

- kī'o'ē.** nvt. Ladle, dipper, cup; scoop or spoon made of coconut shell; dip, as of poi; arm or wrist motion in paddling or dipping; net-mending instrument; to skim, as cream from milk; to dip, ladle, scoop; to join nets together; to twist and snap, as breadfruit with a *lou* stick. Cf. 'o'e, to probe. *Ka 'ai kī'o'e lā'au*, the food reached with a stick [breadfruit].
- kio.ēa, kiowea.** 1. n. Bristle-thighed curlew (*Numenius tahitiensis*), large, dusky brown, migratory bird with a long, curved bill; the cry of this bird. See ex., *lawekeō*. 2. nvi. Tall, long-legged, slender person; long, tall; standing high on long legs; to extend, stretch out. 3. n. An extinct honeyeater (*Chaetoptila angustipluma*).
- kio'elē.** n. A small native shrub (*Hedyotis coriacea*, syn: *Kadua menziesiana*), belonging to the coffee family, a rare or extinct species.
- kī'oē.oē.** vs. Long, tall, as a ship mast or giraffe neck.
- kī'o'ē.o'ē.** Redup. of *kī'o'e*.
- kī'o'e poi.** n. Finger or single dip of poi.
- kio.hoa.** vi. Spoiling, as a flower too long in the rain. *Pala kiohoa i ka ua ka pua kou* (chant), yellowed, spoiling in the rain are the *kou* blossoms.
- kio honua.** n. Heap of food (For. 6:398), earth protuberance.
- kī'ohu'ohu.** nvs. Mist; misty; misty place. Cf. *kili 'ohu. Noho ana ke akua i ka nāhelehele i ālai 'ia e ke kī'ohu'ohu, e ka uakoko* (hula prayer), the gods dwell in the forest, hidden away by the mists and low-lying rainbow.
- kī'oki.** nvs. Striped; creased with fat; stripes. *He kākau kī'oki 'ōni'o i ka lae, he kī'oki 'o ke kīkākāpu, 'o ka i'a kapu* (chant), marked with bars and streaks on the forehead, the *kīkākāpu* is [a fish] with bars [of color], a sacred fish.
- kio.kio.** Redup. of *kio* 1, 2; young, immature, as flora or fauna. Cf. *piopio, 'ōpiopio. Nā kiokio pōhaku*, rock heaps [or jutting rocks]. **ho'o.kio.kio.** Redup. of *ho'okio*. (PCP *tiotio*, to cheep.)
- kī'o.kī'o.** Redup. of *kī'o*; variegated, as calm and unruffled spots in the sea.
- kī'oki'oki.** Redup. of *kī'oki*.
- kio.kiōla.** Redup. of *kiōla*.
- kio.kio pali.** n. Cliff or ridge with irregular projections.
- kiōla.** vt. To throw, toss; to deposit, as bones of the dead. *Kiōla mai i ke kinipōpō*, throw me the ball. *Kiōla 'ino*, to dash down, as in anger.
- kī'ola.ōla.** 1. Redup. of *kiōla*; tossing back and forth or up and down, as in juggling; to cast for fish; to sort and distribute, as sweet potato cuttings (For. 5:665). 2. n. A form of black magic, by which a special stone was prayed over and hurled at a victim; it entered through the anus or mouth and destroyed the victim, and then returned to the magician.
- kī'ola.ōla hao lio.** nv. Horseshoe pitching; to pitch horseshoes.
- kī'ola.ōla lina.** n. Ringtoss.
- kiōla pō.kā.** n. An old name for shot-put.
- kio.lēa.** nvs. High, rickety or unsafe seat; high, long, rickety. *A'a kiōlea* (FS 61), aerial roots, as of pandanus.
- kī'o.lēi.** Same as *ki'elei*, to squat.
- kī'o.lēna.** nvt. Tapa-drying and bleaching place; to dry and bleach tapa; to dye tapa.
- kī'o lēpo.** n. Swamp, mire (2 Pet. 2.22), fen (Ioba 40.21); mud puddle, dirty pool.
- kio.loa.** 1. Same as *kialoa*, a long, narrow canoe. 2. n. Long fishing line for deep-sea fishing.
- kiōlo.hia.** Same as *pu'uka'a*, a sedge.
- kio.mana.** vt. To ride or sit astride, as on a horse; to straddle. Cf. *kīthelei. Kiomana nā wāwae o ua keiki nei ma kēlā 'ao'ao a me kēia 'ao'ao o ua hā mai'a nei*, then the legs of this child sat astride of each side of this banana trunk.
- kī'omo.** Var. of *kī'amo*.
- Kiona, Ziona.** n. Zion. *Eng.*
- kī'ona.** n. Dung heap, dump; privy, toilet. See ex., *lolena. Hale ki'ona* (2 Nal. 10.27), latrine (RSV), draughthouse (KJV).
- kī'ō.naha.** vs. Bent, crooked, curved. Cf. *'ōnaha*.
- kio naha.welē.** n. A common mussel, probably *Brachidontes cerebristriatus*.
- kī'oni.** n. Key to animate a toy.
- kio-noho-one.** n. Probably *Natica gualteriana*. *Lit.*, sand-dwelling *kio* (mollusk).
- kī'o'ohu.** vt. To dip. *Ua ki'o'ohu a'ela lākou i ka wai i loko o kekahi 'umeke*, they dipped up water into a calabash.
- kī'o'ō.pae.** n. Taro-leaf container as held in the mouth, so as to form a basket to hold shrimps (*'ōpae*) while groping with the hands for shrimp. Also *pū'olo 'ōpae*.
- kī'opa.** vi. Lame; to limp. Cf. *'o'opa*.
- Kio-pa'a.** n. North Star. *Lit.*, fixed projection.
- kī'opē.** 1. nvt. A bundle; to make a bundle. 2. vt. To scatter a fire in order to put it out. (PH 119.) 3. n. A fish resembling *kawakawa*.
- kio po'a.po'ai.** Same as *po'apo'ai* 2, a mollusk.
- kio poi.** Poi calabash. (And.)
- kī'o wai.** nvi. Pool of water, water hydrant, water hole, fountain (Mele 4.12); to settle, as water.
- Kī'o-wao.** n. Cool mountain rain accompanied by wind and fog, sometimes associated with Alaka'i swamp on Mt. Wai-ale'ale, Kaua'i, as well as Nu'u-anu Valley, O'ahu. See chant, *kohāhā*.
- kiowea.** Var. spelling of *kioea*.
- kīpa.** 1. vt. To visit, call. *Hale kīpa*, guest house, inn (Puk. 4.24). *Ua kīpa a'e au i kō lākou hale*, I visited their house. **ho'o.kīpa.** To entertain, treat hospitably; hospitable; hospitality. 2. vi. To turn aside; to turn from the direct path. Cf. *kepa*. (PPN *tipa*.)
- kīpā.** nvi. Chinese gambling game *chee-fah*; to play this game. (Probably from Chinese: Gram. 2.9.)
- kīpae.pae.** n. Stone pavement or steps for entering a house.
- kīpa hele.** vi. To go visiting from place to place.
- kīpahu.** n. Place where soil is worn out (*pahu*) from constant farming; worn-out soil.
- kīpa'i.** vt. 1. To shoo away, as by clapping (*pa'i*); to drive away animals; to pat with the hands; to strike with the wings, as an angry bird. 2. To cover or spread leaves.
- kīpai.pai.** vt. To encourage, inspire.
- kīpa'i.pa'i.** Redup. of *kīpa'i*.
- kīpaka.kē.** Same as *pakakē*, gibberish.
- kīpa.kīpa.** Redup. of *kīpa* 2. (For. 6:499.)
- kīpaku.** vt. To send away, drive away, expel, discharge, banish, put out of the house, get rid of, rout, exile, evict.
- kīpala.he'a.** vs. Smear, stained.
- kīpala.lē.** nvi. Disorder, jumble, tumult; rapid flow, as of a swollen stream; disorderly, unsystematic, without method; to spread, extend in a disorderly fashion. *Kīpalalē ka 'ōlelo*, to talk in a rapid, incoherent manner.
- kīpala.pala.he'a.** Redup. of *kīpalalē*.
- kīpao.** Similar to *pao* 1. *I ke kīpao 'ia e ke kai*, due to erosion by the sea.
- kīpaoa.** Same as *kī'a'ala*, sweet basil.
- kīpao.pao.** vt. To scoop out the earth from the side, as by the sea hammering on a coast.
- kīpapa.** 1. nvt. Pavement, level terrace; to pave, lay stones in pavement or terrace; to wall in, as with stones (GP 98). 2. vi. To be close together, as clouds, or as taro neatly packed in a load; to shoot together (see *papa* 3, Kel. 45). 3. n. A sweet potato. 4. nvi. Prone position on a surfboard; to assume such.
- kīpa.pa'i.** Same as *kīpa'ipa'i*.
- kīpapala.lē.** Redup. of *kīpalalē*. *Nā 'ōlelo kīpapalalē*, jumble of speech.
- kīpā.pali.** nvs. Cliff brink, small cliffs; hilly.
- kīpa.pani.** vi. To flock. *Kipapani ka noio e kītko'u i ke aku*, the *noio* birds flocked together to make a din over the bonito.
