

- first-born. **ho'o.hiapo**. To have the privileges of a first-born; to act as a first-born; to treat as a first-born.
- hie**. nvs. Attractive, distinguished, dignified, noble, becoming. Cf. *māhie*. 'A'ohe hie o kēnā pāpale iā'oe, that hat is not becoming to you. *Pau ka hie*, no longer attractive. **ho'o.hie**. To make or cause to appear distinguished; distinguished, stately, regal; delightful.
- hie.hie**. Redup. of *hie*; superb. **ho'o.hie.hie**. To beautify, make distinctive, beautiful, elegant; distinguished in manner or appearance. 'O ke aloha . . . 'a'ole ho'i e ho'ohiehie (1 Kor. 13.4, 5), charity . . . does not act elegantly. *Ho'ohiehie launa 'ole*, showy, superlatively decorated, gaudy, gorgeous.
- hiena**. n. 1. Kind of soft porous stone used to smooth and polish utensils; it is harder than the 'ana stone, which is used on wood. 2. Hyena. *Eng*. 3. Speckled bird of prey. (Jer. 12.9.)
- hī.he'ē**. vi. Obliquely, indirectly, sideways. (For. 6:495.)
- hihi**. 1. nvi. To entangle, creep, spread, intertwine, intermingle; entanglement, web, snare. Cf. *pohihihi*. *Hihi ka lani*, intermarried, of chiefly families. *Lā'au hihi*, vine. **ho'o.hihi**. To cause entanglement; to entwine, entangle. (PPN *fihihi*.) 2. n. A large-meshed fish net.
- hihi**. **ho'o.hihi**. To take a fancy to, admire greatly, be enraptured with. *Ho'ohihi ka mana'o i ka nani o Kahana*, the mind is entranced with the beauty of Kahana.
- hī.hī**. Redup. of *hī* 2; to hiss. (PPN *sisi*.)
- hihia**. 1. nvs. Entangled, interwoven, involved, perplexed, hampered, rank, snarled, obscure and difficult to understand (Kep. 167); snarl, entanglement, kink, thicket, difficulty, problem, trouble. *Ka hihia pa'a o ka nahele*, the dense thicket of the forest. *Nui nā kumu hihia ma nā maka, lima, wāwae, kino (ma ka hula)*, there are many sources of difficulties [immoralities] from the eyes, hands, feet, body (in the hula). **ho'o.-hihia**. To get into difficulties, entangle, perplex, beset with trouble (Mat. 26.31), complicate. *Ka ho'ohihia 'ana o kēia kanaka iā kākou* (Puk. 10.7), this man is a snare to us. 2. n. Lawsuit or case before the court, trial. Cf. *hihia kalaima, hihia waiwai*. (PCP *fifia*.)
- hihia kalaima**. n. Criminal case.
- hihia.lou**. A plant with small yellow flowers. (And.)
- hihia.wai**. n. The swamp fern (*Ceratopteris thalictroides*), an edible, somewhat succulent fern, distributed through the tropics. It grows in mud or water, as around taro patches, in tufts about 30 cm high. The fronds are triangular and are finely divided into long, narrow parts. Young fronds are eaten with fresh-water shrimps. (Neal 12.) Also *palai kahawai*.
- hihia wai.wai**. n. Civil case.
- hihihi**. Redup. of *hihi* 1.
- hihi.hiki**. vi. To come or go, of many people. Cf. *hiki* 3, *hihiki*.
- hihi.hina**. Redup. and intensifier of *hina*, to fall.
- hihiki**. Redup. of *hiki*, to come, go. 'Akahi a hihiki ka makemake (chant), at last has come desire.
- hihi.kolo**. 1. Same as *kākalaioa* 2, 3, kinds of brambles. 2. n. Name of a legendary *koa* tree on Kaua'i that was said to have no trunk. 3. See *Ka-hili-kolo*.
- hihi manō**. n. Net made of strong cord used for shark fishing. (Malo 213.) Also *kāhala*.
- hī.hī.manu**. 1. n. Various sting rays (*Dasyatidae*) and eagle rays (*Actobatus narinari*). Also *lupe*. 2. nvs. Lavish, magnificent, elegant; elegance. *He nui ka hīhī-manu o kā lāua mau anaina ho'okipa i hā'awi ai*, they gave very lavish receptions. *Hīhīmanu noho'i nā hale kū'ai i nā mea kū'ai o nā mea like 'ole*, the stores are magnificent with all sorts of things for sale. 3. (Cap.) n. A Kaua'i peak. (FS 75.) See saying, *keha*.
- hihina**. 1. Redup. and plural of *hina*, to fall. **ho'o.-hihina**. To cause to fall; to sway to and fro. *E ho'ohihina noho'i ke kino i mua a i hope, i ka 'ākau a i ka hema*, the body sways forward and back, to the right and to the left. 2. n. Entanglement, spreading. Cf. *hihi*.
- hihio**. nvi. Soft whistling sound, gust or draft of wind; to whistle.
- hihi'o**. nvi. A dream or vision (Kin. 15.1), as while dozing; to dream while dozing; to whistle or sough, as wind.
- hihi.pe'a**. nvs. Jungle, tangled thicket; entangled. *Fig.*, bewilderment, grief.
- hihi pū.nā.wele, hihi pūnā.wele.wele**. n. Spider web, cobweb. *Maka hihi pūnāwelewele*, dim, lifeless eyes.
- hihiu**. vs. 1. Wild, untamed. **ho'o.hihiu**. To cause fear, frighten. 2. Rare, uncommon. *Hana hihiu*, unusual or rare work. *Maka hihiu*, a person of exceptional merit or lineage.
- hī.hī.wai**. n. 1. Endemic grainy snail (*Neritina granosa*), in both fresh and brackish water, eaten both cooked and raw. Also *wī*, if in fresh water. *He pō hīhīwai*, a night for *hīhīwai* [a lucky time]. (PPN *sisi*, PNP *sisiwai*: cf. Samoan *sisivai* in Pratt.) 2. A shellfish (*Nerita vespertina*). Also *hapawai*. See *hūai* 1. 3. A pelagic grapsid crab, probably *Grapsus tenuicrustatus*. 4. A tide in the high-tide zone.
- hi'i**. 1. vt. To hold or carry in the arms, as a child; to bear; to nurse or tend a child (Hawaiians did not carry children unrelated to them, and commoners did not touch a chief's child; carrying a child symbolized love, kinship, and affection). Cf. *Hi'iaka, hi'ialo, hi'ikua, hi'ilani, hi'ilei, hi'imo'opuna, hi'ipaka, hi'ipoi*. **ho'o.-hi'i**. Caus/sim. (PPN *siki*.) 2. Same as *kūpoki*, a plaiting process. 3. vs. Tall, as cliff or mountain. *Ku'u kai-kua'ana o ka pali hi'i*, my older brother of the tall cliff.
- hi'ia**. Pas/imp. of *hi'i* 1. *Ē nā keiki o . . . Hawai'i, hi'ia i ka hana mau 'ia e ka makani anu Ka-la'i-ākea* (chant), o children of Hawai'i, sustained by the constant action of the cool Ka-la'i-ākea wind.
- Hi'i.aka**. n. 1. First part of the names of the twelve younger sisters of the goddess Pele; the youngest and most famous was *Hi'iaka-i-ka-poli-o-Pele*. See PH. 2. (Not cap.) A rare variety of taro with bronze-red leaf and stem, used in medicine. 3. (Not cap.) A variety of sweet potato.
- hi'i.alo**. 1. vi. Carried in the arms, as a beloved child. *Ku'u lei i hi'ialo 'ia*, my beloved child carried in my arms. 2. loc. n. Nearby, in front. See ex., *hi'ikua*.
- hi'i.kala**. n. Hook used for *kala*, a fish, and baited with *kala*, a seaweed.
- hi'i.kua**. 1. vi. Carried on the shoulders, as a beloved child. 2. loc. n. In back, far. *Hele 'ia i hi'ikua i hi'ialo*, gone far and near. 3. (Cap.) n. Name of a star said to rise on the night of Hoaka and to vanish on the night of Muku in the month of Welehu.
- hi'i.lani**. nvt. To nurse or care for, as an infant; to admire, exalt, praise, extol in poetry; praise. *E halelū aku 'oukou iā Iēhova, ē kō nā 'āina apau, e hi'ilani aku iāia* (Hal. 117.1), oh sing psalms of praise to Jehovah, those of all nations, praise him.
- hi'i.lawo**. 1. vt. To lift, carry. 2. (Cap.) n. Name of the highest waterfall in Hawai'i, and one of the highest in the world, with a vertical drop of about 300 m, at Waipi'o Valley, Hawai'i. See Elbert and Mahoe, p. 49, for a famous song.
- hi'i.lei**. v. To carry, tend, and cherish a beloved child (*lei*).
- Hi'i-Lēi**. n. Name of a star that rises and vanishes at the same times as *Hi'ikua*.
- hi'i.mo'o.puna**. nv. To bear a grandchild in the arms; to be a grandparent (a term of pride and affection). *Ua hi'imo'opuna 'oia*, he has the joy of being a grandparent.
- hi'i.paka**. vt. To care for a child; to instruct a child.
- hi'i.poi**. vt. To tend, feed, cherish, as a child. *E hi'ipoi 'oe iā lākou ma kou umauma* (Nah. 11.12), carry them in your bosom.
- hi'i.poi.poi**. Redup. of *hi'ipoi*. *Mālama pono 'oe i ku'u aloha, hi'ipoi'poi 'ia ma kō alo* (love song), take good care of my love, cherishing always in your presence.
- Hik**. Abbreviation for *hikina*, east.
