

- Po'o kea*, towhead, gray-haired person. *One kea*, white sand [this is shortened to *ōkea* or *kea*, as in the expression *kea pili mai*, drift gravel [vagabond]. (PPN *tea*.) 2. n. Breast milk. See *Nu'a-kea*. 3. n. A variety of sugar cane, among Hawaiians one of the best-known and most-used canes, especially in medicine: clumps erect, dense, of medium height; pith white. (HP 223-5.) *Ua ola ā 'ō kō kea*, living until *kea* cane tassels [until the hair turns gray]. 4. n. Name listed by Hillebrand for *kolomona* (*Mezoneuron kavaiense*); see *uhiuhi*. 5. nvs. Share, as of stocks; stocks. *Ku'u kuleana kea*, my shared property. *Eng.* 6. Also *dea*. n. Hart, male deer. (Kanl. 12.15.)
- ke'a**. 1. nvt. Cross, crucifix, any crossed piece; main house purlin; sticks connecting canoes of a double canoe. *Fig.*, to hinder, obstruct, intercept, block; obstruction, barrier; baffled (*fig.*). Used idiomatically like *kana 2* and *ka'e 1*: 'A'ole i ke'a mai ka hahana wela o kēia lā (Kel. 14), there was no limit to the stifling heat of this day. Cf. *ke'ahakahaka*, *ke'apa'a*. **ho'o.ke'a**. To cross, block, obstruct, hinder. (Probably PPN *teka*.) 2. n. Hand, as of bananas. (FS 245.) 3. nvt. Bow, dart; to shoot with bow and arrow (For. 4:259). (PPN *tika*, PCP *teka*.) 4. n. Male animal reserved for breeding; virile male; sire. *Kū i ke ke'a*, like the sire [of a child]. 5. Pleurisy. (AP.)
- ke'a.awai.leia**. n. Fishhook with more than one barb; small stick with hooks at each end and line in the middle, as used for small fish. *Rare*.
- kē.ʻaē**. vi. To saturate, soak in.
- ke'a.haka.haka**. n. 1. Abdomen. (PPN *fatafata*.) 2. Ladder with crosspieces, a poetic reference to the ladders used to scale Kaua'i precipices. *Rare*.
- keahi**. n. A native tree (*Nesoluma polynesianum*), with milky sap and oblong, alternate leaves.
- Ke-ahi-lele**. n. Name of a star that rises in the month of Welehu, accompanied by Ke'alohi-lani. *Lit.*, the firebrand.
- Ke-aho-lehi**. n. A *lua* fighting stroke; fish was taboo to the learner.
- ke'a ho'o.hano.hano**. n. Honorary cross or medal.
- kē'ai**. See *kē 1*.
- keaka**. 1. n. Theater, drama, theatrical. *Eng.* *Hale keaka*, theater building. *Hana keaka*, to act in the theater; show business; a play. *Mea hana keaka*, actor. *Wahine hana keaka*, actress. *Keaka lio*, horse show, circus. *Keaka nika*, minstrel show. 2. Jack (in a deck of cards). *Eng.* 3. vi. To chat, speak. *Eng.*
- keaka hopena kau.maha**. n. Tragedy.
- keakea**. n. Semen. *Fig.*, child, seed. *Pohō i ka mālama i kō ha'i keakea* (saying), bad luck from caring for the children of others [said in anger at a foster child].
- ke'a.ke'a**. Redup. of *ke'a 1*; to object, prevent, oppose; disputed. *Ke'ake'a 'ole*, unobstructed. *Ke'ake'a 'ia e nā au*, blocked by the currents [as a ship]. *E ke'ake'a ai i kā kāua ho'ohiki* (Laie 383), to circumvent our oath.
- Ke-ake-o-Milu**. n. A *lua* fighting stroke. *Lit.*, the liver of Milu. (Also without *Ke-*.)
- keakula, teasura**. n. Pine (RSV), box tree (KJV) (*Buxus sempervirens*). (Isa. 41.19, Neal 520.) (Heb. *teasur*.)
- ke** (verb) **ala**. Same as *ke* (verb) *lā*, but less common.
- ke'a lā.ʻau**. n. A stick game like peewee: one player pries a small stick up from the ground with a longer stick, hits it, and tries to run to a point and back before his opponent can catch it. *Lit.*, wooden cross.
- Ke-ala-ka'a**. n. Name of a star. *Lit.*, the rolling pathway.
- Ke-ala-polo.hiwi-a-Kana.loa**. Same as *Alanui-polo-hiwi-a-Kanaloa*; see *alanui*.
- Ke-ala-polo.hiwi-a-Kāne**. Same as *Alanui-polohiwi-a-Kāne*; see *alanui*.
- Ke-ali'i-o-Kona-i-ka-lewa**. n. The star Canopus. *Lit.*, the chief of the south in the heavens. Also *Ali'i-o-Kona-i-ka-lewa*.
- Ke'alohi**. n. Name of a star that appears on the night of Hoaka in the month of Ka'aona after the disappearance of Pau-ahi-lani; it in turn vanishes in Welehu. *Lit.*, the brightness.
- Ke'alohi-lani**. n. A star that rises on the night of Maui in the month of Welo and continues through the month of Māhoe Mua, when it vanishes on the night of Muku. A ring around it is said to portend a coming revolution. *Lit.*, the heavenly brightness.
- kēāmaka. ho'o.kē.ā.maka**. Selfish, ungracious, as one eating in the presence of others; partial; partiality.
- Ke-ā.mio**. n. A *lua* fighting stroke. *Lit.*, the gusty one. (Also without *Ke-*.)
- kea.nahā**. n. A specially built place reserved for the high chief on the platform of a double canoe.
- Ke-ao-lewa**. Same as *Ke-ō-lewa*.
- ke'a.pa'a**. n. Human chest. *Lit.*, solid cross.
- ke'a papa nu'u**. n. Firmament. (Kam. 64:13.)
- ke'a pua**. v. To shoot or slide arrows made of the stems of sugar-cane tassels.
- Ke'a 'Ula.ʻula**. n. Red Cross.
- Ke.au.mā.hina**. n. A variety of sweet potato.
- Keawe**. n. Name of a southern star, said to be named for an ancient chief.
- Ke-awe.awe-Maka.li'i**. n. Perhaps the constellation Pleiades. (Kuhelani.)
- ke'e**. 1. nvs. Crookedness; fault, defect, flaw, deformity; crooked, bent, full of faults. *Nānā ke'e*, to look at with disfavor, look for faults. 'A'ohe pu'u, 'a'ohe ke'e, no physical defects, no flaws [common description of a handsome person]. *Noho ke'e*, to sit crookedly; in disagreement, opposition. **ho'o.ke'e**. To make a turn, as in cutting paper or cloth; to turn, as in walking; to bend, form an angle. *Ho'oke'e i ka wāwae*, to walk by crossing the feet one in front of the other, as in some kinds of square dancing. (PPN *teke*.) 2. Same as *ke'ena*; nook. *Rare*. 3. n. A stone used for adzes.
- kē.ʻē. ho'o.kē.ʻē**. To shun, slight, avoid. Cf. *kē 1*.
- ke'e.hana**. n. Any footrest, footstool, footprint; ground or floor stamped on or trodden on. (Probably *ke'e* + *-hana*, nominalizer; *ke'ehi 1*, below, is probably *ke'e* + *-hi*, transitivizer. See *papa he'ehana* and Gram. 6.6.2.)
- ke'e-**. See *ke'ehana*, *ke'ehi*. (Probably PPN *teke*.)
- ke'e.hana wā.wae**. n. Footstool (Isa. 66.1), footrest.
- ke'e.hau**. vi. To farm at night, especially during the moonlight nights of Akua, Hoku, and Māhealani. *Rare*.
- ke'ehi**. 1. vt. To stamp, tramp, step, tread; to brace with the feet; to rebel against, repudiate; to strike against, to put foot into stirrup in mounting a horse; to trip; not to tolerate, to "put the foot down" in ending a situation; to get in by stepping up, as into a vehicle. *Ke'ehi akula ia i kekahi wāwae maluna o kekahi wāwae, ā hina ihola 'o Nūnū i lalo* (FS 147), tripping one foot over the other, Nūnū fell down. *Ke'ehi lō'ihī*, full pace; forward march. *Ke'ehi pōkole*, short step, half step; mark time. (PNP *takafi*.) 2. n. Stirrup. 3. n. Narrow space between top edges of house thatching.
- ke'e.hia**. Pas/imp. of *ke'ehi 1*. See ex., *kauoha*.
- ke'ehi ka'a**. Same as 'a'e ka'a.
- ke'ehi.lae**. vs. Haughty, disdainful, assuming an air of superiority. *Lit.*, treading brow. *Rare*.
- ke'e.hina**. n. Footrest, footstool, position where one stands, stance, firm position, place.
- ke'e.hina hana**. n. Solution, remedy.
- Ke'ehu.hiwa**. n. Name of a star visible on the night of Muku in the month of Hinaia'ele'ele, rising with Lua-ho'omoe.
- ke'e.ke'e**. 1. Redup. of *ke'e 1*. **ho'o.ke'e.ke'e**. Redup. of *ho'oke'e*; zigzag, angular; zigzag lines, as in a mat motif. Same as *kīke'eke'e*. (PPN *teketeke*.) 2. Same as *kekē*, surly, cranky.
- ke'e.ke'ehi**. Redup. of *ke'ehi 1*. *E ke'eke'ehi kūlana i pa'a*, tread firmly in your stance.
- ke'e.ke'e.hia**. Redup. of *ke'ehia*.
- ke'e.ke'e nuku**. vt. To threaten, scold loudly.
- ke'ele**. vs. Great, excessive. *Ke'ele ka pī'ō'ō o ka ma'i*,
