

kā.hiwa (uli). n. Dark pupil, as of the eye (*kā- + hiwa*). 'O ka 'ōnohi o ka lani nui, 'o ke kāhiwa uli o ka 'ōnohi lani (chant for Lili'u-o-ka-lani), the eyeball of the high chiefess, the dark pupil of the royal eyeball.

kā hiwa. n. Sacred vine. (KL line 379.)

kā.hoa. 1. vt. To strike, break; to strike of a fish at a hook (*kā- 2 + hoa*). *E kāhoa aku 'oe i ke po'o*, strike the head. 2. Same as *kāhoahoa*. 3. nvt. Beginning of a chant, with others then joining in; to begin a chant. 4. Same as *kāhoahoa*, to appeal.

kā.hoa.hoa. vi. 1. To appeal, intercede. *E kāhoahoa aku kāu pule i mua o Kāne i loa'a mai ke ola iki, ke ola nui, a me ke ola ā kau i ka pūaneane*, may your prayer to Kāne appeal for the obtaining of small life, big life, and life extending to vast old age. 2. Redup. of *kā-hoa 1*.

kā.hoaka. n. 1. Phantom, specter, spirit of a living person; sign in the heavens. 2. Kind of sorcery prayer spoken in a moderate or natural voice.

Ka-hoana-kū. n. Unidentified star. (Johnson and Mahelona 43.)

Kaho.'ea. n. Name of a star.

kā.hō.hō. Interj. of surprise or anger. Cf. *kāhāhā, kāhīhī, kāhūhū*.

kāho'i. Interj. indicating surprise, following bases. 'O 'oukou kāho'i (For. 5:129)? What of all of you? *He aha kāho'i kāna i hana ai?* What on earth did he do?

kā.holo. 1. vi. Hasty, nimble, swift, quick; to move fast, progress rapidly. Cf. *holo*, to run; *pule kāholo*. *Ko'i kāholo*, planing adze. *Kāholo ka 'ōlelo*, to speak generally and vaguely without committing oneself. *Kāholo ka 'ike o kēlā wahi keiki 'u'uku*, that little boy is quick in learning. **ho'o.kā.holo**. To cause to hurry; to speed, hurry. 2. vt. To sew with long stitches; basting; sennit lashings on royal canoes (Malo 131). *Lopi kāholo*, basting thread. 3. nvi. The "vamp" hula step, more common in modern than in ancient dance, consisting of four counts: (1) one foot is extended to the side, (2) the other is brought alongside, (3, 4) this is repeated on the same side; then the four steps are repeated on the opposite side; to execute this step. 4. (*Cap.*) n. Name of a star.

kā.holo.holo. Redup. of *kāholo 1*, 2. **ho'o.kā.holo.holo**. Redup. of *ho'okāholo*, to exercise, as a horse; to practice racing; skittering in fishing. *E ho'okāholoholo ana ua wahi pua'a nei*, this little pig hurried.

kāhonua. n. 1. Globe of the earth. 2. Level landing place, as after fording a stream or coming down from a cliff. 3. Dirt embankment.

Ka-ho'o.lawe. n. The only uninhabited major Hawaiian Island. In prehistoric times 80 men, sent from Hawai'i, dug a well ten fathoms deep at Ke-ana-pou (For. 5:200-3). *Lit.*, the taking away [as by currents]. See *Kanaloa 4* and saying, *kūpala 4*.

kahu. 1. n. Honored attendant, guardian, nurse, keeper of 'unihipili bones, regent, keeper, administrator, warden, caretaker, master, mistress; pastor, minister, reverend, or preacher of a church; one who has a dog, cat, pig, or other pet. According to J. S. Emerson 92:2, *kahu* "implies the most intimate and confidential relations between the god and its guardian or keeper, while the word *kahuna* suggests more of the professional relation of the priest to the community." Cf. *kahu hipa*, *kahu ho'oponopono*, *kahu mālama*, *kahu waiwai*, and ex., *'anā'anā*. *Kona kahu*, his attendant. 'O ka 'ilio kahu, the dog's master. *Ho'i nō 'ai i kou kahu*, return and destroy your keeper [sending a curse or evil back to the original sender]. **ho'o.kahu**. To act as a *kahu*; to appoint a *kahu*. *Mea ho'okahu 'ia*, ward, beneficiary of an estate. (Probably PEP *taff,sju*.) 2. vn. To tend or cook at an oven; to build an oven fire; to burn, as lime in a pit; one who tends an oven, a cook. *Fig.*, to seethe with hot rage. *E kahu ana kō ia nei inaina*, the rage of this [man] here is seething. *Kahu ka 'ena*, to attend the heat [to be angry]. **ho'o.kahu**. To make a fire for cooking in the oven; to act as *kahu*. (PPN *tafu*.) 3. Sim-

ilar to *kahukahu*. *Kahu ma ka paha 'ana* (GP 52), pray in chant.

kahua. n. 1. Foundation, base, site, location, grounds, background, platform, as of a house; an open place, as for camping or for sports, as for 'ulu maika or hōlua sliding; playground, arena, stand, stage, courtyard; course, camp; bed, as of a stream. *Fig.*, declaration of principles or policy, doctrine, platform. *Ka Monroe kahua kālai 'āina*, Monroe doctrine about land division. *E hana mua ā pa'a ke kahua, mamua o ke a'o 'ana iā ha'i* (saying), work first to make firm the foundation before teaching others. **ho'o.kahua**. To lay a foundation, establish, found; to camp or be stationed, as soldiers; to settle down and develop a place, as homesteaders. *Ho'okahua ka no'ono'o*, settle down to a task with determination to see it through. *Ko'u noho ali'i i ho'okahua 'ia maluna o kahi pu'u pele*, my kingdom established on a lava hill. (PEP *taff,sju'a*.) 2. Base of a quilt on which the pattern (*lau*) is appliquéd; this base is above the layer of cotton or wool. The *pili* is below it.

kahua. See *moekāhua*.

Kahu'a. n. Name of a star.

kahua hale. n. House foundation or site.

kahua hana. n. Subject, as of a discussion, basis for work; foundation principles, as a political platform; work site.

kahua hehi. n. Threshing floor.

kahu ahi. nv. Fire builder; to build and tend a fire.

kahua hō.'ike.'ike.holo.holona. n. Zoo.

kahua hō.lua. n. Sledding course.

kahua ho'o.lele.leo. n. Radio broadcasting station. *Lit.*, site for making voice fly.

kahua ho'o.lulu. n. Meeting place. Cf. *hale ho'olulu*. *Lit.*, site for shelter.

kahua ho'o.lulu.moku.lele. n. Airport.

kahua ho'o.moana. n. Staging area, as in warfare.

kahua ho'o.uka. n. Battleground; place used for competitive sports or contests. *Lit.*, site for attack.

kahu 'ai. vt. To cook taro or vegetable food; to keep the store of such food; to make poi; a keeper or cook. Cf. *kahu 2*. Same as *kahu umu* or *kahumu*.

kahu 'āina. n. Headman of a land division.

kahua kaha. n. Battlefield.

kahua kaha lewa. n. Air base.

kahua kenika. n. Tennis court.

kahua kinai ahi. n. Fire station. *Lit.*, place quench fire.

kahua kini.pō.pō. n. Any ball-playing area, as a baseball diamond, football field, tennis court.

kahua kolepa. n. Golf course.

kahu akua. n. One who takes care of an image or a god; priest.

kahua le'a, kahua le'a.le'a. n. Playground.

kahu ali'i. n. Royal guardian in the family of a high chief.

kahua moku.lu'u. n. Submarine base.

kahu 'anā.'anā. n. Master or practitioner of sorcery and counter sorcery. See ex., *'anā'anā*. Cf. *kahuna 'anā'anā*.

kahua 'ole. nvs. Ignoramus, one without background, trade, profession, knowledge; to be such.

kahua 'olo.hū. n. Bowling alley.

kahua o Mali'o. n. Place of happiness, comfort, pleasure (named for Mali'o, a mythical woman renowned for entertaining with music and for her ability in love magic).

kahua o nā hōkū. n. Solar system.

kahua pa'a. n. Terra firma, the solid earth. *Fig.*, security.

kahua pā.'ani. n. Stadium; playground or athletic field of any kind. *Lit.*, site for play.

kahu au.puni. n. Deputy or regent in the days of the monarchy. *Lit.*, government caretaker.

kahu 'ekale.kia (ekalesia). n. Pastor of a church.

Ka-huelo-iki. n. Unidentified star name. (Johnson and Mahelona 43.)
