō i ēwe i ke ēwe*, rootlet creeps to rootlet [kinfolk seek and love each other]. *I ke ēwe 'āina o ke kupuna*, in the ancestors' family homeland. **ho'ēwe.** Caus/sim. *Ua ho'ēwe pa'a 'ia i loko o kona papa houpo ali'i*, firmly fixed in the heart of the chiefly class. 2. n. Navel string; abdominal aorta, mature birth. 3. Same as 'iwe 1, afterbirth.

Hānau ēwe, premature birth. (PCP *eewe*.) 4. n. White of an egg. *Ke ēwe o ka hua moa* (Ioba 6.6), the white of an egg.

ē.weewe. nvs. Kinsmen, lineage; pertaining to the family, having a family. *Hānau ke ēweewe*, *he ēweewe kona* (KL line 524), born were those of the lineage, of the lineage they. (PCP *e(e)weewe*.)

'ewe.'ewe. interj. Cry of 'Ewe'ewe-iki, a legendary woman who died in childbirth and who is said to return at night as a ghost and make this cry, which is followed by a *nā* cry like that of an infant, an omen that a birth is imminent.

ēwe kapu. n. Sacred or taboo lineage.

ēwe lani. n. Chiefs of divine descent.
