

- holo.holona.** n. 1. Animal, beast, insect. 2. A trip, excursion, ride. *Rare.* Cf. *ipu holoholona*.
- holo.holona 'ai 'i'o.** n. Carnivorous animal.
- holo.holona 'ai weu.weu.** n. Herbivorous animal.
- holo.holona hia.moe.** n. Sloth, sleeping animal.
- holo.holona lele.** n. Insect, flying creature.
- holo.holo.'ō.lelo.** nv. To gossip, slander, bear tales, tattle; tattler, talebearer, spreader of gossip. (Oihk. 19.16.) **ho'o.holo.holo.'ō.lelo.** Caus/sim.
- Holo.holo-pī.na'au.** n. Name of a star, perhaps Mars.
- holo hō.lua.** n. Course for *hōlua*, sledding.
- holo.hu'a.** vi. To glance off, fly off obliquely, miss, fail to hit the mark. *Lit.*, run edge.
- holoi.** nvt. To wash, clean, scour, scrub, rub, erase, wipe (Biblical); washing, erasure. (2 Nal. 21.13.) *Mea holoi*, washing, laundry, eraser. *Holoi ā nalo*, erase completely, blot out. **ho'o.holoi.** To have washed, cleaned; to pretend to wash. (PPN *solo'i*.)
- Holo-i-Kahiki.** n. Name of a legendary star (Kep. 77) that guided Hawai'i-nui on his return to Kahiki-honua-kele after discovering Hawai'i.
- holoi lau.oho.** n. Shampoo.
- holo i mua, holoi.mua.** nvi. To progress, advance, surpass, go ahead; progress, advancement; successful. Also *holomua*. **ho'o.holo i mua.** To promote, cause progress; advancement, success.
- holo 'ino.** vi. To speed recklessly.
- holo ka'a.** v. To ride in a car or carriage. (Hal. 45.4.) **ho'o.holo ka'a.** To drive a car or carriage. *Rare.*
- holo.kahiki.** nv. Sailor; to sail to foreign lands. *Kauwō ulupau ka holokahiki*, the sailor drags anchor everywhere.
- holo.kai.** nvt. Seaman, seafarer; to sail on the sea; sea voyage or cruise. *Nā holokai* (Ezek. 26.17), seafaring men.
- holo.kake.** vs. Not secure, loose, not tight.
- holo.kē.** vi. To run here and there; helter-skelter.
- hō.loke.loke.** Same as *hālokeloke*, loose.
- holo.kia.** vi. To dart, as a bird.
- holo.kikī.** vi. To run or sail swiftly; headlong. Cf. *kikī holo*.
- holo.kū.** 1. n. A loose, seamed dress with a yoke and usually with a train, patterned after the Mother Hubbards of the missionaries. Cf. the *mu'umu'u*, which formerly was not yoked and has no train or seam. Both garments are frequently made of gaily patterned material. 2. n. Cloak (Isa. 59.17), mantle (Hal. 109.29). 3. vs. Evenly plump, stout and symmetrical. Cf. *kolopū, pahupū*.
- holo.kū kua poe.poe.** n. A round-yoked *holokū*.
- holo.kuku.** n. Upper edge of an 'ōpelu fish net.
- holo kū.kū.** vi. To trot, as a horse; to jounce.
- holo.lani.** n. Mission. *Ho'opau akula 'oia i kona hololani 'ana*, he finished his mission.
- holo le'a.** vi. To succeed, fare well; successful. *Holo le'a 'ole*, unsuccessful.
- holo.lōka.** v. To correspond.
- holo lio.** nv. To ride horseback; horseman, rider (Isa. 36.8). *Ka wahine holo lio*, the woman rider. **ho'o.holo lio.** Same as above; horseman (Puk. 14.9); to make a horse run.
- holo lua.** vi. To run, sail, move in two ways. *Fig.*, hypocrite; deceitful.
- holo.makani.** vs. Breezy, airy. *Lit.*, wind running.
- holo mana'o.** v. To decide, determine. See *holo* 2. **ho'o.holo mana'o.** Caus/sim. *Ka po'e i ho'oholo mana'o* (Isa. 30.1), those who took counsel.
- holo.moana.** Same as *holokai*.
- holo.moku.** 1. n. Sailor, passenger, anyone who sails; to sail, take a sail or ocean trip. **ho'o.holo.moku.** To sail. 2. nvi. Rush or torrent, as of water; to rush, break forth, overflow. *Fig.*, overwhelming. *Holomoku ke koho 'ia 'ana o ka mō'i*, the king was elected by an overwhelming majority. *Ua holomoku a'ela ka heluna nui o kō Honolulu mau kini no kekahi hale kū'ai*, most of the Honolulu populace rushed to a certain store.
- holo.mokuna.** Same as *holomoku* 2.
- holo.mū.** n. A long fitted dress, a combination of *holokū* and *mu'umu'u*, a name probably coined after World War II.
- holo.mua.** Same as *holo i mua*; improvement, progress.
- holona.** n. 1. A running, sailing, traveling; performance. *Ka holona a ku'u lio*, the running of my horse. 2. A double bar to show the end of a piece of music.
- hō.lona.** nvs. Unskilled, far from expert; novice, amateur, beginner. (For. 4:293.)
- hō.lono.** Rare var. of *ho'olono*, to hear.
- holo.'oko'a.** nvs. Whole, entire, complete, total, all, absolute, altogether; entirely; paramount, supreme; entity. *He ali'i holo'oko'a*, a chief over all.
- holo.'ō.lelo.** Same as *holoholo'ōlelo*. **ho'o.holo.'ō.lelo.** Caus/sim.
- holo.pahē'e.** vi. To skate, skid.
- holo.pani.** n. A pain that nearly shuts off (*pani*) the breath.
- holo.papa.** 1. n. Shelf, ledge, rack, frame on which tapa and other articles were laid; flooring. *Kau holopapa*, to place on the rack; one of chiefly blood (even though he did not know his genealogy), so called because he was entitled to place his belongings on a separate rack so that they might not be defiled by the possessions of others (Malo 56). 2. vi. To spread, overrun, prevail, overcome, control, defeat; everywhere, completely. *Holopapa ka hana*, work done successfully. *He niuhi 'ai holopapa o ka moku*, the *niuhi* shark that devours all the island [a powerful warrior].
- holopau. ho'o.holo.pau.** To finish, complete. *'A'ole i ho'oholopau 'ia*, not finished; incomplete.
- holo pā.'ū.** nv. To ride horseback while wearing the sarong known as *pā'ū*; a *pā'ū* rider.
- holo.pēki.** vi. To trot. *Lit.*, pace (*Eng.*) run.
- holo.pono.** nvi. To pass off successfully, succeed, accomplish; successful; success. *Ua holo pono ka'ua huaka'i*, my mission was successful.
- Holo.po'o.po'o.** n. Wind famous at Wai-pi'o, Hawai'i. *Lit.*, running in the hollows.
- holo.puni.** nvi. To sail or travel around, circumnavigate; everywhere. *Alanui holo puni*, belt road. *He pilikia holo puni kēia*, this is a trouble that goes everywhere.
- holo.pupule.** nvi. Reckless, mad running; to tear madly, as a frightened horse; to speed recklessly, as an auto.
- holo.uka.** n. Draft, air current, as in the mountains. *Rare.*
- holo.wā.** 1. Same as *holokē*. *Rare.* 2. n. Thrust through a cleft. *Rare.* 3. n. War engine. *Rare.*
- holo.wa'a, holo.a'a.** n. 1. Trough, especially vessel in which kava was mixed; oblong box, coffin, chest, cradle; furrow, as for planting sugar cane. *Holowa'a waiho aniani*, handmade mirror fitted into a wooden frame, as of *wiliwili* wood. *Kau i ka lani ka holowa'a ua o Hilo*, placed in the heavens is the rain trough of Hilo [admiration for one of regal bearing]. 2. Sheath covering coconut flowers. Also *lolo*. 3. Shuttle into which the bobbin of a sewing machine is slipped after it is filled with thread. 4. A kind of fish net.
- holo.wa'a lepo.** n. Form or mold, as for making adobe bricks.
- holo.wa'a 'ō.wili.** n. Powder horn.
- holo.wai.** nvi. Water ditch or course; to run in such courses; watery. *Ua holowai nā kahawai*, the streams run swiftly.
- holo.wī.** vs. Long, thin. *Rare.* Cf. *'aha* 5.
- holu.** 1. vi. Springy, pliable, resilient, as a mattress; to sway, as palm fronds; to ripple, as waves; to play back and forth; bumpy, as an airplane ride. Cf. *hoholu, holu nape, nolū*. *Ke one holu*, the sand carried back and forth [by the sea]. *Ua holu mai ke kai i kō lāua mau kino*, the sea lapped upon their bodies. **ho'o.-holu.** Caus/sim.; to bend, move up and down, sway. (PPN *soru*.) 2. (*Cap.*) n. Name of a star. 3. (*Cap.*) n. Name of a fish god. 4. See *ko'i holu*.
- hō.lū.** vs. Soft; to soften. *Pāpa'i hōlū*, soft-shelled crab.
