

- hopeful, without worry, thoughtful; to want. *Inā e mā'i kekahi kanaka, lana kona mana'o i ke kauka*, when a person is sick, he wants a doctor. *Lana mālie iho ho'i ka mana'o me ka nani lei 'awapuhi* (song), thoughts of the beauty of the ginger lei are serene. **ho'o.lana.** To cause to float, launch; to right a canoe. *Fig.*, to launch a project; cheerful, unworrying, hopeful; to cheer up, encourage (Mat. 14.27), be of good cheer; to lighten grief, as by taking a mourner on a trip and away from the grave of the one he mourns. *Home ho'olana mā'i*, convalescent home. *Ho'olana mā'i*, to ease the pain of sickness. *Ho'olana ka mana'o*, to have hopes. *Ho'olana kaumaha*, to ease grief, condolence. *Ho'olana i ka wai ke ola*, life barely surviving; semi-conscious (Probably PPN *langa*.) **2.** n. Lowest floor of the oracle tower where offerings were placed. (Malo 176.) Cf. *lananu'u, mamao, nu'u*. **3.** vs. To be aware of noises as one wakes. *Lana ka hiamoe*, awakening from sleep. **4.** Also *rana*. n. Frog. (Latin *rana*, a genus.)
- lana.** **1.** **ho'o.lana (a)** Same as *lana* **3.** **(b)** Disobedient, willful. *Ho'olana noho'i nā keiki*, the children are so willful. **2.** Nominalizing suffix, Gram. 6.6.2. Cf. *kaulana, kūlana, mana'olana*. (PNP *-langa*.)
- lana.au.** vi. To float or drift with the current; to look about in every direction, wander, ramble, drift aimlessly.
- lana.ha'a.kōi.** vs. Haughty, superior-acting (Isa. 2.11). *Lit.*, proudly floating.
- lana.hēle.** vi. To drift, as a ship.
- lana.hia.** Pas/imp. of *lana* **1.**
- lana.hō!** interj. Land ho! *Eng.*
- lā.nahu.** n. Charcoal, coal. *Lau lānahu*, coal mine. Also *nānahu*.
- lana.hua.** nvs. Crook, protuberance, hump; bent out, convex.
- lā.nahu pō.haku.** n. Cinders.
- lanai.** Var. of *nanai*, stiff-backed.
- lā.nai.** n. Porch, veranda, balcony, booth, shed; temporary roofed construction with open sides near a house. *Lānai kaupoko 'ole*, terrace.
- Lā-na'i.** n. **1.** Lā-na'i Island. Perhaps *lit.*, day conquest. Also *Nāna'i*. **2.** (Not cap.) A variety of sweet potato. (HP 142.)
- lanai.ēa.** Same as *nanaiea*, weak.
- Lana-ka-malama.** n. Name of a star. *Lit.*, the light floats.
- lana.kana.** See *lākana* **1.**
- lana.kōa.** Var. of *nanakea*, pale.
- lana.kila.** **1.** nvt. Victory, triumph; to triumph, win, overcome, beat, prevail, outwit, conquer. *Mea lanakila*, winner, victor, champion. **ho'o.lana.kila.** To cause to triumph; overbearing or impudent, as of a spoiled child unafraid of punishment, or of a most privileged, unassailable person. (PCP *langatila*.) **2.** (Cap.) n. Wind, Hau-'ula, O'ahu. (Nak. 57.)
- lana.koi.** nvt. To ask for insistently; to desire greatly; great desire. Cf. *koi*, urge. *Mea 'ole ia anu i ka mana'o i ka lanakoi a ka makemake* (hula song), the cold is as nothing when the desire is so keen.
- lana.lana.** **1.** Redup. of *lana* **1.** **ho'o.lana.lana.** Redup. of *ho'olana*. (PPN *langalanga*.) **2.** n. Lashings, as of ornamental sennit binding the float (*ama*) to outrigger booms (*'iako*). **ho'o.lana.lana.** To make lashings, to lash. **3.** n. Spider. (Isa. 59.5.) Also *lalana, nananana*. **4.** n. Ylang-ylang (*Cananga odorata*). (Neal 357-8.)
- lana.lana.hia.** Pas/imp. of *lanalana* **1.** *Nānā i ka moku, ha'aha'a kilohana i lalo, 'imihia lanalanahia, lana* (For. 6:389), behold the island, magnificent far below, sought for, hoped for, hope.
- lanamana'o.** **ho'o.lana.mana'o.** Hopeful, encouraging. (Kel. 15.) See *ho'olana* under *lana* **1.**
- lā.nana.** Var. of *kānana*, to strain.
- lana.nu'u.** n. **1.** High frame where heiau images were placed. **2.** Same as *lananu'u mamao*. **3.** Image placed in front of a heiau (AP.)
- lana.nu'u mamao.** n. Oracle tower; the lowest floor was the *lana*, the second and more sacred floor was the *nu'u*, and the top, where the high priest stood to conduct services was the *mamao*. (Malo 176.)
- lanau.** vs. Unfriendly, unsociable. Same as *nanau*. *Rare*.
- lani.** **1.** nvs. Sky, heaven; heavenly, spiritual. *'Ai lani* (1 Kor. 10.3), spiritual food. *Mai ka lani nō ā ka honua*, from heaven to earth (*fig.*, suddenly, without rhyme or reason). (PPN *langi*.) **2.** nvs. Very high chief, majesty; host (Isa. 34.4); royal, exalted, high born, noble, aristocratic. This meaning is most common in personal names, as *Lei-lani*, royal child or heavenly lei; *Pua-lani*, descendant of royalty or heavenly flowers. Cf. *kamalani, kuhilani. Ka-lani-ana-'ole* (name), the incomparably exalted one. **ho'o.lani.** **(a)** To treat as a chief; to render homage to a chief; to act as a chief; to enjoy the position and prestige of a high chief. **(b)** Same as *ho'olanilani*. **3.** n. Kinds of flowers. See below.
- lā.nia.** vt. To warm, toast, or wilt over a fire, as young pandanus leaves. Cf. *'ōlala, 'ōlani*. (PPN *rara*.)
- lani all'i.** n. **1.** Royal chief. **2.** Same as *nani ali'i*, shrubs.
- lani ha'a.ha'a.** nv. Low sky, of the low sky, a poetic reference to Hāna, Maui, and its rains.
- lā.nihi.nihi.** vs. Thin, narrow. *Lit.*, edge surface.
- lani.ka'ō.** n. Individual privileged to sit with the chief while the latter ate; he might eat the remnants of the chief's food, thus preventing them from falling into the hands of a sorcerer. (Malo 61.) *Lit.*, chief at edge.
- Lani-kōha.** n. Legendary part of heaven; frequent name for residences of high chiefs, as that of Ka-mehameha III at Lahaina, Maui. (Malo 104.) *Lit.*, lofty heaven.
- lani kua ka'a.** n. Poetic name for a very high chief or the highest heaven. *Lit.*, sky with rolling ridge [i.e., clouds].
- Lani-kū-hana.** n. Name of a star. *Lit.*, chief stands [at] work.
- Lani-ku'u-wa'a.** n. Wind of Ka-lalau, Kaua'i. (For. 5:95.) *Lit.*, heaven releasing canoe.
- lani.lani.** Redup. of *lani*. **ho'o.lani.lani.** **(a)** Redup. of *ho'olani*; to treat as a chief; to claim relationship to a chief, especially unwarranted. **(b)** To exalt, praise. (PPN *langilangi*.)
- lani nu'u.** n. Highest heavens, an epithet for royalty.
- lani pa'a.** n. Firmament. *Lit.*, solid heaven.
- Lani-pa'ina.** n. A rain known at 'Ulu-pala-kua, Maui.
- lani.pili.** n. See *ua lanipili*.
- lani.pō.** vs. Dense, dark, lush, as of plants, rain; said of luxuriant growth. *Ku'u haku i ka ua Lanipō-lua, mehe pō lā kā ke anu o ke Ko'olau* (chant for Bernice Bishop), my lord in the dark pouring rain like the night and the cold of the Ko'olau [the lord protecting one from darkness and cold]. *Maika'i ka pā hale i punia i nā pua nani, lanipō i nā mea kanu*, how fine the house yard bordered with beautiful flowers, dense with plants.
- Lani.pō-lua.** n. Rain name. See chant, *lanipō*.
- lani.uma.** n. Both flowering and aromatic-leaved pelargoniums, also called rose geraniums. Cf. *kupukupu 'ala*. (Neal 471.)
- lani wai.** n. Similar to *lemi wai*, a water lemon (*Passiflora foetida*). *Ni'ihau*.
- lani wela.** n. Canada fleabane (*Conyza canadensis*), a weedy composite herb from temperate North America, with long, straight hairy stem, hairy, narrow leaves, and clusters of small flower heads. (Neal 834.) Cf. *ilioha*. On Ni'ihau *Conyza bonariensis*.
- lā.noa.** n. Weekday. *Lit.*, day without taboo.
- lā.nui.** n. Holiday, important or big day.
- Lā-nui o nā Lima.hana.** n. Labor Day. *Lit.*, holiday of the laborers.
- lā.nu'u.** Same as *lananu'u*.
- lā'o.** **1.** vi. Having something in the eye, as a mote or eyelash. *La'o ka maka*, the eye has something in it. **ho'o.lā'o.** To get something in the eye. **2.** Same as *la'ola'o* **2, 3.** **3.** Var. of *'ōla'o*, to weed.
- lā.'ō.** **1.** Same as *lau kō*, sugar-cane leaf. **2.** n. A bright-
