- kini 'ai**. n. Pail for carrying poi ('ai) or other food.
- kini akua**. n. The countless spirits and gods; the multitudinous spirits. (PCP *tini atua*.)
- kini.hama**. n. Gingham. Eng.
- kini.hone**. n. Guinea hen. Eng.
- kini.holo**. nvi. A ball game, something like playing catch on the run; to play the game.
- kinika**. n. Ginger. Eng. Cf. 'ela kinika.
- kini.kini**. 1. Redup. of *kini* 1; numerous, very many, multitudinous, myriad. (PCP *tinitini*.) 2. nvi. Marble, game of marbles (formerly round pebbles or seeds); to play marbles. 3. n. Ni'ihau name for *kākalaioa* 3, yellow nickers.
- Kini.kiu**. n. Uncomplimentary name for Chinese, perhaps from English "Chink."
- kini kohu**. vs. Extremely well-suited, fine-looking. *Lit.*, many suitable. *Kini kohu ka hele 'ana o kahi le'ale'a o ke ali'i*, going to the entertainment of the chief, [we will be] fine-looking.
- kini lau**. vs. Numerous, very many.
- Kini-maka-lehua**. n. Name of a mountain rain. *Lit.*, countless *lehua* blossoms.
- kini 'ō.pala**. n. Garbage or rubbish can.
- kini.pēki**. n. Name of a game in which the stone called *hiu* was used.
- kini pēla**. n. Pail. Eng.
- kini.pō.pō**. nvi. Ball, baseball; to play ball.
- kini.pō.pō hī.na'i**. n. Basketball.
- kini.pō.pō pa'i**. nvi. Tennis. *Lit.*, ball to strike.
- kini.pō.pō pēku**. nvi. Football. *Lit.*, kick ball. *Ho'okū-kū kinipōpō pēku wāwae*, football game.
- kino**. 1. nvs. Body, person, individual, self, main portion, physique, receptacle; form; fully formed, as a foetus; bodily, physical, material, nonspiritual; hull of a ship. Cf. *kino pālua*, *kinopāpālua* under *pālua*, *pāpālua*. *Pili i ke kino, kō ke kino*, carnal, bodily, corporal. *Kino lele* (For. 4:73), power to fly, flying form. *Ka po'e e lawe ana i kou kino*, your subscribers [as of a newspaper]. *Nani ke kino o kēia kīhei*, the main part of this shawl is pretty. *Ho'olako ma ke kino*, supply material (nonspiritual) needs. 'Ōlelo *pili kino*, material, personal or worldly talk (cf. *pili 'uhane* under 'uhane). *E lawe aku 'oe i kēia ma kou kino lahilahi*, take this for your thin form [in the spare columns of a newspaper]. **ho'o.kino**. To take shape, embody; to develop, as a puny infant; to take form, as a spirit. (PPN *tino*.) 2. nvs. Person in grammar; personal. *Kino mua*, *kino kahi*, first person. *Kino lua*, second person. *Kino kolu*, third person. *Nā mea pili kino*, personal things. *Ho'okō kino aku i kēia kono*, personally accept this invitation. *E hana mua i kō ke kino mamua o ka hana 'ana i kō ha'i*, do your personal work first before doing for others.
- kino ahi**. n. A "fire body": the bones of a deceased thrown into a fire pit so that the spirit of the deceased may be with and serve family relatives, of the Pele family. The bones of Mary Kawena Pukui's great grandmother were thus buried. See *kākū'ai*.
- kino aka, kino aka.kū**. n. Spirit, especially of a living person.
- kino 'e'ēpa**. n. Spirit body, strange form.
- kinohi**. n. Beginning, origin, genesis. *Kinohi loa*, the very beginning. *Mai kinohi a Hō'ike 'Ana*, from Genesis to Revelations [from beginning to end].
- kī.nohi**. nvt. Decorated, spotted, ornamented; decoration, ornamentation. *Ua kīnohi 'ia ka pāpale me ka lipine 'ula'ula*, the hat is trimmed with a red ribbon. **ho'o.kī.nohi**. Caus/sim.
- kī.nohi.nohi**. Redup. of *kīnohi*; printed, as calico. See ex., *ho'opukalia*. *He nani maoli nā kīnohinohi o kona lumi ho'oluana*, very beautiful were the decorations of his reception room. *E ka honua ē, ē nahele lā, i kīnohinohi ē* (Kep. 31), O earth, O plants, be adorn-
- ments. *Ka i'a kīnohinohi pōhaku*, marine life that adorns rocks [periwinkles and nerita]. **ho'o.kī.nohi.nohi**. To adorn, add color. *Mea ho'okīnohinohi*, decorations.
- kino.hou**. n. Beginning, first. *Lit.*, new body. *Pehea lā i loa'a mai ai kēia hā'awe i kinohou?* How was this burden obtained at first?
- kino iwi**. n. Skeleton.
- kino kahi**. See *kino* 2.
- kino kanaka**. n. Human form.
- kino kau.lēle**. n. Apposition, in grammar. *Lit.*, enlarged form.
- kino kolu**. See *kino* 2.
- kinola, kinora**. n. Lyre (RSV), harp (KJV). (Hal. 57.8.) (Heb. *kinnur*.)
- kino lau**. n. Many forms taken by a supernatural body, as Pele, who could at will become a flame of fire, a young girl, or an old hag.
- kino lēpo**. n. Earthly body.
- kino lua**. 1. See *kino* 2. 2. vs. Dual-formed, dual-natured.
- kino make**. n. Corpse, dead body.
- kino maoli**. True form or body. *Ua hele kino maoli aku 'o Ka-'ai-ali'i i mua o ke ali'i*, Ka-'ai-ali'i went personally to the chief.
- kino-o-Hau.mēa**. n. A type of low-lying breadfruit. (HP 187.)
- Kino o ka Haku**. n. Corpus Christi.
- kino.'ole**. vs. Frail and thin (animate). *Ua hele kā ho'i 'o Iunia ā kino'ole*, how frail and thin Eunice has become.
- kinopu**. n. A strong scent, as of tobacco.
- kino wai.lua**. n. Spirit of the dead; dead person, bodily remains, corpse. **ho'o.kino wai.lua**. Caus/sim. (For. 6:452.)
- kinu.wā**. Hopscotch; to play hopscotch.
- kio**. 1. vi. To cheep, chirp. **ho'o.kio**. Same as *hōkio*, a whistle. (PCP *tio*.) 2. nvi. Projection, protuberance, bump; to protrude. 'A'ohe *kio pōhaku nalo i ke alo pali*, on the face of a cliff, not one jutting rock is hidden from sight [no use being secretive]. **ho'o.kio**. To spread out, project. 3. Same as *kauna'oa* 2, a mollusk. (PPN *tio*.) 4. interj. Word used in reply to a question one does not care to answer, somewhat like rude English "What's it to you?" *E hele ana 'olua i hea? Kio*. Where are you two going? *Kio*. 5. n. Cords made of hibiscus bark used as drawstrings of a large net. 6. n. Mock warfare, training in warfare by combat (And.); according to Malo 66 *kaua kio* is mock warfare with blunted spears. (Ka-welo's warriors greet him as he returns from fishing by hurling spears at him for him to dodge or parry: FS 52.) 7. n. Mussels. See below. (PPN *kio*.)
- ki'o**. 1. nv. Small pool for stocking fish spawn, as mullet, milk fish, tenpounder, usually attached to longer ponds; puddle, cistern, water sluice, dregs; to settle, as dregs; to deposit, especially of any element beginning with *kūkae*, as *kūkaehao*, *kūkaelā*. Cf. *ki'o lepo*, *ki'o wai*. *Kai ki'o*, sea water remaining in rock hollows after the tide goes down. *Nā ki'o wai o Kū-lani-hāko'i*, pools of Kū-lani-hāko'i [mythical spring in the sky; its overflow came to earth as rain]. **ho'o.ki'o**. To gather or settle, as water in a lake or pond; to cease flowing, of menstruation. *Lua ho'oki'o wai*, cistern. *Luawai ho'oki'o*, reservoir. 2. vi. To excrete, evacuate, give birth to a child (often sarcastic). Cf. *kiki'o*, *ki'oki'o*, *pāki'oki'o*. (PPN *tiko*.) 3. n. Rootlet of sweet potato.
- ki'oa**. Pas/imp. of *ki'o*. **ho'o.ki'oa**. Same as *ho'oki'o*. *He ua nō, he kulu ua no ka liko . . . ke ho'oki'oa i nā kikawaiō* (chant for Ka-mehameha III), it is rain, raindrops for the buds . . . water settling on the *kikawaiō* fern.
- ki'o ahi**. n. Fiery pit, place of torment, hell.
- kī.ōe**. 1. n. Small surfboard. 2. vi. To turn the head with a rotary motion, as of a bird watching its prey. Cf. *oeoe*, long neck.
