

- mark, believed to be the result of the pregnant mother's eating *humuhumu* (fish). 5. vt. To destroy, ravage. 'Ai *humuhumu ka ma'i i nā kānaka*, the disease ravaged the people. 6. n. Seam. See *komo humuhumu*.
- humu.humu 'ele'ele.** n. Black triggerfish (*Melichthys niger*), used as fuel when fuel was scarce.
- humu.humu hi'u kole.** n. Pinktail durgon (*Melichthys vidua*). *Lit.*, red-tailed triggerfish.
- humu.humu lei.** n. Lei triggerfish (*Sufflamen bursa*).
- humu.humu mē'e.mē'e.** Same as *humuhumu-nuku-nuku-ā-pua'a*. (And.)
- humu.humu mimi.** n. Bridled triggerfish (*Sufflamen fraenatus*). *Lit.*, urine triggerfish, so called because of its odor.
- humu.humu-nuku.nuku-ā-pua'a.** n. Varieties of *humuhumu* (*Rhinecanthus aculeatus*, *R. rectangulus*). *Lit.*, *humuhumu* with a snout like a pig.
- humu.humu puke.** n. Bookbinding.
- humu.humu puke 'ili lolo.** n. Cloth bookbinding.
- humu.humu puke 'ili pepa.** n. Paper bookbinding.
- humu.humu ulana.** vt. To darn, as socks.
- humu.humu uli.** Same as *humuhumu hi'u kole*.
- humu.humu uma.uma lei.** n. A variety of *humuhumu* fish (*Balistes bursa*). *Lit.*, *humuhumu* with leis on its chest.
- humu.kā.** nvt. Cross-stitching; to do cross-stitching.
- humu kā.holo (kā.holo.holo).** Same as *humu ho'o-holoholo*.
- humu kaula.hao.** nvt. Chain stitch; to make chain stitches.
- humu lala.** vt. To sew in a diagonal line.
- humu.lau.** vt. To embroider. *He holokū kilika i humulau 'ia me ka pua Pākē*, it is a silk gown (*holokū*) embroidered with Chinese flowers.
- Humu-mā.** n. Name for the cluster of three stars in a row in the constellation Aquila. *Lit.*, Humu and companions.
- humuna.** n. Sewing, seam.
- humu.niki.** n. Pattern in *pāwehe* plaiting, said to consist of a continuous row of red lozenges with their lateral angles touching.
- humu.'ō.mou.** n. Stitch used in tacking.
- humu.pa'a.** nvt. Lock stitch, a stitch that does not loosen easily; to sew thus.
- humu.papa.** vt. To sew to a backing, as feather leis.
- humu pe'a.** nv. Sail-making; to sew sails.
- humu puka pihī.** n. Buttonhole stitch.
- humu.'ula.** n. 1. Red jasper stone, as used for adzes. 2. (*Cap.*) Name of a place on the slopes of Mauna Kea.
- humu.wili.** n. Overcasting stitch; to hem.
- huna.** 1. nvs. Minute particle, grain, crumb, gram, speck, tiny bit, scrap, minutia; small, little, powdery. (This word is similar to *hune* 2.) Cf. *hunaahi*, *huna kai*, *huna kaua*, *huna lepo*, *hunalewa*, *huna olonā*. *Ka hā'ule 'ana o kekahi huna o ke kānāwai* (Luka 16.17), the voiding of one dot of the law. 2. nvs. Hidden secret; hidden. Cf. *huna*, a stative usually following nouns, and the transitive verb *hūnā*. *Wahi huna*, hidden place, sexual part. *Lua huna*, secret cave. *Mea huna*, secret. *Kahi huna* (Oihk. 18.7), nakedness. (PNP *funā*.) 3. (*Cap.*) n. Eleventh night of the month. (Malo 35.) 4. n. Common, fine, red seaweeds (*Hypnea* spp.), irregularly and more or less densely branching, thorny looking; eaten cooked, furnishes a good colloid when boiled.
- hū.nā.** vt. To hide, conceal, disguise, secrete; confidential; covert. Cf. *huna* 2, *pe'e* 1. *He mea ia i hūnā 'ia*, this was a hidden thing. *He mana'o e hūnā*, a thought to be hidden. **ho'o.hū.nā.** To hide deliberately. *Ua ho'ohūnā 'oe i ka na'auao mai kō lākou na'au aku* (Ioba 17.4), you have closed their minds to understanding. (PPN *fuū*, PNP *fuuna-* (Rennell *huunaki*), PEP *na'a*.)
- hunaahi.** n. Fire spark, live cinder. (Isa. 1.31.)
- huna.huna.** n. Fragments, particles, crumbs, scraps. *Hunahuna mea hou*, bits of news.
- hunā.hunā.** Redup. of *hūnā*; to hide frequently or be hidden by many persons; secretly. *Hunāhunā 'ole*, frank, open. **ho'o.hunā.hunā.** Caus/sim. *Nīnau ho'ohunāhunā*, to ask in a roundabout way.
- huna.huna 'ō.lolo.** n. A particle, as *ua*, *e*, *i* in Hawaiian.
- huna.kai.** n. 1. White-flowered beach morning-glory (*Ipomea stolonifera*; synonym, *I. acetosaefolia*), distributed in tropical regions, with oblong to lyre-shaped leaves, and white flowers with yellow centers. (Neal 705.) 2. Sanderling (*Calidris alba*), a small winter migrant to Hawai'i, cinnamon brown with dark markings. *Lit.*, sea foam, so called from the bird's habit of following close behind receding waves.
- huna kai.** n. Sea spray, sea foam. Also *hune kai*.
- Huna.kalia, Hunagaria.** nvs. Hungary; Hungarian. *Eng.*
- huna.kā.nā'i.** n. A kind of tapa with white and yellow dots.
- huna kaua.** n. A battle unit, either a single individual or a group of men; host of an army (Iosua 10.5).
- hū.nā.kele.** vt. To hide in secret, as the body of a loved one in a secret cave; to keep a secret, conceal. *Ua hūnākele 'oia i ka mo'olelo kupuna*, she has hidden the family records.
- huna lepo.** n. Dust particle. *Helu i nā huna lepo o Iakoba* (Nah. 23.10), count the dust of Jacob.
- huna.lewa.** n. Van of an army, front ranks. Cf. *hunapa'a*.
- huna olonā.** n. Waste and refuse of *olonā* after the fiber is cleaned. *E lilo nō ka mea ikaika i huna olonā* (Isa. 1.31), the strong shall become tow.
- huna.pa'a.** n. Rear guard of an army.
- huna pakē.pakē.** n. A species of *Hypnea*, a seaweed. *Lit.*, brittle *huna*.
- huna palai.** Same as *pai*, a native fern.
- huna wai.** n. Drop of water, spray, mist.
- huna wai.lele.** n. Spray from a waterfall.
- hune.** 1. nvs. Poor, destitute; a poor person. Cf. *'ilihune*, *māhune*. *He hune kō lākou nohona*, their way of life is poverty-stricken. **ho'o.hune.** To cause poverty, impoverish. *E ho'ohune iā mākou* (Lunk. 14.15), to impoverish us. 2. vs. Fine, tiny. Cf. *huna*, *kilihune*, *Menehune*.
- hune. ho'o.hune.** To persist, nag, tease; to do with avidity and persistence. See ex., *nē* 1. *Koi ho'ohune* (Nak. 101), keep asking. *He mea ho'ohune loa ka i'a i ka makani hou*, the fish are constantly going into the fresh wind.
- hune.hune.** 1. Redup. and intensification of *hune* 2, very fine, delicate. *Palai lau hunehune*, fine-leaved fern. *Kilika hunehune*, fine quality silk. *Hunehune ka lau o kēia lolo*, the design of the cloth of this dress is delicate. 2. n. Bits, as of news, gossip; minutia. *Nā hunehune mea hou*, bits of news. 3. Same as *huna*, a seaweed.
- hune kai.** n. Sea spray, sea foam. Also *huna kai*.
- hune one.** n. Fine-grained sand, sand particles.
- hū.nō-.** Relationship between parent- and child-in-law. See *hūnōna*, *-hūnōai*. (PNP *funo*.)
- hū.nō.ai.** Father- or mother-in-law, usually after *makua* and followed by *kāne* or *wahine* for specific designation of sex. These terms apply also to uncle and aunt by marriage. (PCP *fungawai*.)
- hū.nō.na.** Son- or daughter-in-law, followed by *kāne* or *wahine* for specific designation of sex. These terms also apply to nephew or niece by marriage. (PPN *funoonga*.)
- hū.nunu.** vs. Lumpy, coarse, as of certain skin diseases; humped; lumps.
- Huo.** n. Name of an unidentified star.
- huoi.** n. Suspicion. *Rare.* **ho'o.huoi.** To suspect, surmise, distrust; suspicion. *Ka huwā, ka paio, ka nuku, ka ho'ohuoi 'ino* (1 Tim. 6:4), envy, strife, railings, evil surmisings.
- hū 'ō.lapa.** n. Gum of the 'ōlapa tree, formerly used for embalming.
