

um, plot in a cemetery. Cf. *ili 1. Pā ilina*, cemetery. *Ka ilina o nā ali'i*, royal mausoleum. **2.** Recipient. **ho'o.ilina**, **ho.'i.lina**. Heir, inheritance, legacy, estate, heritage, bequest; successor (so used in the official English version of the Constitution of 1852, Article 25). *Ho'oilina mō'i*, heir to the throne, crown prince or princess. *Palapala ho'oilina*, will. *Ho'oilina 'ōlelo*, a will made verbally; one entrusted to speak for another. *Kona mau ho'oilina*, his heirs.

**ilina wai**. n. Place where a stream goes underground.

**'ili.nia**. Same as *'inia 2*, the pride of India flower and plant.

**'i.lio**. n. **1.** Dog (brought to Hawai'i by early Polynesians, considered an *'aumakua* by some). Cf. *'apowai*, *hula 'iio*, *nūkea*, Gram. 2.9, Titcomb 1969, Hal. 22.16, Hoik. 22.15. Many types of dogs are listed below. *'iio mo'o*, *'iio pe'elua*, brindled dog. (PPN *kulii*; the Hawaiian term may have come from Tuamotu *kurio*, with replacement of *-u-* by *-i-*.) **2.** A generic term for foreign quadruped. See below and Gram. 2.9.2. **3.** Cloud (poetic, or cloud with an omen). *'iio 'ehu*, cloud with a ruddy tint. *'O 'iio uli*, *'o 'iio mea*, *'o Kū ke ao iki*, *'o Kū ke ao loa*, *'o Kū ke ao poko* (PH 144), dark dog-cloud, reddish dog-cloud, Kū the small cloud, Kū the long cloud, Kū the short cloud. See *kū 11*, the god. **4.** Tie beam in a house, brace that holds rafter to crossbeam. **5.** A seaweed, same as some of the *hulu 'iio 5*.

**'i.lio 'au.kai**. n. **1.** Sea dog, experienced sailor. **2.** Warship.

**ili.oha**. n. Horsetweeds (*Conyza* spp.), tall, slender coarse weeds of the daisy family, established in Hawai'i; used medicinally. One species is *laniwela*. (Neal 834.) Also *'awī'awī*, *puamana*, *'uwī'uwī*.

**'i.lio.ha'a**. Same as *līpahapaha*, *pahapaha*, sea lettuce (*Ulva* and related genera).

**'i.lio hae**. n. Fierce or vicious dog; wolf, jackal.

**'i.lio hahai**. n. Greyhound. (Sol. 30.31.) *Lit.*, chasing dog.

**'i.lio hahai holo.holona**. n. Hunting dog.

**'i.lio hahai manu**. n. Bird dog.

**'i.lio hanu kanaka**. n. Bloodhound. *Lit.*, dog that smells man.

**ili.ohē**. n. Name reported for a green fresh-water moss.

**'i.lio hihū hae**. n. Wild, fierce dog; wolf.

**'i.lio hipa**. n. Sheep dog, shepherd dog.

**'i.lio hohono**. n. Bad-smelling dog; skunk.

**'i.lio-holo-i-ka-ua.ua**. n. Seal. *Lit.*, quadruped running in the rough [seas].

**'ili.'ohu**. Same as *honohina*, wild spiderflower. *Lit.*, mist skin.

**'i.lio hulu pā.pale**. n. Beaver. *Lit.*, hat-fur dog.

**'i.lio 'i'i**. n. Small curly-haired native dog, said to be in four colors; reddish-brown (as the fibers of the *hāpu'u 'i'i* tree fern), cream-colored, ashy-gray, and wine-colored.

**'i.lio 'i.ole**. n. Rat terrier.

**'i.lio kawa.ū**. n. A damp dog. *Fig.*, one shivering with cold (said in fun).

**'i.lio kēkēko**. n. Pug-nosed dog.

**'i.lio kia'i hipa**. n. Sheep dog, shepherd dog.

**'i.lio kula 'ō.lohe.lohe**. n. Prairie dog. *Lit.*, hairless dog of the plains.

**ili 'ō.lelo**. nv. A tattletale, talebearer, gossip; to tattle, gossip.

**'ili 'ō.maka**. n. Foreskin.

**'i.lio mā.ku'e**. n. Native dog, brown dog.

**'i.lio mo'o**. n. Brindled dog. (HM 139.)

**'ili omo wai**. n. Suction tube.

**'i.lio 'ō.lohe**. n. Hairless dog; *fig.*, skilled in fighting and robbery. *'iio 'ōlohe kona 'āina* (GP 6-7), his land is fierce as a hairless dog.

**'ili.'ō.pua**. n. A variety of sugar cane like the *kea* but dwarfed. (HP 224, 225.)

**'i.lio pulu**. n. Bulldog. *Lit.*, bull (*Eng.*) dog.

**'i.lio wahine**. n. Bitch.

**'ili pa'a**. n. An *'ili* land division complete in one section, as distinguished from an *'ili lele*.

**'ili paka.lua**. n. Thick, coarse, or wrinkled skin or bark.

**'ili pala.pala**. n. Parchment. (2 Tim. 4.13.)

**'ili pala uli**. vs. Dark-complexioned.

**'ili pale o kā.ma'a**. n. Sole of shoes.

**'ili pā.pa'a**, **'ili pā.pa'a lā**. Sunburned or tanned skin.

**'ili pilo**. Smelly skin, said approvingly of industrious farmers.

**'ili pipi**. n. Leather, cowhide.

**'ili po'o**. n. Scalp.

**'ili po'o.po'o**. nvs. Concave surface; hollow. *Pono 'i'o nō i ka makaaniani 'ili po'opo'o*, good enough for the one with concave glasses [sarcastic].

**'ili.pua.keā**. n. White person. *Lit.*, white flower skin. *Poetic*.

**'ili.ua.ua**. n. A variety of taro with large, thick, firm leaf blades. The corms are very large, with white flesh tinged with pink; good as table taro but not for poi; leaves good for *lū'au*. *Lit.*, tough hide. Also *kalo Pākē*.

**'ili-'ula**. n. Name of a star.

**'ili wahī**. n. Scabbard, sheath.

**'ili.wai**. **1.** nvs. Surface, as of water; level, horizontal, flat. *'Iliwai like*, completely level. **hō.'ili.wai**. To grade or level, as a road. **2.** n. Carpenter's or surveyor's level. **3.** n. Water hose.

**ilo**. nvi. **1.** Maggot, grub, worm; to creep, as worms, to be beset by maggots. Cf. *kuailo*. *Ua pa'apū ko'u kino i ka ilo* (Ioba 7.5), my body is covered with worms. (PNP *'ilo*; cf. Fijian.) **2.** Young shoot; to germinate, sprout. Cf. *hehu*, *'ōilo*. **hō'o.ilo**. To cause germination or sprouting.

**-ilo. hō'o.ilo, hō'ilo**. Rainy, winter-like months, winter.

**ilo.ilo**. Redup. of *ilo 1, 2*; wormy, maggoty; sprouting, germinating. Sorcerers cursed by saying that maggots would eat a victim's body (Kam. 64:123-4).

**-ilolilo. hō'o.ilo.ilo, hō'ilo.ilo**. To predict disaster or misfortune.

**i loko**. See *loko*.

**'i.loli**. **1.** nvi. Unpleasant sensations of pregnancy; emotional disturbances; intense yearning, longing, desire; to suffer such. *He loli ka i'a, 'ioli ke aloha*, sea cucumber, the sea creature, passionate the love [in *hana aloha* prayers with *loli* as an offering, a play on words]. **hō.'i.loli**. To feel the discomforts of pregnancy; to suffer emotional disturbance; to yearn for an absent lover; to be imbued with (often used favorably). *Ka leo 'olu ho'ioli o ka waipahē* (Kel. 10), sweet voice alive with tenderness. *Ho'ioli ke kai*, the sea rages. **2.** vs. Spotted, daubed with color, as tapa; speckled, as overripe pandanus keys. **3.** n. Unpleasant odor, as of shark.

**i luna**. See *luna*.

**'i.maka**. n. Watchtower; lookout, observation point.

**'ime.peli.ala, imeperiala**. vs. Imperial. *Eng.*

**'imi**. v. To look, hunt, search, seek. Cf. *'i'imi, 'imi'imi*, and other phrases with *'imi* listed below. **hō.'imi**. Caus/sim. (PPN *kumi*, PEP *kimi*.)

**'imia**. Pas/imp. of *'imi*. *'Imia aku ā loa'a*, search until found.

**'imi ā loa'a**. nvs. Discoverer; to discover; to seek until found. Cf. *'imi loa'a*. *'Imi ā loa'a ka waiwai*, seek until [you] obtain wealth. *Lilo 'oe me Kapena Kuke ka 'imi ā loa'a o Hawai'i* (song), you and Captain Cook have become the discoverers of Hawai'i.

**'imi 'ēpa**. n. Deceit, troublemaker.

**'imi haka.kā**. nvi. To look for a fight; one doing so, antagonistic.

**'imi haku**. nv. To seek a chief, as of a lesser chief or priest wishing a new master; one who seeks a chief; a chief who marries one of higher rank than himself, or a sister or half sister so that their child will be of still higher rank.
