keka.mekēle, dekameterere. n. Decimeter. *Eng.*

Ke-kau-hiwa-kā. n. Star appearing on the night of Hoaka in the month of Welehu and vanishing on the night of Muku in the same month. Other stars perhaps rising at about the same time are Hi'i Lei, Hi'i Kua, Pā-kōnane, and Kahuli-ali'i.

kekē. Same as 'akekeke, turnstone.

kekē. 1. nvi. Scolding, shrieking angrily; exposure of the teeth, as in derision, anger, or hypocritical smiles; surly sharp-tongued, cranky; to crow, as a rooster. Cf. *kekē niho, kekē nuku*. **ho'o.kekē, ha'a.kekē.** To scold, expose the teeth, etc. 2. vs. Bony, skinny, thin. *Ua hele wale ā kekē nā iwi*, so thin that the bones show. 3. Indecent exposure by a woman or girl; admonition to a female to sit properly. **ho'o.kekē.** Caus/sim.

kē.kē. 1. nv. Distended, enlarged, as a stomach in pregnancy; big-bellied. Cf. *kēkewe*. 2. A kind of fish (And.), perhaps a variant name for 'o'opu hue, puffer fishes.

-kē.kē. ho'o.kē.kē. Redup. of *ho'okē*. *Ka ho'okēkē o nā kānaka*, the shoving of the people.

kekēa. n. Albino. Cf. *kea*, white. (PPN *tetea*.)

kekē'e. 1. Redup. of *ke'e* 1, but more common; distorted, crooked, twisted. *Fig.*, unrighteous, erroneous, distorted. *Ha'ina keke'e*, irregular verb. *E like me ke keke'e o ka lālā lā'au, pēlā nō ke keke'e o kona aka* (saying), like the crookedness of the tree branch, so the crookedness of its shadow [like father, like son]. **ho'o.-kekē'e.** To crook, bend, twist out of shape, pervert. 2. Same as 'aha, a fish. (And.)

kē.kēkaha. Same as *kīkahakaha*.

kekēko. vs. Small and ugly, with pug nose.

kekēla. 1. Same as *kelakela*. 2. Also *kedera*. Cedar. (Nal. 5.10.) *Eng.* 3. Also *sēkēla*. n. Shekel. (Puk. 30.13.) *Eng.*

kekēle, degerē. n. Degree, as in latitude, music; an academic degree. *Eng.* 'Elua kekele o ka pepehi kanaka, second-degree murder. *Mea hō'ike kekele* (2 Nal. 20.11), sundial; *lit.*, thing showing degrees.

kekēle ho'o.hano.hano. n. Honorary degree.

kē.kē.mapa, Dekēmaba. n. December. *Eng.*

kekēne. vs. Evilly disposed, jealous. 'Opū *kekene*, evil disposition.

kekē niho. vs. Surly, cross, cranky, violently rude, needlessly and unbearably insulting, snarling, often in the sense of making threats that may not be carried out; to shriek in anger.

kekē nuku. About the same as *kekē niho*, but with more verbalization and scolding; sharp-tongued. *Lit.*, scolding beak.

kekēpa. Redup. of *kepa* 1.

kē.kē.pue. 1. vt. To shun others; to withdraw from others, as in shame. 2. (*Cap.*) n. Name of a star.

kekē.ue, kekewe. vi. To gossip maliciously, slander, defame. 'Opū *kekēue*, evil-hearted, malevolent.

kē.kewe. vs. Bloated, swelled, as with dropsy; so fat that the stomach overhangs. Cf. *kēkē*.

keki.mala, dekimala. nvs. Decimal. *Eng.*

kekō. n. 1. Monkey, ape; said to be an ancient name for a small and ugly creature, especially with a pug nose. *Hana kekō*, foolish or ugly behavior. 2. Sago. *Eng.*

kekō.kekō. Same as *kekēko*.

Keko.kia, Secotia. nvs. Scotland; Scotch, Scottish. (*Eng.*, Scotia.)

kekō.leka, setoreka. n. Stork. (Zek. 5.9.) *Eng.* Also *kikonā*.

kekōna, sekōna. Second (the time unit). (Hal. 30.5.) *Eng.*

kekū. v. To repulse, shove away, nudge. **ho'o.kekū.** Caus/sim.

kekū.kekū. Redup. of *kekū*.

kēla. 1. vs. Excelling, exceeding, projecting beyond, reaching high above; to jut out, excel. Cf. *kākēla, pākēla, po'okēla* and ex., 'oi 2. *Hanohano Hā'upu kēla*

i ka lani, glorious (Mt.) Hā'upu reaching high in the sky. **ho'o.kēla.** To outdo, surpass, excel, exceed; to show off, try to excel, show preference; higher, superior, vain. 2. Also *sēla*. n. Sailor. *Eng.* 3. n. Tailor. *Eng.* 4. Also *gera*. n. Gerah. *Biblical. Eng.*

ke (verb) **lā.** Part. denoting present tense at a distance from the speaker. Cf. *ke* (verb) *nei* and Gram. 5.3, 8.3. (PCP *te* (verb) *laa*.)

kē.lā. demon. That, that one, he, she, it, that person or thing; the former. See *kēlā . . . kēia* below and Gram. 8.3. In connected discourse or narration, *kēlā* preceding a noun means "the" in the sense of aforementioned. *Kēlā mau mea*, those things. *Ua hele aku nei kēlā i ka hana*, he has just gone to work. *Ka mea kūpono i ka 'ike hapa o kēlā*, the proper thing for the limited knowledge of the former. *Kēlā pule aku nei*, last week. *Kēlā pule aku nei a ia pule aku*, week before last. *Kēlā Pō'ahā aku nei*, last Thursday. (PNP *teela*.)

kelaka, tēraka. n. Tract. *Eng.* *Kō 'Amelika 'Ahahui Kelaka*, American Tract Society.

kē.lā. . . . kē.ia. demon. This and that, all, every, everything, here and there; miscellaneous, various (*kēlā* always precedes *kēia*: see Gram. 11.2.) 'O *kēlā ai'ole* 'o *kēia*, this or that, alternating. *I kēlā me kēia lā*, daily. *I kēlā me kēia pule*, weekly. *I kēlā me kēia makahiki*, yearly. *I kēlā a me kēia 'elua makahiki*, every other year. *Kēlā mahina kēia mahina*, every month, monthly. 'A'ohe pau pono o kāna pūlumi 'ana, o *kēlā me kēia pau*, she did not sweep thoroughly, just here and there and finished, just a lick and a promise. 'O *kēlā mea kēia mea e makemake ana i ka lio, e hele mai 'oia*, whoever wants a horse, let him come. *Ua ha'i 'ia ka lono i kēlā mea a me kēia mea o lākou*, the news was told to all of them.

kēla.kēla. Redup. of *kēla* 1. *Hō'ike a'e 'oe i kou nani, ka mālamalama 'oi kelakela (mele for Ka-lā-kaua)*, reveal your glory, the light penetrating farthest. **ho'o.kēla.-kēla.** To brag, show off, flaunt, display; disrespectful, overbearing, conceited. *Nā hana ho'okelakela*, extravagant display. *Ua ho'okelakela ka mea hewa i ka makemake o kona na'au* (Hal. 10.3), the wicked one boasts of his heart's desire.

kelaki, keraki. n. Celery (*Apium graveolens*) (Neal 659.) *Eng.*

kēla.kio, keratio. n. Carob tree (*Ceratonia siliqua*), somewhat like the algaroba; in Luke 15.16 Hawaiian *hua keratio* corresponds to English pods (RSV) or husks (KJV). (Neal 421.) (Gr. *keration*.)

kēla.kōna, deragona. n. Dragon. (Hoik. 12.3.) *Eng.*

kēla (tēla) lolē. n. Tailor, dressmaker. *Lit.*, clothes tailor. *Eng.*

kelama, derama. n. Dram (the weight or coin). *Eng.*

kēla.moku. 1. n. Sailor. *Lit.*, ship sailor (*Eng.*). 2. n. Checkered jacket; the material from which it is made. 3. nvi. A hula step invented by Hawaiian sailors: one foot swings alternately on ball and heel of foot, the other points with the toe front and back four times, then reversed; knees are bent, arms out, bent at elbows with hands up and fingers often snapping, swaying with the body; to dance thus.

kēla.pima, serapima. n. Seraphim. (Isa. 6.2.) *Eng.*

kē.lau. vi. To put out first leaves. *Rare.*

kēla.wini. n. Gale. *Lit.*, wind gale. *Eng.*

kele. 1. nvs. Watery, muddy, wet, swampy, greasy, fat, lush. *Fig.*, impurity. Cf. *kelekele, makele, 'ūkele. Wao kele*, forested uplands. *Moku kele*, district surrounded by water; submerged island. **ho'o.kele.** Same as *ho'okelekele*. (PCP *tele*.) 2. nvi. To sail; reached by sailing; flight, sailing. Cf. *pōhaku kele. Awa kele*, harbor that may be reached by sailing. *He moku kele i ka wa'a*, an island reached by canoe. *Momoku ahi kele kahi*, firebrand lighted at one end only before being hurled over a cliff. *Momoku ahi kele lua*, firebrand lighted at both ends. **ho'o.kele.** Steersman, helmsman, navigator; to sail or navigate, as the master of a ship; to steer; to drive, as a car. *Fig.*, to conduct any busi-
