

- a stream (often not preceded by *ke*: Gram. 8.6). *Kū ma kapa*, to stand on the edge; *fig.*, forbidding, unapproachable, unreceptive. *Keiki kapa ali'i* (FS 115), child only one of whose parents was a chief. (PPN *tapa*.) 4. n. Labia. (PCP *tapa*.) 5. vi. To rustle, rattle, splash, as rain. 6. Also *kaba*. n. Cab (a Hebrew measure). (Heb. *qab*.)
- kā.pā.** 1. Same as *puhi kāpā*, an eel. 2. vt. To press, squeeze, as coconut flakes for cream; to strain. *Rare*.
- kā.pa'a.** vt. To hold, as a canoe on its course.
- Ka-pa'a-heo.** n. Name for the nether world, where ghosts of men strove to appease hunger by eating moths and lizards. (Malo 112, 114.)
- kapa-aho.** n. A *tapa* formerly made at Wai-mea, Kaua'i. (GP 8.)
- kā.pa'a.kai.** n. Dish in which fish or meat is salted (short for *kāpī pa'akai*).
- kapa 'ā.pana.** n. Quilt with appliquéd designs. Also *kapa lau*. *Lit.*, piece *tapa*.
- kapa'au.** n. Raised place in the heiau where images and offerings were placed, and where the invisible gods were thought to dwell. Also *nu'u* and *lananu'u*.
- Kapae.** n. Star name (no data). (Kuhelani.)
- kā.pae.** 1. vt. To set aside, turn aside, deviate from, eliminate, discard, remove, lay aside, delete, omit, spare, stow away, cancel, be perverted from; to disqualify, suspend. See *noho kāpae* and *ex.*, *pilipili 1*. *Hiki 'ole ke kāpae*, unavoidable. *Kāpae 'ia*, disqualified. *E kāpae a'e 'oe i kou mana'o huhū*, put away your angry thoughts. *Ua kāpae 'oia i ka 'ōlelo a ka makua*, he disobeyed his parent's teaching. *'A'ole e kāpae nei lā'au iā'oe* (FS 95), this club will not spare you. *Kāpae i ka ihe*, set the spear down [do not fight any more, declare a truce]; throw a spear so that it will not strike a target, especially if the warrior wants to spare his foe's life. See Malo 203. **ho'o.kā.pae.** To cause to turn off, push aside, parry, thrust away, refute an argument. 2. (*Cap.*) n. Name of a trade wind at Hāna, Maui, and at Puna, Hawai'i. (PH 202.)
- kapaea, sapaea.** n. Sapphire. *Eng.* See *kapello*.
- kā.pae 'ō.lelo.** v. To ignore a command; to change the meaning of a word from its original meaning.
- kā.pae.pae.** Redup. of *kāpae*; to hurry. *Kāpaepae akula ia no kauhale*, she hurried away to the household.
- kapa.ha'i.** n. Limit, border, as of land.
- kapa.hulu.hulu.** n. Blanket.
- kā.pa'i.** 1. vt. To slap, pound, as the skin by a masseur; to shatter, as wood (*Maui*). 2. n. Any kind of remedy for external use, especially a ball or pad of medicinal herbs for rubbing on the skin; poultice.
- kapa 'ino.'ino.** n. Sackcloth, as worn by mourners in the Bible (Kin. 37.34). *Lit.*, despicable clothing.
- kā.pa'i.pa'i.** vs. Growing luxuriantly and thriftily, lush, flourishing. Cf. *lupalupa*.
- kapaka.** See *'ōpae kapaka*.
- kā.paka.** n. Container for tobacco, pipe, matches. Cf. *paka*, tobacco.
- kapa.kahi.** vs. One-sided, crooked, lopsided, sideways; bent, askew; biased, partial to one side; to show favoritism. *Lit.*, one side. Cf. *lawe kapakahi*. *Kū kapakahi ka lā ma Wai-'anae* (saying), the sun appears lopsided at Wai-'anae [said by the goddess Hi'iaka while her lover was dallying with someone else, hence said of any unlawful dallying].
- kapa kai.** loc. n. Border of the sea, seashore, seaside, coast; sometimes interpreted as west or *komohana*. (Gram. 8.6.) (PCP *tapatai*.)
- kapa.kā'i.** vs. To wait for. *Rare*.
- kā.paka.kapa.** n. Brief shower, scattered drops (used with *ua*, rain). (Perhaps *kāpakapaka*.)
- kapaka.ke'u.** Redup. of *kapake'u*.
- kapa.kapa.** 1. Plural of *kapa 3*; human crotch; *kilu* quoit shots that stray from the mark. (PPN *tapatapa*.) 2. Redup. of *kapa 2*; to invoke, summon. *Inoa kapakapa*, nickname, fictitious name, pet name, pen name, alias, assumed name. (PPN *tapatapa*.) 3. Redup. of *kapa 5*. 4. vs. Well-off, enjoyable. *Kapa-kapa ka nohona*, prosperous condition. 5. (*Cap.*) n. Name of a star.
- kapa.kapa.lili.** Redup. of *kapalili*.
- kapa.kapa.lulu.** Redup. of *kapalulu*.
- kapa.kō.** vi. To splash, as raindrops on water. *Kāo'o ihola ka ua o Kahana, kapakē a'ela ka wai ma Lo'i-ke'e* (chant), the rains gather at Kahana, splashing on the water of Lo'i-ke'e.
- kapa.ke'e.** vs. Lopsided. Cf. *ke'e*, crooked.
- kapa.ke'u.** vt. To complain bitterly, find fault. Cf. *ke'u*.
- Kā.paki, Sabati.** nvs. Sabbath. *Eng.*
- kapa.kila.** n. Steel armor.
- kapa.komo.** n. Clothing in general. *Lit.*, *kapa* to put on.
- kapa.kū.** vs. Overwhelmed, destroyed. *Hiki ke Kona, ka makani kūla'i kauhale, kapakū ka moku me ka 'āina* (chant for Ke-kā-ulu-ohi), comes the Kona, the wind that pushes over houses, overwhelms the island and the land.
- kapa.ku'ina.** n. Stitched *tapas* for bed covering. Cf. *ku'inakapa*.
- kapa.lā.** Var. of *kopalā*, shovel. *Eng.*
- kā.pala.** 1. nvt. Printing, stamping, blot, daub, stain; to smear, smudge, blot, daub, dab, stain, spot; to paint or print a design, as on *tapa*; smudged, blurred; to spread, as butter on bread. *Kāpala ka leo*, blurred sound (as of a radio). *Kūlina kāpala me ka waiūpaka*, buttered corn. *Kāpala po'omuku kona 'ike*, his is a short daub of knowledge. 2. vi. Cabalistic. *Eng.*
- kā.pala.ki'i.** v. To daub designs, especially to fit ochreous earth in petroglyphs.
- Kapala.kiko.** n. San Francisco. *Eng.*
- kā.pala.lū.** vi. Indistinct, as mumbling; to mumble.
- kā.pala.pala.** Redup. of *kāpala*.
- kā.pala.poi.** nv. To daub with *poi*. *'Aha'aina kāpala poi*, *poi*-daubing party; a person daubed with a finger of *poi* had to provide an extra contribution to the feast; much amusement was afforded among the planners of the feast by attempting to daub one another. Cf. *'aha'aina pī wai*.
- kapa.lau.** n. 1. Quilt with appliquéd designs. Also *kapa 'āpana*. 2. Leaf covering, as placed over a corpse in a pit.
- kapa.lau.ʻt.** n. Plaited ti-leaf textile; ti-leaf covering.
- kapa.lili.** vi. Palpitating, as in fear or joy; trembling, twitching, fluttering, throbbing; waving; quivering, as a leaf in the wind; trilling, as *r*'s in some languages. *Kapalili ka houpo*, the heart is thrilled. *Lohe aku au i ka uwē kapalili*, I heard a terrified, quivering shriek.
- kapa.lō.** n. Tableau, pageant. *Eng.*
- kapa.lulu.** vi. Whirring, as of quail taking flight; buzzing; roaring, as of an airplane; crackling, as of a fire; to whiz. *Manu kapalulu*, quail. *Holo kapalulu*, to zoom. **ho'o.kapa.lulu.** To crackle, roar, etc.
- kapa.moe.** n. Blanket, quilt, bedspread (general name); sleeping *tapa*.
- kapana.** Same as *kapa 3*.
- kā.pana.** n. A slender native plant (*Phyllostegia grandiflora*) in the mint family, bearing paired ovate leaves and white flowers 2.5 cm long. (Neal 732.)
- kapana.hā.** n. Mild insanity. *Rare*.
- Ka-pao.** n. A *lua* fighting stroke.
- Kā.pā.ōka.** n. Sabaoth. *Eng.*
- kapa.olo.nā.** n. Shroud. (Biblical.)
- kā.papa.** 1. Same as *hāpapa 1-3*. 2. vi. Voracious in appetite, destructive. *Niuhi kāpapa o ka moana*, shark of the deep sea, voracious in appetite [an epithet for Ka-mehameha I]. 3. nvi. Rhythmic tapping of canoe side with a paddle to drive fish into a net; to do so. *Kāpapa ulua*, to drive *ulua* thus; *fig.*, to obtain a human victim or sacrifice him (FS 143); priest who makes the sacrifice. 4. vi. To do in unison, as of crowing cocks; all together. *Ā hiki i ka wana'ao, kāpapa ana nā moa*, when morning arrived, the cocks crowed together. 5. n. A variety of sweet potato (no data).
