

- in the bank. (PPN *tomo*.) 2. vt. To dress, put on, wear (any garment, formerly only lower garments). **ho'o.komo.** To dress another person. 3. n. Ring, thimble, tenon.
- komo 'āina.** v. To take possession of a land; to acquire land, as by inheritance.
- komo 'ā.pana.** n. House visiting, as by a priest making the rounds of his district; visiting from district to district, as by a church committee. *Lit.*, enter district.
- komo hale.** nv. Housewarming; moving into a new house.
- komo.hana.** nvs. West, western, so-called because the sun "enters" (*komo*) the sea in the west. (*Komo*, to enter + *-hana*, nominalizer: Gram. 6.6.2.) (PEP *tomo(f,s)anga*.)
- komo.hana 'ā.kau.** nvs. Northwest.
- komo.hana hema.** nvs. Southwest, southwestern.
- komo hewa.** vt. To trespass, enter by mistake or illegally, intrude; to put on in a wrong way, as clothes wrong side out.
- komo.hia.** Pas/imp. of *komo* 1, 2.
- komo humu.humu.** 1. n. Thimble. *Lit.*, sewing ring. 2. vt. To put on clothing inside out. *Lit.*, wear seams.
- komo.'i'i.** vs. Very small, tiny, of small stature; also said of people of little consequence.
- komo 'ino.** vi. To enter wrongly, invade.
- komo kau.hale.** vi. To go from house to house, as a census taker or salesman. *Kōmike komo kauhale*, committee that pays visits to the houses of members, as of a church.
- komo.komo.** 1. n. Evil possession resulting from sorcery. Cf. *noho*. **ho'o.komo.komo.** To cause a spirit, usually evil, to possess; possession. 2. vt. To fit a garment. **ho'o.komo.komo.** To dress, as children; to file, put in. (PCP *tomotomo*.)
- komo lima.** n. Ring, thimble (*rare*).
- komo lolē.** vt. To dress, put on clothes.
- komo mawaena.** vi. To come between, intervene.
- kō.mōmo.** n. Candy. Also *kōmōmō*.
- Kō-momona.** n. Wind associated with Ka-hau-iki, Honolulu. (Nak. 57.) *Lit.*, sweat sugar cane.
- komo 'oko'a.** vt. To do with unanimity; to undertake a project wholeheartedly; to cooperate with enthusiasm. *Lit.*, to enter whole. *Komo 'oko'a akula mākou e kōkua*, we pitched in to help.
- komo.pani.** n. Term used in 1845 for a military company. *Eng.*
- kō.mou.** n. Prepared poi not yet mixed with water, softer than *pa'i 'ai*.
- komo wale.** vt. To enter without permission or ceremony, trespass, intrude.
- komu.nio.** n. Communion. (Latin *communio*.) *Ke komunio me ka po'e saneta*, the communion of saints.
- Kona.** 1. nvs. Leeward sides of the Hawaiian Islands; leeward (PPN *Tonga*.) 2. nvi. A famous leeward wind; to blow, of this wind. Many names of Kona winds follow. See ex., *Kapakū*. 3. n. Name of a star. 4. (*Not cap.*) n. Also *tona*. Ton, tonnage. *Eng.* Also *kana*.
- kōna.** poss. His, her, hers, its (*o*-form; Gram 8.4, 9.6.) (PNP *tona*, PEP *to'ona*.)
- konā.** vs. Hard, unyielding, unfriendly, contemptuous, brusque, haughty. Cf. *konākonā*, *laukōnā*, *mākonā*. **ho'o.konā.** Caus/sim. *Rare*.
- konā.hao.** vs. Strong, as the hand of a fighter.
- konā.hau.** vs. Cold, penetrating, damp, of wind.
- Kona Hea.** n. Name of a cold Kona storm. (Malo 14.) A var. name is *Kona Hea Puka*.
- Kona Hili Mai'a.** n. Name of a Kona wind with protracted rains, (Malo 14.) *Lit.*, Kona wind smiting bananas.
- konā.hua.** n. Fat, grease; kidneys. (Puk. 29.13.)
- kona.kona.** 1. vs. Strong, bulging with muscles; rough and uneven, as a surface; hard. Cf. *pūkonakona*. 2. n. A native tufted grass (*Panicum nephelophilum*), to 1.3 m high, with a large, open-flowering panicle to 35 by 25 cm. Cf. *kākonakona*.
- konā.konā.** vi. Dislike, contempt; disliked; to dislike.
- kona.kū.** n. Posts on each side of the two center posts at the back wall of a grass house.
- Kona Kū.** n. Name of a Kona wind with heavy rain. (Malo 14.)
- Kona Lani.** n. Name of a Kona wind with slight showers. (Malo 14.)
- kō.nale.** 1. Var. of *kōnane* 1. *'Ike kōnale mai*, to see clearly. 2. vs. Quiet, tranquil, peaceful.
- kō.nale.lēwa.** n. 1. Variety of 'a'awa, a fish. 2. Same as *kohelelewa*. (Malo 46.)
- kō.nale.nale.** Redup. of *kōnale* 1, 2. See ex., *hulialana*.
- kona.lēwa.lēwa.** Same as *kōnalelewa* 1, 2.
- Kona Mae.** n. Name of a cold Kona wind. (Malo 14.) *Lit.*, withering Kona.
- Kona-mau-kuku.** n. Name of a star; probably short for *Kukui-a-kona-mau-kuku*.
- Kona Moe.** n. Name of a cold Kona wind and rain.
- kō.nane.** 1. nvi. Bright moonlight; to shine, as the moon; clear, bright. *'O ka pā kōnane a ka mahina*, the moon shines brightly. 2. nvi. Ancient game resembling checkers, played with pebbles placed in even lines on a stone or wood board called *papa kōnane*; to play *kōnane*. Cf. *nane*, riddle; *mū*, *papamū*. 3. n. Tapa-beater design.
- kō.nane ho'o.pa'i.** n. Tapa-beater design.
- kō.nane pepēhi.** n. Tapa-beater design.
- kō.nane pū.pū.** n. A tapa-beater pattern; a *kōnane* checkerboard design with rounded pits (*pūpū*) in the middle of each square.
- Kona-nui-a-niho.** n. Name of a strong Kona storm. *Lit.*, great Kona that bites with teeth.
- kona pā.keke.** n. A variety of introduced sweet potato. *Lit.*, Kona packet (*Eng.*)
- kona.pili.ahi.** vs. Strong, powerful. *Keiki konapiliahi, lawakua, kino 'āwa'awa'a*, a youth, strong, powerful, [and with a] muscular body.
- kone.** n. Rock badger (RSV), coney (KJV) (Kanl. 14.7); described by Kep., perhaps a gony (gooney). *Eng.*
- kō.nea.** vs. Restored to health.
- kō.nea.nea.** Same as *konekonea* 1, 2.
- koneka.** n. Cornet. *Eng.*
- koneko.** n. Doughnut. *Eng.*
- kone.konea.** 1. Redup. of *kōnea*; convalescing. 2. vs. Bald; hard, dry. Cf. *nea*, bare. *Rare*.
- konela.** n. 1. Colonel. *Eng.* 2. Tunnel (also *konela puka*). *Eng.*
- kone.lika, konerisa.** n. Kite, a bird. *Biblical*.
- konene.** 1. vs. Desiccated, dried, as fruit. *Rare*. 2. vt. To move the 'ili'ili, pebble, in the *kōnane* game.
- kone.nea.** *Rare* var. of *konekonea*.
- kone.nene.** Redup. of *konene* 1, 2. *Rare*.
- koni.** vi. To throb, pulsate, tingle, beat; to flutter, as the heart; to tug, as small fish on baited hook. *'Eha koni*, throbbing ache; *fig.*, pangs of love. *Koni au, koni au i ka wai, koni au i ka wai hu'ihu'i* (song), I throb, I throb for liquor, I am eager for cool liquor. **ho'o.koni.** Caus/sim. (PNP *tongi*.)
- konīa.** Pas/imp. of *koni*. (PNP *tongia*.)
- koni.ā.** vs. Stubborn, unyielding, sulky.
- koni.aka.** n. All kinds of asters. (Neal 833.)
- koni.koni.** Redup. of *koni*; to palpitate; passion. *He aloha hu'ihu'i konikoni ana i loko o'u*, a numbing, tingling love within me.
- koni loa.** vi. To persist, keep on. *Koni loa maila kona holo 'ana ā loa'a 'o O'ahu* (Kep. 77), he kept on sailing until coming to O'ahu.
- konini.** vi. To wag, as a dog's tail; to flutter, wave, move to and fro. Also *kolili*. **ho'o.konini.** Caus/sim.
- koni.niu.** Var. of *kōniuniu*.
- kō.niu.niu.** vs. Dizzy. Cf. *pōniuniu*.
- kono.** vt. 1. To invite, ask in, entice, induce, prompt. *Palapala kono*, (written) invitation. **ho'o.kono.** To invite (PCP *tono*.) 2. To attract the attention of a bird, as by imitating its call, and then to snare it, as with gummed 'ie'ie roots. *'Ua'u* birds were snared thus. See *kono 'elepī, kono manu*.
