

- kono'ele**. nvs. Darkness, as of a forest; said also of the inside of thighs thought to be darkened by the chafing of the *malo*; somewhat darker than *konouli*.
- kono'ele.pt.** v. To catch black crabs (*'elepī*), as by tying *'opihi* limpets to a cord dangled above a rock fissure; the crab snatches the bait, the cord is drawn up and the crab seized. (Kep. 172.)
- kono.ht.** n. Chinese New Year. (Cantonese *kong-hee*, congratulations: Gram. 2.9.)
- kono.hia**. Pas/imp. of *kono 1*.
- kono.hiki**. n. Headman of an *ahupua'a* land division under the chief; land or fishing rights under control of the *konohiki*; such rights are sometimes called *konohiki* rights. (PPN *tongafiti*.)
- konoki**. n. Poker (card game). (Perhaps *Eng.*, knock.)
- kono.kono**. Redup. of *kono 1*; to require. **ho'o.kono-kono**. To induce, entice, urge persistently, especially to urge someone to will him his property; to set dogs to fight.
- kono.manu**. nv. To entice a bird, as by imitating its call, and then to snare it; a birdcatcher. Cf. *kono 2*.
- kono.pue**. vs. Short and plump.
- kono.uli**. Same as *kono'ele*, but perhaps less dark.
- konu**. See *waenakonu*, center. (PPN *tonu*, true.)
- kō.nui**. Stricken with great heat, as by the sun's rays. (And.)
- kō.nunu**. vs. Rounded and well shaped, as a *lehua* flower. *Lehua maka kōnunu i ka wai, kōnunu, kōnunu, ō-hāhā, lehua* face rounded in the water, rounded, rounded, plump.
- konu.waena**. Same as *waenakonu*.
- ko'o**. 1. nvt. Brace, support, wand, prop, helper; small stalks to which feathers on large *kāhili*, standards, are tied, and which are attached to the main pole; pole as used in pushing a canoe; sprit of a canoe's sail; stick fastened across a small fish net near the meeting of the sticks (*kuku*) supporting the net; to pole, push with a pole, prop; to uphold (Isa. 63.5). Cf. *kāko'o, kani-ko'o, ho'o.ko'o*. Prop with a pole, as a heavily laden banana plant, or a house to keep it from falling down; to pole, as a canoe. (PPN *toko*.) 2. n. Tail feathers, as of a cock, or as below the tail of the *mamo*, a bird. 3. nvs. Force, strength; strong, rough (rarely used except after *kai*). *Kai ko'o*, rough, strong sea. *Lilo a'ela ke ko'o makani o Lehua* (chant), the force of the wind of Lehua is spent. 4. vs. Larger, a trifle bigger. *A maluna mai o ka huli he wahi 'upena, ko'o a'e ia o ka maka*, and above the bag net is a small net with slightly larger meshes. 5. nvt. Loose, slack; to lay on in folds, as pleats in a dress; to loosen, slacken. 6. n. Light-green leaves near the center of a cluster of pandanus leaves. *'I'o ko'o*, leaves inside the *ko'o* [their base is white and the upper part dark green].
- ko'o-**. Same as *kōko'o*, but usually followed by a number; partner. (PPN *toko-*, PNP *toka-*, PEP *toko-*.)
- ko'o.kā**. 1. vt. To lambaste, buffet, hit. *He wa'a nahā i ko'okā kō kāne*, a smashed canoe that has been buffeted by your husband [overindulgence in sex leads to impotence]. 2. n. A variety of sweet potato.
- ko'o.kāhi**. n. Canoe carrying only one person (a canoe carrying two persons was *ko'olua*, three was *ko'okolu*, etc.). (Malo 131.) See ex., *kana 1*.
- ko'o.kapu**. nv. Taboo with death as penalty for breaking; to lay such a taboo.
- ko'o.keā**. vs. To have gray or white hair.
- ko'o.kolu**. See *ko'okahi*.
- ko'o.ko'o**. 1. n. Cane, staff, rod; support, means of livelihood; staff in music. *He ko'oko'o haki wale*, an easily broken staff [a weak leader]. **ho'o.ko'o.ko'o**. To push, brace, resist, lean back and brace oneself. (PPN *tokotoko*.) 2. Var. of *kōko'o*, and likewise followed by numerals and *-hia*. 3. n. A prayer ending taboos. (Ii 60.)
- ko'o.ko'o 'ā.mana**. n. Cane with a handle. *Lit.*, tee-shaped cane.
- ko'o.ko'o kā.lele**. n. Crutch.
- ko'o.ko'o.kolu**. Same as *kōko'okolu*.
- ko'o.ko'o.lau**. n. All kinds of beggar ticks (*Bidens* spp.), most native, a few introduced, some used medicinally by Hawaiians, as a tonic in tea; the plants are still dried and used for tea, often in preference to tea bought in stores. (Neal 844.) Cf. *kt 2*. Also *ko'olau, kōko'olau*.
- 2**. Ni'ihau name for *nehe, Lipochaeta perditā*, a hairy herb.
- ko'o.ko'o.lau haole**. n. An introduced coreopsis (*Coreopsis lanceolata*), with ray and central florets all yellow. (Neal 842-3.)
- ko'o.ko'o.lua**. Same as *kōko'olua*.
- ko'o.ko'ona**. vt. To reach far for; to rest one hand for support (*ko'oko'o*) and reach out with the other. (FS 211.)
- ko'o.ko'o 'oi.hana**. n. Mace. *Lit.*, professional cane.
- ko'o.ko'o.ū**. Redup. of *ko'oū*. See *ko'ū*.
- ko'o.kū**. 1. vi. To swell out; stick out, as a ruffle. 2. n. Hillside, slope, mountain slope; hillside road or path.
- ko'o.lani**. n. Help given to a chief. *'Awa ko'o.lani*, kava that gives strength to a chief. *Ma'a ia i ke ko'o.lani*, he is accustomed to giving all support to the chief.
- ko'o.lau**. n. 1. Windward sides of the Hawaiian Islands. *He au Ko'olau aku ia*, that is the time of the Ko'olau [trouble]. (PPN *tokelau*.) 2. (*Not cap.*) Short for *ko'oko'olau*. 3. Wind between Ni'ihau and Kaua'i. (For. 5:95.)
- ko'o.lau.loa**. n. *Ulua* fishline 15 or so fathoms long. *Rare*.
- ko'o.lau.wahine**. n. Breeze blowing from the north of Ni'ihau. *Lit.*, feminine windward. See ex., *pā kāhea*.
- ko'o.lili**. Same as *kolili 1-3*. *Rare*.
- ko'o.lima**. nv. Push-up; to push up.
- ko'o.loa keā**. n. A native shrub with pale-pink flowers, otherwise like *ko'olua 'ula*.
- ko'o.loa 'ula**. n. A native, hoary shrub (*Abutilon menziesii*), related to the hibiscus, with heart-shaped leaves 2.5 to 8 cm long, and dark-red flowers from which protrude many stamens borne on a central column. (Neal 550.)
- ko'o.lua**. 1. Var. of *kōko'olua*. (PPN *tokolua*, PNP *tokalua*, PEP *tokolua*.) 2. n. Canoe carrying two persons. 3. (*Cap.*) n. Star name (no data). (Kuhelani.)
- kō'olua**. poss. Your, yours (*o*-form, dual; Gram. 8.4, 9.6). (PNP *to'o koulua*, PEP *too kolua*.)
- ko'o-makani**. n. Wind associated with Mā-hā'ule-pū, Kaua'i. (For. 5:97.)
- ko'o.manu**. n. 1. Support for birds; bird islet. 2. Long tail feathers.
- ko'o.moa**. n. 1. Long tail feathers of a cock. 2. Support for chickens.
- kō.omomo, ko omōmo**. n. Candy. *Lit.*, sucking cane. Also *kōmōmo*.
- ko'ona**. 1. Var. of *ko'ana*, dregs. 2. Same as *ko'o-ko'ona*.
- ko'o.nā**. n. The addressee, the one there. See ex., *ko'onei*.
- ko'o.nei**. n. The person here. *He pane ko'onei, he ho'olohe ko'onā*, the one here answers, you listen.
- ko'o.pali**. n. Wind associated with Hālawā, Moloka'i.
- ko'o.ū**. Var. of *ko'ū*.
- kō'ou.kou**. poss. Your, yours (*o*-form, plural; Gram. 8.4, 9.6). (PNP *too koutou*.)
- kopa**. 1. n. A native shrub (*Hedyotis [Kadua] glaucifolia*), found only on Kaua'i, with narrow, tubular, inconspicuous, pale-yellow flowers, and narrow-ovate to heart-shaped leaves; related to the *'uiwi*. 2. Also *sopa*. nvt. Soap; to cover with soap. *Eng. Kopa 'ala*, perfumed soap. *Kopa 'au'au*, bath soap. *Kopa holoi*, laundry soap. *Kopa pauka*, powdered soap.
- kō.pa'a**. n. Sugar. *Lit.*, hard sugar cane.
- kō.pa'a hō.'ae, kō.pa'a hō.'ae'ae**. n. Powdered sugar.
- kō.pa'a ho'o.ke'o.ke'o**. n. Refined sugar.
- kō.pa'a mā.noa.noa**. n. Coarse sugar.
- kō.pa'a pu'u.pu'u**. n. Lump sugar.
- kō.pa'a 'ula.ula**. n. Brown sugar.
