

- hepa.hepa.** Redup. of *hepa*. **ho'o.hepa.hepa.** Caus/sim. *Rare*.
- hepe.koma, hebedoma.** n. Week; seven years. Cf. *pule*. (Gr. *hebdomas*.)
- Hepela, Hebera.** nvs. Hebrew. *Ma'i Hepela*, smallpox. *Eng.*
- hē.pia.** nvs. Pale yellow, of the domesticated 'ilima flower. Also *pia*.
- heu.** nvs. Down or fine hair, fuzz, loose fibers on certain fruits or leaves, quicksilver or mercury on back of a mirror, hairlike growths or spines on sugar cane stalks or cactus; fuzzy, downy; to begin to grow, as a youth's beard or pubic hair; to sprout, of seedlings. *Kū ka heu, pi'i ka heu*, the fuzz bristles [anger]. *Ku'u keiki o ka lā heu 'ole*, child of my beardless youth [Ka-mehameha's term for his first child, Ka-ōlei-o-Kū]. *'Ōkalakala heu pānini*, bristling with fine cactus spines. **ho'o.heu.** Caus/sim.; to grow, sprout, germinate; pubescence. (PEP *feu*.)
- heu. ho'o.heu.** (a) To bleach. (b) (*Cap.*) Name of a strong wind threatening to be a gale.
- he'u.** nvi. 1. Hoot, as of an owl; to croak, hoot. 2. Deep-throated sounds made in Hawaiian chants and prayers; to chant thus.
- heu ani.ani.** n. Fine bits of broken or ground glass; mercury on glass made into a mirror.
- heu.heu.** Redup. of *heu*. (PEP *feufeu*.)
- he'u.he'u.** Redup. of *he'u* 1, 2.
- heu.miki.** Beautiful, comely, attractive. (AP.)
- he'u.pueo.** n. 1. A reedlike grass, a bent grass (*Agrostis avenacea*, synonyms *A. retrofracta* and *Calamagrostis forsteri*), originally found in Australia, and now found through Polynesia; *Panicum heupueo* on Ni'ihau. *Lit.*, owl hoot. 2. Probable Hawaiian name for *pili uka*, a grass.
- hewa.** 1. nvs. Mistake, fault, error, sin, blunder, defect, offense, guilt, crime, vice; wrong, incorrect, wicked, sinful, guilty; to err, miss, mismanage, fail, mis-. *Ko'u hewa*, my mistake. *Hewa haumia*, filthy sin, immorality. *Hana i ka hewa*, to do wrong, commit adultery. *Hele hewa*, to go wrong. *Ua 'ai hewa au i ka mea 'ono*, I ate the cake by mistake. *Nā hewa i kāpono i ka make*, offenses punishable by death. *Kū ka hewa iāia*, he is guilty. *Ua hewa 'o Pua iā Kū*, Kū treated Pua wrongly. *E hele ana 'oe i hea? E au i ke hewa*. Where are you going? Just drifting aimlessly [said if one doesn't choose to answer the question]. **ho'o.hewa.** To cause one to do wrong, cause or feign a mistake; to blame, condemn. (Cf. the more common *ho'āhewa*, to condemn.) *Ho'ohewa 'ia*, convicted. *'Ōlelo ho'ohewa*, to make errors in speech on purpose. *Mai 'ai 'oe ia mea, ua ho'ohewa ka 'āina nou* (Kin. 3.17), eat not this thing, cursed is the ground for your sake. (PCP (*f,s*)*ewa*.) 2. n. Is it wrong to? Then why not? *He hewa kā 'oe ke kū'ai i 'āina, loa'a ke kahua pa'a?* Why not then buy land and get security? 3. vs. Offended, annoyed. *E hūnā 'oe i ke aloha, mai ha'i, o lohea 'ia auane'i, hewa kahi po'e* (song), conceal the love, don't tell, lest it be heard, and some people be offended. 4. vs. To the point of satiety; to be in great quantities; to do excessively. See ex., *wai* 1. *Hewa ka maka*, to look until one can see no more; to flirt with the eyes. *Hewa ka waha*, to speak too much or hastily. *E hea i ke kanaka e komo maloko e hānai ai a hewa ka waha*, call the person to come in and feed until his mouth can take no more [hospitality].
- hewa.hewa.** 1. nvs. A great many, very, vast, in great quantities. *He nui hewahewa nā mea nani o kēia home*, there are many, many beautiful things in this home. *'A'ole o kana mai i ka hewahewa o nā mea 'ai*, there were boundless quantities of food. 2. vs. Crazy, demented, wild, aimless; to fail to recognize (Ier. 29.26). Cf. *kala hewahewa*. *Kā hewahewa, he ua* (FS 37), hit wildly, it's raining [let the fight begin]. **ho'o.-hewa.hewa.** To fail to recognize. (PEP (*f,s*)*ewa*; cf. Blixen 1977; PCP (*f,s*)*ewa(f,s)ewa*.)
- hewahewa. ho'o.hewa.hewa.** Twill plaiting.
- hī.** 1. vt. To cast or troll, as for bonito, 'ahi, and *kala*. (PPN *sii*.) 2. nvt. Dysentery, diarrhea; to flow, hiss; to purge. *Ka hī koko* (Oih. 28.8), a bloody flux. **ho'o.hī.** Caus/sim.; to purge. (PPN *sii*.)
- hī.** A rare transitivizer. See *kilohi, ukuhi*, Gram. 6.6.4. (PPN *-fi*.)
- hia.** n. Desire, delight. Cf. *hiamoe*. *'A'ole i pau ko'u hia i ka nani o Hilo*, my delight in the beauties of Hilo is endless. *Ua mau ka hia o ka po'e o ka hale e noho*, it was still the desire of the people of the house to stay. (PPN *fia*.) **ho'o.hia.** Caus/sim. (For. 6:419.)
- hia.** 1. inter. How many? How much? (Follows 'a-, 'e-, or *pā*-.) (Gram. 10.3.) (PPN *fiha*.) 2. Pas/imp. (Gram. 6.6.3.) (PPN *-fia* [see *ilihia, kilohia*] and PPN *-sia* [see *'awa'awahia, hulihia*].)
- hi'a.** nvt. 1. To make fire with the fire-plow; the act of making fire thus. (PPN *sika*.) 2. Shuttle or needle for making nets; to knot or fasten the meshes of a net; to form a network; to bind, as house rafters (For. 5:651). (PPN *sika*.)
- hi'a.ā.** nvs. Indisposed to sleep, wakeful, sleepless; insomnia. *E hi'aā ana no kona aloha*, sleepless because of his being in love. **ho'o.hia.ā.** To cause sleeplessness. *He mea ho'ohiaā ke kope*, coffee causes sleeplessness.
- hi'a.ai.** vs. Pleased with, delighted with; delightful, pleasing. *Hia'ai ka mana'o ke honi aku i kou ala* (song), thought is delighted when inhaling your fragrance. **ho'o.hia.ai.** To delight, enchant, entrance.
- hi'a.ai.'ono.** nvs. Greatly pleased or delighted, most delightful; appetite for delicious food. (PPN *fia kai*.)
- hi'a.ala.** Same as the more common *hi'aā*. See ex., *hana aloha*.
- hi'a.hia.** 1. vs. Faded, gray, hazy. Cf. *ahia*, faded. 2. Var. of *hiehie*. **ho'o.hia.hia.** Caus/sim.
- hi'a.hi'a.** Redup. of *hi'a* 1, 2.
- hi'a kā 'upena.** n. Shuttle or needle for making a fish net, sometimes of bone.
- hīaku.** nv. To cast for bonito; bonito casting. *Pā hīaku*, mother-of-pearl lure for bonito. *'O ka hīaku ka lawai'a nui a 'Umi a-Līloa* (FS 173), casting for bonito was the principal means of fishing of 'Umi [son] of-Līloa. (PPN *sii 'atu*.)
- hiala.ai.** 1. Same as *hia'ai*. **ho'o.hiala.ai.** Caus/sim. *Ko'u nanea ho'ohiala'ai*, my delightful relaxation. 2. vt. To eat heartily.
- hia.lele.** vi. Restless, furtive. *Maka 'ā hialele* (Kep. 184), staring, furtive eyes.
- hi'ali.** 1. n. Food offering to the gods. 2. vt. To stir, as a fire; to signal with the hands. *Rare*.
- hia.loa.** vs. Well trained, skilled. *'O mākou nā 'ōlohe āiwaiwa hialoa ma ka lā*, we are the most wondrously skilled experts of the day.
- hi'a.loa.** n. 1. Bald temple. 2. Same as *'uhaloa*, a weed.
- hia.moe.** nvi. Sleep; to sleep, fall asleep, asleep. *Kona hiamoe 'ana*, his sleeping. *Holoholona hiamoe*, sloth. *Hiamoe i ka make*, to sleep in death, die. **ho'o.-hia.moe.** To put to sleep, lull to sleep, to pretend to sleep; soporific. *Lā'au ho'ohiamoe*, sleeping tablet or drug. (PPN *fiamohe*.)
- hia.moe iki.** nvi. A little sleep, nap; to take a nap.
- hia.moe loa.** nvi. To oversleep, sleep deeply; death, eternal sleep. Cf. *moe loa*.
- hia.moe pā'a loa.** nvi. Fast asleep; deep sleep. (Lunk. 4.21.)
- hiana.** n. Depression or hole, as under water. *Hiana ulua*, hole frequented by *ulua*.
- hi'ana.ki'u.** n. Stems by which tubers are attached to vines. (Kep. 99.) Cf. *'anaki'u*.
- hia.pa'i.ole.** n. Foremost, expert. *He āiwaiwa, a he hiapa'i'ole aku kēlā ma nā mea apau, he palena 'ole ka 'ike me ka ikaika*, a wonder, a foremost expert in all things, unlimited knowledge and strength.
- hiapo.** n. First-born child; first born, oldest. *E pepehi nō wau i nā hiapo apau* (Puk. 12.12), I will smite all the
