

- hā.nau keiki 'ana.** n. Childbirth.
- hā.nau mua.** n. First-born child, especially the eldest living member of the senior branch of a family; senior, older brother or sister.
- hanauna.** n. Generation; relative whose relationship was established several generations previously; ancestry, birth. *Hanauna like*, relative of the same generation; of the same generation, contemporary. *Makuahine hanauna*, aunt, female cousin of one's father or mother. *Keiki hanauna*, nephew, niece. *Kaikuahine hanauna*, female cousin of a male. *Pili ma ka hanauna*, related through having a common ancestor. *Nā makua kāne hanauna* (For. 4:161), uncles, fathers, brothers and male cousins. *'Ōpio 'Amelika o ka hanauna Kepani*, American youth of Japanese ancestry. (PPN *fanaunga*.)
- hā.nau pā.hā.** n. Quadruplets.
- hā.nau pā.kolu.** n. Triplets.
- hā.nau pā.lima.** n. Quintuplets.
- hana.wai.** 1. nvt. Irrigation; to irrigate, water. 2. nvi. Menstruation; to menstruate. 3. nvi. Urine; to urinate. See *'ōpū hanawai*.
- hana wale.** vt. 1. To work aimlessly, gratuitously, to no avail, uselessly. 2. To tease, annoy needlessly.
- hana walea.** vt. To do with ease, as of long custom.
- hā.nawa.nawa.** Rare var. of *hāwanawana*.
- hā.nau wawā.** nvs. Reincarnation; to be born repeatedly, as Haumea, an earth mother. (Kam. 64:44, note 1.) *Lit.*, repeated birth.
- hane.** 1. vs. Ghostly, soft, and indistinct sounding. Cf. *'uhane*. See ex., *hinihini* 2. 2. vi. To give life and spirit. *'O ka hua a Kama i hane, nā lani ka hua* (For. 6:412), the fruit of Kama was given life, the high chiefs were the fruits.
- hā.ne'e.** vi. To fall, as a building; to collapse, slide, cave in, slip. See chant, *hanu'u*. *Hāne'e ka mauna*, landslides on the mountain. **ho'o.hā.ne'e.** To cause an avalanche, slide; to flatten.
- hā.ne'e.ne'e.** 1. Redup. of *hāne'e*. 2. Same as *ne'ene'e*, moving along. 3. Same as *kīkala hāne'ene'e*.
- hane.hane.** 1. Redup. of *hane* 1, 2; ghostly. *Na leo wawalo o ka hanehane*, calling voices of the spirit.
- hā.nei.** Rare var. of *hānai*.
- hanele, haneri.** num. Hundred. *Eng.*
- hā.nene.** Same as *nene* 1, to stir.
- hā.nē.nē.** Same as *nēnē*, to chirp; rumor.
- hane.o'o.** n. Strong blow, as of the fist. *Rare*.
- hā.newa.newa.** vs. 1. Weak, giddy. 2. Same as *hāwanawana*. *Rare*.
- hani.** 1. vi. To step or move lightly or softly; to graze, touch; soft, light. *Fig.*, to hint, suggest, act coy or flirtatious. Cf. *māhani, makahani*. *Hani ka helena a ka 'aihue*, soft the step of the thief. **ho'o.hani.** To touch, graze, hint. 2. Same as *hanahanai*. *I kukupu i ka hani pali*, sprouting on the cliff side. 3. vi. To know well. *Ua a'o i nā mele a hani wale*, the songs were learned perfectly.
- hani.hani.** Redup. of *hani* 1.
- hanile.** vt. To prepare for or receive company.
- hanina.** 1. Same as *hani* 1. *Nā manu hanina i ka la'i*, the birds moving lightly in the calm. 2. Yellow sarong, as dyed with turmeric. (And.)
- hanini.** vi. To overflow, spill, pour out, slop over; to pour down, as rain; to disappear. (Isa. 45.8.) **ho'o.hanini.** To overflow, etc.; to cause an overflow. *Ho'o-hanini i Mānā ka wai 'ōpua*, the water of the cloud banks pours down at Mānā. *Ua hanini anei kō lākou akamai?* (Jer. 49.7.) Is their wisdom vanished?
- hā.nini.nini.** Redup. of *hanini*.
- hā niu.** n. Heavy end of a coconut frond.
- hano.** 1. Same as *hanohano*. Cf. *pūhano*. *Kau i ka hano*, placed in a position of honor. *Leo hano*, voice of authority and respect. **ho'o.hano.** Same as *ho'ohanohano*. 2. nvs. Hoarse; humming sound of chanting. Cf. *hanopilo*. (PCP (*f,s*)*ango*.) 3. n. Nose flute. (Probably PPN *fangu*.) 4. nvt. Enema, syringe; to inject, use as a syringe. 5. n. Fish net, as for *mālolo* fish or *'iao*; bag net. 6. n. Container, as for water or tobacco.
- hā.nō.** nvi. Asthma; to wheeze.
- hanoa, hanowa.** vs. Fermented. *'O nā 'umeke pi'iali'i, nohu, . . . ua hanowa i loko o ke kāmāu*, the bowls with *pi'iali'i* and *nohu* taros . . . had fermented in the poi bowls.
- hanoalewa.** n. Temporary altar where offerings were made to the gods.
- hano.hano.** nvs. Glorious, magnificent, noble, honored, stately, dignified, grand, distinguished, honorable, honorary; honor, pomp, glory, prestige. *I ka mea hanohano, ka luna ho'omalū*, to the honorable speaker. *Ka Mea Hanohano, ke Kia'aina*, his Excellency, the Governor. **ho'o.hano.hano.** To honor, exalt, glorify; to conduct oneself with distinction. *Mea ho'o-hanohano, hō'ailona ho'ohanohano*, insignia of distinction, regalia, decoration. *Kekele ho'ohanohano*, honorary degree. *Medala ho'ohanohano*, medal, as a military medal for merit.
- hano hā.weo.** See *hāweo*.
- hanona.** 1. Same as *hano* 5. 2. To determine by lot the virtue or value of a thing. (AP.)
- hā.nono, hā.nonono.** Same as *nono* 1, 2.
- hano paka.** n. Tobacco box or container.
- hano.pilo.** vi. Hoarse, wheezy, weak-voiced. *Hanopilo ka leo o ka 'alae*, hoarse is the voice of the mudhen [a person who talks himself hoarse].
- hanowa.** Var. spelling of *hanoa*.
- hano wai.** Same as *hue wai*.
- hanu.** nvt. To breathe, smell, sniff, inhale; breath, respiration, transpiration, last breath of life; vanity (Biblical). Cf. *hanuāpua'a, pūhanu*. *'Ilio hanu kanaka*, bloodhound. *Omo i ka hanu*, suck in the breath, gasp. *Eia ua lani a Hā-loa i pili ai ka hanu i ke kapu*, here is a chief descended from Hā-loa, whose taboo makes one hold his breath [as in terror]. *He hanu wale nō ku'u mau lā* (Ioba 7.16), my days are vanity. *Nāna nō i hā'awi mai nei ke ola . . . a me ka hanu* (Oih. 17.25), he has given life . . . and breath. *Hanu lipo o ka palai* (song), breathing deep of the *palai* fern. *Nui nei ka hanu* (Kel. 52), breathing hard; to puff, sigh. *Pa'a ka hanu*, breathing is stifled; smothering; to gasp. *Hanu i loko*, inhale. *Hanu i waho*, exhale. **ho'o.hanu.** To cause to breathe, resuscitate, administer an inhalant. *I ka ho'ohanu 'ana o kou mau pukaihu* (Puk. 15.8), with the blast of your nostrils. (PPN *fangu*.)
- hanua.** Pas/imp. of *hanu*.
- hā.nu'a.** Same as *nu'a* 1.
- hanu.ā.pua'a.** vi. To breathe like a pig; to gasp for breath, as a strangled pig.
- hanu.hanu.** Redup. of *hanu*. **ho'o.hanu.hanu.** Redup. of *ho'ohanu*. *Lā'au ho'ohanuhanu*, inhalant. *Pa'akai ho'ohanuhanu*, smelling salts.
- hā.nui.** Same as *mokumoku hā nui*, a damselfish.
- Hanu-i-pi'i.** n. A stroke in *lua* fighting. *Lit.*, rising breath.
- hā.nuna.** vi. To snore, to talk with nasalized sounds; blurred, as sound.
- hā.nuna.nuna.** 1. Redup. of *hānuna*. 2. First fermentation of fresh poi (AP.)
- hā.nū.nū.** Similar to *nūnū*, speculation.
- hanunu.** vs. Steep, bent-over, stooped, round-shouldered; stooping. *Rare*.
- hanu nui.** n. Deep breath.
- hā.nupa.** vi. Surging, swollen; choppy, as the sea; slippery, muddy.
- hanu pā'a.** nvi. A head cold; stifled breathing; to have such.
- hā.nupa.nupa.** Redup. of *hānupa*. *Ke awa hānupanupa*, the surging channel.
- hanu.paoa.** Same as *na'ena'e* 1, plants. *Lit.*, fragrant breath.
- hanu.pau.** n. A disease, perhaps pneumonia.
- hanu pau.** nvi. Last breath or gasp; to give the last breath, as of one dying.
