

hū.hā. 1. nvi. Chat, talk, rumor; to chat, talk. 2. nvs. Fat, unwieldy; such a person.

hū.hewa. vi. To miss the course, digress, fail to penetrate or grasp. *Hūhewa ka pōkā*, the shot missed the mark. *Hūhewa kō lākou lohe*, a me kō lākou 'ike a'o 'ia (Kep. 15), what they heard and were taught was not maintained. *Ua hūhewa paha ke Kīna'u* (song), the Kīna'u [ship] has perhaps gone off her course.

hū honua. vi. To come out of the earth as a spring or an outcrop of 'alaea dirt. *Fig.*, to rise in revolt.

huhu. 1. n. A wood-boring insect, termite; worm-eaten, rotten. *E 'ai noho'i ka huhu iā lākou e like me ka hulu hipa* (Isa. 51.8), and the worm shall eat them like wool. (PCP (f,s)u(f,s)u.) 2. vt. To pet, cherish, as animal pets. *Hānai ā huhu*, to raise a pet. *Moe kō a ka huhu*, dream fulfilled and cherished.

huhū. nvi. Angry, offended, indignant, mad, scolding; anger, wrath; to scold, become angry. See ex., *pau pū*. *Huhū wela loa*, very great anger, fury. *Pi'i ka huhū*, to become angry. **ho'o.huhū.** To provoke anger, pretend anger. *Mai ho'ohuhū aku iāia* (Puk. 23.21), do not rebel against him.

hū.hū. Redup. of *hū 1*; to bulge; to effervesce. (PPN suusu.)

huhu-'ai-lā'au. n. Wood-eating borer. (For. 5:169.)

huhue. Possibly a redup. of *hue 2*, fast. *Huhue nā keiki paniolo* (chant), the cowboys were fast.

huhu'e. Probably a redup. of *hu'e*; to cease, quit. *Huhu'e aku kāua*, *moe i ke awakea* (FS 94-5), let's stop [fighting], sleep at noon.

huhuhu. vi. Insect-eaten, rotten, worm-eaten, wormy.

huhu.hue. Redup. of *hue 2*; to filch repeatedly, to steal in company.

huhu.hui. Redup. of *hui 1*; to meet as equals, as two beautiful persons.

huhu.hula. nvi. Hawaiian hula by many persons; to hula, of many.

huhu.hulei. Redup. of *hulei*; lifting, tossing about, trotting, sporting, leaping, twisting.

huhu.huli. Redup. of *huhuli*; to turn, seek frequently. See *huli 1, 2*.

huhu.hume. Redup. of *huhume*.

huhu.huna. Redup. of *huhuna*.

huhu.hune. Redup. of *hunehune* and *hune 1, 2*; fine, dainty; stripped of all property.

huhui. n. 1. Cluster, collection, swarm, bunch. Also *huihui*. *E noho malalo o ka lā'au maka*, *iho mai ka huhui*, *mā'ona ka 'ōpū*, sit under a green tree, the cluster falls, stomach is filled [serve a worthy person and you will be rewarded]. 2. (Cap.) Pleiades. Also *Huihui*. *Ho'opa'a i nā mea pa'a o nā Huhui* (Ioba 38.31), bind the chains of the Pleiades.

huhui helu. n. Logarithm. *Lit.*, number collection.

huhui palaoa. n. Ears of grain. (Mat. 12.1.)

huhui waina. n. Cluster of grapes. *A 'o kā lākou hua waina*, *he hua waina make*, a 'o nā huhui waina a lākou, *he 'awa'awa ia* (Kanl. 32.32), their grapes are grapes of poison, their grape clusters are bitter.

huhuki. Redup. of *huki*; to pull hard or frequently. *Pau ke kalo i ka huhuki 'ia*, all the taro was pulled up. *Koi huhuki*, compelling, insistent urge. **ho'o.huhuki.** To pull, cause to pull. *Fig.*, headstrong. (PPN fufuti.)

huhuku. Redup. of *huku*.

huhula. nvt. Hula dance by many; to dance the hula, of many.

huhuli. Redup. of *huli 1, 2*; to seek, turn, of many and repeatedly.

huhulu. vs. Bristling, tousled, as feathers, fur, body hair.

huhulu i'i. Intensifier of *huhulu*. *Huhulu i'i ka hulu o ka manu i ka ua kakahiaka* (chant), tousled were the feathers of the bird in the morning rain.

huhulu kū. vi. To rise, as fur of an angry dog.

huhulu weo. Same as *huluhulu weo*.

huhume. Redup. of *hume*.

huhuna. Redup. of *huna*; particles, fragments.

huhune. 1. Redup. of *hune 1, 2*. 2. nvi. Skin eruption on animals, as hog, dog; to have such.

huhu-pao-lā'au. n. A wood borer. *Fig.*, slanderer, defamer. *Lit.*, borer that digs wood.

huhū wale. vi. Short-tempered, peevish, cantankerous, angry without cause.

hui. 1. nvi. Club, association, society, corporation, company, institution, organization, band, league, firm, joint ownership, partnership, union, alliance, troupe, team; to form a society or organization; to meet, intermingle, associate, congregate. (Probably *hū 7 + -i*, transitivizer; cf. Gram. 6.6.4.) *Ā hui hou aku*, good-by; till [we] meet again. **ho'o.hui.** To form a society. *Palapala ho'ohui*, charter, as of an association. (PPN fuhi.) 2. nvi. To join, unite, combine, mix; combination. See *hui pū* and saying, *nāwao 1*. *Hui 'ia*, united, joined, joint. *Nā mahele i hui 'ia*, combined divisions, precincts. *Hui ka 'aha*, to press together, of a crowd; to mingle, as two sides at the conclusion of an athletic competition (For. 5:407). *Ka hui 'ia o ka loa a me ka laulā*, *pēlā e loa'a mai ai ka 'alea*, the multiplication of the length and the width, thus is obtained the area. **ho'o.hui.** To join, as two words; to add a prefix or suffix; to add on, annex, append, unite; to introduce one person to another; meeting of persons; binder. *Ho'ohui 'ia*, united, allied. *Ho'ohui ā ho'opa'a*, to bring together, consolidate. *Ho'ohui 'ana*, union, joining. *Ho'ohui 'āina*, joining of lands, annexation. *Ho'ohui helu*, to connect, as telephone numbers by a telephone operator. *Ka ho'ohui o ka mīkini humuhumu*, sewing machine binder. (PPN fuhi.) 3. n. A plus sign. 4. n. Cluster, as of grapes or coconuts; bunch, as of bananas. Also *huhui*, *huihui*. 5. n. Chorus of a song. 6. n. Flippers of a turtle. *Ua loha nā hui o Hā'upu*, the flippers of Hā'upu droop [an aged person, a reference to the story of *Kana* and *Niheu*, in which a turtle lifted up Hā'upu hill on Moloka'i]. 7. Var. of *huli*, to turn, seek. *Hui iho nei ka wa'a a Ka-moho-ali'i* (chant), *Ka-moho-ali'i's* canoe turned. 8. n. Small uniting stick in a thatched roof, supporting rod for purlins. 9. vi. To disperse, as a meeting. 10. A prayer on the morning after 'anā'anā sorcery. (For. 6:17.) (Pronunciation uncertain: perhaps *hu'i*.)

hūi. interj. Halloo.

hu'i. 1. nvs. Ache, pain; aching. *Niho hu'i*, toothache. (PPN suki.) 2. n. A prayer.

huia. 1. Pas/imp. of *hui 2*. 'O 'oe ka i huia ihola, ē ke aloha (song), you are the one who was met, O love. (PPN fuhia.) 2. (Cap.) n. Name of a surfing wave. (Laie 505.)

hui'apa. n. A kind of stone, as used for making *maika* stones.

Hui Hei.hei Moku Pā.kī.pika. n. Pacific Yacht Club. *Lit.*, Pacific ship racing club.

hui hali ukana. n. Express company.

hui hō.'ai.'ē kā.lā (dala). n. Credit union. *Lit.*, society [for] loaning money.

hui ho'o.pa'a. n. Insurance company.

hui.hui. 1. vi. Mixed, mingled, united, joined; to pool together, as to buy cooperatively. **ho'o.hui.hui.** Caus/sim. *Ho'ohuihui lā'au*, chemistry, pharmacist. *Mea ho'ohuihui*, alloy, anything mixed. *Mea inu ho'ohuihui*, mixed drink, punch. 2. n. Cluster, collection, bunch. (PPN fuhifuhi.) 3. n. Constellation. *Nā hōkū o ka lanī a me nā huihui ona* (Isa. 13.10), the stars of the heavens and their constellations. 4. (Cap.) n. Pleiades. Also *Huhui*.

hu'i.hu'i. nvi. Cold, cool, chilly; numbing, tingling, as love. *He aloha hu'ihu'i konikoni ana i loko o'u*, ardent, tingling love within me. *Ke kī'aha wai hu'ihu'i* (Mat. 10.42), the cup of cold water. **ho'o.hu'i.hu'i.** To make cold, chill, as by refrigeration. *Mea inu ho'o-hu'ihu'i*, iced or chilled drink.

hui.hui ā kō.lea. vi. To gather together like a flock of *kōlea* birds. *Fig.*, to gather together to help one another in time of trouble.
