

- hungry. 5. nvt. To stare, gaze. (Hal. 22.17.) *Haka hele*, to stare or examine carefully as one walks. *Ua haka malū aku kona mau maka i ka mea 'ilihune* (Hal. 10.8), his eyes are privily set against the poor. 6. vt. To place wood in a ground oven, to lay an oven fire. 7. n. Heart, hearts, in a deck of cards. *Eng.*
- hā.kā.** Same as *hakakā*.
- haka.'ano.** n. 1. Breach, as in mist. *Rare.* 2. Wind associated with Hālawā, Moloka'i.
- hā.kā'ē.** Same as *hakakā'e*.
- hā.kāha.** To delay, detain. (*And.*)
- haka.haka.** 1. Redup. of *haka 4*; vacant space, vacancy, room; blanks, as in a questionnaire; gap; thin, emaciated, especially of one with hollow chest or sunken features. *He lawa ke kino, 'a'ohe hakahaka*, a strong body, not emaciated. Cf. *pani hakahaka. Hakahaka nā maka*, hollow-eyed. *Niho hakahaka*, teeth with gaps. *Uea hakahaka*, wire screen, window screen. *Kohala ihu hakahaka*, Kohala of the extended nostrils [climbing the Kohala mountains makes one breathe hard]. **ho'o.-haka.haka.** Full of openings and spaces; to make open spaces, holes. *'A'ole i ho'ohakahaka 'ia kou pepeiao* (Isa. 48.8), thine ear was not opened. (PEP *(f,s)ata-(f,s)ata*.) 2. Same as *haka 1*. *Rare.* Cf. *ke'ahakahaka*. (PEP *(f,s)ata(f,s)ata*).
- haka.haka.ēa.** n. Rainbow with much green color. *Rare.*
- haka.haka leo.** n. Ghostly voice, spirit voice. *Rare.*
- hakai, hagai.** n. Container, bag, named for Haggai (Hagai 1.6), who carried a bag with holes [spoken humorously]. *Eng.*
- hā.kai.** 1. n. Stem, stalk. 2. *Rare* var. of *hākui 1, 2*.
- hā.kā'i.** Probably similar to *ka'i 1*; to move along, as rain. *Hāka'i lua nei i ke anu o Wai-'ale'ale* (For. 5:705), venturing again into the cold of Wai-'ale'ale.
- haka ipu.** n. Shelf for calabashes; frame from which calabashes were hung.
- hakaka, hadasa.** n. Myrtle. (Isa. 41.19.)
- haka.kā.** vt. To fight, quarrel; fight, duel, strife. *Hakakā 'ōlelo*, dispute, argument. (Kin. 26.20.) **ho'o.-haka.kā.** To provoke a fight.
- haka.kā-a-moa.** n. 1. Cockfight. Also *hākā moa*. 2. (*Cap.*) n. Type of *lua* fighting in which the contestants did not use their hands, but fought with feet, legs, shoulders, head.
- haka.kā'ē.** vs. Frail, weak; thin, as tapa or a dress.
- haka.kai.** vs. Bloated, swollen. *Rare.*
- haka.kā pahi kaua.** n. Duel with swords.
- haka.kā pū.pana.pana.** n. Pistol duel.
- haka.kau.** nvt. To straddle. *Fig.*, a tall thin person.
- haka kau.** n. Perch, shelf.
- haka kau.lā'i.** n. Drying frame or rack.
- haka.kau.luna.** Same as *lona*, canoe rest.
- haka.kau.pili.** vi. To stand intently watching, as a thief [said to be the name of a legendary rat thief]; to stand precariously, as at the edge of a cliff.
- haka.kā.** 1. vs. Crowded, overlapping, entangled. 2. vi. To stand on stilts, as a spider.
- haka.kī.** vs. Plump. *Rare.*
- haka.kū.** n. Frame, platform, as for drying fish.
- hā.kalā.** n. Ends of a house, gable. Also *kala*.
- haka.lā.'au.** n. Wooden trough, flume. (For. 6:546.)
- hā.kalā.lū.** vs. Debilitated, weak, as from age or sickness.
- Haka-lau-'ai.** n. Name of a star associated with Hana-kau-luna, considered a sign of pestilence or calamity; also the name of a legendary place.
- haka lele.** n. Altar platform, especially where human sacrifices were laid.
- haka.ŋ.** vs. High. *Mai pi'i a'e 'oe i ka lālā kau hakali o 'ike 'ia kou wahi hilahila*, don't climb to the topmost branch lest your private parts be seen [do not act superior].
- hā.kā.lia.** vs. Slow, dilatory [used idiomatically]. *Hākā-lia nō ā*, as soon as. *Hākālia nō ā ao, 'o kō mākou hele nō ia*, as soon as it became day, we went. *'A'ole hākālia pau kēia*, not long, this will be finished. *E hākālia anei kekahi mea iā Iēhowa?* (Kin. 18.14.) Does Jehovah have to wait for anything? **ho'o.hā.kā.lia.** To delay, slow down; slow, dilatory; hesitation. *Mai ho'ohākālia aku 'oe*, don't delay.
- haka.lina.** vs. Showy, pompous, vain, as of one's attire.
- haka.lū.** Var. of *hakanū*.
- haka.lunu.** Same as *hākalalū*.
- Haka.moa.** n. Name of a constellation. *Lit.*, chicken roost.
- hā.kā moa.** Same as *hakakā-a-moa 1,2*. **ho'o.hā.kā moa.** Caus/sim.
- hā.kanē.** Same as *ho'okanea*.
- haka.nēa.** Same as *ho'okanea*.
- haka.nēle.** nvs. To be worthless, useless; uselessness. See *nele. He hakanele kēlā*, that's worthless.
- hā.kanēlo.** Same as *hākaneno*.
- hā.kanēno.** vs. Weak, sick.
- haka.nū.** vs. Silent, sullen; struck dumb, as in amazement. **ho'o.haka.nū.** To cause silence; silent.
- hā.kā'o.** vs. Naked, nude.
- hā.kao.kao.** 1. vs. Decaying, as taro in the field or a few days after cooking. Cf. *kaokao*. 2. n. Hole for inserting mast in a canoe. *Rare.*
- hā.kā'o.kā'o.** n. Net that enclosed a calabash. (Malo 91.)
- haka 'ō.lēlo.** n. Medium or one possessed, who speaks; one who reports to a chief, especially the misdeeds of others.
- hā.kā 'ō.lēlo.** v. To quarrel, argue violently.
- haka.pō.** n. Darkness. (For. 6:371.)
- haka pono.** vt. To observe carefully, stare. (2 Nal. 8.11.)
- hā.kau.** 1. vs. To protrude, as bones or cliff ridges. See *ex., kōlīlā*. 2. Same as *haka kau*, perch, shelf.
- haka 'ula a Kāne.** n. Poetic name for the rainbow. *Lit.*, red perch of Kāne.
- haka 'ū.lili.** n. Ladder, trestle.
- hakō.** vs. Packed full, protruding, bulging, cramfull, swollen. *Hakō ka pa'i 'ai o ka Malu-lani*, the Malu-lani [ship] is overloaded with bundles of hard poi [uncomplimentary reference to a pregnant woman]. **ho'o.-hakō.** To pack full, cram, push; to break, as a boil.
- hā.keā.** 1. Same as *ha'akea 1*. 2. n. A variety of banana.
- hā.keā.keā.** Same as *hākea 1*; faded, wan, fair, blond.
- hā.kei.** Same as *ha'akei. Hākei nā moku kaiāmū* (For. 6:398), the hushed islands are in glory.
- hā.kelo.** nvs. Slimy, snotty; mucus, slime. Cf. *kelo*.
- hā.ke'o.ke'o.** nvs. Whitish.
- haki.** Same as *ha'i 1. Haki wale*, easily broken, fragile. *He ko'oko'o haki wale*, an easily broken staff [a weak leader]. (PPN *fati*.)
- hā.kī.** Same as *ho'okī. 'O kō lāua 'i'o, hāki koko nei 'o Kalua* (chant), their own flesh was Kalua, [their] blood issue.
- hakiā.** Pas/imp. of *haki*.
- hā.kia.** nvt. Pin, nail, spike; to fasten, nail. Cf. *kākia*.
- hakiā koko.** n. Bloody stools. (Kam. 64:111.)
- haki.haki.** Same as *ha'iha'i 1. Malaila ia i hakihaki ai i nā pua* (Hal. 76.3), there he broke the arrows.
- haki.hana.** Same as *hakina*.
- hā.ki'i.** vt. To tie, bind. Cf. *-ki'i*.
- hā.ki'i.ki'i.** Redup. of *hāki'i*. See *nīki'i*.
- hā.kikili.** Same as *kikili*, thunder. (PNP *fatutili*.)
- hā.kilo.** vt. To observe closely, spy on, reconnoiter, snoop, eavesdrop. Cf. *kilo. Hākilo ihola lākou iāia* (Luka 14.1), they watched him.
- hakina.** n. Broken piece, remnant, portion, balance, section, scrap, fragment; fraction, as in arithmetic. See *ex., palena. Hakina 'āina aupuni*, portion of government land.
- hakina 'ai.** n. Food fragment, scrap, morsel.
- hakina kū.pa'ewa.** n. Improper fraction.
- hakina kū.pono.** n. Proper fraction.
- hakina maoli.** n. Common fraction.
- hakina 'ō.lēlo.** n. Portion of a word, syllable.
- hakina pā.nā'i.** n. Reciprocal number.
- hakina pā.'umi.** n. Decimal fraction.
- hakina pili.** n. Mixed number.
