 hoa launa. n. Neighbor, close associate or friend (2 Sam. 15.37).
 hoa lawe hana. n. Fellow laborer or worker, helper.
 hoa lawe pū. n. Sharer, partner. *Mau hoa lawe pū i kona hewa* (Hoik. 18.4), partakers of her sins.
 hō'ale'ale. See *'ale'ale*.
 ho'āli. See *-ali*.
 ho'ālia. See *alia*, to wait.
 ho'āli.ali. See *aliali*, clear.
 hō'ali'ali. See *'ali'ali*, scarred.
 hoa li'i. Same as *hoa ali'i*.
 ho'āli'i. See *ali'i*, chief.
 hoa like. n. Companion or contemporary of equal status.
 hō'alo. See *'alo*, to dodge.
 hoa loa'a. n. Fellow sharer, receiver, partaker.
 hoa loha, hoa aloha. n. Friend. *Lit.*, beloved companion. Cf. *aloha*. *Kona hoaloha*, his friend. ho'o-hoa loha. To make friends, be friendly, befriend.
 ho'āloha.loha. See *alohalo*.
 hō'alu. See *'alu*, depression.
 hō'alu'alu. See *'alu'alu*, loose.
 hoa luhi. n. Fellow worker, especially one helping to rear a child. Cf. *luhi*.
 hoa lumi. n. Roommate.
 hō'ama. See *-'ama*.
 hoa maka'āi.nana. n. Fellow citizen.
 ho'āmana. See *-'amana*.
 hoa moe. n. Sleeping companion, bedfellow.
 hoana. 1. nvt. Hone, whetstone, grindstone; to rub, grind. (PCP (*f,s*)*joana*.) 2. vt. To brandish, as a whip; to threaten. *Hoana e hō'eha*, assault and battery. 3. n. Joining, joint, binding. See *hoa* 2. 4. See *puhi hoana*. 5. Same as *kōkala*, porcupine fish.
 ho'āna. See *ana*, to measure.
 ho'ana'ē. See *ana'ē*.
 hoana ka'a. n. Grindstone, rolling grindstone.
 ho'āni. See *ani*, to beckon.
 ho'āno. See *ano*, awe.
 hō'ano. See *'ano*, somewhat.
 hoa noho. n. Neighbor, one who lives with or near another.
 ho'ānu. See *anu*, cool.
 ho'ānu'u.nu'u. See *'anu'unu'u*.
 ho'āo. n. Marriage. See *ao* 1, light.
 ho'ā'o. vt. To try, taste. See *a'o*, instruction.
 hoa 'ō.lolo. n. Companion with whom one converses or consults.
 hoa pa'a.hana. n. Fellow worker.
 hoa pā'ani. n. Playmate.
 hoa paio. Opponent, antagonist, adversary, enemy, rival.
 hoa pā.oni.oni. n. Enemy, contestant, rival.
 hō'ā.pī. See *-āpī*.
 hoa pili. n. Close, intimate, or personal friend.
 ho'ā.pipi. See *'āpipi*.
 ho'ā.pono. vt. To approve. See *'āpono*. Cf. *hoa pono*, true friend.
 ho'āu. See *au* 11, to set; and *-au*.
 hō'au. See *'au*, to swim.
 hō'auana, ho'o'auwana. See *'auana*, to wander.
 hō'au'au. See *'au'au*, to bathe.
 hō'au.he'e. See *'auhe'e*.
 ho'āu.huli. See *auhuli*.
 hō'au.li'i. See *'auli'i*, dainty.
 hoa una. n. One accompanying a messenger.
 ho'ā.una. vi. To flock, collect. See *'āuna*.
 hō'au.waha. See *'auwaha*, ditch.
 hō'awa. 1. n. All Hawaiian species of the genus *Pittosporum*, trees and shrubs with narrow leaves clustered

at branch ends, and thick-valved fruits containing many seeds surrounded by a sticky substance (Neal 382-4); considered poisonous (Kam. 64:124, 140). Cf. *'a'awa hua kukui*. Also *hā'awa*. 2. See *'awa*, bitter.
 hoa wa'a. n. 1. Canoe companion, mate. 2. Canoe rigging, tackle.
 hō'awa lau nui. n. A kind of *hō'awa* (*Pittosporum kauaiense*), a tree to 12 m high, found only on Kaua'i, with large leaves to 25 by 8 cm, more or less downy beneath, and with quadrangular fruits 1.3 cm in diameter.
 ho'ā.wāwa. See *awāwa*, valley.
 hō'awe. vt. To carry. See *'awe*, pack, burden.
 hoe. 1. nvt. Paddle, oar; to paddle, row. *Fig.*, to travel, get to work, continue working. *Kāna hoe* (FS 21), his paddle. *Hoe aku i ka wa'a*, paddle ahead the canoe [do your share; continue; keep going]. ho'o.hoe. Caus/sim.; to have a canoe paddled. (PPN *fohe*.) 2. vi. To draw in the breath and expel it with a whistling sound, as when tired. 3. n. A bird reported by Kepelino as being the size of the 'ō'ō and black and gray.
 hoēa. Pas/imp. of *hoe* 1; let's get started, go ahead.
 hō'ea. vi. To arrive. *Pōmaika'i e hō'ea mai ana*, blessings to come.
 hoe-a-Mā.ui. n. Probably same as *'ekaha 'ula* fern, but according to some it is *Elaphoglossum pellucidum*, a smaller *Elaphoglossum* than the *'ekaha 'ula*. *Lit.*, Māui's paddle.
 hō'eha. vt. To hurt. See *'eha*.
 hoē.hā'a. Same as *'oeha'a*. *Fig.*, unreliable, unstable. *Hoēha'a noho'i ua O'ahu maka 'ewa'ewa*, unreliable are the O'ahu people who avert the eyes.
 hō'eha.pu'u.wai. n. A West African vine, the bleeding heart (*Clerodendrum thomsonae*), with red and white flowers, grown for ornament. (Neal 730-1.) *Lit.*, heart aching.
 ho'ē.heu. See *'ēheu*, wing.
 hoe.hoe. 1. Redup. of *hoe* 1; paddling back and forth. (PNP *foefoe*.) 2. Redup. of *hoe* 2; a plaintive prolonged sound, as of the nose flute. Cf. *hoene* 1. 3. n. Shoulder blade (used after *iwi*). 4. See *lipi hoehoe*.
 hoe.hoēna. Same as *hoe* 2.
 hoe.hoēne. 1. Redup. of *hoene* 1. *Kai hoehoene i nā pali* (chant), sea singing softly to the cliffs. 2. To pierce the ear lobes with acid. (And.) 3. Poor, destitute, sick. (And.)
 hoe.hoe.pā.kea. n. A name for a Ni'ihau *pāwehe* design in plaiting.
 ho'ēhu. vt. To drive, stir. See *-ehu*.
 hō'eka. vt. To soil. See *'eka*.
 hoe kala. n. A paddle with a blade narrower than the *hoe nanue*. *Lit.*, pointed paddle.
 hō'ēke.ke'i. vt. To shorten. See *'ekeke'i*.
 hō'ele'ele. vt. To blacken. See *'ele'ele*.
 hō'eleu. vt. To animate. See *'eleu*.
 hoēlo. vt. To stir, poke, as a fire. (PH 42.)
 ho'ēmi. vt. To reduce, diminish, cheapen. See *emi* 1, 2.
 hoēna. n. Paddling. *Aia nō i kāu hoēna*, it's up to you to paddle [to decide, start].
 hoe nanue. Same as *hoe nenuē*.
 hoēne. 1. nvi. A soft sweet sound, as of song; to sound softly, rustle, sigh, as the wind. 2. Var. of *'owā* 5. *Mākahi hoēne*, a net mesh somewhat larger than the width of a finger. 3. nvt. To use a douche or enema; enema, medicine, injection, abortion. *Nā hoēne wai 'akika ho'omake 'ano'ano pūponika*, acid solution for killing bubonic germs.
 hoe nenuē. n. A type of paddle named for *nenuē* fish, with broad and round blade.
 hō'ēpa. vt. To deceive. See *'ēpa*.
 hō'eu. 1. vt. To stir up. See *'eu*. 2. n. A bird name (no data).
