

**kule.ana puka.** n. Dividends. (Will 129, island of Maui, State Archives, 1856.)

**kule.ana wai.wai like.** n. Common ownership or interest. *He kuleana waiwai like kō mākou 'ohana i loko o ka 'aina mahi 'ai, our family has a common ownership in the farm.*

**kū.lēha.** Same as *leha 1, 2.*

**kū.lēhu.** Var. of *pūlehu.*

**kule.kana, suletana.** n. Sultan. *Eng.*

**Kuleke, Tureke.** nvs. Turkey, Turk; Turkish. *Eng.*

**kule.kia, kuresia.** n. Crusader. *Eng.*

**kule.kule.** vs. Secure, permanent. Cf. *kuleana.*

**kū.lō.kū.kō.** Redup. of *kūlō*, to seize.

**kū.lōlō.** vt. To scatter as does the wind. *Kūlele ke ehu kai i ka makani, the sea spray is scattered by the wind. Kūlele 'ula ke ehu wai, the red tossing spray. (PCP tuulele.)*

**ku.lōlō.iwi.** vs. Insecure, destitute. *Lit.*, wind-scattered bones.

**kū.lō.lōwa.** Redup. of *kūlewa.*

**kulepa, sulepa.** n. Sulphur. *Eng.*

**kū.lepe.** 1. vt. Split open from head to tail, as fish prepared for drying and salting; to slit thus; to hew out roughly, as a canoe; to make a hole or dig out. *Kūlepe mai ka mahi 'ai i nā 'eka lepo (For. 5:683), the farmer dug out blocks of earth [in a taro patch]. 2. vi. To flap, flutter; strong, of wind. Kūlepe nā pepa i ka makani, the papers are flipped about by the wind. Mai kulepe i ka 'u hana, don't muss up my work. 3. n. Harelip. (Less common than 'alepe.)*

**kū.lepe.lepe.** Redup. of *kūlepe 1, 2.*

**kū.lōwa.** vs. Moving slowly through space, as clouds; swaying, dangling, hanging. *Fig.*, far away in space, as the ocean beyond sight of land or as its profound depths. (PCP *tuulewa.*)

**kū.lōwa.lōwa.** Redup. of *kūlewa.*

**kuli.** 1. n. Knee. (A mother would rap a disobedient child on the knee: see *ho'okuli*; knocking on the knee was also a sign of stinginess: the person referred to is deaf (*kuli 2*) to appeal for generosity.) (PPN *turi.*) 2. nvs. Deafness, deaf person, noise, racket; deaf, noisy, loud. *Hana kuli, noise, hubbub, cacophony; noisy. Po'e kuli ā 'ā'ā, deaf-mutes. Kuli 'oko'a, stone deaf. Mai hana kuli, be quiet [politer than kulikuli] ho'o.kuli. Deaf; to feign deafness. Fig., to disobey; disobedient. Ho'okuli maila i ka waiwai (For. 5:159), disregard or pay no attention to wealth. (PPN *tuli.*)*

**kū.lia.** 1. Pas/imp. of *kū 1*; to stand, halt, etc. *Kūlia i ke ākea, place before the public. Ke kūlia nei ka lā i lalo, the sun is setting. 2. vt. To try, strive. Kūlia i ka nu'u (Queen Ka-pi'o-lani's motto), strive to reach the summit. Kūlia i kō ikaika, exert your strength. Kūlia e loa'a kā na'auao, strive to obtain wisdom. ho'o.kū.lia. Caus/sim. 3. vs. Outstanding, fortunate, lucky. Kūlia i ka u'i, outstanding beauty. Lā kūlia, lucky day.*

**kū.li'a.** vt. To desire greatly.

**kū.lihi.** Var. of *kūnihi 1, 2*; grazed, as by a bullet; hit but not seriously hurt; hooked but escaped, as a fish.

**kuli hia.moe.** vi. To doze; too drowsy to hear (a deeper sleep than *kulu hiamoe*). *Lit.*, sleep deafly. *Rare.*

**kū.lihi.lihi.** Redup. of *kūlihi.*

**kū.like.** vt. Alike, identical, conforming, resembling; standing in similar fashion or in even rows. *Kūlike loa, exactly similar, literal, precise. Unuhi kūlike loa, literal translation. Kūlike 'ole, different; to disagree. Kūlike me ia, in conformity with, according to. ho'o.kū.like. To conform, make alike. Ka ho'okūlike a like i nā 'ao'ao a 'elua, to balance the accounts.*

**kū.liki.liki.** vs. Tight. See *liki 2.*

**kuli.kuli.** nvs. Noise, din; noisy, deafening, inharmonious; a noise. Be quiet! Keep still! Shut up! (PEP *tuli-tuli.*)

**kuli.lipi.** vs. Ridgeline, sharp. *Kua kulilipi, razor back [as of a pig]. Cf. lipi.*

**kulima.** Var. of *kalima*, cream. *Eng.*

**kulina.** n. Deafness, disobedience, noise. *Ka lono*

*mamua, ke kulina mahope kulikuli wale i ka makani o Ka'ā (chant for Ka-umu-ali'i), hearing before, deafness afterwards, deafening in the wind of Ka'ū.*

**kū.lina, kurina.** n. Corn, maize (*Zea mays*). (Neal 81-2.) *Eng.*

**kū.lina 'ono.** n. Sweet corn (*Zea mays*). (Neal 81-2.) *Lit.*, delicious corn.

**kū.lina pohā.pohā.** Popcorn. (*Zea mays*). (Neal 82.)

**kū.lina wali.** n. Cornmeal. *Lit.*, fine corn.

**kuli.o'o.** vs. Stingy, penurious.

**kulipa.** n. Tulip. *Eng.*

**kuli.pa'a.** vs. Stingy, penurious, niggardly, deaf. *Lit.*, solid deafness.

**kuli.pē'e.** vi. To creep along, as a sick person; to stumble awkwardly along; to walk as though weak-kneed. (PH 38.)

**kū.lipo.** vs. Dark, dank, deep, as a cave. *Fig.*, extremely, intense, much. Cf. *kumulipo, lipo. ho'o.kū.lipo. Caus/sim.*

**kū.lipo.lipo.** Redup. of *kūlipo. He 'eha kūlipolipo, an intense pain.*

**kuli.pu'u.** n. Design with zigzag stripes, in tapas, mats, and quilts. *Lit.*, bent knees. Also *niho-wili-hemo.*

**kū.li'u.** vs. 1. Deep, as a voice; penetrating, profound, as thoughts; late, remote, of the distant past. *Ipo kūli'u, sweetheart of the distant past. Kūli'u kona 'ike lapa'au, his medical knowledge is profound. 2. Same as li'u 2.*

**kū.lō.** Same as *kūlō'ihī*, short for *kūloa. E kūlō a'e ana au i ku'u haku, I am waiting long for my master.*

**kū.loa.** Same as *kūlō'ihī, kūlō*; name of the lengthy ceremonies on the night before graduation day in hula; a "long waiting" with feasts and ceremonies lasting for hours; lengthy religious prayers, ceremonies. *He lā kēlā e kūloa ai i nā mea 'ai i ulu mai (For. 6:125), that was the day for long prayers to get food to grow.*

**Kū-loa.** Var. of *Hōkū-loa*, name of a star.

**kū.loa'a.** vs. Prosperous, well-supplied with needs. *Hānau ke kanaka ia lā, he kāne kūloa'a (Kep. 107), a man born on this day is a prosperous man.*

**kulo.hia.** vs. Languid, lounging about. *Lit.*, state of slowness. (PCP *tu(u)lohi.*)

**kū.lō'ihī.** vt. To wait a long time; to stand long; to last long, endure; to take a long time. *E hana kūlō'ihī aku ana kēia, this is work that takes a long time to do.*

**kū.loko.** vs. Local, domestic. *Lit.*, state of being inside. *Kaua kūloko, civil war. Nā mea hou kūloko, local news.*

**kū.loku.** vs. Falling, flowing, as rain or stream; flattened, as plants by rain. *'O ka hoi, uhi, pia . . . ua nika nānawāu mai kō lākou ulu 'ana, ā ua kūloku loa ā make (Kep. 93), the hoi vine, yam, arrowroot . . . are blackened and sickened in their growth, and flattened down [by bad weather] until dead.*

**kū.loku.loku.** Redup. of *kūloku. Also kūnokunoku. Pakapaka ua, paka ua, kūlokuloku (chant), rain of many drops, drops of rain, running, running in streamlets.*

**kulo.kulou.** Redup. of *kūloa.*

**kū.lola.** vs. Helpless, inactive, due either to infirmity or laziness; sluggish. Cf. *lola.*

**kū.lola.lola.** Redup. of *kūlola.*

**kū.loli.** vs. Having no wife, children, or relatives (name derived from a lone mulberry tree growing in a cave at Kūloli, Kona, Hawai'i, which was known as *ka wauke kā kahi o Kūloli*, the lone mulberry tree of Kūloli); also said of any very young *wauke* plant.

**kū.lō.lia.** 1. Pas/imp. of *kūlō*, long waiting or enduring. *Ku'u hoa kūlōlia, my companion of long years. 2. vs. Of changed appearance, as of plants in different seasons (Kep. 89); grief-stricken, said to apply particularly to a mourner who wears a *malo* or *pā'ū* of the deceased about his neck as an expression of grief: he is breaking a taboo and has "changed" (*loli*).*

**Kū.lō.lio.** n. Name of a wind at Hāmākua, Maui. (Probably a contraction of *kū kololio*, gusty state.)
