

Also *wesenanā*. *He aha sananā, he mau'u Hilo* (Kel. 138)? What does it amount to? It's just Hilo grass.

hea.hea. 1. vt. To call frequently and hospitably; to welcome; friendly, hospitable, genial. *He leo heahea*, a hospitable calling voice. *Kēlā pali heahea, walowalo i ke kanaka*, that calling cliff summoning men. (PPN *seasea*.) 1. vs. Warm, tepid, insipid. Cf. *'āheahea, mūhea, 'ōheahea*.

he'a.he'a. vt. To imprint with spots, stains; smeared, as with red earth. *Pulu au i ka huna kai, kai he'ahe'a i ka 'ili* (song), wet by spray of sea, sea that reddens the skin. (PNP *fekafeka*.)

hea inoa. nvi. To give a name; to chant a name chant; to call a name in hospitable welcome; to call the roll; roll call; name chant.

heana. n. 1. Corpse, especially of one slain in battle; victim, human sacrifice; carcass (Mat. 24.28), remains. *Kou heana* (Kanl. 28.26), your corpse. *Kāu heana*, your victim. (PEP *(f,s)jeana*; cf. Marquesan *heana*.) 2. Calling, as in greeting. *He heana kanaka, he pihana kamali'i*, a calling of people, a gathering of children.

heana kanaka. n. Human carcass, human sacrifice, an insulting name for *kauwā*, outcasts.

heau. n. 1. Place where fishermen set a basket fish trap, as for *hīnālea*. 2. *Exocarpus* spp., native shrubs and small trees (sandalwood family), with more or less leafless, jointed branches. (Neal 325.) Also *au 12*.

he'e. 1. n. Octopus (*Polypus* sp.), commonly known as squid. *He'e mahola*, octopus given for sickness caused by sorcery, as octopus (*he'e*) would cause the sickness to flee (*he'e*) or spread out (*mahola*). (PPN *feke*.) 2. vi. To slide, surf, slip, flee (Kin. 14.10). Cf. *he'e nalu, pūhe'e*. See ex., *pu'e one*. *'O ka mea i hilina'i aku iāia, a'ole ia e he'e* (Isa. 28.16), he that believed did not make haste. **ho'o.he'e.** To cause to slip, slide, flee; to put to flight, rout. *Ho'ohe'e kī, ti leaf sliding*. (PPN *seke*.) 3. vi. To melt, flow, drip, soften; to skim, as milk. Cf. *he'ehe'e, hehe'e*. 4. vi. To hang down, as fruit; to sag; to bear breadfruit. See ex., *ule 1*. *Laho he'e*, hernia rupture. (Probably PNP *seke*.) 5. n. Line that supports the mast, stay.

heehē. vi. To bleat.

he'e.he'e. 1. Redup. of *he'e 2-4*; avalanche (*rare*). **ho'o.he'e.he'e.** Redup. of *ho'ohe'e*; to slide, slip. 2. n. Breast disease, with caking and great pain during nursing. (PPN *fekefeke*.)

he'e hō.lua. See *hōlua*.

he'e koko. n. Flow of blood, hemorrhage, menstrual flow (Oihk. 15.25).

he'e mā.koko. n. A variety of large red octopus (*Octopus ornatus*); it was rarely eaten because of its bitter taste, but was sometimes used as medicine.

he'e mā.kole. n. Squid beginning to decompose, with a pinkish color and a bad odor, liked by some.

he'e nalu. nv. To ride a surfboard; surfing; surf rider. *Lit.*, wave sliding.

He'e-nehu. n. Name of a misty rain observed off the coast of Hilo when *nehu* fish are running.

he'e nehu. nv. Season when *nehu* fish run; to run in schools, of *nehu*. *Ke kai he'e nehu o 'Ewa*, the sea of 'Ewa with its *nehu* schools.

he.e.pā.laha. n. Each of two posts at the back wall of the ancient house, visible at the door. *Rare*.

He'e-pā.laha. n. A stroke in *lua* fighting.

he'e pā.laha. n. An octopus settled on the ocean floor with tentacles spread out.

he'e pali. n. Tiny, young octopus that clings to rocks along sea pools, especially in certain seasons.

he'e pu'e.wai. v. To surf toward the mouth of a stream or up the stream.

he'e pū loa. n. A long-headed, long-tentacled octopus (*Octopus ornatus*), very tough, tenderized only by much pounding; now called the night octopus. *Lit.*, long-headed octopus.

he'e pulu. n. Octopus slightly decomposed. Also *he'e mā.kole*.

he'e uma.uma. nvi. Body surfing; to body surf.

he'e.wale. nvi. Miscarriage; to have a miscarriage.

heha. nvs. Lazy, indolent, drowsy; weariness following sexual gratification. *'Ōpū heha*, indolent character. *Heha Wai-pi'o i ka noe*, Wai-pi'o is drowsy in the mist. *He ho'opunipuni mau kō Kerete . . . 'ōpū heha* (Tito 1.12), the Cretans always lie and are . . . slow bellies.

hehe. n. A kind of bird (no data). (KL line 348.)

hehē. nvi. Burst of laughter, guffaw; to guffaw. *Ka 'aka hehē a ka manu o Kaiona* (song), the loud laughter of the birds [people] of Kaiona.

hē.hē. nvs. A boil, running sore; ulcerous; botch [KJV], boils [RSV] (Kanl. 28.27).

hehe'e. 1. Redup. of *he'e 2-4*; to slide, sag, fade; landslide, avalanche; soft, watery, melting. *E hehe'e auane'i ka po'e āpau e noho ana ma Kana'ana* (Puk. 15.15), all the people of Canaan shall melt away. **ho'o.hehe'e.** To melt, liquefy, cast, dissolve, soften; to slide, especially to slide by jerks, as on a *hōlua*, sled, or ti-leaf slide. *Wahi ho'ohehe'e hao*, foundry. *Wai ho'ohehe'e*, digestive juice. *E ho'ohehe'e 'oe i 'ehā 'apo gula* (Puk. 25.12), thou shalt cast four rings of gold. 2. nvs. Discharge, as of pus; fluid. *He ma'i hehe'e* (Oihk. 13.18), a boil.

hehe.he'e. Redup. of *hehe'e 1, 2*.

hehe.hewa. Redup. of *hewa*; a mistake by many. *I hehe-hewa kākou iāia lā, i ke koi huhuki a ka mana'o* (chant), we were in the wrong because of him, and the insistent urging of the thought.

hehei. 1. Redup. of *hei 1*, to entangle. 2. n. Type of *pā'ū* (no data).

heheia. Pas/imp. of *hehei*.

hehele.lē'i. Redup. and intensifier of *helele'i*. *Ua wāwahia, ua nāhāhā, ua hehelele'i ka papa i Pua-lei ē* (chant by Hi'iaka), shattered, broken, the foundation at Pua-lei crumbles.

hehelo. Redup. of *helo*; reddish, bright, showy. **ho'o.hehelo.** Caus/sim. *Nā pāpale hulu manu like 'ole o nā ali'i e ho'ohehelo ana i ka 'ōnohi o ka lā*, the hats of the varying bird feathers of the chiefs shining brightly within the eyeball [sight] of the sun.

-hehelo. ho'o.hehelo. Proud, especially of one's appearance or dress.

hehena. nvs. Insane, raving mad, crazy, possessed; insanity, madness; lunatic, maniac. (1 Sam. 21.13, 14). *Kai hehena*, raging sea. *E hahau mai 'o Iēhowa iā'oe i ka hehena* (Kanl. 28.28), and Jehovah shall smite you with madness. **ho'o.hehena.** Caus/sim. *'O kāna mau hana lapuwale, he mea ho'ohehena i ka no'ono'o mai-ka'i*, his wretched actions drive a sane mind mad.

heheo. nvi. A swaggering or swishing walk; swishing, as of a skirt; to whirl, swish, strut. **ho'o.heheo.** Caus/sim.; to swish, swirl; to swish up and down on the foot, as a child.

hehi. nvt. To stamp, tread, trample, pedal, step on; trampling. *Fig.*, to repudiate, deny, desecrate, loathe, break (as taboo). Also *hahi*. *Hehi 'ia*, downtrodden. *Hehi berita*, to trample on a covenant. *Ka'a hehi wāwae*, bicycle. *Kahi hehi palaoa* (Nah. 15.20), threshing floor. *Ka hehi 'ana i ka lā Kāpaki*, desecration of the Sabbath day. *Hehi nō ka mea mā'ona i ka waihona meli* (Sol. 27.7), the person full of food loathes the honeycomb. *Hehi i ka pili*, to repudiate a relationship, as to in-laws after a spouse's death.

hehia. Pas/imp. of *hehi*.

hehi.hehi. Redup. of *hehi*.

hehi hewa. nvi. Misstep; to make a misstep.

hehi 'ino. vt. To step firmly, stamp; to make a misstep and come down hard. *Ua hehi 'ino 'oia no ka huhū*, he stamped his foot in anger.

hehi.kū. nvt. To break rules or taboos, disregard the rights of others, trample on their rights, trespass; willful; trespassing, violation. *Ka hehikū wale 'ia o kekahi 'ōlelo ho'oholo*, the breach of any regulation.

hehina. n. Footrest; any place on which to step or tread; a stepping, treading.
