

Get out! *Aia ka 'ai i kahi 'ē kahi i waiho ai* (Kep. 157), the food is left elsewhere. *Mai kahi 'ē ā noho mai*, from far away but yet sitting here [said rudely of intruders or uninvited guests]. *'Auhea kahi e hele ai?* Where's the place to go? *'Auhea kahi o Kupa mā?* Where's the residence of Kupa and his family? *Ma kahi ho'okahi*, at the same place, at one place. *A koe 'o kahi wale nō e pa'a ana i ka lima* (For. 5:711), only the handle [of the spear] was left. *Ma kahi o 'umi kapua'i*, approximately ten feet. *Ka mea iāia kahi i pa'a ai kona komo 'ana*, the one whose duty it was to register his entrance. *Ā ma kahi o ke komohewa*, in case of trespassing.

kahi.aka. Old var. of *kakahiaka*, morning.

kahi.au. vt. 1. To give generously or lavishly with the heart and not with expectation of return. *Rare*. 2. To polish, as a bowl. *Rare*.

kahi 'ō. See *kahi 3*.

kā.hihi. nvi. Entanglement, perplexity, involvement, blocking; entangled, choked, as by weeds; blocked, involved, as with the law (Mat. 5.40), trapped, framed (slang). Cf. *hihi*. **ho'o.kā.hihi.** To entrap, ensnare, entangle, etc.

kā.hi.hi. Interj. of disapproval or disbelief; the vowels are sometimes nasalized and the last two greatly lengthened, spoken with rising inflection. Horrors! Cf. *kāhāhā, kāhūhū*. *Nui ko'u kāhiti 'ana!* I couldn't believe it [*lit.*, much my disbelief]!

kahi.hihi. Redup. of *kāhihi*.

ka hihi kolu. Same as *ka hili kolo*.

Ka-hihi-kolu. Same as *Ka-hili-kolo*.

kahi hō.'ike.'ike holo.holona. n. Zoo.

kahi holoi pā. n. Sink (basin).

kahi ho'o.ma'e.ma'e. n. Place for cleansing; purgatory.

kahi 'ino. n. Buttocks. (For. 5:703.)

kahi.kahi. Redup. of *kahi 1*. (PPN *tafitafi*.)

kahi kā.lōna. vt. To stretch out smooth by rubbing, as in making tapa. *Lit.*, rub stretch out.

Kahiki. 1. n. Tahiti. Cf. *holokahiki*. *Holo i Kahiki*, sail to Tahiti. The sky was divided (Malo 10) into five areas beginning with the term Kahiki: *Kahiki-moe*, horizon; *lit.*, prostrate Kahiki. *Kahiki-kū*, sky just above the horizon; *lit.*, upright Kahiki. *Kahiki-ka-papa-nu'u*, the next layer; *lit.*, Kahiki the elevated stratum. *Kahiki-kapapa-lani*, high in the sky, almost directly overhead; *lit.*, Kahiki the sky (or god) stratum. *Kahiki-kapu-i-Hōlani-ke-ku'ina*, the sky directly overhead; *lit.*; sacred Kahiki at Hōlani the meeting place. (See Malo 10.) (PEP *Tafiti*.) 2. (Not cap.) nvs. Any foreign country, abroad, foreign. (PCP *tafiti*.) 3. n. A variety of banana, common wild on Maui. Kinds are *kahiki hae*, *kahiki mauki*, and *kahiki puhi*.

Ka-hiki-kolo. n. Name of a legendary tree and place in the uplands of Kaua'i (FS 233), probably a var. of *Kahili-kolo*. Kama-pua'a used the tree as a club with which he knocked away (*kuehu*) his foes' clubs from their hands, enabling him to kill them.

Kahiki-nui. n. Name of a navigation star, said to be named for one of the eight steersmen of Hawai'i-loa.

Kahiki Nui. n. Name of a district or *ahupua'a* on Maui. (Malo 6.) *Lit.*, great Tahiti. (PEP *Tafiti Nui*.)

kahiko. 1. nvs. Old, ancient, antique, primitive, long ago, beforehand; to age; old person. (Usually in the singular; cf. *kāhiko 2, puka kahiko*.) *Wā kahiko*, old times. *Wahi a kahiko* (Kel. 50), said the old people. *Kahiko 'ē*, prematurely old. *E kala kahiko*, gone a long time. *E paupauaho a manakā kahiko 'oe ia'u* (Kel. 60), you would be disheartened, weary, and old before me. **ho'o.kahiko.** To think, act, speak in the old way; to speak of old times; to cling to old ways; old-fashioned; maturity. *He wahine ho'okahiko*, an old-fashioned woman. (PPN *tafito*, base; PCP *tafito*, ancient.) 2. (Cap.) n. Name of the first Hawaiian. (Malo 4.)

kā.hiko. 1. nvi. Finery, ornaments; to wear finery, dress up; to harness (Jer. 46.4). *Kāhiko o ke akua*, adornment of the gods [rain]. *Kāhiko o ka hale*, house adornments

and furniture. **ho'o.kā.hiko.** To dress someone in finery; to adorn, decorate, deck, trim, array; to wear fine clothes. 2. Plural of *kahiko 1*.

kā.hiko.hiko. 1. vs. Somewhat old. 2. Redup. of *kāhiko*, finery. **ho'o.kā.hiko.hiko.** Caus/sim.

kā.hiko kaua. n. War finery, formerly shield, helmet, feather cape.

kahi.kolē. vi. To have lost the red glow of dawn. Cf. *kahikū*. *Ua kahikole ka lā*, the sun is up and has lost the glow of dawn.

Kahi.kolu. n. Trinity, three in one. See *Kū-kaua-kahi*.

Ka-hiku. n. Star name (no data). (Kuhelani.)

kahi.kū. vi. To rise higher, of the sun, to a stage between *kahikole* and *kau i ka lolo* (noon).

kā.hili. 1. nvt. Feather standard, symbolic of royalty; segment of a rainbow standing like a shaft (also a sign of royalty); to brush, sweep, switch (*kā- 2 + hili*). See *uhao* and *kāhili* chants, *'ou'ou 1* and *uluao'a 2*. *Pa'a kāhili*, *kāhili* bearer. *Kū kāhili*, one standing by a *kāhili* or carrying it. *Kāhili pulu*, to clear away mulch. *Haku 'ia na'e ho'i ka hulu o ka moa i kāhili i mua o nā ali'i*; *kāhili 'ia na'e ho'i kō kua* (FS 101), chicken feathers indeed are woven into a standard for the presence of the chiefs; your back is brushed by the *kāhili*. **ho'o.kā.hili.** Caus/sim., to brush or fan gently. 2. n. The crape myrtle (*Lagerstroemia indica*), an ornamental shrub from China, with small oval leaves and panicles of pink, white, or purple crapy flowers. (Neal 618.) 3. n. A small tree (*Grevillea banksii*) from Australia, related to the silky oak, *'oka kilika*, but the leaves with fewer subdivisions and the flowers red or cream-white. This is a later application of *kāhili* to a plant. Flowers not used for leis on head or around neck because of irritating hairs, but made into leis for hats by sewing alternate rows of flower clusters and own leaves on pandanus band. (Neal 321.) See *ha'ikū*. 4. n. *Kāhili* ginger (*Hedychium gardnerianum*), from the Himalaya region; much like the white ginger but with a more open flower head, the flowers with narrow yellow segments and one bright-red stamen apiece. (Neal 253-4.) Also *'awapuhi kāhili*. 5. n. A seaweed, probably *Turbinaria ornata*.

kā.hili.hili. Redup. of *kāhili 1*; to spray. *Kāhilihili ke kai a ka he'e nalu* (UL 36), spraying sea of surfrider.

kā.hili kā.popo. n. Medical combination of juices of the gourd and the *pu'uka'a* sedge.

ka hili kolo. n. Name of a legendary *koa* tree on Kaua'i said to consist of branches without a trunk. *Lit.*, the creeping tangle.

Ka-hili-kolo. n. *Lua* fighting stroke. (Also without *Ka-*; also *Ka-hiki-kolo*.)

kahi lio. n. Currycomb. *Lit.*, horse comb.

kā.hili pa'a lima. n. Small *kāhili* carried in the hand.

kahi moe. n. Place to sleep, bed, cot.

kahina. n. Wood shavings; rubbing, cutting, etc. Cf. *kahi 1*. (PNP *tafinga*.)

kā.hina. v. To knock down, take advantage of, deceive.

Kahina.li'i. n. Name of a legendary chief in whose time was a great sea flood (HM 315), perhaps a *tsunami*. See *kānāwai*. *Kai a Kahinali'i*, flood.

kahi noho. n. Residence, address.

kā.hinu. vt. To rub with oil, grease, petroleum jelly; to anoint (*kā- 2 + hinu*). Cf. *hinuhinu*. **ho'o.kā.hinu.** Caus/sim.

kā.hiō. vi. To lean to one side (*kā- 2 + hiō*). Cf. the more common *hiō*. **ho'o.kā.hiō.** Caus/sim.

kā.hi'o. vi. Topsy.

kahi 'ō. n. High-backed comb with long prongs ('ō) such as worn by the Spanish.

kā.hiō.hiō. Redup. of *kāhiō*.

kā.hi'o.hi'o. Redup. of *kāhi'o*; drunk.

kahi 'ō.mou. n. Back or side comb used to hold the hair in place. *Lit.*, comb to pin down.

kā.hiu. See *pule kāhiu*.

kahi 'uku. n. Fine-toothed comb, as used for removing dandruff or head lice ('uku).

kahi 'umi'umi. nv. To shave the whiskers; barber.
