

kapa pa'ū.pa'ū. See *pa'ūpa'ū 2*, *tapa*.

kapa pe'a. n. Filthy rags; tapa worn by women in the menstruation hut (*hale pe'a*). *Ke kapa pe'a lau'i kolo hului ā kau ana i ke kua* (FS 161), a ragged garment of ti leaves used for a fish dragnet hanging on the back.

kapa pili. n. Lined quilt that is not padded, formerly used as a top sheet (old-time Hawaiians did not put a bottom sheet on top or vice versa, due to strict taboos concerning body contact). *Lit.*, clinging tapa.

kapa poho, kapa poho.poho. n. Patchwork or crazy quilt of varied color or design. *Lit.*, patch quilt.

kapa pulu. n. Padded quilt, comforter. *Lit.*, pad covering.

kapa ua. n. Raincoat.

kapa uhi lio. n. Horse blanket.

kapa.u'u. vs. Splashing, spattering, as fish being driven into a net; fluttering, flapping. *Fig.*, agitated, worried, disturbed (formerly said mostly on Kaua'i and O'ahu). Cf. *kāpeku*. *Ua kapau'u ka lani*, the high chief is greatly disturbed.

Ka-pawa. n. Name of a star. *Lit.*, the *pawa* or predawn hour.

Ka-pe'a. n. Southern Cross. *Lit.*, the cross. (PCP *Peka*.)

kā.pe'a. vt. To seize and hold a criminal; to knock down helter-skelter; to bring false accusation against an innocent person. *Kukulu 'ia mai nā pine, na ia nei e kāpe'a aku* (song), set up the pins, he'll knock them down. (PCP *taapeka*.)

kā.pe'a.pe'a. nvt. Barrier made of crossed sticks; barrier to progress; to cross one over another.

kape.au. vi. To go on hands and knees before high royalty; to act humbly. *Kō ia nei kapeau loa akula noho'i ia a hā'ule ihola, moe malalo o nā wāwae o Kūai-ka-ua-kama*, he crept up, fell down prostrate at the feet of Kūai-ka-ua-kama.

kā.pehe. 1. n. Fellow worker, associate, assistant. 2. nvs. Soft, beguiling, gentle, quiet; soft and beguiling words. Cf. *waipēhē*. *Hele kāpehe*, to go quietly. *Mai ho'olohe aku i kāna kāpehe*, do not heed his soft, beguiling words.

kā.pehi. vt. To throw at, pelt, strike.

kapeilo, sapeiro. n. Sapphire. (Gr. *sappheiros*.) (Mele 5.14.) Cf. *kapila*.

kā.peka. n. Carpet. *Eng.* Now called *moena weleweka*.

kapeke. 1. n. Kind of *malo* dyed one color on one side, and another color on the other side (the wind often blows and exposes [*kapeke*] the color on the reverse side). 2. vi. Exposed, revealed; askew, out of joint; to slip to one side or out of joint, to miss in one's aim. *Kapeke ihola ku'u wāwae a 'eha ke ku'eku'e*, my foot slipped, hurting my ankle. **ho'o.kapeke.** To loosen, set askew; to tilt, as a canoe; to sit or loosen the clothing so as to cause indecent exposure.

kā.pē.ke'i. Var. of *kāpeke'u*.

kā.pē.ke.pē. vi. To walk unsteadily, totter; insecure, unsteady. *Fig.*, doubtful, uncertain, vague, inconstant, fickle. *Pili kāpekepeke*, uncertain relationship. *Ē ka po'e mana'o kāpekepeke*, ye of little faith. *Pa'a kāpekepeke*, vaguely, incompletely recorded, as a legend. **ho'o.kā.pē.ke.pē.** Caus/sim.

kā.pē.ke'u. vs. Quarrelsome, disagreeable, complaining, fault-finding. Cf. *ke'u*.

kā.pēku. nvi. To splash the feet in the water, as in scaring fish; the person who splashes thus. *Fig.*, blustering, harsh. Cf. *kapau'u, peku*. *Kāpeku ka leo o ke kai, 'o ho'oilo ka malama*, blustering the voice of the sea, the month is winter.

kā.pēku.pēku. Redup. of *kāpeku*.

kā.pele. vs. Large, as an abdomen. *Rare*.

kā.pena. n. 1. Captain. *Eng.* 2. Cabin. *Eng.* Cf. *'ōhua kāpena*.

kā.pena.keoe. n. An introduced variety of sweet potato, probably named for a captain.

Kāpena Kuke. n. Captain Cook. *Eng.*

kā.pena.loke. n. Name of an introduced vine, the seeds of which are strung as leis, perhaps *lit.*, Captain Rhodes. *Kaua'i*.

kapene.kine, tapenetine. n. Turpentine. *Eng.*

kā.pī. vt. To sprinkle, as with salt; to salt; to scatter, as sand or salt. Also *kōpī*. *Mai kāpī mai 'oe i ke one*, don't throw sand at me.

kā.pī'i. nvs. Curly; person with curly hair, believed to be strong and hence a good warrior (Malo 201). *Fig.*, warrior, attendant to a chief.

kapī.kala. n. Capital, capitol (city, building). *Eng.*

kā.piki. n. 1. Poi made with an inferior grade of soggy taro. 2. Cabbage (*Brassica oleracea* var. *capitata*). *Eng.*

kā.piki 'ai maka. n. Lettuce. *Lit.*, cabbage eaten raw. *Rare*. See *lekuke*.

kā.piki li'i.li'i. n. Brussels sprouts (*Brassica oleracea* var. *gemmifera*). *Lit.*, small cabbage.

kā.piki pua. n. Same as *kalipalaoa*, cauliflower. *Lit.*, flowering cabbage.

Ka-piko-o-Wā-kea. n. A *lua* fighting stroke. *Lit.*, the navel of Wā-kea. (Also without *Ka-*.)

kapila, sapira. nvs. Sapphire. (Ioba 28.6.) Cf. *kapeilo*. *Eng.*

kā.pili. vt. To build, put together, put on (as glasses), fit together, set (as precious stones), mend, fix, repair, shingle, join, plaster, unite, attach blame, shoe (as a horse). Cf. *pōhaku kāpili wa'a*. *Kāpili hou*, mend, fix, repair. *Ua popopo ke kia moku, ho'i hou 'oia e kāpili*, the mast was rotten, he returned to repair it. **ho'o.kā.pili.** Caus/sim. (PCP *taapili*.)

Ka-pili-mai.'u'u. n. A *lua* fighting stroke. *Lit.*, the clinging [to] fingernail. (Also without *Ka-*.)

kā.pili manu. nv. To catch birds with lime; one who does so.

kā.pili mekala. nvt. Solder.

kā.pili moku. nvt. Shipbuilding; shipbuilder, shipwright; to repair ships. (For. 5:479.)

kā.pili.pili. Redup. of *kāpili*. (Puk. 35.33.) (PCP *taapili-pili*.)

kā.pili wa'a. nv. Process of adding on canoe parts after the hull has been carved and rubbed smooth; to do so.

kā.pī'o. 1. nvt. Bird snare made by bending a sapling over and attaching a baited noose; the bird enters, dislodges a weight, the sapling straightens up and the noose tightens and catches the bird; to catch in such a snare. Also *pī'o 3*. *'A'ohē manu noho i ka lipo e pakele i ke kāpī'o* (saying), no bird of the deep forest can escape the snare [of an expert lover]. 2. nvs. Upright, as supporting corners in a house.

kapī.oka. n. Tapioca. *Eng.*

kā.pī.pī. Redup. of *kāpī*.

kā.pī pua'a. nv. To salt pork; one who salts pork. *Fig.*, dirty wretch.

-kāpō'ai. ho'o.kā.pō.'ai. To rotate, revolve, as in a hula. *Rare*.

Ka-pohā-kō.'ele.'ele. n. Unidentified star, no data. (Johnson and Mahelona 43.)

kā.pō.haku. n. Heap of stones, as thrown (*kā*) from a garden to make room for planting.

Ka-pola. n. Star name (no data). (Kuhelani.)

kā.pola. vt. To bind, wrap, bandage. *Rare*. (Perhaps PCP *taapola*.)

kapola.kā. vs. Mysterious, unfathomable. *No Kū, no Lono, no Kāne ma lāua 'o Kanaloa, no Papa nui aiwaiwa ā kapolakā* (old chant), in honor of Kū, Lono, Kāne and Kanaloa, in honor of great Papa, mysterious and unfathomable.

kapo.lena. n. Tarpaulin, canvas. *Eng.*

kapo'o. Same as *napo'o*. *Kani kapo'o*, loud echoing sound, as of a heavy object falling into water, or of waves booming.

kā.po'o.po'o. Redup. of *kapo'o*; to abound in ruts, as a highway.

kā.popo. See *kāhili kāpopo*.

kapou.lena. 1. n. Jaundice. Cf. *lena*, yellow. 2. vs. Lazy, idle, indolent. Cf. *lena*, lazy.

kapu. 1. nvs. Taboo, prohibition; special privilege or exemption from ordinary taboo; sacredness; prohibited, forbidden; sacred, holy, consecrated; no trespassing, keep out. **ho'o.kapu.** To make taboo, prohibit, sanc-
