

Ua ho'ohauhauia ka lā'au e ke kanaka, the stick was struck by the man.

hahau.hui. Same as *uhauhui*, a prayer.

hahau kā.kua. vt. To hurl a blow by swinging from the shoulders. (FS 169.)

hahēi. 1. Same as *kīkepa*, a type of pig. *Rare.* 2. vs. Plump, fleshy. *Rare.* 3. vi. To be bound fast.

hahi. Same as *hehi*. *Kahua hahi* (Ruta 3.2), threshing floor.

hahi.hahi. Redup. of *hahi*.

hahili. A kind of fish. (And.)

hahina. Same as *hehina*.

haho. vs. Lacking in flesh, thin; to fail, of an invalid. *Rare.*

hahoma. Same as *homa 1, 2.* *Rare.*

hā.ho'o.ili. n. Hereditary stalk; established people with inherited land. *Rare.*

hahu. 1. Var. of *hehu*, seedling or plant (see ex., *mānewanewa 2*). 2. vt. To clear, smooth; to purge, as the bowels. **ho'o.hahu.** To smooth, level off; to give a purge; cathartic purge. (PPN *safu*.)

hahu.alo. Same as *halo 1.* (AP.)

hahu.hahu. Redup. of *hahu 2*.

hai. 1. nvt. Offering, sacrifice; to offer, sacrifice. Cf. *hai'ai, haialo, haiiau, haipule, heiau.* *Hai nō 'o 'Ai-kanaka iā'oe i luna o ka lele* (FS 87), 'Ai-kanaka will sacrifice you on the altar. *Hai kanaka*, to offer human sacrifice; to kill for a human sacrifice. (PNP *fai*.) 2. Same as *hahai*, to follow. (PCP (*f,s*)*ai*.) 3. vt. To hire, employ. *Eng. Ka hai 'ana*, the employment, hiring.

hai- 1. Simulative prefix similar to *ha'a-*. See *haikea, hailawe, hailepo, hailuku, haipule, hai'ula, haiwa*, Gram. 6.3.3. 2. See *akahai*. (PPN *fai*.)

hai'i. 1. nvt. To break or snap, as a stick; broken; fracture, joint, break. (Cf. *haki, moku, nahā, wāhi*.) **ho'o.hai'i.** To cause a break. (PPN *faki*.) 2. vt. To say, tell, mention, state, declare, confess. Cf. *hai'ina, hai'i pōkole.* *Ka hai'i 'ana*, the telling, annunciation. *Kona hai'i maoli 'ana i kona hewa*, the true confession of his offense. (PNP *fa(a)ki*.) 3. loc. n. Edge, border (not used with the articles). *Lepo ma hai'i o ke kalo* (Kep. 155), dirt on the edge of the taro. 4. vi. Coquettish, flirtatious; to flirt. *Ke holo mai nei 'o Halaki hai'i 'ē nā pua i ke kula*, as Charlotte rides along, the youngsters of the plains had become coy. **ho'o.hai'i.** Caus/sim. 5. vi. To sway, bend. *Kāna hele ho'oha'i lua 'ana ma ka 'aluhe'e noho'i ma'ō a ma'ane'i*, her swaying walk, sagging this way and that. 6. n. House. *Kaua'i.* *Rare.* 7. pronoun. Someone else, another person; another place, elsewhere (*rare*). (Not used with articles: Gram. 8.2.) *No hai'i*, for someone else. *Aia nō iā hai'i nā 'āina o mākou* (Neh. 5.5), other men have our lands. *Ho'olei ke 'a'ā apau ma hai'i ā maika'i*, throw all the stones somewhere else so [the garden] will be fine.

haiā. Pas/imp. of *hai 2*, to pursue.

hai.ā. 1. n. Retainer or follower of a chief. Cf. *haiā kāne, haiā wahine*. 2. Same as *haihaiā*.

hai'ai. nv. Food offering; to offer vegetable food.

hai.ā kāne. n. Male retainer of a chief.

hai'i'ale. v. To break, of billows. *Fig.*, to surge, of emotion.

hai'i.all'i. n. Name of a hard rock used for making adzes.

hai.alo. Same as *haiā 1.* *Lit.*, follow the presence.

haiā.mū. vi. To gather, crowd, flock; in great numbers, as ripening fruit. Cf. *mū 3.* *Ua haiāmū 'ia a'e nā huina alanui*, the street intersections are crowded.

haiā.mua. Pas/imp. of *haiāmū*.

hai'i'ano. n. Adjective.

hai'i'ano. v. To describe, tell the nature of.

hai'ao. nv. Day sacrifice; to sacrifice by daylight.

hai'i'ao. nv. Sermon, lecture, instructive discourse; to give advice.

haiāu. Var. of *heiau*. Cf. *hai*, to sacrifice.

hai.ā wahine. n. 1. Female retainer of a chief. *Papai'awa a'ela 'o 'Ai-wohi-kupua me kona mau kaukauali'i a me nā haiā wahine ona e ho'opau i kāna 'ōlelo ho'ohiki* (Laie 475), 'Ai-wohi-kupua and his lesser

chiefs and the women of the household made ceremonial kava offerings to put an end to his oath. 2. Wicked woman, concubine (Lunk. 19.1).

hai.'e'a. n. A variety of 'a'awa lelo, a fish.

hai.ēhu. Var. of *kaiehu 1*.

hai'i'euane.lio. nv. To preach the gospel; evangelist.

hai.hai. Same as *hahai*, to follow.

hai'i.hai'i. 1. Redup. of *hai'i 1*; brittle; limbering exercises, as for the hula; massage in chiropractic; quavering; breaking, rising and falling of the voice; a style of singing with a breaking voice; to break, as a law. *Kauka ha'iha'i iwi*, chiropractor. *E ha'iha'i i ke kanaka* (For. 4:35), to break the bones of people [in fighting]. *E ha'iha'i iho 'oe i kāna 'auamo* (Kin. 27.40), you break his yoke. **ho'o.hai'i.hai'i.** Caus/sim.; to break, as waves. *Ma ka leo kauō, ho'ānu'unu'u, ā ho'oha'iha'i*, with loud voice, vibrating, rising and falling. 2. Redup. of *hai'i 2*; to speak quietly back and forth; to murmur (Kel. 70). *Ku'u hoa ha'iha'i leo*, my friend [with whom I] talk flirtatiously.

hai.hai.ā. nvs. Wicked person; wicked, unholy. *Ka po'e haihaiā* (1 Tim. 1.9), the unholy. *E māhuahua ai ka haihaiā* (2 Tim. 2.16), to increase unto more ungodliness. 2. vi. To prevent the gods from hearing a rival's curses by acting insane (eating poison, going naked), thus diverting the god's curses to himself and freeing the victim; with his superior mana he turns the curses away from himself and on to the rival sorcerer (Kam. 64:140-1); to prevent gods from hearing by offering herbs and medicine (And.).

hai'i.hai'i iwi. nv. By holding the shoulders, to make a person's bones crack audibly; a form of chiropractic; to do so; to break bones.

hai'i.hana. n. Verb (old name).

hai'i.inoa. n. Noun. *Lit.*, name telling.

hai'i.inoa lau.lā. n. Common noun.

hai'i.inoa pili kāhi. n. Proper noun. *Lit.*, noun referring to someone or place.

haika. 1. Same as *haikaika*. 2. vi. To gasp. *Rare.*

hai.kaika. nvi. To make faces; a grimace of defiance and contempt; the corners of the mouth were drawn back tightly, the teeth separated, chin and lower teeth twisting from side to side; perhaps the figure-eight mouthed images were inspired by this violent fighting expression. Cf. *ikaika*, strong. **ho'o.hai.kaika.** A less violent grimace than *haikaika*; to make faces, cause to make faces.

hai.kala. n. 1. Severe cramps, said to have often proved fatal. 2. Asthma. (For. 6:451.)

hai.kala muku. n. Cramps, less severe than *haikala*.

hā.'ike. Same as *hō'ike*, to show.

hai.keā. 1. Same as *hākea*, pale, and *hākea*, a type of banana. 2. n. A type of tapa (no data).

hā.'ike.'ike. Same as *hō'ike'ike*.

hā.iki. nvs. Narrow, pinched; limitation, restriction (in fast speech, *haiki*). *Hāiki ka no'ono'o, hāiki ka 'ike*, narrow-minded. *Aia nō i kahi hāiki*, just there in a narrow place [said of an unborn child]. *Ka hāiki o ka manawa*, limitations of time. *Kona wā i hāiki ai i ka pōloli* (Mar. 2.25), the time he was pinched with hunger. *Ha'iha'i pua o ku'u manawa ē, eia wau lā ua hāiki* (Laie 521), broken flowers of my heart, here I am in straits. **ho'o.hā.iki.** To contract, shrink, restrict, curtail, narrow. *Kekahi mau ho'ohāiki o ka lawai'a 'ana*, certain restrictions on fishing.

hā.ikiiki. Redup. of *hāiki*.

hai.kina. n. Hyacinth. *Eng.*

hai'i.kū. 1. n. The *kāhili* flower (*Grevillea banksii*), so named because first planted near the town of Ha'i-kū, Maui. (Neal 321.) Also *kāhili*, and 'oka pua 'ula'ula on Ni'ihau. 2. vs. Haughty, conceited. *Rare.*

hai'i.kū ke'oke'o. Same as 'oka kilika, silk oak.

hai'i.kūpuna. nv. To tell of ancestors; a chant concerning ancestors, genealogy.

hai'i.kū.uma.uma. n., interj. A call to lift a canoe or to rally together in any work.

hai.lapu. Same as *hōlapu*. *Hailapu ke aloha*, love flares.
