

- the first earnings in a new job or undertaking; offerings in gratitude for a particular success, as a big fish catch. *Lit.*, first fruit. **2.** Initial letter, first word.
- huana.** n. Gushing forth, overflow. *Hala ka huana wai*, gone is the rush of water.
- hua nanai.** n. Name of the *hinahina* root when used in *hana aloha*, love sorcery.
- hua nui.** **1.** nvi. Large fruit; to be fruitful, productive. **2.** n. Capital letter.
- hua 'oko'a.** n. Whole note in music.
- hua 'ole.** vs. Fruitless, unproductive, worthless, sterile, unrewarding.
- hua 'ō.lēlo.** n. **1.** Word, term. **2.** An affront to a family 'aumakua god. *E no'ono'ono noho'i i ka hua 'ōlēlo*, then think of the affront [that caused the god's displeasure].
- hua 'ō.lēlo ho'o.hui 'ia.** n. Compound word.
- hua 'ono.** n. A variety of sweet potato.
- hua pā.kā.** n. Scrambled eggs, omelet.
- hua.pala.** **1.** n. Orange trumpet or sweetheart vine (*Pyrostegia venusta* syn. *Bignonia venusta*, *B. ignea*), an ornamental climber from Brazil, bearing early in the year many deep-orange flowers, hence chestnut-colored or light brown. (Neal 764.) *Lit.*, ripe fruit. **2.** nvs. Sweetheart, lover; pretty, handsome. *E Kohala i ka huapala kau i ka nuku*, O Kohala with the handsome folk to delight the eyes [*lit.*, to appear at the mouth]. **3.** nvs. Chestnut brown.
- huapalaoa.** n. Wheat. *Lit.*, flour (*Eng.*) grain. 'Ai 'ia nā pu'u huapalaoa (Puk. 22.6), the stacked grain is consumed.
- hua palaoa 'ole.'ole.** n. Rye (*Secale cereale*).
- hua pala.pala.** n. Letter of the alphabet. *Lit.*, writing letter.
- hua pala.pala hiō.** n. Italics.
- hua pala.pala leo hui, hua leo hui.** n. Consonant. *Lit.*, letter joined in pronunciation.
- hua pala.pala leo kahi, hua leo kahi.** n. Vowel. *Lit.*, letter pronounced separately.
- hua pala.pala nui.** n. Capital letter.
- hua pale (bale).** n. Barley (*Hordeum vulgare*). *Ho'okahi paha 'epa hua bale* (Ruta 2.17), about an ephah of barley.
- hua pāma.** n. Date. *Lit.*, fruit of *pāma*, date palm.
- hua.pī.** Same as 'alae huapī.
- hua.po'o.** n. Bones of the side of the head; side of the head.
- hua pō.polo.** n. *Pōpolo* berry. Also 'olohua.
- hua.'ula.'ula.** n. The red sandalwood tree (*Adenanthera pavonina*), from parts of tropical Asia and Malaysia, of moderate height and with rather widespreading branches. The tree is planted in parks, and its round, lens-shaped, red seeds are used for leis, and their long, yellow-lined pods for decorative arrangements. (Neal 414.)
- hua.waena.** Same as *hāpai*, a variety of banana.
- hua.wai.** Var. of *hue wai*, water gourd container.
- hua.wai.maka.** n. Collection of dew or rain water, pool.
- hua waina.** n. Grape, grapes (*Vitis* spp.). (Neal 540-3.) *Lit.*, wine (*Eng.*) fruit. 'O ka manawa ia o ka hua waina pala mua (Nah. 13.20), it was the time of the first ripe grapes.
- hua waina malo'o.** n. Raisins. *Lit.*, dry grapes.
- hue.** **1.** n. Gourd, water calabash, any narrow-necked vessel for holding water, flask. Cf. *ipu, pōhue*. (PPN *fue*, a creeper; PEP *fue*, gourd.) **2.** nvi. Quick, as in stealing or deception; light-fingered; to steal, filch, move fast; to work the rope fast in skipping rope; theft (*rare*). Cf. 'aihue. (Probably PPN *fue*.) **3.** nvi. A type of hula dancing, usually at the end of a program, a kind of 'ai 'ami with a revolving of the hips as fast as the drummer can beat time, to see who can dance longest; to dance thus. **4.** n. A way of connecting net sections by interlocking meshes.
- hu'e.** vt. To remove, lift off, uncover, expose; to unload, as a ship; to open, as an oven; to exhume, push, force, prod; to wash out, as flood waters; to reveal. *Hu'e i ke kaona*, reveal the hidden meaning. *Ua hu'e ka wai i ke pili*, the water flowed out over the *pili* grass. *E hu'e mai 'oe i ke koai'e o Maka-wao*, uproot the *koai'e* tree of Maka-wao [a boast and challenge of the native of Maka-wao, Maui]. (PPN *fuke*.)
- huea.** Rare var. of 'aihue. (For. 6:424.)
- hu'ea.** Pas/imp. of *hu'e*. *Hu'ea maila nā piha'a moe wai o uka*, the flotsam in the upland stream comes pouring down [of gossip]. *Hu'ea pau 'ia e ka wai*, all washed away by water.
- hue 'awa.'awa.** n. Type of bitter gourd, as used for utensils.
- Huehu.** **1.** n. Name of a strong northwesterly wind of the winter months. Also *Kiu Inu Wai* and *Mālua Ki'i Wai*. **2.** (*Not cap.*) vs. Chilled, benumbed, as of one shivering in this wind.
- hue.hue.** **1.** nvi. Pimples, acne; to have pimples. (PPN *fua'fua*.) **2.** n. A native climber (*Cocculus ferrandianus*), with oval leaves and bluish one-seeded fruits. The stems were used for twine and for funnel-mouthed fish traps. (Neal 354.) Also *hue 'ie*.
- hu'e.hu'e.** **1.** Redup. of *hu'e*; to keep removing; to take out and put in again, as furniture; to overflow repeatedly. (PPN *fukefuke*.) **2.** See *hu'ehu'e kai*.
- hue.hue haole.** n. A wild passionflower (*Passiflora suberosa*) with small greenish-yellow flowers, small three-lobed or undivided leaves, and blackish fruits 1.3 cm in diameter. (Neal 597.) *Lit.*, introduced *huehue*.
- hu'e.hu'e kai.** Same as *hu'ahu'a kai 1, 2*.
- hue.huelo.** n. Tail end, as of a strip of pandanus plaiting. Cf. *huelo*. *He wahi huehuelo mana'o kēia*, this is a trivial bit of idea.
- hue 'ie.** **1.** Same as *huehue 2*. **2.** n. Demijohn.
- hue 'ili.** n. Container or bag for liquids made of animal skin. *Nā hue 'ili waina kahiko* (Iosua 9.4), old wine-skins.
- hu'e.lepo.** **1.** Var. of *hu'alepo*. (FS 89.) **2.** n. Small hula graduating exercises held at noon outside in the dust (*lepo*).
- huelo.** **1.** nvs. Tail, as of dog, cat, or pig; train of a dress; tail-end, last. *Fig.*, inferior. Cf. *huehuelo, pewa, hi'u, puapua*. *He po'e kanaka huelo ia* (Kel. 119), these are the tail ends of Hawaiians. **ho'o.huelo.** To lengthen, continue, make a tail; to stream down, as water over a cliff. **2.** A hop vine. (AP.)
- huelo.'awa.** n. Sting, as of a scorpion. *Lit.*, bitter tail.
- huelo.elo.** vs. Tail-like, having tails.
- huelo.'i.liō.** n. A small shrub (*Buddleja asiatica*), native of southeastern Asia to Java, growing wild in Hawai'i, related to the summer lilac. It has narrow leaves and small white flowers growing in long narrow clusters. (Neal 683.) *Lit.*, dog tail.
- huelo mā.ewa.** n. Tail end, especially of a junior line of a lineage. (KL line 525.)
- huelo.poki (boti).** n. Whaleboat. *Eng.*
- huelo.pō.poki.** n. Australian bluegrass, *Andropogon sericeus*. *Lit.*, cat tail. *Ni'ihau*.
- hue mā.nalo.** n. An edible sweet gourd.
- hu'ena.** n. Opening, unloading, flowing, pushing. Cf. *hu'e*. *Ho'okahi nō hu'ena a nā kānaka i kā lākou māpuna hoe*, just one push by the men of their paddle stroke.
- hū.'ena.** vs. Very angry.
- huēne.** n. A wheezing sound, as of asthmatic persons; a prolonged shrill cry.
- hue nuku pueo.** n. A variety of gourd with a short beak.
- hū.'eu.** nvs. Witty, comical, amusing, funny, mischievous; rascal, rogue.
- hue wai.** n. Gourd water container, water bottle.
- hue wai 'ihī, hue wai 'ihī loa.** n. Long-necked water container.
- hue wai pū.'ali.** n. Gourd water container with constriction about the middle.
- hue wai pu.ēo.** n. Water gourd shaped like an hourglass. *Lit.*, owl water gourd.
