

- 'ole, dauntless, quick, alert. *Ku'upau nā hana i ke ākea, ka'uka'u lua 'ole i ka lehulehu* (drinking song), unrestrained doings in public, unchecked by the crowd.
- kau.kaunu.** Redup. of *kaunu*. *Le'a ke kaukaunu i nā pua hala 'ai a ke kīna'u* (Kaua'i song), there is fun in loving the tip of the pandanus fruit of which *kīna'u* eels are fond [if these fruits fall into the sea they are said to be eaten by *kīna'u* eels].
- kau.kepa.** vi. To fall or lie on a slant, as rain; slanting. *Mehe manu lā ka ua e kau kepa nei, e willi nei i luna o ka lā'au* (chant for Ka-Haku-o-Hawai'i), like a bird the rain falls slanting, whirling about on the tops of trees.
- kau.kini, kausini.** n. Cousin. *Eng.*
- kau.ko'a.** Short for *kau 'oko'a*, to place separately; to separate.
- kau.koe.** vt. To continue or persevere in a straight course. *E kaukoe aku 'oe i ka 'imi na'auao*, go on with your education.
- kau.ko'e.** See *kau'o'e*.
- kau.koho pā.loka.** n. Election season, election.
- kau.kolo.** nvt. To creep on, as roots searching for moisture; to chase, follow; to persevere in making a request; creeping; petition. *E kaukolo aku ana au i ku'u akua, e kala mai i ku'u hewa iā'oe* (old prayer), I am pleading to my god, to forgive my wrongs to you.
- kau.kolu.** n. Triple, trinity, group of three (Kep. 27).
- kau.ko'o.** vt. To walk with a cane (*ko'o*); to lean on, rely on, depend on. *Fig.*, old and infirm. **ho'o.kau.ko'o.** To cause to walk with a cane; to walk thus. *Ua loa'a iā 'Alamila ke kuleana e ho'okauko'o aku ai maluna ona i nā lawelawe kōkua 'ana*, Almira obtained the right to depend on him for serving help.
- kau.kukui.** n. Candlestick, lamp stand. *Lit.*, place light.
- kaula.** n. Rope, cord, string, line, strap, thong; lash or stroke, as of a whip (2 Kor. 11.24); arc of a circle in geometry; chain, as used by surveyors and engineers. (PPN *taula*.)
- kā.ula.** n. Prophet, seer, magician. (PPN *taula*, PNP *taula*.)
- Ka'ula.** n. 1. A rocky islet off Ni'ihau. *Ke lei maila 'o Ka'ula i ke kai* (UL 56), Ka'ula wears the ocean as a lei. *'Ai lā 'oe i ka manu o Ka'ula* (FS 97), then rule the birds of Ka'ula [Ka'ula was famous for its birds: see ex., *kē 1, kō'ala'ala 2, puaea*]. 2. Name of a wind associated with Pōhaku-loa, Maui. (For. 5:101.) 3. (*Not cap.*) A sea bird.
- kaula.ahi.** n. Wick.
- kau.lā'au.** nvs. Growing in a tree; to be in a tree; all kinds of epiphytic plants. See ex., *'awa 1. Pīlali kukui kau lā'au* (song), candlenut gum on the trees.
- kau.lā'e.lā'e.** vs. Cloudless, standing out clearly, plainly seen.
- kaula.hao.** n. Chain. *Lit.*, iron rope.
- kaula.hō'ā.** n. Fuse. *Lit.*, ignition rope.
- kaula.ho'o.hē'e.** Same as *kaula.pahē'e*.
- kaula.ho'o.hēi.** n. Rope for lassoing or ensnaring.
- kaula.ho'o.lewa.** n. Bracelets. (Kin. 38.18.) *Lit.*, dangling rope.
- kaula.ho'o.lu'u.kapa.** n. Cord for marking tapa.
- kaula.hope.** n. Line from mast to stern.
- kaula.huelo.** n. Tall strap.
- kaula.huki.** n. Drawstring, rope or cord to pull on.
- kaula.huki.pē'a.** n. Halyard.
- kau.lā'i.** vt. To hang up, as to dry in the sun. (*kau*, to hang + *lā'i*, transitivizer: Gram. 6.6.4.) *Haka kaula'i*, drying rack or frame. *I'a kaula'i*, fish hung or spread for drying. (PPN *tauraki*.)
- kaula.ihu.** n. Line from mast to bow (*ihu*).
- kau.lā'i.iwi.** v. To talk too much of one's family affairs or ancestors, to tell the cherished stories, and chants of one's ancestors (a taunt to those who reveal too much of the Hawaiian past). Cf. *kaula'i.lā*. *Lit.*, to dry out the bones, meaning to expose the bones of the ancestors, a crime.
- ka'ula.iki.** n. Type of pink, smooth, somewhat porous stone.
- kau.lā'i.lā.** nv. To sun, bleach in the sun; sun bath; to talk too much of family and ancestors (cf. *kaula'i.iwi*).
- kaula'ili.** n. Leather rope, lassoing rope, lariat, strap. *Mālama pono 'oe i ku'u kaula'ili, o pa'a aku 'oe i ka ho'ohei'ia* (song), watch out for my leather rope, or you'll be caught in my lasso.
- kaula'ili'ula.** n. Lariat of tanned leather.
- kaula.kā'ili'ili.** n. Line from forward outrigger boom (*iako*) to prow to strengthen the boom in storms. Cf. *kā'ili'ili*.
- kaula.kā.iki.** n. Lacings, cords as those by which the coconut knee drum (*pūniu hula*) was tied to the thigh of the player.
- kaula.kā.ohi.** n. Reins, check line.
- kaula.kau.lā'i.lolō.** n. Clothesline. *Lit.*, line to dry clothes.
- kaula.kau.ō.** n. Towline.
- kaula.kī.** n. Swivel rope.
- kaula.kolo.** n. Towline.
- kaula.kū.pē'e.** n. Rope to tether, as horse, cow, or pig.
- kaula.lei.** n. Cord on which flowers are strung into a lei; cluster of fruit or flowers growing together on a stem like a lei; streamer.
- kaula.ī.** n. Lacing, as for shoes or corset.
- kaula.ī.kā.ma'a.** n. Shoelace.
- kaula.likini.** n. Rigging.
- kaula.lio.** n. Halter. *Lit.*, horse rope.
- kaula.lua.hine.** n. Line running from the prow of a canoe to the after end, used to lash the *'ahu*, or mat, used for protection from high seas. *Lit.*, old woman line.
- Ka'u-lama-ā.kala.** n. Name of a star.
- kaula.maka.** n. Rope made of willow or other green bark or branch. (Lunk. 16.7.) *Lit.*, green cord.
- kaula.malina.** n. Sisal rope.
- kaula.moku.** n. 1. Ship line of any kind. 2. Broken rope, string.
- kau.lana.** 1. nvs. Famous, celebrated, renowned, well-known; fame; to become famous. *Lā kaulana*, day of celebration or festivity, famous day. **ho'o.kau.lana.** To make famous; to spread a report concerning a person or thing. 2. nvi. Resting place, place to put things, placement; restful, quiet (*kau*, to place + *-lana*, nominalizer: Gram. 6.6.2). (PPN *taulanga*.)
- kau.lana'a'ā.** n. Heap of stones.
- kau.lana'āina.** n. Land administrator. (For. 5:441.)
- Kau.lana-a-ka-lā.** n. Name of a star; a poetic name for the west.
- kau.lana-a-Kāne.** n. Resting place of Kāne, said to be on the islet of Ka'ula off Ni'ihau; also a poetic name for the west.
- kau.lana.haka.** n. Bridge, trestle.
- kau.lana.mahina.** n. The position of the moon.
- kau.lana.mū.hē'e.** n. A squid (family Sepiolidae), *Euprymna scolopes*. *Lit.*, resting *mūhe'e*. (Kam. 76:151.)
- kau.lana.ō.lōlo.** nv. Heir by word-of-mouth rather than by written will; to make a will verbally; a verbal will.
- kau.lana.wa'a.** n. Place where canoes stop, as while fishing.
- kau.lani.** vi. To rely on the chief, to support the chief, to put confidence in the chief. *I ke kapu, 'a'ole e pono, 'o ka pono o ka 'āina e kaulani* (chant for Ke-kā-ulu-ohi), in the taboo there is no salvation, the salvation of the land is in upholding the chief.
- kaula.ō.** n. Sprit line.
- kaula.ō.hi'a.** n. Strong outrigger lashing used on deep-water canoes, probably so called because of the hardness of *'ōhi'a* wood.
- kaula.ō.pū.** n. Saddle girth. *Lit.*, stomach rope.
- kaula.pa'a.lima.** n. Leash. *Lit.*, rope held hand.
- kaula.pae.pae.** n. Sheet from boom to after outrigger boom (*iako hope*).
- kaula.pahē'e.** n. Line, as to raise a sail. *Lit.*, sliding line.
- kaula.pā.ū.** n. Line holding in place the canoe *pā'ū*, cover.
- kaula.pū.** n. Ship shroud.
