

- kū.hipa.hipa.** Redup. of *kūhipa*; to mutter indistinctly; unintelligible gibberish.
- kū.hiwa.** nvi. Special taboo made by a chief; to be subject to this taboo.
- kuhō.** nvi. To plop, splash, as a stone dropping into water, or as a leaping fish; sound of a deep cough. *Ke kuhō 'ana o ke kai* (Nak. 102), the splashing of the sea.
- kū.hoē.** n. Quartermaster of ship.
- kū.hō.hō.** nvs. Deep ravine; deep.
- kū.hohonu.** Same as *hohonu*.
- kuhō.kuhō.** Redup. of *kuhō*.
- kū.honu.** n. An edible spotted-back crab (*Portunus sanguinolentus*). *Lit.*, turtle back. Also *pāpā'i kūhonu*.
- kū.honua.** 1. vi. Suddenly struck, as by disease. 2. n. See *maile kūhonua*.
- kū.hou.** vi. To rise again, recover from illness, resurrect. *Kū hou 'ana*, resurrection, recovery.
- kū.hou po'o.** v. To dive headfirst.
- kuhua.** vi. To thicken, as scrambled eggs; to become pasty; to gel.
- kuhue.** Var. of *kuhua*. Cf. *lepo kuhue*.
- kuhu.hua.** Redup. of *kuhua*.
- kuhu.kukū.** n. Dove, turtledove (Kin. 15.9); cooing of a dove. *Ke leo o ke kuhukukū* (Mel. 2.12), the voice of the turtle.
- kū.hulu.kū.** n. Goose flesh, as from chill; quaking, as during an earthquake; agitated, disturbed. See prayer, *kualakai*.
- kui.** 1. vt. To string pierced objects, as flowers in a lei, or fish; to thread, as beads. Cf. *kui lima*. (PPN *tui*.) 2. nvt. Needle, pin, spike, nail, screw, any pointed instrument of wood or metal; to sting. *Ē ka make, ai mahea kou kui?* O death, where is thy sting?
- ku'i.** 1. vt. To pound, punch, strike, box, hit, hammer; to beat out, as metals; to churn, as butter; to boom or clap, as thunder; to smite, injure; to jar; to prod, as 'opihi shells from rocks with a knife, formerly with sharp stones; to clash (as sound). See *hula ku'i Moloka'i*. *Piha ku'i ka hale*, the house is jammed full. *Ku'i palu*, to pound, as bait [to give a threshing]. With a fronted *n*-word, for emphasis, *ku'i* is used as a stative: *'A'ole na'u 'oe ā ku'i, na kēlā wahi keiki . . . , nāna 'oe e ku'i* (Laie 387), I won't fight you, that little boy . . . will fight you. **ho'o.ku'i.** To hit, pound, collide, crash, bump. *Fig.*, to hurt the feelings. *Hālāwai ho'oku'i*, collision; to collide. *Ho'oku'i i ka mana-mana*, stub the toe. (PPN *tuki*.) 2. nvt. To join, stitch, sew, splice, unite; joined; seam. See *niho ku'i*. *Hula ku'i*, any interpretive hula, so called since the days of Ka-lā-kaua; *lit.*, joined hula, i.e., old and new steps were joined together. *Nā lā ku'i o ke kapu akua*, days of godly taboo; *lit.*, days joined. *Ali'i ku'i*, the power behind the throne, the one who really holds the reins [often used in a derogatory way]. *E ku'i ka mā mā ā loa'a 'o Ka'ohele*, combine speeds and get Ka'ohele [a famous runner, Ka'ohele, could be caught only by relay runners; said of any cooperation]. **ho'o.ku'i.(a)** To join, connect, annex, weld, unite; to connect, as letters in forming a word; to spell; to dovetail, fit, splice; to add up, as numbers. *'Ami ho'oku'i*, joint. *Ho'oku'i nei kou alelo i ka ho'opunipuni* (Hal. 50.19), thy tongue frameth deceit. **(b)** Zenith. *Mai ka ho'oku'i ā ka hālā-wai*, from zenith to horizon. 3. vs. Artificial. *Lauoho ku'i*, wig or switch. *Niho ku'i*, false teeth. *Wāwae ku'i*, artificial leg. 4. n. Back tooth, molar, tusk. 5. vi. To disseminate news; to spread, as news. *Ku'i ka lono i Pelekane*, the news spread to England. (PCP *tuki*.) 6. n. Elbow of pipe. 7. vs. Sheer, steep, tall. *Ku'u kaikua'ana o ka pali hi'i, pali ku'i o Ka-liu-wa'a* (chant by Kama-pua'a), my older brother of the sheer cliff, steep cliffs of Ka-liu-wa'a. 8. n. Move in the *kōnane* game. See For. 4:57.
- ku'ia.** 1. Pas/imp. of *ku'i* 1; to meet an obstacle, stumble; to waver or be unsettled mentally; hit, hindered; attack, sudden blow (*loa'a*-type word; Gram. 4.4). *Fig.*, disturbed or hurt mentally. Cf. *ha'aku'ia*. *He aha kō mea hele 'ole e kōkua iā lākou?* 'A'ole, ua ku'ia au iā lākou! Why don't you go and help them? No, they've hurt my feelings. *Ua ku'ia kona mana'o no ka hilahila i kāna uku 'ole* (FS 103), his feelings are wounded from shame at having no pay. *Ke 'ole e ku'ia*, if there's no stumbling [i.e., if nothing prevents]. *Loa'a kekahi ku'ia iāia*, he received a shock. **ho'o.ku'ia.** Same as above; checks and balances, as in government. (PPN *tukia*.) 2. n. Sharp, pointed stick, dagger, spear.
- ku'i 'ai.** nv. To pound food, especially poi; one who pounds food, as poi.
- Kū'ia-kā.naka-hele-o-ka-pō.** n. A stroke in *lua* fighting. *Lit.*, people traveling at night are hindered.
- Ku'i-a-lua.** n. God of trainees in *lua* fighting.
- ku'i a lua.** nvi. Art of *lua* fighting; to fight thus.
- Ku'i-a-manini.** n. Name of a wind of Weliweli, Kaua'i. (For. 5:97.)
- ku'i.au.moe.** n. Privileged and trusted persons in a chief's retinue. *Lit.*, join [at] late night.
- kui.'ō.'ō.** vt. To carry under the arm; to escort arm in arm. *Lit.*, string armpit.
- kui hao.** n. Nail, iron spike.
- ku'i hao.** nv. To pound and shape iron; to forge; blacksmith.
- ku'i.hō.** vs. Hesitating, uncertain, undecided, wavering; hurt in feelings.
- ku'i hekili.** n. Peal of thunder, thunderclap.
- kū iho.ihō.** n. Candlestick.
- kui hou.hou.** n. Awl, gimlet. *Lit.*, piercing sharp instrument.
- kui hou lā.'au.** n. Hypodermic needle.
- kui humu.humu.** n. Needle.
- Kui-'ilima.** n. Name of a Honolulu rain.
- kui iwi.** n. Bone awl.
- ku'i.kā.** vt. To pound smooth.
- ku'i.kā'a.** vt. 1. To swing and hit, as with a war club [this is the name of the club of the legendary hero, Ka-welo]. (FS 65.) See ex., *kāpukupuku*. 2. To join together, splice.
- ku'i.kahi.** nvs. Treaty, covenant, agreement, league, feeling of unity; united, unified; to agree. *Ku'ikahi like*, agreement, peace (Hoik. 6.4). *He mea anei ia e ku'ikahi ai?* Is it something to lead to peace or agreement? **ho'o.ku'i.kahi.** To unite, reconcile, agree, make a peace treaty or armistice; armistice. *Lā Ho'oku'ikahi*, Armistice Day.
- Ku'i.kahi-a-Mō.hō.'ula.** n. Stroke in *lua* fighting. *Lit.*, Mēhē'ula's single blow.
- Ku'i.kahi Pā.na'i Likē.** n. Reciprocity Treaty, by which Pearl Harbor was given to the United States as a coaling station. *Lit.*, treaty equal reciprocity.
- kui kai.apa.** n. Safety pin. *Lit.*, diaper pin.
- kui kā.kia.** n. Tack, small nail, wedge, plug.
- kui kā.kia moēna.** n. Carpet tacks. *Lit.*, sharp instruments for nailing mats.
- kui kala.** n. Screwdriver. Commonly called *kala*.
- ku'i kā.lā (dala).** nv. Silversmith; to weld silver.
- kū.ika.wā.** vs. Temporary, for the time being, ad hoc, transient, makeshift, occasional, provisional, special, acting; free and independent, not bound to a chief in opinion or course. *Lit.*, standing at the time. Cf. *pōpilikia*. *Kau kūikawā*, special session, as of a legislature. *Hō'ike kūikawā*, special or occasional report. *Komikina kūikawā*, acting commissioner.
- kū.'ikē.** 1. vt. To know by sight, to understand or know in advance or beforehand. *Ua kū'ike au i kēlā wahi*, I know that place by sight. *Aia a kū'ike au he pono ke hele, a laila hele*, when I know in advance it is proper to go, then I go. **ho'o.kū.'ikē.** To show beforehand; to recognize at sight. 2. n. Cash. *Uku kū'ike*, cash payment. *Kū'ike pau*, full payment.
- ku'i.kē.** 1. vi. To toll or ring, as a bell. *Ke ku'ikē, kanikē maila nā pele*, the bells are tolling and ringing. 2. vt. To pound smooth, level off, raze; to strike right and left indiscriminately; to destroy completely, as in war.
