

kī.kala.kē. n. Kind of fishhook.
kī.kala moa. n. Name of a seaweed that irritates the throat if eaten alone.
kī.kala pa'a.keā. A rare idiom referring to hard-working tenant farmers in 1851.
kī.kala pai. n. Flat, thin buttocks.
kika.likī. n. Cigarette. *Eng.* See ex., *me'ome'o*.
kikama. n. White tapa made of *wauke*.
kī.kā.mū. vi. Suspicious, wary; gathering in silence, as fish about a hook they hesitate to bite. Cf. *mū*, silent.
kika.naine. n. Strychnine. *Eng.*
kikana.lēi. vi. To sit on the heels, squat.
kika.nē. n. Jitney. *Eng.* *Ka'a kikanē*, jitney carriage.
kī.kā.nia. n. 1. Weed (RSV), tares (KJV) (Mat. 13.25); *zizania*. *Gr.* See *pōpolo kīkānia*. 2. Cockleburs (*Xanthium* spp.), coarse herbs, bearing tenacious burs about 2.5 cm long. (Neal 838.) 3. Same as *kīkānia haole*.
kī.kā.nia haole. Same as *lā'au hānō*, Jimson weed.
kī.kā.nia lēi. n. A kind of nightshade (*Solanum aculeatissimum*), the round, scarlet fruits used in leis. (Neal 742-3.) Also *akaaka*.
kī.kā.nia pipilī. n. Spanish clover (*Desmodium uncinatum*), a weedy, South American perennial herb with small clinging pods. (Neal 451.) Also *pua pilipilī*.
kī.kanu. vt. To cover, bury.
kī kaola. n. Crossbar or beam used to close a door or gate. *Lit.*, beam key.
kī.kā Pukī.kī. n. A mandolin, usually with 12 strings. *Lit.*, Portuguese guitar. (*Eng.*)
kī.kau. To give freely and with good will. (*And.*)
kī.kau.pē'a. Same as *kīhikau*.
kika.wai.ō. n. A native fern (*Cyclosorus [Dryopteris] cyatheoides*), with pinnate fronds, 1 m high or more, used for food and medicine. Roots and young fronds eaten raw; the roots grated and salted to taste, slimy like okra. Also *pakikawaiō*. See ex., *kī'oa*. Cf. *kupukupu makali'i*.
kika.wai.ōa. Var. of *kikawaiō*.
kikē. n. Kitty. *Eng.*
kī.kē. 1. vi. To rap, tap, knock; to break open, as with a hammer; to click glasses, as in drinking a toast. See ex., *māmane 1. Kīkē hala*, to break open pandanus fruit. 2. vi. To share. *E kīkē ka hānau 'ana me ku'u punalua*, the children will share with my second wife.
-kī.kē. Back and forth. See *'ōlelokīkē, walakīkē, pākīkē, kīkē'ōlelo*. Gram. 6.5. **ho'o.kī.kē.** Ready with a rude retort.
kī.kē 'alāna. nvi. Crashing sound, as of lava rock ('alā) smiting rock, or as made by an active *aa* lava flow (PH 38); to sound thus.
kī.kē'ē. vi. To bend, crook; bending, zigzag; perverted. *Alanui kīkē'ē*, zigzag road. **ho'o.kī.kē'ē.** To go zigzag.
kī.kē'ē.kē'ē. Redup. of *kīkē'ē*; zigzag. *Alanui kīkē'ē-ke'ē*, road with many turns. **ho'o.kī.kē'ē.kē'ē.** Caus/sim.
kī.kē.kē. vt. To knock, rap, tap, pound. Cf. *elelū kīkēkē* and *kīkōni*, to tap with a single knuckle.
-kī.kē.kē. Same as *-kīkē*. *'ōlelokīkēkē*, conversation, phrases.
kike.kikē. Redup. of *kīkē*.
kike.lona, kiterona. n. Citron (*Citrus medica*). (Neal 482.) *Eng.*
kī.kēne.nēi. vi. To contract, shrink; to crouch or squat.
kī.kē.ō.lēlo. vt. To argue, talk back, banter.
kī.kepa. 1. n. Tapa or sarong worn by women under one arm and over the shoulder of the opposite arm. 2. vi. To lean over to one side, to cover one side; to turn to the side; to place in a one-sided manner; on the side, as a tapa or lei worn over one shoulder and under the opposite arm. *Ku'u lei kīkepa kau po'ohiwi*, my lei over one shoulder and down on the opposite side. *'Okī kīkepa*, to cut the hair on one side, as formerly in mourning. *'Ako kīkepa*, to pluck on one side. *Kā kīkepa*, to strike on one side or glance off on a side; a

glancing blow. 3. vt. To bite sideways, snap. 4. n. Edge, rim, as of a canoe. 5. n. Pig of one solid color with a spot of another color on the shoulder.
kī.kepa.kepa. Redup. of *kīkepa 1-3*.
kī.kepa.nī. n. A weed (*Cassia leschenaultiana*). *Ni'ihau. Lit.*, Japanese ti (its leaves were used for tea).
kikepe.pēkia. n. Dyspepsia. *Eng.*
kiki. 1. nvt. A plug shaped like the *kepa* wedge but with the outer end longer, used in filling cracks in wooden bowls or canoes; to plug a hole, patch a canoe or calabash. (PEP *titi*.) 2. vt. To sting, as a bee; to peck, leap at, as a hen. *Fig.*, to make disagreeable remarks. 3. Same as *'ūtkiki*, a fish. 4. vt. To kiss. *Eng. Rare*.
kikī. 1. vi. To flow swiftly, spout; to spurt, as water from a hose (cf. *kahe wai*, flowing water, as in irrigation); to eject, as octopus ink; to do swiftly. See *pau kikī. Kikī ka hou*, perspiration poured. *Holo kikī o ke ka'a*, speeding of the car. **ho'o.kikī.** To cause to flow, pour, etc. *Ho'okikī kānāwai*, to enforce the law. (Perhaps PPN *titi*.) 2. n. Slimy liquid in the blossom of the mountain ginger.
kī.kī. 1. Redup. of *kī*, to shoot, as a gun; to incite or sick, as a dog; to spout. *Kīkī māka*, target shooting. *Kīkī manu*, to shoot birds. *Wai-kīkī* (name), spouting water [a reference to the many springs and streams in the Waikīkī *ahupua'a* that extended far inland]. **ho'o.kī.kī.** Caus/sim. (PCP *titi*.) 2. vi. To do up the hair in a type of knot. 3. n. Crude temporary basket or bundle, as made of *'ilima*, ti, or morning-glory plants and used to carry food. *Rare*. 4. n. A bird resembling the plover. 5. n. Name given a shellfish. (KL line 33.) 6. n. A seaweed.
-kīkī'a. ho'o.kīkī'a. Same as *ho'oki'eki'e*.
kī.kī'alo. 1. Redup. of *kī'alo*. 2. vi. To dodge quickly.
kī.kī.ao. n. Sudden wind gust, squall. *Fig.*, sudden burst of passion.
kikia.pali. Same as *kiapali*.
kikihi. 1. vs. Crescent-shaped; having corners like a cocked hat. 2. n. Doorframe, covering for doorframe; side posts of a door, house post on a heiau; door casing (cf. *kukuna*). Cf. *kīhi*. 3. vi. To dodge or move about quickly, especially with quick turning of sharp corners; canoe sailing, to sail.
kikī holo. vi. To run fast, to grow fast. Cf. *holo kikī. Ma ia malama, ua pau ke kikī holo ulu ha'aheo 'ana o ka hoi* (Kep. 93), during this month, the fast proud growth of the *hoi* vine was finished.
kī.kī'i. 1. vi. To lean back; to tilt, heel, as a ship; to stretch out, extend. See *kānāwai. No Kona ka makani he kula'i pau, kīkī'i kapakahi 'o ka 'Iwa-lani*, in Kona is the wind that pushes everything over, that heels the 'Iwa-lani to one side. **ho'o.kī.kī'i.** Caus/sim. *Noho ho'okīkī'i*, to sit up, as a dog; to sit leaning back. 2. n. Spiral fishhook with the end curled back fairly close to the shaft. (Malo 79.)
kikika. Redup. of *kika 1*, slippery. See ex., *kika 1*.
kikiki. 1. Same as *ikiiki*, stifling. 2. Short for *'ūtkiki*, a fish. 3. n. A bird. (KL line 313.) 4. Same as *'i'i* or *makali'i*, tiny. *He kanaka kikiki*, a small man. *'Upena kikiki*, small-meshed net. *Kikiki ka 'ai 'ana*, to eat very little. 5. n. Ticket. Also *likiki*. *Eng.* 6. nvt. Cheat; to cheat. *Eng.*
kiki.kiki. 1. vt. To mend, as a crack in a wooden bowl. 2. Redup. of *kiki 2*, to sting, peck.
kikiko. vt. Spotted, dotted, mottled, spattered; to make a dot; to print; to tattoo with dots and spots. *Ua kikiko 'ia ku'u lōle*, my dress is spotted, spattered [as with ink].
kiki.kō. interj. Cry of the 'ō'ō bird; to cry thus.
kī.kī.kō'ole. vs. Done to completeness, perfection. *Ua hana kēlā mea kēia mea o kou alo ali'i a kīkīko'ele, 'a'ohe mea koe*, every one of your royal retainers has done everything in proper order and to completion, nothing remains [undone].
kī.kī.kō'u. 1. n. Chirping or screeching, as of a flock of birds; deep tone in chanting; tapping noise. Cf. *ko'u*, to
