

- altitudes (HP 214, Neal 25.) Cf. *pohole*, the Maui name. 2. See 'i'o 1.
- hō.'i'o kula.** n. A native fern (*Dryopteris stegnogrammoides* syn. *Stegnogramma sandwicensis*), resembling the *kikawaiō*, having large pinnate fronds, but the tip tapering to a point instead of forming a separate lobe. Young fronds are eaten raw, like those of the *hō'i'o*.
- hoka.** 1. nvi. Disappointed, thwarted, baffled; disappointment, frustration (Hal. 9.18). *Ā hoka!* Serves you right! Good for you [insulting]! **hō'o.hoka.** To cause disappointment, chagrin; to frustrate, thwart, put to shame (Hal. 44.7). 2. vt. To squeeze, strain, as kava or liquids through fibers. *Hoka ana lākou i ke ahu 'awa* (Ii 150-1), they were straining kava dregs [they were disappointed, a pun on *hoka* 1]. (PPN *fota*.)
- hō.kā.** Same as *hō'okā*. See *kā* 1. *Ua 'ane hōkā ke anu i ka malama o Kā'elo* (Kep. 89), the cold really strikes during the month of Kā'elo.
- hō.kā'a.** nvs. Dizzy; a dull ache, as in head or stomach.
- hoka 'awa.** nv. To strain kava; a kava strainer.
- hō.kā'ē.** vt. To smudge, smear, blot.
- hō.kā'ē.kā'ē.** Redup. of *hōkā'ē*.
- hoka.hoka.** Redup. of *hoka* 1, 2. **hō'o.hoka.hoka.** Caus/sim.
- hoka.hokai.** 1. Redup. of *hōkai*. 2. vt. To mix, as ingredients. *Kuha ihola ia ma ka lepo, ā hokahokai ihola i ke kuha ma ka lepo* (Ioane 9.6), he spat on the ground and made clay of the spittle.
- hō.kai.** nvt. To confuse, disturb, meddle, mix up, spoil, interfere; to blunder along; nuisance, bother, confusion, disorder. *Hōkai ua lawai'a o ke kai pāpa'u, he po'opa'a ka i'a e ho'i ai*, a fisherman who blunders about in shallow water, takes home *po'opa'a* fish [easy to catch but not desirable]. **hō'o.hō.kai.** To cause confusion, mix up, bother; to blot out the memory.
- hō.kake.** vt. To interfere, disturb, as would a child; to annoy. See *kake* 1.
- hō.kake.kake.** Redup. of *hōkake*; to roil, as mud.
- hō.kale.** 1. Same as *kakale*, watery. 2. n. Mastoid infection.
- hō.kana, hosana.** interj. Hosanna. (Gr. *hōsanna*.)
- hō.kele, hotele.** n. Hotel. Eng.
- hō.kelo.** Same as *hōkeo* 1. *Hōkelo ua*, container for catching rain.
- Hokene.koka, Hotenetota.** nvs. Hottentot. Eng.
- hō.keo.** 1. n. Long gourd calabash, as used to hold food, clothing, fishing gear; any cooking pot. *Fig.*, an empty container, a trifle. Cf. *hōkeo kani*. *He wahi hōkeo wale nō*, just an empty container [to have or know nothing]. (PCP (*f,s*)*ooteo*: cf. Maori *hooteo*.) 2. vt. To cherish secretly, as love. *E hōkeo iho i ke aloha* (song), cherish the love. 3. n. A variety of sweet potato.
- hō.keo kani.** n. Wind instrument, as in a band.
- hōki.** 1. n. Mule, ass (Nah. 16.15). (Eng. horse.) 2. vs. Barren, of a woman. *Modern*.
- hō.kī.** Same as *hō'okī*. See *kī* 3.
- hō.kī'i.** nvs. Thin, wasted; tuberculosis, wasting sickness; consumption (Oihk. 26.16). Cf. Isa. 10.18.
- hō.kī.kī.** Probable redup. of *hōkī*. (PH 121.)
- hō.kilo.** Same as *hōkī'i*.
- hō.kio.** n. Small gourd whistle; flute [RSV], pipe [KJV] (1 Sam. 10.5); to whistle.
- hō.kio.kio.** n. Gourd whistle; flute [RSV], pipe [KJV] (Isa. 5.12); to whistle.
- hō.kio pū.ēo.ēo.** nvi. To whistle with hands cupped over the mouth; such a whistle. (*Pūēoēo* is said to be the sound of the whistle.)
- hoko.** 1. vs. Fat, fleshy, as thighs, buttocks, or calf. *Rare*. 2. vt. To strike, threaten. *Rare*. (PCP (*f,s*)*oto*: cf. Maori *hoto*.)
- hoko.hoko.** Redup. of *hoko* 1, 2.
- Hoku.** n. Night of the full moon. When this moon set before daylight it was called *Hoku Palemo*, Hoku that slips away. When it set after daylight it was called *Hoku Ili*, grounded Hoku. (Malo 32.) Cf. *hōkū*, star. *Ka mahina o Hoku*, the full moon of the night Hoku. (PEP (*F,S*)*otou*.)
- hoku. Hō'o.hoku-i-ka-lani.** n. Name of the daughter of Wākea and Papa. *Hoku* may be compared to Tahitian *hotu*, to produce fruit and Tongan *fotu*, to appear. (PPN *fotu*.)
- hō.kū.** n. Star. (PPN *fetu'u*.)
- hokua.** 1. n. Nape of the neck, shoulder (Puk. 12.34); main stem of a vine (Kep. 157). *He kanaka hokua kano*, a person with hard, strong shoulders. *He nalu ha'aeo i ka hokua o ke kanaka*, the proud surf at the nape of a man's neck [a wind from the back, and a pun on *hokua* 2]. 2. n. Tip of high waves, crest. See ex., *hamohamo*. 3. vt. To lift up. (Kel. 152.)
- hō.kū 'ae'a.** n. Planet. *Lit.*, wandering star.
- hō.kū 'ai 'āina.** n. Probably same as *alanui-o-nā-hōkū-ho'okele*. *Lit.*, stars ruling land.
- hō.kū ala.** Same as *hōkū 'ae'a*. *Lit.*, rising star.
- Hō.kū-ali'i.** Same as *Hōkū-loa*. Called *Hōkū-ali'iwahine* in Kep. 83.
- Hō.kū-ao.** n. Morning Star, Venus when seen in the morning. Also *Hōkū-loa*, *Hōkū-ali'i*.
- hō.kū hēle.** Same as *hōkū 'ae'a*. *Lit.*, traveling star.
- hō.kū-hēle.lē'i.** n. A design on Ni'ihau mats. *Lit.*, falling star.
- Hō.kū-hō'o.kele-wa'a.** n. The star Sirius. *Lit.*, canoe-guiding star.
- Hoku Ili.** See *Hoku*.
- Hō.kū-iwa.** n. A Hawaiian constellation, perhaps Boötes. *Lit.*, frigate-bird star.
- hō.kū kai.** n. Starfish. Cf. more common *pe'a*.
- Hō.kū-kau-ahiahi.** n. Evening Star.
- Hō.kū-kau-'ō.pae.** n. Evening Star or Sirius. Also *Hōkū-'ōpae*.
- Hō.kū-ke'a.** n. Southern Cross. *Lit.*, cross star.
- Hō.kū-komo.hana.** n. Morning Star. (Kep. 83.) *Lit.*, western star.
- hō.kū.kū.** nvi. Discomfort preceding bowel discharge; to suffer this. *Fig.*, angry, agitated.
- Hō.kū-lē'a.** n. A navigational star, probably Arcturus; a zenith star above Hawai'i. (Kep. 83.) *Lit.*, clear (or happy) star. Also *Le'a*.
- Hō.kū-lēi.** n. An unidentified star.
- hō.kū lele.** n. Shooting star, meteor, any moving star.
- hō.kū lewa.** n. Moving star, planet.
- hō.kū li'ilii'i.** n. Small star, asteroid.
- Hō.kū-loa.** Same as *Hōkū-ao*. (Kep. 83.)
- Hō.kū-noho-aupuni.** n. A name for the Milky Way. (Kep. 83.) *Lit.*, ruling star.
- Hō.kū-'ō.pae.** Same as *Hōkū-kau-'ōpae*. (GP 34.)
- Hō.kū-pā.** n. Name of a constellation, perhaps Leo or the head of Cetus. *Lit.*, fence star.
- Hō.kū-pa'a.** n. North Star. *Lit.*, immovable star.
- Hoku Palemo.** See *Hoku*.
- Hō.kū-pō.kano.** n. Name of a star. *Lit.*, very dark star.
- hō.kū puhī.paka.** n. Comet. *Lit.*, tobacco-smoking star. *Modern*.
- hō.kū ukali.** Satellite star. *Lit.*, accompanying star.
- Hō.kū-'ula.** n. A star, perhaps Mars, but see *Auhaele*. *Lit.*, red star.
- hō.kū welo.welo.** n. Shooting star, comet. *Lit.*, streaming star.
- hola.** 1. Same as *hohola*, to spread. Cf. *kauhola*, *mahola*, *pāhola*. (PPN *fola*.) 2. Same as *'auhuhu*; to drug fish with this poison. *'Upena hola*, net used with this poison. *Hele nō i ka hola i'a i ka lā*, go to poison fish in the daytime [more efficient to work by day]. *Ni'ihau*. 3. n. Groin (rare, in chants, Kam. 64:124). 4. n. Hour, time, o'clock. Eng. *Hola 'ehia kēia?* What time is it?
- hola.hia.** Pas/imp. of *hola* 1. *He kapa kea i holahia lā i ke kai* (chant), a white tapa spread over the sea. (PPN *folasia*.)
- hola.hola.** Redup. of *hola* 1, 2. See *papa holahola kānā-wai la'a*. (PPN *folafola*.)
- holā.holā.** vi. To blossom, as a flower or adolescent growing into maturity. *Ka'ū. Holāholā wale 'ia a'e nō ā pau ka pupuka*, just having blossomed with an end to ugliness.
- holana.** Same as *hola* 1.
