

- the patient was greatly troubled. *Ke'ele ku'u aloha i ku'u kama*, great is my love for my child. *Ke'ele 'āwa'a ke ala*, the road has many gullies.
- ke'ē.moa**. 1. vs. Sour, bitter, crabbed, surly, ill-natured, turning against friends (frequently follows 'ōpū, disposition). **ho'o.ke'ē.moa**. To behave thus. 2. n. Rump bone of a chicken.
- ke'ēna**. n. Office, room, booth, closet, stall, vault, studio, nook, cranny; drawer of a bureau (*rare*); department, board, bureau; memory (*fig.*). *Ke'ēna pale ahi*, fireproof vault. *Pau ka mo'olelo kaulana o Kawelo*, a koe paha kekahi ma nā ke'ēna 'ōpū o ka lehulehu (FS 113), the famous story of Ka-welo is over, but some of it perhaps remains in the crannies of the hearts of the people.
- Ke'ēna Hā.lā.wai**. n. Assembly Hall, where the Territorial House of Representatives met.
- ke'ēna hana**. n. Place to work, workshop, office, laboratory.
- ke'ēna ho'o.nā**. n. Office where land claims were adjudicated by the Board of Commissioners to Quiet Land Titles.
- Ke'ēna Ho'o.nā'au.ao o ka Lehu.lehu**. n. Department of Public Instruction.
- ke'ēna kā.kau kope**. n. Recorder's office.
- ke'ēna kalaunu**. n. Throne room.
- ke'ēna kapu**. n. Taboo room; tabernacle (Puk. 25.9), sanctuary (Puk. 25.8), private room.
- ke'ēna koho pā.loka**. n. Voting booth.
- Ke'ēna Kope**. n. Bureau of Conveyances.
- ke'ēna noho**. n. Apartment.
- Ke'ēna Uku Ho'o.mau**. n. Pension Board.
- ke'ēna waiho**. n. Closet.
- ke'eo, ho'o.ke'eo**. Same as *ka'eo*.
- keha**. nvt. Height, pride, dignity; lofty, high, prominent; majestic, dignified; to brag, boast, praise; to rise to the top. *Fig.*, head. *Ka lā e keha iho ai kō au hou* (Kel. 145), the day your new era boasts of. *Kau ke keha i ka uluna*, the head rests on the pillow [work is done]. *Ki'eki'e kau keha i luna*, high above it rests. *Moe keha*, to lie with the head on a pillow. *Ke keha nei 'oe i kō laki*, you are bragging of your luck. *La'i ke keha o ka nohona*, peaceful the dignity of life. *Kaha ka'akepa ka 'olelo i Hihimanu*, toplofty and from side to side goes the talk at Hihimanu [said of a boaster who keeps repeating; Hihimanu is a Kaua'i peak]. **ho'o.keha**. To cause height, pride, boasting, etc. Same as *keha*.
- kehaka, tehasa**. n. Badger. (Hebrew *tahash*.)
- keha.keha**. Redup. of *keha*; to flaunt. *Kau kehakeha Nu'u-anu i ka makani, wehiwehi i ka holu a ke kāwelu* (song), proudly stands Nu'u-anu in the wind, adorned with the ripple of *kāwelu* grass. **ho'o.keha.keha**. To act proudly; to cause pride.
- kē.hau**. n. 1. Dew, mist, dewdrop. See ex., 'ōpū 2. 2. (*Cap.*) Name of a gentle land breeze, as of West Hawai'i; Ka-pa'a, Kaua'i; Kula, Maui; Hālawā, Molo-ka'i and O'ahu. (For. 5:97.)
- kē.hau anu**. n. Cold dew, frost.
- kē.hau.pā'a**. n. Ice. (GP 20.)
- kehe**. Var. of *ke'e l*. *Ke-ala-kehe* (Kona place name), the winding path.
- Kē.hela**. n. Name of a star.
- kehena**. n. 1. Place where refuse is thrown and burned, dump. 2. (*Sometimes Cap.*) Gehenna, hell. (Hoik. 1.18.) *Eng.*
- kē.hō.hō**. interj. Bray, to bray, as a donkey.
- Ke.ho'o.ēa**. n. Constellation name. See *Keoe*.
- kēhu**. Var. spelling of *ke ehu*. *Kāne ali'i i kēhu kai*, Kāne, chief in the sea spray.
- kē.hue**. vs. Yellowish, of soil.
- kei**. 1. nvt. To glory in, take pride in; dignified, proud, glorious; one's pride and glory. Cf. *ha'akei*. *E Ka-malama iki ku'u pōki'i, e kei ka noho* (FS 67), o little Ka-malama, my favorite younger brother, may you act with dignified pride. *E kei a'e ana au i ku'u keiki*, I'm glorying in my boy. *Kei ka nani o 'Iesū!* How glorious is Jesus! **ho'o.kei**. Caus/sim. 2. n. A hard rock from which adzes were made.
- kē.ia**. demon. This, this person, this thing; the latter. Cf. Gram. 8.3 For *kēlā mea kēia mea see kēlā . . . kēia*. *Kēia pule a'e*, next week. *A me nā pilikia o kēia*, and the troubles of the latter. *E hele ana kēia i ka hana*, this person is going to work; work; I'm going to work. [Note use of *kēia* for "I."] *Nā kānāwai . . . e ho'opau 'ia, a ma kēia ua ho'opau loa 'ia nō*, the laws . . . are to be revoked, and hereby are revoked. *Kēia mau mea*, these things. (PPN *ee*, PCP *teeia*.)
- ke'ia**. Var. of *kēia*.
- kei.kei**. Redup. of *kei*. *Keikei kūlana hale wili, 'a'ohē mea hana o loko* (chant), nice-looking spot has the sugar mill, but nothing doing inside. **ho'o.kei.kei**. Caus/sim.
- keiki**. 1. nvi. Child, offspring, descendant, progeny, boy, youngster, son, lad, nephew, son of a dear friend; calf, colt, kid, cub; worker; shoot or sucker, as of taro; to have or obtain a child; to be or become a child. Cf. *keiki kāne*. *Kāu keiki*, your son. *Keiki a ka pueo*, child of the owl [one whose father is not known]. *Keiki hānau o ka 'āina*, a native son, one born on the land. *Ua keiki kākou no ke Akua* (Rom. 8.16), we are the children of God. (PCP *t(a,ejiti)*.) 2. n. Gauge, as on a sewing machine. *Eng.*
- keiki 'ai wai.ū**. n. Suckling child. *Lit.*, child consume milk.
- keiki ali'i**. n. Prince, child of a chief.
- keiki 'alu.'alu**. n. A premature baby.
- keiki hanauna**. n. Nephew or niece.
- keiki hē'e wale**. n. Miscarried foetus. *Lit.*, child slide without cause.
- keiki hele kula**. n. School child.
- keiki hipa**. n. Lamb. *Lit.*, sheep (*Eng.*) offspring.
- keiki kame.ha'i**. n. Illegitimate child whose father is not definitely known. *Lit.*, wonder child.
- keiki kāne**. n. Boy, lad, son.
- keiki kao**. Same as *kao keiki*.
- keiki lawe nū.pēpa**. n. Paper boy.
- keiki.mahine**. An old spelling of *kaikamahine*.
- keiki makua 'ole**. n. Orphan. *Lit.*, child without parent.
- keiki manu.ahi**. n. Illegitimate child. *Lit.*, gratis child.
- keiki mea makua**. n. A child with parents who provide good care and affection; people who have important parents.
- keiki papa**. n. Native whose ancestors for several generations back were natives of the same place.
- keiki papa.kema**. n. Godchild. *Lit.*, baptismal (*Eng.*) child.
- keiki pipi**. Same as *pipi keiki*.
- keiki po'o 'ole**. n. Illegitimate child. *Lit.*, headless child.
- keka, sēka**. n. Sex, gender. *Eng.*
- kekahi**. article. A, some, one, few, other, another, a certain; besides, too, also, including, moreover, likewise, someone, anyone, companion, fellow worker, spouse. *Kekahi lā*, some other day, a certain day. (Gram. 10.1.) *Kekahi kanaka*, someone else, someone, somebody. *Kekahi mea*, someone, else, something else, something. *Kekahi wā, kekahi manawa*, sometime, some other time. *Na'u kekahi*, give me some. *'O au kekahi e hele*, I'm going too. *'A'ole 'o au kekahi*, I'm not either. *Pehea kekahi o 'olua?* How's your companion (wife, colleague)? *'O ka i'a kekahi na ke akua*, the fish also for the god. *Eia kekahi*, moreover, furthermore, also. *I kekahi ā i kekahi aku*, to one or the other, alternatingly. *Ua kama'ilio aku nā moho kekahi me kekahi*, the candidates conversed with one another. (PEP *tetasi*.)
- Ke.kahuna**. n. The book Ecclesiastes.
- Ke-kai-hili**. n. Name of a southern star.
- kē.kake**. n. 1. Donkey, jackass. *Eng.* Also *'ēkake, iākake*. 2. Same as *piula*, a card game.
- keka.kia, setadia, sedatia**. n. Stadia, in surveying (RSV), furlong (KJV). (Hoik. 21.16.) *Eng.*
- ke.kaloa-kā-maka.maka**. n. A religious service, especially for dedication of timber for a temple building, or
