

papa hulei. ho'o.hulei. Caus/sim. to trot, cause to trot, move back and forth. (PPN *fule*.)

hulē'ia. n. A kind of soft pumice stone. Also *'ana, 'ōla'i.*

hū.lei.lei. Redup. of *hulei. ho'o.hū.lei.lei.* Caus/sim.; to toss, as a child on one's foot.

hulēi.lua. Intensifier of *hulei*; to toss and pitch, trot, swing. *Walawala ka pumi mahope, huleilua i ka 'ilikai,* the boom teetered at the stern, pitching on the surface of the sea. *Huleilua i nā nalu o Lau-niu-poko,* tossing on the waves of Lau-niu-poko [of one not sure of himself].

huli. 1. vi. To turn, reverse; to curl over, as a breaker; to change, as an opinion or manner of living. *E huli loa,* about face [military command]. *Ma ka 'ākau, huli,* right, face. *Kai huli,* a sea that dashes and recedes. *Huli i luna ke alo,* turning the front up [an early stage of infancy when the infant lies on its back]. *Pau ka 'ai 'ana, huli ke alo i luna,* after eating, turn over [relax]. **ho'o.huli.** To turn, change, affect, overturn, convert, reform. *Ho'ohuli kū'ē,* to alienate. (PPN *fuli*.) 2. nvt. To look for, search, explore, seek, study; search, investigation; scholarship (see *huli honua, huli kanaka*). **ho'o.huli.** Caus/sim. *Ho'ohuli pipi,* to drive cattle; cattle roundup. Also *huli pipi.* (Possibly PCP (*f,s*)*huli*: cf. Marquesan *hu'iahia*.) 3. n. Section, as of a town, place, or house. 4. n. Taro top, as used for planting; shoot, as of *wauke* (see 'ae 7). See ex., 'ōmaka 1. (PPN *suli*.) 5. n. Trump or winning card. *'A'ohe huli,* no trumps. 6. Same as *hului,* bag net.

hulia. Pas/imp. of *huli* 1, 2.

hulia.lana. v. To remove the bitterness, especially to pour off the bitter liquid and add fresh water to the preparation of arrowroot (*pia*). *I pau ka hualalana* (a prayer; Malo 199), to remove the bitterness. *Ka pō luluka me ka hualalani, ma'ema'e ka 'āina, kōnalēnale ka noho* (For. 6:403), the night of peace and returned tranquillity, clean the land, calm the dwelling.

huli alo. v. To turn toward; to face one another. *Iā 'Olopana me ke kahuna e huli alo ana* (FS 207), while 'Olopana and the priest faced each other.

Huli-alo-pali. n. Name of a wind at Lahaina, Maui. *Lit.*, turn to the face of the cliff.

huli.ā.mahi. 1. vi. To join together in great numbers to cooperate; to act with unanimity, as a political party. 2. vs. Strong, as the sea. See Gram. 8.7.2.

huli 'ao.'ao. v. To lean over to one side, tilt, turn to the side.

huli.āu. 1. n. Turning point, time of change. *'O ka ho'ohui 'āina, he huliau ia no Hawai'i,* annexation was a turning point for Hawai'i. 2. vi. To think of the past, recall the past. *Ua 'ākoakoa mākou no ka huliau 'ana,* we gathered together to recall the past.

huli hana. v. Diligent in work; to seek work.

huli hele. vt. To search here and there. *Ua huli hele au i ku'u puke, 'a'ole i loa'a,* I looked everywhere for my book, [but] didn't find [it].

huli.hia. Pas/imp. of *huli* 1, 2; overturned; a complete change, overthrow; turned upside down. Chants about Pele with verses beginning with the word "hulihia" are referred to as *hulihia*. See prayer, *kualakai* 2. *Hulihia ka mauna, wela i ke ahi* (PH 204, 225), mountain overturned, hot with fire. *Hulihia Kī-lau-ēa, pō i ka uahi* (PH 197), Kī-lau-ēa [Volcano] is overturned, darkened by smoke. *Kaua hulihia,* revolutionary war. (PNP *fulisia*.)

huli honua. nv. Profound study of the earth, geology; to do such. Cf. RC 433.

huli hope. vi. To turn back; inverse, as in math.

huli.huli. Redup. of *huli* 1, 2; to search repeatedly or long; searching by many people; to turn repeatedly. *Kōmike hulihuli,* reference committee, as in the legislature. *E hulihuli mai 'oia iā 'oukou* (Ioba 13.9), he searches you out. **ho'o.huli.huli.** Caus/sim.; to convert. (PPN *fulifuli*.)

huli kanaka. nv. Profound studies of any kind, moral philosophy, social science, anthropology; to do such.

huli.ko'a. nvt. To seek into the depths of a matter, to describe fully; description. *"He Wahi Huliko'a Manu Hawai'i"* (title of an article about birds), "A Short Study of Hawaiian Birds."

huli.kua. n. Ornamental comb decorated with feathers, with ornaments turned towards the back. (Malo 77.)

huli kua. 1. nv. To turn one's back, refuse to help, ignore; one who does so, as one who is offended. 2. n. Back section, as back house wall.

huli.lau. n. 1. A variety of large gourd or calabash, used as receptacle for tapa or garments, or for food offerings. *Fig.*, a woman, mother, wife. *'O ka po'e hulilau 'ole o hope,* those with no large gourd calabashes in the back [without wives]. 2. Border, boundary. *Ke 'ike maila nō 'o Lā'ie-ka-wai i ka 'aha kanaka mai kēlā hulilau a kēia hulilau o ke kaha o Kea'au,* Lā'ie-ka-wai looked at the assembly of people from that border to this border of the arena at Kea'au.

huli.lawa. vt. To find enough material goods, as food. *Hiki ke hulilawa i ka i'a,* possible to get enough meat.

hulili. nvs. Dazzling light, vibration, undulation; to blaze, sparkle, dazzle, glare, vibrate, swell. **ho'o.-hulili.** Caus/sim.

hū.lili. 1. nvt. Ladder, bridge, as to scale a cliff or cross a gully; trestle; log or plank serving as a bridge; steep trail; to lay sticks, as for a bridge or trestle. See ex., *wāhia*. 2. n. Garrison, fort, tower, altar, strong high place. 3. n. Bracelet of hog's or dog's teeth. (For. 5.419.) 4. n. A type of tapa.

huli.ii. vi. To shiver. Cf. *ii*.

huli lua. vi. To turn in two directions or twice; to shift, as the wind; unstable, shifting. *Nā pali huli lua,* cliffs facing each other. *Mehe makani huli lua lā, huli ka mana'o,* like a shifting wind, the mind changes.

huli.mai'a. n. Name of a reddish-brown honey-sucking bird (no data). *Lit.*, banana seeker.

huli mana'o. v. To seek an opinion; to change an opinion. **ho'o.huli mana'o.** To induce change of opinion, influence, convert.

huli mio. n. Taro stalk with spent strength.

huli.moku. vi. To turn and rush; to pour forth, as a cloudburst; to stampede.

hulina. 1. n. Turning, overturning, turning place, reversing, frontage. *Ka hulina i ke Ko'olau,* the side facing the Ko'olau. 2. n. A searching, seeking; search. 3. vs. Soft and sticky, glutinous, gluey. Also *'ulina*.

hulina alo. n. Facing, face to face, opposite. *Ka Mauna 'Oliwēka ma ka hulina alo o ka luakini* (Mar. 13.3), Mount of Olives opposite the temple.

huli.nu'u. n. Highest rank or grade.

huli.pahu. n. Second mate of a vessel. *Lit.*, binnacle turner.

huli pau. vt. To overturn completely; to search everywhere; said sometimes as equivalent to modern "bottoms up" toast, instead of the vulgar "ōkole maluna."

huli.pēua. nvs. Greedy; a greedy person.

huli pēua. n. Twists of the tail; *fig.*, passing of time. See *pawa* 1 and *pewa* 1.

huli.pōe.pōe. n. Globe. *Lit.*, revolving sphere.

huli.pū. Same as *ulua kihikihi*, a fish.

huli pū. vt. To overturn, turn upside down, overthrow.

huli.pū.loa. n. A variety of taro. (HP 32.)

hulō, huro. interj. Hurrah, cheers. *Eng.* See ex., *kiliwehi, pa'apa'ina. ho'o.hulō.* Caus/sim. *Rare.*

hulu. 1. n. Feather, quill, plumage. (PPN *fulu*.) 2. nvs. Esteemed, choice, precious; esteemed older relative, as of parents or grandparents' generations. (This meaning may be connected with the high value attached to featherwork.) *He hulu ali'i,* an elderly chief who is loved and esteemed. *Nā hulu maka'āinana o nā ali'i,* the most precious of the chiefs' citizenry. **ho'o.hulu.** To esteem, prize. *Inā ho'i 'oe he manu lele i luna, ho'ohulu aku ua hoa nei* (chant for Ka-mehameha III), if you then were
