

**hehi palaoa.** nv. To thresh wheat; threshing. *Lit.*, tread flour (*Eng.*).

**Hehi-pua-hala.** n. Rain name associated with Po'o-kū, Kaua'i. *Lit.*, stepping upon pandanus flowers.

**hehu.** 1. vt. To uproot, dig up, put to flight, drive away, evict, shoo. *E hehu a'e 'oia i ka 'Isera'ela mai loko a'e o kēlā 'āina maika'i* (1 Nal. 14.15), and he shall root up Israel out of this good land. 2. n. Young seedlings or plants, as for transplanting; sucker. Cf. *ilo* 2. 3. nvt. A purge, as of water and juice of gourd stems used as an enema; to purge. 4. n. Ceremony to drive away evil influence. 5. n. Pile, as of rocks. (GP 100.)

**hei.** 1. nvt. Net, snare, stratagem, ruse; to ensnare, entangle, catch in a net; to festoon with leis. See *kāhei* 1, 2; *Luka* 5.4. **ho'o.hei.** To snare, tangle, rope, lasso; to beset with difficulties; to infatuate, be enraptured. *Ho'ohei mana'o*, to infatuate, beguile; spellbound. *Ho'ohei pipi*, to rope cattle. *Ka ho'ohei 'ana i nā pua*, catching fish fry. *E ho'ohei a'e 'oe i kānaka* (*Luka* 5.10), you shall catch [by fishing] men. *Ho'ohei mana'o*, to cast a spell, enchant, beguile. 2. nvi. String figure, cat's cradle; to make such. Many kinds are listed by Dickey. 3. n. Motion of hands and fingers, especially of the dying. (Some persons did not make string figures, *hei*, at night because of the association of the figures with the motions of death.) 4. vs. Adept, deft; to absorb, as knowledge or skill. *Ka 'ike a ka makua, he hei na ke keiki*, the knowledge of the parent is absorbed by the child. 5. Var. of *hai*, to sacrifice. Cf. *hai*, *heiau*. *Hei kapu*, sacred place. (Probably PPN *fai*.) 6. n. Water oozing from a cliff and trickling down. Cf. *ht* 2.

**he-** . . . -i. See *helele'i*.

**hē.** 1. Same as *mikana*, papaya. (Neal 600-1.) 2. n. A variety of sweet potato usually called 'uala hē. 3. Same as *mai'a Polapola*, a wild banana. (PCP *feekii*.)

**heia.** 1. Pas/imp. of *hei* 1. 2. n. Piece of hair, tooth, fingernail, small bone, or the like of a deceased beloved, kept and offered food in order to please the spirit of the deceased.

**heiau.** n. Pre-Christian place of worship, shrine; some heiau were elaborately constructed stone platforms, others simple earth terraces. Many are preserved today. Several types are listed below. In *Isa.* 15.2, heiau is a high place of worship. See *hei* 5. *Hale heiau*, house of worship. (PPN *fai*.)

**heiau ho'ōla.** n. Heiau for treating sick.

**heiau ho'o.ulu 'ai.** Heiau where first fruits were offered to insure further growth. *Lit.*, heiau for the increase of food crops.

**heiau ho'o.ulu i'a.** n. Heiau where fish were offered to insure good fishing.

**heiau ho'o.ulu ua.** Heiau where offerings were made to insure rain.

**heiau kālua ua.** n. Heiau for stopping rain, or (less frequently) for bringing rain. One such heiau named Imukālua-ua (rain-baking oven) was in the Kaunakakai quadrangle, Moloka'i; a land section in Puna, Hawai'i, also has this name. Rain in leaf packages is said to have been baked in an oven.

**heiau mā'o.** n. Small temporary heiau covered with tapa stained green (*ma'o*), used for the *ho'oulu 'ai* ceremony to bring food. (*Malo* 158.)

**heiau po'o kanaka.** Heiau where human sacrifices were offered. (FS 159.)

**heiau wai.kaua.** n. A heiau used for services to bring success in war.

**heihē.** n. Helper or apprentice to a priest.

**heihēi.** 1. nvi. Race, as foot race, canoe race, horse race; to race. *He kanaka ikaika e heihēi ana* (*Hal.* 19.5), a strong man running a race. **ho'o.heihēi.** To run swiftly, take part in a race, pretend to race, cause to race. 2. Redup. of *hei* 1-3; to festoon, drape. Cf. *pā'u heihēi*. **ho'o.heihēi.** To ensnare, entrap; to mend, as a net or wire fence. 3. vt. To enthrall, enchant. *Noho 'oia mehe*

*mea lā ua heihēi 'ia*, he sat like one entranced; enchanted; in a daze. **ho'o.heihēi.** Caus/sim.; to fascinate, flirt; to ward off possible sorcery by imitating the gestures of the *kahuna*.

**-heihēi. ho'o.heihēi.** To beat, as a heiau drum; sound of heiau drum.

**heihēi kū.kini.** n. Footrace.

**heihēi kapu.** n. A sacred place, as one where a priest stayed in seclusion to await a message from the gods, usually a small house on the heiau. (UL 74.)

**heka.** vs. Red, sore, inflamed, bleary. Cf. *he'a*, *phēka*.

**heka.heka.** Redup. of *heka*.

**hekau.** 1. nvt. Anchor, stone anchor, towline, line for fastening boats; warp; to anchor, make fast, tow; taut, stretched, anchored. *Hekau o ka pōloli*, the taut intensity of hunger. 2. vi. To come upon, happen, befall, strike. *Hekau auane'i i ka lae 'a'a*, you will strike a rocky point [trouble]. *He nui nā pō'ino i hekau aku maluna o kekahi po'e*, lots of trouble happens to some people. *'O ka lanakila ki'eki'e i hekau iho*, complete victory resulted.

**heke.** 1. n. Best, greatest, foremost. See *ex.*, *manomano*. *Eia nō 'o Kāwika, ehē, ka heke o nā pua, ehē* (chant for Ka-lā-kaua), here comes David, oh, oh, the greatest of descendants, oh, oh. 2. n. Top gourd in a hula gourd drum. Cf. *'olo* 1. 3. n. Feathered top of an 'ull'ull, hula rattle. 4. n. Nail, pin, rack, as for hanging objects in a house. 5. n. Triangular sail, topsail. Also *pe'a heke*. 6. vs. Shy, sensitive. Cf. *'ōheke*. 7. Same as *hekeheke*. Cf. *'uheke*.

**heke.heke.** vs. Plump.

**heke.kē.** vs. Plump.

**heki.kili.** Redup. of *hekili*. *Ke kau nei ka malu, hekikili i luna*, a shade spreads, thundering above.

**hekili.** 1. nvi. Thunder; to thunder. *Fig.*, passion, rage. See *hakikili*. *Ku'i ka hekili*, thunder roars. *Ua hekili*, rain consisting of big drops, so called because of the noise of their falling. *Nā hekili o ke kuko 'ino*, passions of lust. *Ke hekili mai nei ke Akua nani* (*Hal.* 29.3), the God of glory thunders. **ho'o.hekili.** To cause thunder; threatening thunder storm. *Ho'ohekili maila 'o Iēhova*, Jehovah thunders. (PNP *fatitili*.) 2. n. A variety of taro. 3. n. A variety of sweet potato.

**hekili pā.malō, hekili pā.malo'o.** n. Thunder without rain.

**hē.kuawa, heku.awawa.** Same as *kuawa* 1, valley. *Malu hekuawa*, valley shade.

**hē.kupa.pa'u.** n. Grave. (*Nah.* 19.16.)

**hela.** 1. nvi. Redness of the eyelids; rawness, as of scraped skin; to be red or raw. (PPN *fela*.) 2. vi. To spread, as the arms. Cf. *helahela, kāhela*. (PPN *fela*.) 3. nvi. Hula step: one foot is placed at about a 45-degree angle to the front and side, with the weight on the opposite hip and with that knee bent; the foot is then returned to the original position and the step is repeated with the other foot; to dance thus.

**hela.hela.** Redup. of *hela* 1, 2; widespread.

**hele.** 1. nvi. To go, come, walk; to move, as in a game; going, moving; a gadabout. *Fig.*, to die. Cf. *hele wale, hele wāwae*. *Hele mai*, come. *Hele aku*, go; go away. *Hele pololei*, to go straight ahead. *Hele nō ā ka po'e 'ōpiopio*, extending even to the young people. *Kāu hele kēia*, this is your move [as in the *kōnane* game]. *Hele a ka lā*, the path of the sun; circuit of the sun. *Hele i lalo*, go down, descend. **ho'o.hele.** To cause to move, set in motion; to start, as a clock; to manage; to walk someone else or force oneself to walk. *Kō kākou mau ho'ohele 'ana*, our management. *E ho'ohele aku 'oe i ka uaki*, start the watch. (PPN *sa'ele*, PCP *sele*.) 2. vi. To become, get; like, in a state of, similar (frequently followed by *ā*). *Hele loa i ka 'ono*, really delicious. *Ua hele 'oia ā huhū, momona, 'ona*, he has become angry, fat, drunk. *I uhi pākaukau hou, i hele loa aku kēia lumi i ka maika'i*, [bring] a fresh tablecloth, so that this room will be greatly improved. **ho'o.hele.** To imitate,
