

In causative/simulative forms beginning with ho-, hō, ho'-, or hō', delete the prefix and look for the stem.

- hoe uli.** n. Steering paddle or oar, rudder, helm. *He hoe uli*, just a steering paddle [a wagging tongue].
- hō. 'ēwa.** See 'ēwa, crooked.
- hoe wa'a.** nv. Oarsman, paddler; to paddle a canoe. 'Elua nō āna mau hoe wa'a, he has only two paddlers.
- hohani.** Same as hani 1. *Hohani me ka 'ō'ō i ka pu'e*, soften the hill with the digging stick.
- hō.hē, ho'o.hē.** nvs. Cowardly; coward, cowardice. (FS 81.) *He kaua kamali'i, he hōhē wale*, a battle of children, just cowards [quarrels of children are not worth worrying about].
- hohiu.** n. A native fern (*Dryopteris glabra*) with rather finely divided fronds.
- hohō.** vi. To snore, snort, bray, heehaw, splash, gurgle, breathe hard, draw in mucus. **ho'o.hohō.** Caus/sim.; to cause a snort.
- hohoa.** Same as *hoahoa*, tapa beater, washing stick.
- hoho.ho'i.** Redup. and plural of *ho'i* 1, to leave.
- hoho'i.** Redup. of *ho'i* 1, to leave; to return often.
- hohoi.ēa.** vs. Wheezy. Cf. For. 4:169.
- hohoka.** Redup. of *hoka* 1, 2. **ho'o.hohoka.** Caus/sim.
- hohola.** vi. To spread out, unfold, unfurl, as tapa, mats, clouds, wings; to extend, stretch, diffuse. Cf. *hola, ma'ihohola, pāhola.* (PPN *fofola.*)
- hohole.** Redup. of *hole* 1, 2. (PCP *sosole.*)
- hoholo.** Redup. of *holo*, to run, sail. **ho'o.hoholo.** Caus/sim. *Ho'ohoholo 'ia akula ka hūpē i loko*, snuffle up mucus.
- hoholu.** Redup. of *holu* 1. *Hoholu ka 'āhihi i ka makani* (chant), the 'āhihi shrub sways in the wind.
- hohoma.** Redup. of *homa*.
- hohono.** nvi. Acrid odor, unpleasant body odor of perspiration; to smell thus. Cf. *honohono* 5; *pepeiao hohono*. **ho'o.hohono.** To cause or produce such an odor. (PPN *sosongo.*)
- hohonu.** nvs. Deep, profound; depth, soundings. *He kanaka hohonu o ka 'ike*, a man with profound knowledge. **ho'o.hohonu.** To deepen. (Probably PPN *fonu*, full, as of liquid; PCP *fofonu*, deep.)
- hohopa.** vs. Tall, thin. *Rare.*
- hoi.** 1. n. Bitter yam (*Dioscorea bulbifera*, synonym *D. sativa*), a vine with cylindrical stem, heart-shaped leaves, small tuberous root, round aerial tubers. The tubers, used only in times of famine, need long washing to make them fit to eat. (HP 167, Neal 230.) Called *pi'oi* on Kaua'i. *Ua ua paha, ke ulu nei ka hoi*, perhaps it's been raining, the *hoi* is growing [said when someone looks happy, a play on *hoi* 1 and *hoi* 2]. See *Kalulu-hoi*. (PPN *soi.*) 2. Same as *hoihoi*. *Kū 'ole i ka hoi*, not suiting; displeasing.
- ho'i.** 1. vi. To leave, go or come back; to cause to come back. Cf. *ho'i hou*. *Ho'i loa*, to go or come permanently. *E ho'i ana au*, I'm leaving. *O ho'i*, go then. *E ho'i mai*, come back. 'A'ole e ho'i kō wahine ia mau hana (FS 273), these things won't cause your wife to return. (PPN *foki.*) 2. vi. To enter, as an institution or last resting place. *Ua ho'i i ke kula*, has entered school. 3. n. A parting chant to which hula dancers dance as they leave the audience. 4. nvt. Marriage of a chief with the daughter of a brother or sister; to do so (a means of increasing the rank of the offspring). (Malo 55.) 5. Part. intensifying preceding base. See *kāho'i, noho'i*, Gram. 7.5. 'Elua ho'i, just two; two indeed. 'A'ole ho'i au i lohe, I certainly did not hear. (PPN *foki.*) 6. part. Also, too, besides. (Gram. 7.5.) 'A'ole ho'i, neither. (PPN *foki.*) 7. Part. expressing doubt, uncertainty. (Gram. 7.5.) *Pehea ho'i*, how indeed, I don't know. *He mea aha ho'i!* What indeed for!
- hoi'a.** n. Ni'ihau name of a sea tern.
- ho'ia.** Pas/imp. of *ho'i*, to leave.
- ho'i.hā.** Intensive of *ho'i* 5 (often written as two words). (Gram. 7.5.) *E hele ho'ihā kāua*, well, let's go then.
- Maika'i ho'ihā*, very good indeed. *I Hawai'i ho'ihā me Pele e noho ai* (FS 239), then stay at Hawai'i with Pele.
- hō.'ihi.** See 'ihi, sacred.
- ho'īho.** See *īho*, to go down, and *-īho*.
- hoi.hoi.** nvi. Pleased, interesting, entertaining, happy, joyful, amused; pleasure, happiness, joy, delight, enjoyment, interest, cheerfulness (Rom. 12.8). *Hoihoi 'ole*, unpleasant, unenthusiastic, unhappy, uninterested, dispirited, dull, boring, to dislike. *Mea e hoihoi ai*, treat, pleasure. **ho'o.hoi.hoi.** To entertain, amuse, charm, delight, encourage, please.
- ho'i.ho'i.** vt. To return, send back, restore. Cf. *ho'i* 1. *E ho'īho'i aku 'oe i ka lio iā Kale*, take the horse back to Charles. *Pelā anei 'oukou e ho'īho'i aku ai iā Iēhowa?* (Kanl. 32.6) Do you thus requite Jehovah? (PNP *foki-foki.*)
- ho'i.ho'i ēa.** nv. Restoration, as of sovereignty; to restore sovereignty. *Lā Ho'īho'i Ea*, Restoration Day.
- ho'i hope.** vi. To go back, return, retreat, revert, backslide, deteriorate morally. (In Jer. 3.22 *ho'i hope* seems to be the translation of "faithless" and "faithlessness" and in Jer. 6.28 the translation of "revolter.") *Po'e lāla ho'i hope*, backsliding members [of a church].
- ho'i hou.** 1. vi. To go or come back, return. 2. n. Repeat sign in music.
- hō.'īT.** See 'īT, tight.
- hō.'T.T.** See 'T.T, sour.
- hō.'ikaika.** See *ikaika*, strong.
- ho'i.kau.** part. Very, great (often written as two words). *He u'i ho'i kau*, very beautiful indeed. (Gram. 7.5.)
- Ho'i-ka-u'i-o-Mā-noa-ua-ahi.ahi.** See *E-ho'i-ka-u'i-o-Mānoa-ua-ahiahi*.
- hō.'ike.** v. To show, exhibit. For the many important meanings see 'ike.
- Hō.'ike 'Ana.** n. Revelation (Biblical). See 'ike.
- hō.'ike honua.** n. Geography.
- hō.'ike.'ike.** n. Display. See 'ike'ike for the many meanings.
- hoi kua.hiwi.** n. A native vine (*Smilax sandwicensis*), growing wild in the mountains; the leaves are heart-shaped, shiny, with longitudinal veins, much like the *hoi* but bearing tendrils; the roots are tuberous and not palatable. (Neal 211.) Also *aka'awa*.
- hō.'ike manawa.** n. Chronology.
- ho.T.lewa.** n. Pain of hunger. *Rare.* Cf. *houpo lewalewa*.
- ho'īli.** See *ili* 1, 2.
- hō.'ili.** See -'ili.
- hō.'ili.hune.** See 'ilihune, poor.
- hō.'ili.'ili.** vt. To collect. See 'ili'ili 2.
- ho.T.lina.** n. Heir. See *ilina*.
- ho'īlo.** 1. v. Var. spelling of *ho'oilo*. See *ilo* 2 and *-ilo*. *Ka hale ho'īlo* (Jer. 36.22), the winter house. 2. n. Land term of unknown meaning used in the 1840s, perhaps a winter-time plot.
- ho'i loa.** vi. To go or come with no thought of returning; to go permanently.
- ho.T.loli.** See 'loli 1.
- hō.'imi.** See 'imi, to look for.
- hō.'imo.** See 'imo, to wink.
- ho'ina.** n. 1. Returning, coming back; return. 2. Farewell gift, as to a parting guest after a feast.
- hō.'inaina.** See *inaina* 1, wrath, and *inaina* 2.
- hō.'inā.'inau.** See 'inā'inau.
- ho.T.nana.** See 'nana.
- hō.'ino.** See 'ino 1-4.
- ho'īnu.** See *inu*, to drink.
- hō.'io.** Same as 'ua'u kani. *Rare.*
- hō.'i'o.** 1. n. A large native fern (*Diplazium [Athyrum] arnottii*) with subdivided fronds. The young fronds are eaten raw, much liked with raw fresh-water shrimps or with salted salmon. Only Orientals cook this fern. It was formerly sold in the market. It will not grow at low
