

- kipa.pau.** Var. of *kipopou*.
- kī.pau.** vt. To overturn completely. *Rare*.
- kipa.wale.** n. A variety of sweet potato. (HP 142.)
- kipa.wale.** vi. To call without being asked; to intrude; to happen in on a visit by chance.
- kī.pē.** 1. nvt. Bribe, bribery (Ioba 15.34); to bribe. Cf. *pē*, humbled, flattened. 2. vt. To pelt with stones; to strike, as hail stones. 3. n. A large ti-leaf bundle tied at one end. Also *wahī*.
- kī.pē'a.** vt. To cross sticks, as in building a temporary shelter.
- kī.pē'a.pē'a.** Redup. of *kīpē'a*.
- kī.pēhi.** vt. To pelt, throw at. *Fig.*, to assail with rough language, speak harshly. **ho'o.kī.pēhi.** Caus/sim.
- kī.pē.pē.** Redup. of *kīpē* 2.
- kī.pē.pēhi.** Redup. of *kīpēhi*.
- kīpi.** 1. nvt. Rebellion, revolt, treachery, treason, uprising; rebel, seditious; to rebel, plot, revolt, resist lawful authority; to conspire against; to ram, as of a goat. *E kīpi 'ia nō wau e 'oe* (FS 153), I have been conspired against by you. **ho'o.kīpi.** To foment or act in revolt; rebellious. (PCP *tipi*.) 2. n. Hilo name for mound taro patches. 3. vt. To dig with a sharp tool. (PPN *tipi*.) 4. n. O'ahu name for the 'akialoa bird.
- kīpi.kelia, dipiteria.** n. Diphtheria. *Eng.*
- kīpi.kīpi.** Redup. of *kīpi* 1, 3; to hew, trim; little by little. (PPN *tipitipi*.)
- kīpi.kua.** n. Pickaxe. *Lit.*, dig hew.
- kīpipili.** Same as *kī, kī nehe, nehe* 3 (*Bidens*).
- kī.pō.** 1. Var. of *kīmō*. 2. n. Depot. *Eng.*
- kī.pō.'ae'ae.** n. Armpit (*pō'ae'ae*) and shoulder above it. *Pa'a a'e nā 'awe'awe ma kēlā a me kēia kīpō'ae'ae*, fastened the packs around each armpit and shoulder.
- kī.poho.** 1. n. Small, shallow pool, basin, or hollow in a rock, as where salt water collects; small container. 2. vi. To dive, dip or pitch downward, as a kite.
- kī.poho.poho.** 1. Redup. of *kīpoho*. 2. n. Small arable patch surrounded by lava beds, smaller than a *kīpuka*.
- kī.po'i.** vt. To cover, conceal, hide; to protest giving away objects to others. Cf. *po'i*, lid.
- kī.po'i.po'i.** 1. Redup. of *kīpo'i*. 2. n. Sweet potato patch. (For. 5:115.)
- kīpoka, kipoda.** n. Porcupine (Isa. 34.11); hedgehog (RSV), bittern (KJV) (Zep. 2.14); (Heb. *qipod*.) Cf. *pua'a 'ili 'oi'oi*.
- kīpō.kā.** v. To shoot.
- kī.pola.** nvt. Wrapper, such as ti leaves about fish; to wrap up, bundle up; to keep warm with wraps, as a sick person.
- kī.pola.pola.** Redup. of *kī.pola*.
- kī.poli.poli.** n. Nook and cranny. Cf. *poli*, bosom. *I loko o ka mahina me ka lā, i loko o nā ao 'ōpua o ka lewa a me nā kīpolipoli apau*, in the moon and sun, in the cloud banks of the firmament and in every nook and cranny.
- kī.polo.** n. Type of prayer used in black magic requesting that the victim be led to a place of death.
- kī.polo.lēi.** nvt. To shoot straight; sharpshooter.
- kipona.** 1. nvi. Intense; to intensify, usually but not always pejorative, often followed by a qualifier; translations vary greatly and depend on context; very common in Kelekona; distress, pain. *Ua hiki mai kona kipona huhū*, his worst of bad tempers is here; he has flown into a rage. *Malalo ho'i o nā kipona wela hahana a ka lā*, beneath the suffocating intense heat of the sun. *I loko o nā kipona o ka meha anoano 'e'ehia* (Kel. 6), in the distress of loneliness, solitude, fear. *Nā kipona o ka ma'i* (Kel. 6), the distress of sickness. *Nā kipona o nā 'ano hana hou*, the fascination of newly made kinds. *Mamuli o nā kokoina ho'omana'o i kipona 'ia e nā hāli'ali'a* (Kel. 3), because of the urging of memories intensified by recollections. *Ke anu 'iniki hō'eha o nā kipona wehe ka iao* (Kel. 21), the tingling painful cold of earliest dawn. 2. vi. Own. *Nā kipona home o ka wahine 'oni 'o Hōpoe* (Kel. 3), the own home of the dancing woman, Hōpoe. 3. vt. To make a hollow or
- round opening, like the eye socket; hollow. 4. vt. Mixed, mingled; varying in color or texture, as of the sea; to add to, as something of different character, as ferns to a lei. *Ka wai kipona me ke kai*, water mixed with sea water. *Kipona paukū i ka laua'e, ka pua o ka 'ilima nono i ka lā* (chant for Ka-'iu-lani), add a section of *laua'e* fern [to] the flower of the 'ilima, bright in the sunlight.
- kī.pona.pona.** 1. Redup. of *kipona* 1-4. 2. n. A small, climbing, native shrub (*Phyllostegia racemosa*) in the mint family, with small, downy leaves, and small, purplish-white flowers in whorls.
- kī.po'o.hiwi.** Same as *kīhi po'ohiwi*. *He kīpo'ohiwi i ke kīpo'ohiwi*, shoulder to shoulder. 2. n. Gun.
- kī.po'o.po'o.** nvs. Indented, pitted with holes; pits.
- kī.pō.pō.** Redup. of *kīpō* 1.
- kīpo.pou.** Redup. of *kīpou*.
- kī.pou.** vt. To drive down, as a stake into the ground; to go downward; descend; to lean, as a post.
- kī.pū.** 1. nvt. To hold back or brace, as a canoe on a wave with a paddle; to rein in, as a horse; to remain, as mist or rain; to fold tightly about one, as a blanket; steersman. *He mau ho'okele ā he mau kīpū noho'i* (For. 4:123), navigators and also steersmen. *Ā laila i kīpū auane'i lāua* (For. 4:123), then the two of them just braced [the canoe]. *Kīpū i ka mana'o, kīpū i ke kapa a ka noe; 'auhea wale 'oe ē ka 'ohu, kīpū maila i Ka'ala* (song), hold fast to an idea, hold fast to the tapa blanket of mist; listen here, O mist, nestling now on [Mt.] Ka'ala. 2. n. Tranquillity. *Kīpū aheahe*, quiet peace. *Kīpū ahiahi*, tranquillity of eventide.
- kī.pū.** v. To shoot, fire or discharge a gun. Cf. *laikini kīpū*.
- kī.puka.** n. 1. Variation or change of form (*puka*, hole), as a calm place in a high sea, deep place in a shoal, opening in a forest, openings in cloud formations, and especially a clear place or oasis within a lava bed where there may be vegetation. 2. Short shoulder cape; cloak, poncho. 3. Loop, lasso; snare, as for catching owls (a rat was tied to a sharp stick in a net; the owl, pouncing on the rat, was pierced by this stick).
- kī.pū.kai.** n. Seaside heliotrope (*Heliotropium curassavicum*), a prostrate, perennial American herb 30 to 60 cm long, with narrow, hoary leaves, white or pale purple flowers, considered indigenous to Hawai'i. Formerly the plants were dried and brewed for tea used as a tonic. (Neal 718.) Also *nena* and *po'opo'ohina* or *lau po'opo'ohina* on Ni'ihau.
- kī.puka 'ili.** n. Leather lasso. *Nā keiki ho'olei kīpuka 'ili*, the boys who throw lassos.
- kī.puka.puka.** Redup. of *kīpuka*.
- kī.pū.lani.** vs. Immobile, motionless in the sky, as clouds, stars; steadfast and loyal to one's chief.
- kī.pulu.** nvt. Fertilizer, mulch; to fertilize, mulch. **ho'o.kī.pulu.** To enrich or fertilize, as soil.
- kī.pulu.pulu.** Redup. of *kīpulu*.
- kī.puni.** vt. To gird, wrap around, surround. *Ua kīpuni 'ia mākou e ke aloha*, we are enfolded in love.
- kī.pupū.** Redup. of *kīpū* 1; to hinder, draw back; to jerk and start, as an automobile. Cf. *pupū*, to stall. **ho'o.kī.pupū.** Caus/sim.
- kī.pu'u.** Rare var. of *hīpu'u*, knot.
- kī.pu'u.pu'u.** n. 1. Name of a chilly wind and rain at Wai-mea, Hawai'i. *Hole Wai-mea i ke ahe a ka makani, hao mai nā 'ale a ke Kīpu'upu'u* (name song for Ka-mehameha I), Wai-mea is rasped by the blowing of the wind, billows of the Kīpu'upu'u wind ravage. *Kū i ka Kīpu'upu'u*, buffeted by the Kīpu'upu'u [of hurt feelings]. 2. Name of a company of warriors from Wai-mea in Ka-mehameha I's time, named for the wind.
- kipu.wē.** vi. To keep away. *Eng.*
- kiu.** 1. nvt. Spy, scout; to spy, observe secretly. Cf. *ho'omakākiu*. *Māka'i kiu*, detective. *'Oihana kiu*, secret service. (PEP *tiu*.) 2. (*Cap.*) Name of a strong, moderately cold northwesterly wind, known as *Mālua-lua*, *Mālua-ki'i-wai*, and *Ho'olua*, in some localities;
