

- holua**. 1. Pas/imp. of *holu* 1. 2. n. Prayer for *luakini* dedication. (For. 6:27.)
- hōlua**. n. Sled, especially the ancient sled used on grassy slopes; the sled course. *Papa hōlua*, sled. *He'e hōlua*, to ride a *hōlua* sled; the *hōlua* course; *fig.*, an expression of pride in descent from certain chiefly families at Wai-pi'o, Hawai'i, who were famous for their skill with the *hōlua* sled.
- hōlua kī**. nv. Sliding downhill on ti leaves; to do so (a children's sport).
- holu.holu**. Redup. of *holu* 1; flexible. *Kai holuholu*, sea rising and falling. **ho'o.holu.holu**. Caus/sim. *Rare*.
- hōlule**. 1. vs. Soft, flexible, limp; soft-shelled, as an egg or crab; hanging loose, as fat. 2. n. A variety of sweet potato.
- hōlulo**. Var. of *hōlule* 1.
- holulu**. To oppress. (And.)
- hōlūlū**. 1. n. Mid-tide. 2. Redup. of *hōlū*; corpulent.
- holu.lule**. Redup. of *hōlule* 1.
- holu nape**. nvi. To sway, wave; swaying. *Ka holu nape a ka lau o ka niu* (song), the swaying of the fronds of the coconut.
- homa**. 1. vs. Disappointed. *Kū mawaho o ka pā o Homa*, standing outside Holmes's yard [said of one who is disappointed, a play on the name Holmes]. 2. vs. Thin, flabby; hollow, as cheeks. *Rare*. 3. vt. To hold a canoe to its course in a rough sea. *Rare*. 4. n. Beat of paddle on canoe side, as in rhythmic paddling while fish are driven into a net. *Rare*.
- homa.homa**. Redup. of *homa* 1-4.
- hōmale, hōmali**. vs. Emaciated, thin.
- home**. n. Home. *Eng.* *Ka home kaupoku 'ole*, the home without a ridgepole [a prison, ship, or place occupied by man that is not actually a home; an unhappy home].
- home ho'o.kū. 'ono'ono**. n. Homestead.
- home ho'o.pa'a**. n. Detention home.
- homeka, hometa**. n. Sand lizard (RSV), snail (KJV). (Oihk. 11.30.)
- home lula**. Home rule; the name of the political party composed of native Hawaiians formed in the early years of Hawai'i as a territory. This party ended in 1912 after Kūhiō was elected delegate to Congress. (Daws 294-5.) *Eng.* See ex., *wela* 1.
- homeo.pakika, homepakika, homepatita**. Homeopathic. *Eng.*
- Home Rula Republa.lika**. n. Semi-weekly newspaper in Hawaiian and Eng. published 1901-02.
- hōmī**. vi. Withered, stunted, puny, feeble; to wither, dry or shrivel up.
- hōmī.mī**. Redup. of *hōmī*.
- hona**. 1. Same as *hōpue*, a tree. 2. n. A variety of taro. (HP 32.)
- hone**. 1. vi. Sweet and soft, as music; sweetly appealing, as perfume or a memory of love; to sound softly; to tease, play pranks; mischievous. *Ke kani hone a ka waiolina*, the sweet sound of a violin. *Na ka moani lā i hali mai, hone ana i ke kai* (song), brought by the moani breeze, spreading sweetly to the sea. *Kani hone kēia keiki*, this child keeps up a teasing cry. **ho'o.hone**. Caus/sim. 2. n. Honey. *Eng.* *Wili i ka hone*, to extract honey. 3. n. Tenon of a wall post (Kam. 76:97.)
- hone.hone**. Redup. of *hone* 1; melodious.
- hone.kakala**. n. Honeysuckle, a low, twining shrub (*Lonicera japonica*), from East Asia, with short-stemmed, oval leaves and fragrant tubular flowers that open white and turn yellow. (Neal 805-6.) *Eng.*
- hone.koa**. vs. Saucy, impudent.
- hōnē.nē**. vt. To attract. *He lāhui kanaka hōnēnē i nā mea 'ino* (Kep. 75), a race of people attracted persistently by sinful things.
- honi**. 1. nvt. To kiss; a kiss; formerly, to touch noses on the side in greeting. *Hele akula 'o Iakoba, a honi a'ela iaia* (Kin. 27.27), Jacob came near and kissed him. **ho'o.honi**. To cause or pretend to kiss. (PPN *songi*.) 2. nvt. To smell, sniff, scent; a scent. **ho'o.honi**. Caus/sim. (PPN *songi*.) 3. vt. To touch, as a match to a combustible. (Lunk. 16.9.)
- honia**. Pas/imp. of *honi* 1-3. *Ua honia wale i ke 'ala o ka maile*, to have inhaled indeed the fragrance of *maile*.
- honi.honi**. Redup. of *honi* 1-3; to kiss or smell repeatedly, sniff. (PPN *songisongi*.)
- honi.kā**. nvt. A loud kiss; to kiss loudly. *Rare*.
- honi lima**. nvt. To throw a kiss; such a kiss.
- honina**. 1. Same as *honi* 1-3. 2. n. Name of a tapa dyed with turmeric and worn as a sarong.
- hōnina.nina**. vi. Soft, yielding. Cf. *lina*.
- honi pā.ha'o.ha'o**. n. A "puzzling" smell: said if the smell is out of place, as that of gardenias in a canoe at sea, interpreted as a warning of danger (Nānā 58.)
- hono**. 1. nvi. To stitch, sew, mend, patch; a joining, as of mountains. Cf. *pāhonohono*. *E hono ana i kā lākou mau 'upena* (Mat. 4.21), mending their nets. (PPN *fono*.) 2. n. Back of the neck, brow of a cliff. 3. vs. Bad smelling (less common than *hohono*). Cf. *mimi hono*. 4. n. Rite at the end of *kapu loulou* rituals during which chiefs sat without shifting positions while a kahuna prayed for as long as an hour. (Ii 44.) (PPN *fono*.)
- Hono-**. Bay, gulch, valley (as a part of place names such as Honolulu, Honokōhau, Honoli'i, Honomanu; also in the poetic phrase *nā Hono- a Pi'i-lani*, the bays beginning with Hono- of *Pi'i-lani* [a chief who ruled the bays on Maui, Moloka'i, and Lā-na'i that were visible from Lahaina]. *Hana-* occurs similarly as in Hanalei and Hanauma. See Gram. 8.1. (PPN *fanga-*.)
- hono.ā, hono.wā**. Same as *kūkae*, excrement, and an insulting epithet for commoners.
- hōnō.āi, -hōnō.wai**. *Rare* var. for *-hūnō.āi*.
- hono.hina**. n. Wild spiderflower (*Gynandropsis gynandra*), a cosmopolitan tropical hairy annual weed, native to Africa, in the caper family, 30 to 90 cm high, leaves five-parted; flowers spider-like, white with a purple tinge; fruit narrow, cylindrical capsule with many seeds. (Neal 369.) Also *'ili'ohu*.
- hono.hono**. 1. n. Short for *honohono kukui*. (PPN *hongohongo*.) 2. n. The wandering Jew or dayflower (*Commelina diffusa*), known in many temperate and tropical countries, a creeping weed, rooting at the joints, and bearing grasslike, ovate leaves and small bright-blue flowers. (Neal 185.) Also *honohono wai*, and *mākolokolo*. Cf. *honohono 'ula*. 3. n. A very rare native mint (*Haplostachys haplostachya*), a downy erect herb with oblong or narrower leaves and white flowers. (Neal 732.) 4. See *'okika honohono*. 5. Same as *hohono*, bad-smelling. 6. n. A children's game; the child locked fingers of two hands and thrust them into the sand, letting the sand out through a small opening.
- hono.hono kukui**. n. The basket grass (*Oplismenus hirtellus*), a creeping grass that originated in America, called *kukui* because it is often found under *kukui* trees. Also *honohono maoli*. (Neal 73-4.)
- hono.hono kū mau**. n. A variety of *honohono*.
- hono.hono maoli**. Same as *honohono kukui*.
- hono.hono 'ula**. n. Wandering Jew or zebrina, an ornamental, now naturalized, native to Mexico (*Zebrina pendula*). (Neal 183-4.)
- hono.hono wai**. Same as *honohono* 2.
- hono.ka'a**. 1. Cavern, sea cave. (AP.) 2. (*Cap.*) n. Town name, Hāmākua, Hawai'i.
- Hono.kaona**. n. Hong Kong. *Eng.*
- hono.koī**. n. A hard lump beside the mons pubis. (And., Kam. 64:115.)
- honole**. vs. Mischievous, teasing; to tease. *Rare*.
- Hono.lulu**. n. Name of the capital city in the Hawaiian Islands. *Lit.*, sheltered bay. (For PPN see *Hono-* and *lulu*.)
- hono.makani**. n. Windbreak. *Rare*.
- hono.pū**. Mob, angry crowd. (AP.)
- hono.wā**. Var. spelling of *hono.ā*.
- hōnō.wai**. *Rare* var. for *-hūnō.āi*.
- honu**. 1. n. General name for turtle and tortoise, as *Che- lonia mydas*. *Hula honu*, an ancient dance imitating the
