

- kū.lolo.** n. Pudding made of baked or steamed grated taro and coconut cream. Cf. *lololo 2*, *niu kūlolo*.
- kū.lolo.hili.** vs. Long in doing a thing; to tell a story with many unnecessary details; garrulous.
- kū.lolou.** Var. of *kāloulou*.
- kū.loma.** vs. Slow, dull, stupid, awkward, helpless.
- kū.loma.loma.** Redup. of *kūloma*. *Ua 'ane'ane e kūlomaloma ka 'emepera*, the emperor was almost helpless.
- kū.lono.** vs. 1. Sheer, precipitous. *E pi'i kūlono i ke alo o ka pali*, climb straight up the face of the cliff. 2. Leaky, as a calabash. Also *kūnono*. 3. Insignificant, as an idea. Rare. Also *kūnono*.
- kulo.pia.** vi. To decay, as crops. (Malo 199, Emerson note.)
- kū.lō pia.** nv. The long process of sweetening arrowroot starch (*pia*); to do this.
- kū.lou.** vt. To bow the head, bend; to beckon with the head. Also *kūnou*. Cf. *kūlolou*, *kūloulou*, *kūlokulou*, *kū'ou*, *ha'akūlou*. **ho'o.kū.lou.** To bow down, cause to bow, humiliate; to subdue, as an enemy (2 Sam. 22.40). (PPN *tulou*.)
- kulou.kulou.** Redup. of *kūlou*. **ho'o.kulou.kulou.** Caus/sim.
- kū.lou.lou.** Redup. of *kūlou*.
- kū.lou po'o.** nvi. To bow the head; to dive headfirst.
- kulu.** 1. nv. To drip, leak, trickle; to flow, as tears; a drop; general name for distilled liquor. *Fig.*, disparaging term for a chief whose mother was said to be a commoner (PPN *tulu*.) 2. nvs. To pass, of time; time. See *kulu aumoe*. *Ua kulu ka pō* (Nak. 88), the night has passed. 3. n. Timber used in houses, as sticks, posts; fuel sticks. Cf. *kūkulu*, to build a house. *Kūkulu ho'omoe mai nā kulu* (Kep. 163), to pile the sticks leaning against each other [of an oven]. 4. vs. Drowsy (usually followed by *hiamoe*). Cf. *kuluhio*. 5. vi. Swift. *Kaua'i. Kulu ke kī a ka lio*, swiftly runs the horse. 6. n. Dysentery, gonorrhoea. 7. vs. To be late at night. *Kulu aumoe* is more common.
- kulua.** Pas/imp. of *kulu 1*, to drip.
- kū.lua.** n. Pairing off, as of mates; twins.
- Kū Lua.** n. Fourth day of the old lunar month; also, the name of the 17th day and second after the full moon (Malo 35).
- kulu au.moē.** n. Late night, midnight. *Hiki mai ke kulu aumoe*, the late night has come.
- kulu hau pa'a.** n. Icicle. *Lit.*, drop [of] hard dew.
- kulu.hia.** Pas/imp. of *kulu 1*.
- kulu.hia.moē.** Similar to *kuli hiamoe*.
- kulu.hio.** vi. Wafted off to sleep.
- kului.** vi. 1. To drip (*kulu 1* + *-i*, transitivizer). *Hilo ua kului ua* (Nak. 28), Hilo with rain, dripping rain. (PPN *tulu'i*.) 2. To be late at night. (For. 6:420.) Cf. *kulu 7*.
- kulu.'i.** n. Endemic small trees and shrubs (*Nototrichium* spp.), with small more or less hairy leaves, and downy catkin-like flower spikes. (Neal 332.)
- kului.kului.** Redup. of *kului 2*. (For. 6:421.)
- kulu.koē.** vs. Perfect, without error, as a prayer. *Kulu-keoe kāna pule 'ana*, his praying is perfect.
- kulu.kulu.** Redup. of *kulu 1*; to drip, leak, drop; leaky. **ho'o.kulu.kulu.** Caus/sim; to cause to drip, distill. (PPN *tulutulu*.) 2. vi. To multiply, become numerous. *Kulukulu ka hua o ka 'uala* (Kep. 109), the fruit of the sweet potatoes become numerous.
- kulu.kulu.'ā.** n. 1. Sap from green *kukui* nuts, used to prevent infections in cuts and as a gargle for sore throat and thrush. 2. (*Cap.*) Name of a legendary chief at Hilo. (FS 251.)
- kulu.kulu.ā'o.** Same as *ae'o 2*, stilt bird. (PNP *tuli*, PCP *tutul(i,u)*.)
- kulu.kulu au.moē.** Same as *kulu aumoe*.
- kulu.kuluna.** n. Flowing, leaking, dripping.
- kuluma.** vs. Accustomed to, acquainted with, intimate with; customary, usual, chronic. *Ma'i kuluma*, chronic sickness. *'Akahi no ā 'ike, 'a'ole i kuluma*, we've just met and have not been acquainted.
- kuma.** 1. Var. of *hākuma 1, 2*. 2. n. Cracking of the skin between fingers and toes, as with athlete's foot.
- kū.mā-** Prefix to numbers as *'umi kūmākahi, 'umi kūmālua, iwakālua kūmākahi, kanakolu kūmālua*, etc. See Gram 10.3 and *kumamā-*.
- kū.maha.keā.** nvi. To work in gardens; such work. *Hele aku i ke kūmahakea*, gone to work in food patches.
- kū.maka.** nvs. Seen by the eye, seen, visible; eyewitness; associated with; to see for oneself. *Kuhina kūmaka*, associated councilor. *Kūmaka ka 'ikena iā Hi'ilawe i ka papa lohi a 'o Maukele* (song), see, indeed, Hi'ilawe and the sparkling flats of Maukele.
- kū.maka.hiki.** nvs. Annual, yearly; yearly contract (see ex., *lōpā 1*). *Pua kūmakahiki*, annual flower. *Hālāwai kūmakahiki*, annual meeting. *Hana kūmakahiki*, work on yearly contract.
- kuma.kaia.** nvt. Traitor, turncoat; traitorous; to betray; to abuse one who has been kind to one. **ho'o.kuma-kaia.** Caus/sim.
- kū.makani.** 1. nvs. Windbreak; wind-resisting. 2. Same as *'a'ali'i*, a shrub or tree.
- kū.mā.kena.** vt. To lament, bewail, mourn loudly for the dead, grieve. Cf. *make*, death.
- kū.makua.** 1. Same as *'ahihi 2*, a *lehua* bush. 2. (*Cap.*) n. Name of a strong wind.
- kuma.kuma.** Redup. of *kuma 1, 2*.
- kū.mala.mala.** Var. of *malamala*, see *mala*.
- kuma.lau.ā, kumalauwā.** vi. To rise above. *'Akahi, 'alua, 'akolu, ka heluna kupuna o lākou, 'a'e'a'e kumalauā i ka mo'o kanaka* (chant), once, twice, thrice the enumeration of their ancestors, stepping high over commoners.
- kū.malolo.** n. Reverential bowing during old prayers.
- kū.malolo.hia.** Pas/imp. of *kūmalolo*.
- kuma.mā-** Same as *kūmā-* (rare in conversation, Biblical). The origin is uncertain. Ellis (1827:479) suggests that the old term may have been *kumu ma*, beginning and; perhaps *kumu* assimilated to *kuma* before *mā*. *'Umi kumamākahi*, eleven (Biblical).
- kumano.** To set in order, as in laying stones. (And.)
- kū.mano.** n. Water dam (*rare*), reservoir.
- kū.manō.** v. To catch sharks with bait and noose. (Malo 210, 213.)
- kū.mano.mano.** n. A bur grass (*Cenchrus agrimoides*). Also *kāmanomano*.
- kū.mau.** 1. vs. Customary, usual, regular. See *pu'u kālā kūmau*. *Uku kūmau*, usual fees, taxes, dues. *Hālāwai kūmau*, regular meeting. 2. n. Deep wooden bowl with a thick base, as for poi. *Nā kūmau palapa'a o Nā'ālehu*, *'oia mau nō kā pāpa'a*, the thick-based calabashes of Nā'ālehu are always crusted [with dried poi]; strict adherents to principles, are the thick-headed natives of Nā'ālehu; the old poi stays in the calabash]. 3. (*Cap.*) n. North Star.
- kū.maua.** vs. Lazy, inactive. *Rare*.
- kū.mau.mau.** 1. Redup. of *kūmau 1*. 2. Same as *maumau*; constant, continuous, together. *Hai kūmaumau ē, hai kuwā!* (chant for those carrying a log to shore to be made into a canoe), follow together, follow shouting!
- kū.mauna.** 1. Var. of *kūmau*, bowl. 2. Same as *'alaea*, dye plant.
- kumē.heu.** n. Path, trail, road.
- kū.meka.** n. Shoemaker. *Eng.*
- kū.mene.** vs. Blunt, flat, of the nose. **ho'o.kū.mene.** Caus/sim.
- kumē.pala, kumebala.** n. Cymbal. *Kumepala wala'au* (1 Kor. 13.1), tinkling cymbal.
- kumia.** Same as *kualakai 1*, a sea creature.
- Kumima, Tumima.** n. Thummim. (Puk. 28.30.) (Heb. *tummim*.)
- kū.mimi.** n. Small crabs such as *Lophozozymus intonsus*. Varieties are *kūmimi māka'o* (*Petrolisthes coccineus*) and *kūmimi pua* (*Lybia tessellata*). Both were used in sorcery and are inedible.
- kū.mī.mī.** vs. Frail, feeble, blighted Cf. *mīmī, 'ōmīmī*.
