- kī hō'alu.** n. Slack key (the first and last strings of the guitar are tuned to D, instead of E; the strings are picked individually and are not chorded).
- kī.hōe.** nvi. To lead a roving life, without fixed abode, wander; vagabond.
- kī.holo.** n. 1. Large wood fishhook, as used for sharks and large fish. 2. Large fish net about 20 fathoms long, held by a canoe at each end. 3. Long ti-leaf food package, more commonly called *holo'ai*.
- kī.honua.** n. Side or bank of a canal or ditch.
- kī ho'o.ikaika.** n. Staccato mark (music); small dot or wedge placed over a musical note.
- kī ho'o.ku'u.** Same as *kī hō'alu*.
- ki'i.** 1. n. Image, statue, picture, photograph, drawing, diagram, illustration, likeness, cartoon, idol, doll, petroglyph; features, as of a face; plans, as for a house; carved, as end of an 'auamo pole. Cf. *akua kā'ai, hula ki'i, kaha ki'i, ki'i 'ōnohi, na'ana'a 1, pa'i ki'i. Kona ki'i*, his picture, statue (of him). *Kāna ki'i*, a picture (or statue) by him or owned by him. *Pepa ki'i*, joker, in deck of cards. *Ki'i maka nunui*, prominent, wealthy, or important person, VIP; *lit.*, big-eyed image. *Ki'i maka li'ili'i*, ordinary person; *lit.*, small-eyed image. 'O *ke ki'i nō kēlā o ka makuahine*, he's the image of his mother. *He 'oko'a kona ki'i a me kona kūlana* (FS 279), her features and appearance were different. (PCP *tiki*.) 2. vt. To fetch, get, procure, send for, go after, summon, attack; to seek for sexual ends. See *maka ki'i. ho'o.ki'i*. To send, have sent for; to take away (Isa. 34.4.) (PCP *tiki*.) 3. vi. To try and, go and (idiomatic). See ex., *lololole. E ki'i ā loa'a ā loa'a 'ole mai paha*, go and get or perhaps don't get. 4. nvi. Hula step: one foot points to the side, front, and back; then the other foot does the same. Also *wāwae ki'i*, fetching step. 5. Same as *'alani*, orange. 6. n. Gesture, as in hula.
- ki'i.** 1. See *hāki'i, hīki'i, māki'i, nāki'i, nīki'i*, all meaning to tie, bind. (PCP *-tiki*.) 2. *ho'o.ki'i*. Var. of *hōki'i*, thin, wasted. (Isa. 34.4.)
- ki'i akua.** n. Idol, image.
- ki'i.hei.** n. Lashing of wall plate to wall post.
- ki'i.heke.kē.** n. 1. A variety of taro. 2. A variety of sweet potato.
- ki'i.hele.** nvi. Gadabout, wanderer; to gad about, wander, on the move. Cf. *ki'inoho*.
- ki'i.helei.** vi. To stand, sit, or walk with legs wide apart, straddle; straddling.
- ki'i ho'ā.kaaka.** n. Illustration, picture. *Lit.*, clarifying picture.
- ki'i hō'aka.aka.** n. Cartoon. *Lit.*, picture to cause mirth.
- ki'i ho'o.hehe'e'ia.** n. Molten or cast image.
- ki'i ho'o.hene.hene.** n. Caricature, mocking picture.
- ki'i ho'o.laha.** n. Poster. *Lit.*, advertising picture.
- ki'i ho'o.lele.** n. Enlargement of a picture.
- ki'i ho'o.lele aka.** n. Slide picture shown on a screen by a projector. *Lit.*, image enlargement.
- ki'i ho'o.weli.weli.** n. Scarecrow, terrifying image.
- ki'i hua.** nvi. To make gestures in the *hula pū'ili* and *hula 'uli'uli* imitative of the words of the chant; these gestures.
- ki'i kā.lai'ia.** n. Carved image, graven image.
- ki'i kapu.** vt. To fetch something, as greenery for an altar, with observation of taboos.
- ki'i.kau.** n. Drifting clouds of different colors, including black and white.
- ki'i.keā.** n. Ointment made of breadfruit bark crushed with thin young coconut leaves.
- ki'i.ki'i.** 1. Redup. of *ki'i* 2. *ho'o.ki'i.ki'i*. To cause to fetch, fetch, take hold of, seize, get. 2. Same as *kīki'i*.
- kī'iki.kī.** Same as *kī'ili'i* 1.
- ki'i kino'ie.** n. John 'I't's name for *kā'ai*, casket. (li 155.) *Lit.*, image wicker body.
- ki'i kuhi.** nv. To make time-keeping hula gestures with the left hand reaching forward and back to the front of the shoulder, while tapping the 'uli'uli on the right lap; these gestures.
- ki'i.lau.** vi. To ramble in conversation. *Rare*.
- kī'ili.ii.** vi. 1. To squat on haunches; to perch. *Kī'ili'i ka pua hau o Ka-lena*, the *hau* blossom of Ka-lena squats [said of beauties who squat but do no work; play on *lena*, lazy, in Ka-lena]. 2. To trill, of a bird. Cf. *kī'ikiki, kā'ili'i*.
- ki'i.lua.** nvi. Two-faced; liar, deceiver; to deceive. *Rare*.
- ki'i maka manu.** n. Bird's-eye view.
- ki'i maka nunui.** See *ki'i 1*.
- ki'i.manana.** vi. Enlarged, swollen, bloated, as of a rotting corpse.
- ki'ina.** Pas/imp. of *ki'i* 2, 6; war-club stroke. See Gram. 6.6.2. *I kāna ki'ina lā'au* (GP 66), his club stroke. *Ki'ina o ka leo*, voice intonation. *Ki'ina 'ōnohi maka*, glances of the eyes [*lit.*, fetching pupils of the eyes]. *Ki'ina 'ia aku nā paemoku*, search the archipelagoes.
- ki'i.noho.** nvi. Homebody; to remain at home constantly. Cf. *ki'ihēle*.
- ki'i'oni.oni.** n. Moving picture, movie, cinema.
- ki'i 'ō.nohi.** n. Pupil of the eye. *Fig.*, beloved person. See ex., *ki'ina, loloku, wālania*.
- ki'i pā.** nvi. In a hula, tapping the lap or left hand with the base of the 'uli'uli; tapping the palm of the left hand, floor, back of left hand and right shoulder with end of *pū'uli*; both are now called in English "common motion"; to do so.
- ki'i pala.pala.** n. Printed picture, as in a newspaper.
- ki'i pena.** n. Painting. *Lit.*, painted picture. *Eng*.
- ki'i pō.haku.** n. Stone statue; petroglyph.
- ki'i.pua.** vi. To go about in idleness and mischief. [*Pua* was the name of a mischievous goddess of sorcery.]
- kika.** 1. vs. Slippery, slimy, as with mud. *E ua ana ka ua a kika malama, 'ōlali kika ana kikika i ka ua* (chant), the rain rains so that the month is slippery, bright, slippery, slippery in the rain. 2. Also *tita*. n. Sister. *Eng*. 3. Also *sida*. n. Cider. *Eng*. 4. Also *tiga*. n. Tiger. *Eng*. 5. Also *kida*. n. Cassia. *Eng*.
- kikā.** vs. Of humble position, lowly.
- kī.kā.** 1. n. 'Opelu fish, when about the length of a finger. 2. vs. Strong, energetic; having authority and force, as a magistrate. *Rare*. 3. n. Guitar. *Eng*. 4. n. Cigar. *Eng*. 5. n. The cigar flower (*Cuphea ignea*), from Mexico, a small, smooth shrub with narrow, red, tubular, odorless flowers nearly 3 cm. long. The flowers are used for leis. (Neal 617-8.) Also *pua kīkā*.
- kī.kā'ele.kē.** vs. Frisky, restless; to jump here and there.
- kī.kaha.** vi. To soar, glide, poise, wheel, skim along, as a frigate bird; to turn aside, detour, veer, deviate; to maneuver, as fighting cocks; to walk along absent-mindedly, ignoring everyone. *Kīkaha ka 'iwa, he lā makani*, the frigate bird soars, it's a windy day [said of a beautiful woman or handsome man]. *Hele kīkaha a'ela ka ua*, the rain goes sneaking along [of one who goes out of his way to avoid an acquaintance]. (PCP *tiita(f,s)a*.)
- kī.kaha.kaha.** Redup. of *kīkaha*.
- kī.kahō.** vi. 1. To splash. 2. To speak or interrupt rudely.
- kī.kakaha.** Redup. of *kīkaha*.
- kī.kā.kala.** vt. 1. To strike with spurs, as fighting cocks. 2. To draw up with a hook, as in fishing octopus.
- kī.kā.kapu.** n. Various species of butterfly fishes of the genera *Chaetodon* and *Cheilodactylus*. Varieties are qualified by the terms *alo lua* and *ko'a*. See *hilia, kī'oki, lauwiiliwiili*.
- Kikako.** n. Chicago. *Eng*.
- kikala, tidara.** n. Pine tree (RSV), fir tree (KJV). (Isa. 41.19.) (Heb. *tidhar*.)
- kī.kala.** n. 1. Hip, coccyx bone; posterior; stern, as of a canoe. 2. Same as *kīkala moa*, a seaweed.
- kī.kala hā.ne'e.ne'e.** n. Pyelitis, kidney disease; sacroiliac strain; lumbosacral slipped disks. *Lit.*, sliding hips.
