

- i'a Pā.kō.** n. An introduced fish (*Ophiocephalus striatus*) found in rice or taro patches and streams. *Lit.*, Chinese fish.
- iā.pana.** n. Japan. *Eng.* Cf. *Kepanī*.
- ia'u.** pronoun. 1. Me, to me; because of or due to me (the particle *iā* and *a'u*, me; see *i 1*). 'Ike mai 'oia ia'u, he saw me. (Gram. 8.2.) 2. conj. While I, at the time that I, when I, as soon as I, no sooner than I (the particle *iā* and *a'u*, me; see *i 5*). *Ia'u i puka aku ai mai ka hale aku nei* (Laie 433), when I emerged from this house.
- i'a 'ula.'ula.** n. Goldfish (*Carassius auratus*), introduced from China or Japan in the time of Ka-'ahu-manu. *Lit.*, red fish.
- i'a 'ula.'ula kea.** n. Pale-red goldfish or carp.
- i'a 'ula.'ula iā kea.** n. White-marked goldfish. *Lit.*, white-finned red fish.
- i'a 'ula.'ula uli.** n. Probably the introduced carp (*Cyprinus carpio*). *Lit.*, dark-red fish.
- lawa, lava.** n. Java. *Eng.*
- 'iawe.** Same as 'iawe.
- i'e.** n. Tapa beater. For types of beaters, see Buck 169-79 and *pepehi 2* and *ho'opa'i (b)*. A beater with a smooth surface was used finally (*ho'ōki*) to smooth out the cloth. (PPN *ike*.)
- 'ie.** 1. n. Aerial root of the 'ie'ie vine; the vine itself. *Pua ka 'ie*, the 'ie vine blossoms [royalty is born]. (PPN *kie*.) 2. n. A woven basket. 3. nvs. A flat, plaited braid as used in hats; braided. *Kāma'a 'ie*, braided shoes. *Mahiole 'ie* (Laie 479), plaited feather helmet. 4. nvs. Wicker. *He noho 'ie*, a wicker chair. 5. n. Name for fish traps, combined with the name of the fish, as 'ie kala, 'ie palani. 6. Same as 'ie'ie 3. 7. nvs. Canvas, cotton, linen. *Rare*. 8. nvs. Corduroy. *Rare*.
- iē.howa, iēhova.** n. Jehovah. (Heb. *Yehowah*.)
- 'ie.'ie.** 1. n. An endemic woody, branching climber (*Freycinetia arborea*) growing luxuriantly in forests at altitudes of about 300 to 600 m. The ringed stems end in tufts of long, narrow, spiny leaves, in the center of which flowers are borne on cylindrical spikes surrounded by leafy bracts, which are orange or green with orange bases. (Neal 54.) 'Ie'ie was one of five plants used on the hula altar (see *palai*). Also 'ie. (PNP *kiekie*.) 2. n. A native variety of taro with leaf blades and flowers suggesting 'ie'ie 1; the leaves are dark and glossy, the petioles reddish with yellow-green stripes. (HP 18, 32.) 3. vs. High, conceited. *hō.'ie.'ie, ho'o.'ie.'ie.* Caus/sim.
- 'ie.'iea.** nvs. Barbed, as a hook; barb.
- 'ie.'iewe.** *Rare* var. of 'iewe.
- i'e-io.io-kaha-loa.** n. Kind of brown tapa made at Wai-pi'o, Hawai'i. *Lit.*, tapa beater with ridges of long stripes.
- iē.kuiko, iēsuito, iēsuita.** n. Jesuit. *Eng.*
- i'e kuku.** n. Tapa beater.
- i'e kuku ho.'ōki.** n. Tapa beater, as used to finish the tapa. *Lit.*, finishing-beating mallet.
- 'ie lawe.** n. Fish-trap basket made of 'ie vine. *Lit.*, portable 'ie.
- iēle.** pejorative suffix. *Rare*. See *iēiele, luaiēle, luluaiēle, maiēle, noiēle*.
- 'iēle.** n. Person of distinction, chief. (And.) Cf. 'i, supreme.
- iēlu.kalema, iērusalema.** n. Jerusalem. *Eng.*
- 'ie 'ō.pala.** n. Wastebasket.
- 'ie palaoa.** n. Breadbasket.
- iēsū.** n. Jesus. (Probably Heb. *Yeshua*.)
- 'iewe.** n. 1. Afterbirth, placenta. Also *ēwe*. 2. Infant. (Kanl. 28.57.) 3. Relatives of a common ancestry. *E kolo ana nō ka ēwe i ka 'iewe*, descendants of the same ancestors crawl together [seek out one another].
- 'iha.** Same as 'iha'iha.
- 'iha.'iha.** nvs. Feeling of discomfort of one needing to relieve himself; tight, taut, tense. 'Iha'iha ke kaula, the rope is taut. *No'ono'o 'iha'iha*, mental anxiety, trouble, discomfort. *ho'o.'iha.'iha* Bloated, uncomfortable. (PCP *kif(s)a*.)
- ihe.** n. 1. Spear, javelin, dart. Various types of *ihe* are listed below. (PCP *i(f,s)e*.) 2. Same as *iheihe*, a fish. (PPN *ise*.)
- 'ihe.** Var. of 'iha'iha.
- i hea.** inter. Where (indefinite), why, why not. *I hea 'oia?* Where is he? *I hea iā 'olua kama'ilio mai?* Why didn't you two speak of it?
- i.he'e.** vi. To spread out, prevail, as of calm, peace. *Rare*.
- i.he'e.he'e.** vi. To flow. *Rare*.
- i.he'e.kai.** n. Turmeric or ocher with salt water, used as a daub by guardians of shark gods and other priests. (Malo 116.)
- ihe.ihe.** n. 1. One of several halfbeaks (*Hemirampus depauperatus*). (PPN *iseise*.) 2. A variety of taro. (HP 32.)
- 'ihe.'ihe.** Same as 'iha'iha.
- ihe.ihe lei.** n. A variety of *iheihe* taro.
- ihe lau.meki, ihe lau.maki.** n. Barbed spear.
- ihe 'ō.** n. Dart; piercing spear.
- 'i.hēpa.** Same as *hepa*, imbecilic.
- ihe pahe'e.** n. Short spear, lance; stick used in the game *pahe'e*.
- ihe pakelo.** n. Lance.
- ihi.** vt. To strip, peel, as bark or fruit; to tear off, remove. (PPN *hisi*.)
- 'ihi.** 1. vs. Sacred, holy, majestic, dignified; treated with reverence or respect. *hō.'ihi.* (a) To treat thus; to hallow. (b) Tapa or pandanus fitted into a hoop and placed on the head of an attendant (*kahu*), serving as a holder for a food container from which the chief or favorite child was served, a means of bestowing high honor. 2. n. Wood sorrels (*Oxalis*, all species), perennial weedy herbs, creeping or not, and bearing clover-like leaves and yellow, white, red, or pink bell-shaped flowers. The plants have a pleasant sour taste due to oxalic acid. (Neal 473-4.) Known to some as *Portulaca* spp. (PPN *kisi*.) 3. See *hue wai 'ihi*.
- 'ihi 'ai.** n. A kind of 'ihi (*Oxalis corniculata*). (Neal 473.) *Lit.*, edible 'ihi.
- ihi.akala.** Same as *holomoku 2*. (Kam. 76:10.)
- 'ihi 'awa.** Same as 'ihi 'ai.
- 'ihi.'awa.'awa.** n. Storm accompanied by much thunder and lightning, and an epithet for the gods of thunder and lightning. *Lit.*, stormy sacred ones.
- ihi.hī.** vi. To neigh, whinny. *hō.ihi.hī.* To imitate neighing; to make a horse neigh.
- 'ihi.'ihi.** 1. Redup. of 'ihi 1; revered. 2. An unknown plant formerly growing at 'Ihi'ihī-lau-ākea, the western side of Hanauma Bay, O'ahu.
- 'ihī.'ihī.** Same as *ihihī*. 'A 'ike i ke kumulau, 'ihī'ihī launa 'ole (song), seeing the mare, such a neighing.
- 'ihi.'ihi-i-one.** n. A mustard plant, *Coronopus didymus*. *Ni'ihau*.
- 'ihi kū.kāe hipa.** Same as *kūkaehipa*, spiny bur (*Acanthospermum australe*). (Neal 837.) Also *pipili 3*.
- 'ihi kū kō.pau.** n. Same as *pā'ihī*, a weed related to watercress.
- 'ihi kū mā kua.** n. A weedy sorrel. (*Oxalis* sp.).
- 'ihi iā'au.** *Marsilea villosa*. *Lit.*, medicinal sorrel. *Ni'ihau*.
- 'ihi lani.** n. Heavenly splendor; sacredness of a chief; reverence due a chief.
- ihi loa.** n. Small, long-necked gourd as used for holding water.
- 'ihi maka 'ula.** Same as 'ihi mākole.
- 'ihi mā.kole.** n. A creeping variety of 'ihi with red stems (differing in this from 'ihi 'awa), yellow flowers, and no bulbs; used medicinally. *Lit.*, red-eyed 'ihi. Also 'ihi maka 'ula.
- 'ihi pēhu.** n. A kind of sorrel (*Oxalis martiana*) with large leaves, pink flowers, bulbous scaly root, used medicinally. (Neal 473.)
- 'ihi pua kea.** n. Shamrock. *Lit.*, white-flowering *Oxalis*.
- iho.** 1. nvi. To go down, descend; downhill, towards the sea; to subside; go south or before the wind; descent.
