

kō kāua. poss. Our, ours (*o*-form, dual, inclusive; see Gram. 8.4, 9.6). (PNP *to'o taaua*, PCP *too taaua*.)
-kō kauoha. **ho'o.kō kau.oha.** Executor of an estate (*o*-class).
kōkō. part. and n. Quick, near, quickly, soon, immediately, early; swift runner. Cf. *kokoke*, near; Gram. 7.1. *E hele kōke 'oe*, go quickly.
kō.kō. vt. To strike, hit, punish. *Ka hana ia a ke akamai, ka 'ike i ke kōkō 'ulu* (song), that is what a clever one does, he knows how to hit the billiard ball. **ho'o.kō.-kō.** Caus/sim.
kō kōa. See *kea* 3.
kō.keano. vs. Silent, deserted, uninhabited. Cf. *ano* 1.
kō.ke'e. vi. To wind, bend. *Rare*.
kō.kō.kō.kō. Redup. of *kōkō*; the noise of hitting.
kōki. 1. vs. Snub-nosed, as of a bulldog. *'Ilio kōki*, pug dog. 2. Same as *'alae*, mudhen.
kōkī. n. Settee, couch (formerly made of pandanus plaiting). *Eng*.
kō.kī. 1. n. Extremity, tiptop, topmost; upper limit. *'O ka pi'i nō ia a kōkī o Wai-lau* (saying), climbed to the very top of Wai-lau [i.e., has reached the peak of a career, has made a great achievement; Wai-lau is a very steep valley on Moloka'i]. *Nani-kōkī*, supremely beautiful [name of 'Umi's ivory pendant]. 2. vi. To don a helmet. *Kākua nā pū'ali, hūme nā malo, uhi nā 'ahu'ula, kōkī nā mahiole*, tighten the belt, don the malo, drape the feather cloak, put on the feather helmet.
kō.kia. Var. of *kōkī* 1.
kōki.aka, zodiaka. n. Zodiac. *Eng*.
Kō.kia-Wai.lau. n. Stroke in *lua* fighting.
Kōkika, Gotika. nvs. Gothic. *Eng*.
kō.kī.kī. nvs. Sagging, bending; place where a branch divides off.
kō.kikiu. vs. Away up high. *Fig.*, ambitious.
kōki.kōki. Redup. of *kōki*.
kō kīna. n. A kind of sugar cane, 1857. *Lit.*, Chinese cane.
kō.kio. Same as *kio* 4. *E hele ana 'oe i hea? Kōkio!* Where are you going? Never you mind!
kōki'o. n. 1. A native shrubby hibiscus (*Hibiscus kokio*) with red flowers. The wood produced fine charcoal. (Neal 560-1.) Also *aloalo, māku*. 2. All species of a native genus (*Kokia*) of small trees related to the hibiscus, with red flowers, and round, leathery leaves with from three to seven shallow points. (Neal 567-8.)
kōki'o kōa. Same as *kōki'o ke'oke'o*.
kōki'o ke'o.ke'o. n. A native hibiscus, a small tree or tall shrub (*Hibiscus arnottianus*) with large, white, fragrant flowers. It is found chiefly on O'ahu; also a similar hibiscus (*H. waimeae*) from Kaua'i, with smaller leaves. (Neal 561.) Also *pāmakani, kōki'o kea*.
kōki'o 'ula'ula. n. *Hibiscus kokio*, a native red hibiscus. Also *kōki'o, kōki'o 'ula*.
kōko. 1. nvs. Blood; rainbow-hued. See *kōko pi'i, lana* 1, *pūkoko, waiwai kōko*. *Ho'okomo kōko*, blood transfusion. *Kōko pau manō*, blood of a shark victim. *Uakoko*, rainbow-sparkling rain. *Kahe ke kōko o ka ihu*, to have a nosebleed. **ho'o.kōko.** To cause bloodshed; to blush (*rare*). *Fig.*, angry. Cf. *pi'i ka 'ula* under *pi'i*. (PPN *toto*.) 2. Same as *'akoko*, shrubs and trees. 3. Same as *limu kōhu*, a seaweed.
kōkō. nvi. Crow, cackle, of chickens; to crow.
kō.kō. 1. n. A carrying net, usually made of sennit, as used for hanging calabashes; a string hammock, as formerly used for carrying the very old. *Kōkō pū'alu*, plain net carrier; *lit.*, slack net. *Kōkō pu'u*, a fine, knotted net carrier. *Ua ka'i kōkō*, carried about in a hammock [due to extreme old age]. (PCP *tootoo*.) 2. nvt. To tie up strings, as of a calabash; lacings, as of sharkskin to a drum body. *Kōkō a'e i ka pū'olo a pa'a*, bring up the corners of the wrapper and tie together firmly in a bunch. 3. Redup. of *kō* 2; to pull, jerk, drag, push, massage; to set a bone by applying pressure. Cf. *pale kōkō*. 4. nvi. Pregnancy; pregnant,

heavy with child. *Nā malama o kō lākou kōkō 'ana* (Ioba 39.2), the months of their pregnancy. 5. Redup. of *kō* 3, to fulfill. 6. n. Cocoa. *Eng*. Also *kōkōa*.
kōkōa. Same as *kōkō* 6 *Rare*.
kōkōe. Redup. of *kōe* 2. *Kōkōe maka*, to frown, cast shy glances. *Nānā kōkōe*, to look with disapproval. *Kōkōe akula nā maka i ka 'ike i kona 'enemi* (Laie 491), the eyes glared at seeing his enemies. **ho'o.kōkōe.** Caus/sim. *Hō'inā'ināu mea ipo i ka nahele, ho'okōkōe ana ka maka i ka moani* (chant), lovers are wooing in the woods, casting shy glances at the wafted fragrance.
kōkōhi. Redup. of *kōhi* 1-4. **ho'o.kōkōhi.** Slow and stunted of growth; black and threatening, as clouds before a storm; forceful. Same as *ha'akokōhi* 1, 2.
kō.kō.hia. Pas/imp. of *kōkōhi*.
kōkōhi.kū. vt. To lay waste, especially to devastate crops. *Kōkōhikū i nā kalo*, to lay waste the taro.
kōko hō.wai. nvi. Anemia; to have such. *Lit.*, watery blood.
kōkōhu. Redup. of *kōhu* 2.
kōko hua waina. n. Wine. *Lit.*, blood of grapes. *Rare*.
kōkoi. nvi. Jet, spurt; to flow, rush, as a torrent or crowd. *Kōkoi hele nā kānaka i ke ki'i 'oni'oni*, the people rush in crowds to the movies. 2. Redup. of *koi* 1.
kō.koia. n. Beating, as the heart.
Kōko-iki. n. Star said to be named for Kōko-iki, Kohala, Hawai'i, where it was first observed at the time of Kamēhameha's birth. *Lit.*, little blood.
kōkoi.na. n. Urging, insistence. See *ex.*, *kipona* 1.
kōko kāhiki. n. A hairy cosmopolitan spurge (*Euphorbia hirta*), a small, weedy herb; leaves opposite, oblong, pointed at tip, oblique at base, with brownish spot near center, tiny flowers clustered at leaf axils. (Neal 516.) *Lit.*, foreign *kōko*.
kōkōke. vi. Near, close, adjacent, soon, shortly, immediately, friendly (*rare*); to draw near; almost, approximately. Cf. *kōke*, fast. *Kahi kōkōke*, nearby place, vicinity. *Kōkōke lākou e loa'a i ka ulia*, they were almost in an accident. *Kōkōke i ka hale*, near the house. **ho'o.kōkōke.** To draw near, approach.
kōkōki. Redup. of *kōki* 1.
kō.kōkī. Redup. of *kōkī* 1, 2.
kōkōko. vs. Bloody; rare, as steak. *Fig.*, violently angry. (PPN *totototo*.)
kōko.kōhe. vt. To have intercourse with a menstruating woman. *Lit.*, vagina blood.
kōko.komo. Redup. of *komo* 1, 2.
kōko.ko'o.hā. n. Small, inferior, and sometimes soggy sweet potatoes.
kōko lana. n. High blood pressure. See *lana* 1.
kōkolē. 1. Redup. of *kōle* 1. (PPN *totolo*.) 2. n. Taro of the fifth generation. (Kep. 153.) See *kalo* for names of generations. 3. Any food crop stunted by weeds or drought. (AP.)
kōko.lēka. n. Chocolate. *Eng*.
kō.kō.lēle. See *ahahana*.
kōkōli. Redup. of *kōli* 1.
kō.kō.lī'i. n. Thick black cloud. **ho'o.kō.kō.lī'i.** To rise, as a thick black cloud.
kō.kōli.kōli. vs. Dark, burned, of a *kukui* nut candle.
kōkolō. Redup. of *kōlo*, to creep. **ho'o.kōkolō.** Caus/sim. *Rare*. (PPN *totolo*.)
kōkolō.līo. nvi. Sharp, swift wind gust; rapid flowing water; drafty; to blow in gusts, move fast.
kōkolō.nāhe. Redup. of *kolōnāhe*.
kōkolō.wini. nvi. Sharp, penetrating, of wind; gust. *He makani kōkolowini ka i hiki mai i ka pō nei*, swift, penetrating wind gust came last night.
kō.kō.mā.lēi. Same as *'akoko*, shrubs and trees.
kōkōmi, sodōmi. n. Sodomy. *Eng*.
kōkōmo. Redup. of *kōmo* 1. *Ke kōkōmo maila kēlā wa'a*, that canoe is filled [and about to sink]. *Kōkōmo akula ka wa'a i ka nalu*, the canoe is plunging through the waves.
kōkōna. nvi. Bleeding.
kōko.nā. Same as *konākonā*, dislike.
