

- hai.lawe.** vt. To exchange, barter. *Rare.*
- ha'i.le'a.** vt. To tell clearly.
- hai.lepo.** 1. nvs. Ash-gray pallor; to have this pallor. *He limu ka i'a, hailepo ka lani*, if seaweed is the marine food, the chief pales [sometimes *limu* is a bad omen]. 2. n. An ancient pestilence. (Malo 246.) 3. n. One of the sting rays, perhaps *hihimanu*. (PPN *fai*.)
- haili.** 1. Same as *hali'a*. *Ke kau mai nei ka haili aloha* (FS 41), the loving memory returns. *Haili moe*, premonition, as in a dream. *Haili 'opua*, a cloud bank that recalls to mind. **ho'o.haili.** To cause, produce a recollection or premonition; to challenge (Nak. 12). 2. nvs. Spirit, ghost; dim, indistinct. **ho'o.haili.** To assume a ghostly form; dim. 3. n. Yellow band, as on the tail of *ono*, the fish.
- hā.'ili.** Same as *hā'ili'ili*. *Ka pali hā'ili kauā* (KL line 2094), the cliff that curses the outcast.
- hai.lia.** Pas/imp. of *haili 1*.
- haili aka.** n. Shadowy form of a ghost.
- hā.'ili.'ili.** vt. To revile, curse (Puk. 21.17), blaspheme, speak evilly.
- ha'i liki.** vt. To boast.
- hai.lili.** Same as *lili*, jealous.
- ha'i.lima.** n. Distance from the elbow to the end of the fingers.
- haili.moa.** n. A shellfish resembling the *wana*, but with short spines, possibly *Tripneustes* or *Echinometra*.
- haili moe.** n. Recollected dream, vision.
- haili-o-Pua.** n. A small native fern (*Schizaea robusta*) found in high mountain wet areas believed to be the plant form of the sorcery goddess Pua; sometimes used as a psychological remedy to ward off the evil influence of Pua. (Neal 8.) *Lit.*, Pua's memory. *Hawai'i*. Also *'oāli'i makali'i*.
- hai.lipo.** Var. of *hailepo 3*, a sting ray.
- ha'i.loa'a.** n. Answer to a problem, solution, key. *'O ka ha'iloa'a o ka hope o ka helo na'au*, key to the supplement of the mental arithmetic.
- hai-lō-keaka.** n. The card game high-low-jack-and-the-game. *Eng.*
- hai.lona.** nvi. Divination, casting lots, throwing dice; to test (also used interchangeably with *hō'aiona*). *Hailona 'o Moikeha i nā keiki āna, i akaaka kō lākou mea ikaika a koa* (For. 4:161), Moikeha tested his children to discover their strength and valor.
- ha'i.lono.** 1. v. To tell the news, to spread a report. 2. (*Cap.*) n. Name of a star.
- ha'i.lua. ho'o.ha'i.lua.** To flirt; loose-jointed.
- hai.luku.** vt. To stone. *Fig.*, to hurt the feelings. *Ua kokoke lākou e hailuku mai ia'u* (Puk. 17.4), they be almost ready to stone me.
- ha'i.malule.** Same as *malule*, weak, limp.
- ha'i mana'o.** v. To state an opinion, testify.
- ha'i.manawa.** n. A thin, delicate white tapa.
- ha'i manawa.** 1. v. To tell of the times. 2. (*Cap.*) n. *The Times* (name of a publication).
- ha'i.moe.ipo.** n. Fascination, interest. *Ka ha'imoeipo o kona mau ho'oka'au*, the fascination of his wit.
- haina.** n. Offering, sacrifice. Cf. *hai*, to sacrifice. *Ka haina 'awa*, offering of kava. *Ka haina kanaka* (KL line 2098), human sacrifice.
- hai.nā.** vt. Cruel, unmerciful, heartless; to abuse, treat cruelly. *Mai hainā wale i ka holoholona*, do not abuse the animal. *Mea haina*, cruel person, tyrant.
- ha'ina.** 1. nvi. A saying, declaration, statement, explanation; answer, as to a riddle; confession; solution; the two (or sometimes more) last verses of a song that usually begin with the word *ha'ina* and that repeat the theme of the song, or the name of the person to whom the song is dedicated; to sing the *ha'ina* of a song; to tell, confess. Cf. *ha'i*, to speak. *Ha'ina hou*, to sing the *ha'ina* again. *Ha'ina 'ia mai ana ka puana*: see *puana 1*. 2. n. A breaking, as of a stick or law; a break. 3. n. Verb. Cf. *ha'ina keke'e*, *ha'ina kōkua*, *ha'ina 'oko'a*, *ha'ina pili*.
- hai.nakā.** n. Handkerchief, napkin (*rare*). *Eng.*
- hai.nakā 'ā.'t.** n. Neckerchief.
- hai.nakā lei.** n. Neckerchief.
- hai.nakā pa'ēke.** n. Pocket handkerchief. *Eng.*
- hai.nakā pakeke.** n. Pocket handkerchief. *Eng.*
- hai.nakā pepa.** n. Paper handkerchief, cleaning tissue.
- ha'ina keke'e.** n. Irregular verb.
- hai.naki.** 1. n. Prayer removing the taboo on land after the taxes had been collected (an example of a *pule hai-naki* is in Malo 146-7). 2. nvt. Quarter of a roasted pig reserved for priests at the *laukini* service (Malo 174); to offer such.
- ha'ina kō.kua.** n. Helping or auxiliary verb.
- ha'ina.le'a.** n. Adverb. *Lit.*, clarifying verb.
- ha'ina kuhi.kuhi.** n. Directional adverbs, as *mai, iho, aku, a'e*. *Lit.*, pointing adverbs.
- ha.t.nana.** vi. To talk with animation. *Rare.*
- ha'ina nalu.** n. Breaking wave.
- ha'ina 'oko'a.** n. Neuter or intransitive verb.
- ha'ina pili, ha'ina pili aku.** n. Transitive verb, active verb.
- ha'ina pili ha'i.inoa.** n. Verbal adjective.
- ha'ina pili iā ha'i.** n. Transitive active verb. *Lit.*, verb referring to another person.
- ha'ina pili 'ia mai.** n. Transitive passive verb.
- ha'ina pili 'ole aku.** n. Intransitive verb.
- ha'ina pule.** n. Recitation of prayers.
- ha'i.nau.** vt. To bend the head forward.
- hai.nikā.** Var. of *hainakā*. *Pāpale hainikā* (Puk. 28.4), turban (RSV), mitre (KJV).
- ha'i.noa.** Same as *ha'iinoa*.
- hai.nole.** Same as *nīnole*, pliant.
- ha'i.nole.** vt. To incite, encourage, stimulate. *Rare.*
- hā.inu, ho'o.hā.inu.** vt. To give drink. *Pali hāinu kai*, the cliff that drinks of the sea [rising from the sea]. *Ā ho'ohāinu ihola i nā hipa* (Kin. 29.3), and watered the sheep.
- ha'i ola.** nv. To preach salvation or eternal life; one who so preaches.
- ha'i 'ole.** vs. Unbreakable, inflexible, stubborn.
- ha'i.'ō.lelo.** nv. Speech, address, lecture, sermon; to orate, preach, make a speech; speaker. See *ex.*, *lālā*.
- ha'i.'ō.lelo ho'o.le'a.** n. Eulogistic speech.
- ha'i 'ō.uli.** nv. To tell omens, prognosticate, as by observing clouds; soothsayer. *Nā mea ha'i 'ōuli ma ka malama* (Isa. 47.13), the monthly prognosticators.
- hai pō.** n. Night religious service, sacrifice. (For. 6:377.)
- ha'i pō.kole.** vt. To speak or report briefly, *Ha'i pōkole mai ma ka waha*, orally summarize.
- hā ipu.** n. Stem of a gourd leaf, as used in medicine.
- hai.pule.** nvi. Religious, devout, pious, reverent; piety, a pious person; to worship; to hold prayers or service, as to consecrate a heiau; church service. *Ka pule a kāu kauā nei e haipule ai i mua o kou alo* (1 Naī. 8.28), the prayer which thy servant prays before thee.
- hā.'iu.'iu.** nvs. High, height. Cf. *'iu'iu*. (FS 201.)
- hai.'ula.** Same as *hā'ula*.
- hai.wā.** vt. To plant far apart, as taro, coconuts. *Rare.*
- ha'i waha.** vt. Word-of-mouth, verbal, oral; to tell verbally.
- ha'i.wale.** n. All native species of *Cyrtandra*, slender soft-wooded forest shrubs with white tubular flowers. (Neal 773.) Sometimes called *kanawao ke'oke'o*. See *'ilihia*.
- ha'i wale.** 1. vs. Easily broken, brittle. 2. vt. To tell without reason. 3. vt. To flirt readily, with little reason.
- haka.** 1. n. Shelf, perch, platform; roost, as for chickens; fish spear rack; rack for suspending water gourds and other household objects; rack attached to booms of double canoe to hold spears and other objects; ladder (see *alahaka, haka 'allii*). *Haka kau a ka manu*, a perch for birds to light upon [a promiscuous woman]. (PPN *fata*.) 2. n. Recipient; medium, oracle, one possessed. *Haka waiwai* (Kep. 117), recipient of wealth. 3. n. Crested feather helmet, so called because the crest perches on the helmet. 4. nvs. Hole, breach, open space, vacancy; empty, vacant, full of holes or spaces. Cf. *hakahaka, 'olohaka. ho'o.haka*. To make openings, holes, spaces; to create space; full of holes. *Fig.*,
