

**kakala.keke, katarakete.** n. Cormorant. (Kanl. 14.17.) (Gr. *kata(r)raktes*.)  
**kaka.lama, dagarama.** n. Silver money.  
**kā.kala manini, kā.kala mani.nini.** n. Half-grown *manini*, a fish.  
**kā.kā.lana.** n. Proclamation. Cf. *kala 1*.  
**kā.kala-pī-ka-wai.** n. Sharp spurs of a fighting cock.  
**kā.kala wela.** 1. nv. Scar from burning; to scar. 2. vs. Black with brown markings, of a pig. Cf. *kala wela*.  
**kakale.** Redup. of *kale*. 'Ai *kakale*, poi cocktail, thin poi. **ho'o.kakale.** To make soft or watery; soft, flexible, saggy, soft, limp; to dilute.  
**kaka.lemā, sakarema.** n. Sacrament. See *kakelema*.  
**kakali.** Redup. of *kali 1*. (Isa. 64.4.) (PPN *tatali*.)  
**kaka.lina.** n. Gasoline. Eng.  
**kā.kā.lulē.** vs. Uncertain, variable, equivocal.  
**kā.kā.maka.** nvt. Raw salted meat; to cut raw meat into large pieces and salt it. *Lit.*, chop raw.  
**kaka.mina, katamina.** n. Catmint, catnip. Eng.  
**kā.kā.mo'a.** nvt. Hunks of cooked meat scored and salted for preservation; to prepare cooked meat thus.  
**kakana.** vs. Harsh, rude, ungracious, surly.  
**Kā.kana, Satana.** n. Satan. Eng.  
**kakana.i'i.** Same as *kakana*.  
**kakana.kana.** A grass. (And.)  
**kakana.li'i.** vs. Stunted, wee. Also 'a'anali'i.  
**kakana.lua.** Redup. of *kānalua*; dubious.  
**kakane.** nvi. Blight on plants; blighted. Cf. *kane*.  
**ho'o.kakane.** Caus/sim.  
**kakani.** 1. nvi. Noisy; to make repeated noises, to talk incessantly; pealing, ringing, squeaking. Cf. *kani*. **ho'o.kakani.** To make noises. (PPN *tatangi*.) 2. n. A plant disease in hot areas, 1857.  
**kakano.** Redup. of *kano 1*, hard; to persist, keep on. *Kakano hele*, to keep going on. **ho'o.kakano.** Caus/sim.  
**kaka'o.** Same as *ka'oka'o 1-3*. *Kaka'o ka waha o ka ua, nahua i ka nahele*, lofty the mouth of the rain, pelting down in the forest.  
**kakā.ohi.** Redup. of *kāohi*.  
**kā.kā.ola.** 1. vt. To cut up alive. Cf. *kākāhou*. 2. n. Visible spirit of a living person.  
**kā.kā.ō.lēlo.** nv. Orator, person skilled in use of language; counselor, adviser; storyteller; oratory; to orate. *Lit.*, to fence [with] words.  
**kakapa.** Redup. of *kapa*, edge, border. (Gram. 8.6.) *Ma kakapa o ka loko*, along the edges of the pond.  
**kā.kā.pahi.** nv. To fence with swords; fencing.  
**kā.kā.pala.** n. Dye container, probably so called because the edge of the container was hit (*kā*) with the bamboo stamp to dislodge excess dye before printing the tapa.  
**kā.kā.pua'a.** n. Slab of salted pork.  
**kaka.pila, katapila.** n. Caterpillar (tractor). Eng.  
**kakau.** Redup. and plural of *kau*, to place; to leave imprints; to stand out, as veins. (PCP *tatau*.)  
**kā.kau.** 1. nvt. To write, sign; to print on tapa; to mark out for distribution, as land (Jos. 18:6, 8); writing. (Probably *kā-*, causative + *kau*, to place.) *Kākau wale*, to write carelessly, scribble. *Mea kākau*, writer, author. *Kākau 'ia mai*, written to us (as a report submitted). *Kākau 'ole*, unwritten. *Kākau 'apuka*, forgery. (PPN *tatau*.) 2. nvt. To tattoo; tattooing. (PPN *tatau*, PCP *taatau*.) 3. n. Young but fully marked and fully developed fish.  
**kā.kā.ua.** poss. Our, ours (*a*-form, dual, inclusive; Gram. 8.4.1, 9.6). (PNP *ta'a taaua*, PCP *taa taaua*.)  
**kā.kau ali'i.** n. Royal scribe; writer of chronology or history of chiefs.  
**kā.kau 'euane.lio (ewanelio).** n. Evangelist.  
**kā.kā.uha.** vi. Rigid, inflexible; stretched forth, as the arm (Puk. 6.6); oppressive; to display strength. **ho'o.kā.kā.uha.** To stretch forth (Puk. 7.5), to make rigid; to oppress; to flex muscles, as in desire to show off one's strength.  
**kā.kau hana.** n. Recorder.  
**kā.kau ho'o.pa'a.** vt. To register.  
**kā.kau inoa.** nv. To sign a name, register, as for voting

or as at a university; to endorse, enroll; sign, signature, autograph, registration, recorder. *E kākau inoa 'ia e ka Luna Kānāwai*, shall be signed by the Judge.  
**kā.kau kaha.** nv. To make lines, print, mark, paint, tattoo.  
**kā.kau kā.ko'o.** nv. To endorse; written support.  
**kā.kau kope.** nv. Registration; to copy. *Mea kākau kope*, registrar.  
**kā.kau lēka.** nv. To write letters; correspondence.  
**kā.kau lima.** nv. Handwriting, penmanship; written by hand.  
**kā.kau mo'o.lēlo.** n. Author, writer of stories; secretary or recorder.  
**kā.kau nū.pēpa.** nv. Reporter; to write for newspapers.  
**kā.kau 'ō.lēlo.** nv. Secretary, clerk, scribe; to act as secretary (Kel. 98).  
**kā.kau 'ō.lēlo pō.kolē, kā.kau pō.kolē.** Same as *kākau 'ōlēlo*; stenographer, shorthand.  
**kā.kau uhi.** nvt. Solid tattoo pattern; to tattoo thus.  
**kā.kā.wahie.** n. Moloka'i creeper (*Loxops maculata flammea*); the male is largely scarlet; the female and the immature male are brown with scarlet markings. *Lit.*, wood chopping. Also 'alauahio.  
**kā.kawa.ū.** Same as *nānawaū*.  
**kā.kā.welē.welē.** Same as *kāwelēwelē*. Rare.  
**kake.** 1. nv. Chants with mixed or garbled words, for and by chiefs, with inserted syllables and some secret words (as: *nohouwō o luhunā, nohouwō o lahalō*, for: *no'u 'o luna, no'u 'o lalo*, mine are the chiefs, mine are the commoners); to use this language; play language used for amusement and intrigue; code. *Hula kake*, hula danced to a garbled chant. **ho'o.kake.** To speak *kake*; to speak unclearly. Cf. *holokake, hōkake*. (PCP *tate*; cf. Marquesan *tate*, stammer.) 2. vt. To slip back and forth; to mix, shuffle. **ho'o.kake.** Caus/sim.; to disturb. 3. n. A native variety of sweet potato; the name may be qualified by the term 'ele'ele. 4. n. Cartridge. Eng. 5. n. Jack (instrument). Eng.  
**Kā.keā.** n. Name of a stormy wind. *He Kākea ka makani kulakula'i kauhale o Mānoa* (saying), the Kākea wind that pushes over the houses of Mānoa [said of one who is excessively aggressive].  
**kake.kake.** Redup. of *kake 1, 2*; to jerk, fidget, interfere; to shuffle, as cards. Cf. *hōkakekake*. *E holo kakekake ai ke aho i ka lima* (For. 6:411), the line runs and jerks in the hand. (PCP *tatetate*.)  
**kā.kā.kepa.** Var. of *kākepakepa 1*.  
**kake.kimo.** n. Catechism.  
**kā.kēko.** Powerful, strong. (And.)  
**kakeku.mēno.** n. Catechumen. (Gr. *katechoumenos*, Latin *catechismus*.)  
**kā.kēla.** 1. vt. To perform well. Cf. *kela*, to excel. *He kaka'ikahi loa nā kānaka 'ōpio i hiki ke lanakila maluna ona ma ke kākela 'ana ma kēia mau 'ike apau*, few young men could best him in clever performance of all these skills. 2. n. Castle. Eng. 3. Also *gazela*. n. Gazelle. Eng.  
**kā.kēle.** 1. vt. To rub with oil, to mix or stew with sauce or gravy. Cf. *kelekele*, greasy. *Lawe ipu kakele* (For. 5:81), bearer of ointment calabash. 2. vt. To cast with hook and line, as for *ulua*. *Na'u e kakele a mau ia pua* (song), I will cast and get this flower. 3. vi. To slide, skid, glide, to go rambling at will and hence to do as one pleases. *Kakele mai*, come on; act now. *Nāna i kakele ke kaona lā* (song), she's the one to do the town.  
**kā.kēle.kēle.** Redup. of *kakele 1-3*.  
**kake.lemā, sakarema; kakele.mēneka, sakere-mēneta.** n. Sacrament. (Latin *sacramentum* or Spanish and Portuguese *sacramento*.)  
**kā.kēlo.** Same as *hākelo*. Cf. *kēlo*.  
**kā.kēlo.kēlo.** vs. Slimy, as mucus; to hang, as mucus.  
**kā.kepa.** Similar to common *kīkepa 2*. *Nā lei maile e kakepa ana ma ka 'ā'ā ku'uwelo akula ma ka 'ao'ao*, maile leis crossing at the neck and hanging down on the side.  
**kā.kepa.kepa.** vi. 1. To cross the arms high in front, with hands on shoulders; to cross the hands behind the
