

haupa. vt. To eat heartily or voraciously. *Rare*. *Ka haupa 'ana*, feasting.

hā'u.pā. vi. To open and shut, as scissors, jaws.

Hau-palemo. See *Ka-hau-palemo*.

hau.pe'e.pe'e. nvi. To play hide-and-seek; hide-and-seek.

hau.pia. n. Pudding formerly made of arrowroot (*pia*) and coconut cream, now usually made with cornstarch. Cf. *haukō*.

hau.poa. vt. To soften the earth, as for planting. *Rare*.

hā'upu. vt. To recollect, recall, remember. 'O 'oe ka'u i hā'upu a'e nei (song), you are what I have remembered. **ho'o.hā'upu**. To cause to recollect, recall.

hau.pū.ēhu.ēhu. n. Snowflake.

hau.pu'u. Same as *pu'uhau*. *Rare*.

hā'upu'upu. 1. Redup. of *hā'upu*; to recall again and again. 2. n. Sprouts from sweet potatoes. Also *hāpu'upu'u*, *hā'apu'apu*.

hau.pu'u.pu'u. Redup. of *hāpu'u*.

hau.wala'au. vt. To gabble, gossip, chatter, babble, hubbub, fuss.

hau.wala.o'a, hau.lao'a. nvi. A confused, excited din; to sound thus. (The following words are confused at times: *uluao'a, wala'au, wanao'a*.)

hau.wala.wala'au. Redup. of *hauwala'au*.

hau.wana.o'a. Same as *wanao'a*.

hau.wawā. Same as *wawā*; medley of simultaneous talking. **ho'o.hau.wawā**. Caus/sim.; provocative of loud noise.

hau.wene. vt. To cry, tease, nag, fret. **ho'o.hau.wene**. Caus/sim.; to tease others.

hawa. vs. Defiled, unclean, filthy, daubed with excrement. (PPN *sawa*.)

hā.wa'a.wa'a. vi. To wallow in troughs, as a rough sea.

hā.wa'e. n. 1. A sea urchin (*Tripneustes gratilla*). *Fig.*, of no character or substance, perhaps so used because of the sayings *hāwa'e kai nui*, sea urchin with much juice [and little meat, hence useless], and *he hāwe'a 'i'o 'ole*, sea urchin without meat [or brains]. Varieties of sea urchin are qualified by the terms *maoli* (natural) and *po'o hina* (gray-head). (PNP *saawak(e,i)*.) 2. A kind of stone, used as sinkers for octopus lures. 3. Sprouts from sweet potatoes. 4. (*Cap.*) Name of a famous evil sorcerer. See *lauhue 1*, for figurative meaning.

hā.wa'e.wa'e. n. 1. General name for small lobsters. 2. Sprouts from sweet potatoes.

hawa.hawa. Redup. of *hawa*; a taunt in a children's game. (PPN *sawasawa*.)

hā.wai. 1. vt. To generate steam in an earth oven by pouring on water (Kep. 163); to purify with water. 2. n. Temporary long, gabled house in which priestesses assembled for purification ceremonies. (Malo 178.) 3. n. Sewer. 4. n. A variety of sweet potato.

hā.wai. n. Water trough or pipe, aqueduct, flume.

Hawai'i. nvs. Hawai'i (both the island and the group of islands); Hawaiian person; Hawaiian. Elsewhere in Polynesia, Hawai'i or a cognate is the name of the underworld or of the ancestral home, but in Hawai'i the name has no meaning; see Pukui, Elbert, and Mookini, 1974. See saying, *kuauli*. **ho'o.hawai'i**. To act as a Hawaiian; to ape or imitate Hawaiians. (PPN *Sawaiki*.)

Hawai'i-loa. n. 1. Name of a legendary figure believed by some to have discovered Hawai'i, but see Barrère, 1969; place name. 2. (*Not cap.*) Name of a line for *ulua* fishing in 17 or more fathoms of water.

Hawai'i piha. n. Full-blooded Hawaiian.

hā.wai.lawe'ino. n. Sewerage pipes, sewage system.

hā.wale. vt. To lie, bluff. *Rare*.

hā.wali. vs. Weak, soft, boggy. Cf. *nāwali*.

hā.wali.wali. Redup. of *hāwali*.

hā.wana. Same as *hāwanawana*.

hā.wana.wana. nvi. To whisper; whispering. (Hal. 41.7.) See *kānāwai*. (PPN *fanafana*.)

hā.wane. n. 1. Nut of the *loulou*, native palm, considered

delicious to eat; also the tree itself. Also *wāhane*. *Lau hāwane* (Nak. 77), *loulou* leaves. 2. A small, fine, red seaweed (*Polysiphonia* spp.), consisting of branching filaments forming dense tufts.

hā.wā.wā. nvs. Unskilled, awkward, clumsy, incompetent, blundering; blunder, incompetence. Cf. *wa'awa'a*. See saying, 'ō 2. *Na'au hāwāwā* (Rom. 1.21), foolish heart. *I make nō he hāwāwā, 'auhea noho'i nā lima e 'au mai?* The unskilled die, where are arms to swim with? [Skill saves life.] *A ke ho'omake nei ka huhū i ka mea hāwāwā* (Ioba 5.2), anger kills the foolish man.

hā.wele. 1. nvt. To tie, bind, lash, make fast; to snub, as cattle; net lashing, as for a *hue wai*, gourd; thong. *Fig.*, umbilical cord; to eat. *E hāwele 'oukou 'o kēlā kanaka kēia kanaka i kāna pahi kaua* (1 Sam. 25.13), gird ye on every man his sword. 2. n. A type of tapa (no data).

hā.wēna. n. White lime, as used for dressing hair and turning the hair brown. *Hāpala 'ia i ka hāwēna*, be-daubed with white lime [one whose gray hairs have not brought wisdom].

hā.wēo. vs. Glowing. *Fig.*, distinguished, honored (used after *hano*). *Kau i ka hano hāwēo*, placed in a position of glittering honor.

hā.wēo.wēo. Redup. of *hāwēo*.

hawewe. nvi. 1. To rumble, clatter, patter, as rain; rumbling. (GP 78.) Cf. *kawewe*. 2. To pour down, as the sun; to vibrate, as heat.

he. indefinite article. A, an; to be a, have (with a possessive). (Gram. 10.2.) *He kanaka maika'i ia*, he is a good person. *He ka'a ko'u*, I have a car. (PPN *sa*.)

hē. 1. n. Grave. *Ka 'eho no ka hē o Rāhela* (Kin. 35.20), the pillar for Rachel's grave. 2. n. General name for caterpillar. Cf. *'anuhe, kāhē*. (PCP *fee*.) 3. vt. To scrape, rub, polish. 4. nvi. Swish, as of a whip; murmuring sound of wind or running water; to swish, sough. *Ka hē o ka makani*, the swish of the wind. 5. n. Upper part of a crab's leg. *Rare*. 6. n. Poi from the center or core of taro, formerly reserved for chiefs, as it had not come into contact with dirt (Kep. 165). 7. n. Edges of the mouth of the square *uhu* (parrot fish) net. *Rare*. 8. n. Dividing line between lands. *Rare*. 9. n. Hollow container in which canoe paint was mixed. 10. n. The letter "h." *Eng*. 11. n. Hay. *Eng*.

-hē. ho'ohē. Same as *hōhē*, cowardly.

hea. 1. vt. To call, name; to sing or recite a name chant; to give a name to. Cf. *'auieha, kāhea*. *Ua hea aku au i kona inoa 'o La'a-kea*, I named him La'a-kea. *Ke hea mai 'oukou ia'u, he kumu* (Ioane 13.13), ye call me, teacher. (PPN *sea*.) 2. vs. Misty, clouded, smoky, obscure. Cf. *Kona Hea*. 3. n. Bank, as of a river. (Kep. 91.) 4. interr. Which (in questions and after other words). Cf. *'āhea, ināhea*. *Ka mea hea?* Which thing? *Ka manawa hea?* Which time? When? *Ka hale hea?* Which house? (Gram. 8.5.) (PPN *fea*.) 5. inter. Where? (Usually following prepositions *i, ma, mai, no, 'o*; *mahea* is often written as one word.) *I hea ka puke?* Just where is the book? *Mahea ka puke?* Whereabouts is the book? *Mai hea mai?* Where from? *No hea 'oe?* Where are you from? *Ā e hele ana 'oe 'o hea* (For. 5:219)? Where are you going? *Aia i hea ka puke?* Where's the book (sometimes shortened to *aihea*)? 'O *kēia lio ā 'o kēlā lio, mahea 'oe?* This horse or that horse, which for you? (See also *'auhea*.) (PPN *fea*.)

he'a. nvs. Stained red, inflamed, reddened; flattened and destroyed, as by lava; blood red; a blood sacrifice, as hog or man. Cf. *heka, kilihe'a, kīpalahe'a*. *Kā ia he'a hala o Ka-li'u* (song), this destroyed pandanus of Kali'u is struck [Pele's destruction of Hi'iaka's pandanus trees].

hea'e. Kaua'i name for *kāwa'u*, a kind of *Zanthoxylum*. Cf. *a'e*.

he aha, heaha. See *aha*.

he aha sana.nā. interj. of scorn. What does it amount to? It's of no value. (Perhaps *nanā* is from *he 'ahi kananā*, a phrase describing a fierce fighter; cf. *nanā*.)
