

- (For. 5:131), to place bets. *Ke pau ka 'ai 'ana a ka moa, kākā i ka nuku*, when the chicken finishes eating, it shakes its beak. (PPN *taataa*.) 2. vs. Odorous, either fragrant or otherwise; to make an odor. *Rare*. 3. nvi. To excrete; dirty, excreta (a euphemism, taught to children). 4. nvi. To fish, as for *uhu*, parrot fish, with a square net (FS 39) or *ulua* with hook and line but no pole; net or nets dropped in a semicircle in shallow water, as for mullets or 'ō'io.
- kaka'a**. nvi. To roll, whirl, turn over; to revolve, as a wheel; to turn aside, deviate; rolling, turning, etc. See *maka kaka'a*. **ho'o.kaka'a**. To cause to turn, roll, etc.; to turn somersaults or cartwheels. (PPN *tataka*.)
- kā.kā'a**. vi. To shift or roll, as the eyes.
- kā.kā.āko**. Dull, slow. (AP.)
- kaka'a.lawa**. vs. Far apart, not close. *Kanu kaka'alawa i ka huli*, to plant taro stalks sufficiently far apart.
- Kā.kā.āu-kī**. n. 1. Name of a place at Kohala, Hawai'i, celebrated in song for the tests held there for the presence of sharks: ti stalks ('*au kī*), whose bark had been beaten off (*kāka*), were thrown into the water; if the stalks were pulled under this was a sign of the presence of sharks and the natives climbed the steep cliff trail rather than swim. 2. Name of a stroke in *lua* fighting.
- kaka'a.wale**. Redup. of *ka'awale*. **ho'o.kaka'a.wale**. Redup. of *ho'oka'awale*.
- kakae**. Spry, lively, quick; to run. (And.)
- kaka'e**. Similar to *hakaka'e*, transparent. *Rare*.
- Kā.kā'e**. n. Name of a star.
- kakaha**. Redup. of *kaha* 1, 3. *Kakaha nā maka o ka 'ilima*, the center of the 'ilima flowers turn. (PPN *tataha*.)
- kā.kaha**. n. Strip of barren land near the sea shore; shoal.
- kakahē**. Redup. of *kahe* 1. *E kakahē mai noho'i nā kumu mua i ka wela loa o ke ahi* (2 Pet. 3.12), and the elements shall meet in the great heat of the fire. (PPN *tatafe*.)
- kakahē.ā.wai**. Similar to *kaheāwai*.
- kaka.hele**. To go quickly. (And.). **ho'o.kaka.hele**. To parade, as Lahaina-Luna students. (For. 6:531.)
- kakahi**. vs. Solitary, unique, outstanding. See *pākakahi*. *Kakahi Lahaina i ka malino* (chant for Ka-mehameha I), solitary Lahaina in the calm.
- kaka.hiaka**. n. Morning. *Kakahiaka nui*, early morning. *Kēia kakahiaka aku*, later this morning. (Cf. Tahitian 'a'ahiata, dawn.)
- kaka.hiki**. Var. of *kakahili*.
- kaka.hili**. nvi. Idle chatter; to talk idly; to wander aimlessly. Cf. *hili*, to wander.
- kā.kā.hou**. 1. vt. To torture to death by flaying or piercing. *Lit.*, strike poke. *Rare*. 2. vs. Immature, unripe. *Rare*. Cf. *hou*, fresh.
- kā.kai**. nvt. Handle, as of a bucket, pot, basket, purse; strings by which a netted (*kōkō*) calabash is hung; woman's scarf (Ni'ihau); to tie on; to encircle with a band, specifically, to stretch the taboo cord before the entrance of a chief's house (this cord was said to fall of its own accord if a relative approached). *Kini kākai*, pail with a handle.
- kā.kai-**. See *kakaiawī*, *kākailena*, *kakaiowi*, *kakaipū*.
- kaka'i**. nvt. To walk along with a group; to follow in line, as chickens after a hen; procession; litter, as of pigs. Cf. *kaka'i pali*, *ka'i*. 'Oia nā hōkū he nui wale e *kaka'i hele ana ma ka pōnaha lani* (Kep. 83), there are the many stars moving in groups in the firmament. *Kaka'i ka 'aha*, a prayer is rendered (same as *ka'i ka 'aha*, see 'aha 3). **ho'o.kaka'i**. To lead, take along. (PPN *tataki*.)
- kaka'i.ā.hele**. vi. To go in file, wander. *Ke kaka'iāhele ala lākou*, they went in single file.
- kaka'i.ā.hili**. Var. of *kakahili*.
- kaka'i.ā.lupe**. Same as *kauālupe*.
- kakai.ā.pola**. n. Tail of a kite.
- kā.kala.wī**. n. Ancient name of a disease, the symptoms of which suggest appendicitis in various stages.
- kā.kai.ewa**. vi. Long, fatiguing, as a trip. *Rare*.
- Kā.kai.hili**. n. Name of a star.
- kaka'i.kahi**. vs. Scarce, sparse, rare, few, uncommon; seldom, rarely; precious (in sense of rare, 1 Sam. 3:1). *Kaka'ikahi ka mau'u o kēia 'āina*, the grass on this land is sparse.
- kā.kai.lena**. Same as *kakaiawī*.
- Kā.kā.ili**. n. Name of a star.
- kā.kā'i.hili**. vs. Slow, slow moving.
- kaka.'ina**. n. Sequence, one of a series, branch, success. 'O nā *kaka'ina ame nā loina li'ili'i 'ē a'e o ke 'ano ho'omana* (Kep. 19), sequences and various small rules of a religious nature. (PNP *tatakiina*.)
- kā.kaiowī**, **kakaiowī**. Var. of *kakaiawī*.
- kaka'i pali**. nvs. A series of precipices; consisting of such. *He ala kaka'i pali*, a road following cliff tops.
- kā.kai pauka (pauka)**. n. Powder horn, cartridge box.
- kā.kai.pū**. n. A disease whose symptoms suggest appendicitis.
- kakaka**. 1. nvt. Bow for shooting arrows; crossbow; the shooting of a bow; bent, as a bow; to shoot, as a bow. *Ua mākaukau lākou i nā kakaka* (1 Oihn. 12.2), they were adept at shooting bows. 2. n. Deep-sea fishing with weighted line. 3. Redup. of *kaka* 1. 4. n. A sweet potato, usually qualified by the terms 'ili *pahe'e*, smooth skin, or 'ili *pohole o Keawe*, scraped skin of Keawe.
- kaka.kaka**. Redup. of *kaka* 1.
- kaka.kau**. Redup. of *kakau*, to place.
- kā.kā.kau**. 1. Redup. of *kākau*; to reprint, to rewrite. *E kākākau ana kamali'i i ke kumu*, the children are writing to the teacher. *Kākākau ka 'āina i ka pali*, the scars are engraved on the cliff. 2. n. A cuplike dish, usually of stone, used to hold tapa-printing or tattooing dye.
- kaka.kō**. vs. Poor quality, as of taro not fit for poi. *Rare*.
- kaka.kī**. 1. n. Iron hoop, iron from a hoop. 2. vs. Thin, stooped. *Rare*. 3. n. Name given for a kind of *kala*, a fish. *Rare*.
- kaka.kihi**. vi. To step lightly or softly; to do quietly; to run lightly.
- kā.kā.ki'i**. vs. Clumsy, awkward-moving, gangling, blundering in speech, uncouth in manner and speech; rambling, as a road. *Rare*.
- kaka.kō**. n. Quail.
- kā kā.kou**. poss. Our, ours (*a*-form, plural, inclusive). (Gram. 8.4, 9.6.) (PNP *ta'a tatou*, PCP *taa taatou*.)
- kakala**. Redup. of *kala* 1. (PPN *tatala*.)
- kā.kala**. 1. nvs. Knifelike cartilage near the tail of some fish, as surgeonfish; horn of a fish; cockspur, thorn; rostrum, as of a shrimp; caudal or anal horn, as of a caterpillar; sharp, rough, thorny, craggy; spines on fish fins. *Fig.*, rough, ill-natured, harsh. See *kala* 3, 4; 'ōkākala. *Leo kākala*, harsh, grating voice. 2. n. Octopus hook used with a stone sinker and a cowry shell. 3. nvi. Surf comber; to form combers; to blow in gusts. 4. vs. Mature, of a gourd, with a dry stem.
- kā.kā.lā.āu**. nv. Spear fencing; to fence.
- kakala.'ihi**. Redup. of *kala'ihī*. *He mana kākulu kakala-'ihī* (chant), power established oppressive.
- kaka.lai.ō**. nvi. Creepy sensation due to either cold or fright; to have goose flesh, shuddery feeling. *Rare*.
- kā.kalai.ōa**. 1. vs. Thorny. (Kin. 3.18.) *Lei kākalaioa*, crown of thorns [as worn by Christ]. *Kū kākalaioa*, filled with thorns, wild, rude; to rage. 2. n. Gray nickers (*Caesalpinia major*, misidentified locally as *C. crista*), a straggly bramble, a pantropical vine indigenous to Hawai'i, with thorny branches and leaf stems and with small yellow flowers. Within each large spiny pod are two or three gray marble-like seeds, which are used for leis, also powdered for medicine. (Neal 433.) Also *hihikolo*. 3. n. Yellow nickers (*Caesalpinia bonduc*), today commonly called Hawaiian pearls, similar to the gray nickers, but with yellowish-gray instead of gray seeds. (Neal 433-4.) Also *hihikolo*. See *kinikini* 3.
