

- Lele-aka.** n. Milky Way.
- lele.aoa.** vi. Flying away in groups, as migratory birds; to fly thus; to sail, as a canoe fleet.
- lele 'ao.'ao.** vi. To leap sideways; to shy, as a horse.
- lele 'ē.** vi. To speak prematurely or before one is spoken to; to jump to conclusions. 'A'ole i pau ka'u wehewehe 'ana, 'o kou lele 'ē nō kā ho'i ia, my explanation was not finished and there you had already leaped to a conclusion.
- leleha.** Redup. of *leha* 1, 2.
- lele hapa.hā.** vi. To count by fours.
- lele hapa.kolu.** vi. To count by threes.
- lele hapa.lima.** vi. To count by fives.
- lele hapa.lua.** vi. To count by twos.
- lele hapa.'umi.** vi. To count by tens.
- lele hauli.** See *haulī*.
- lele ho'o.kau.** n. 1. Altar to place (*ho'okau*) things on, as sacrifices, especially a temporary altar. 2. Peak, top of a peak.
- lelehu.** Same as *mōlelehu* 1, 2.
- lele.hua.** n. A good thinker, planner.
- lele.huna, lelehune.** nvi. Fine windblown rain spray, dust, mist; to fall as fine rain.
- lele.'ino.** vi. To spring or leap violently, as in an attack or fright; to rush violently, plunge. *Lit.*, to fly evil.
- lele.iō.** Same as *leleiona* 2, fidgety.
- lele 'iomo.** Same as *lele kawa*.
- lele.iona.** 1. n. Shark-sucker, remora (*Echeneidae* spp.); it clings to large fish, such as swordfish, marlin, bonito, shark. 2. vs. Fidgety, foolish, restless. 3. (*Cap.*) n. Milky Way.
- lele.iwī.** n. A kind of shark, possibly thresher, reported by Hyde (no data), perhaps the same as *laukāhi'u*.
- lele kawa.** vi. To leap feet first from a cliff into water without splashing or into (at Ka'ū) soft earth. *Papa lele kawa*, diving board. *Lele kawa o Kaumaea*, sport of leaping over earth banks, at Kaumaea, Ka'ū.
- lele.kē.** vi. To leap here and there. **ho'o.lele.kē.** A game of tossing ti leaves into Malama Crater at Puna, Hawai'i, and dedicating them to Ka-moho-ali'i.
- lele.kepue.** n. Hard volcanic rock, as used for adzes.
- lele kī. ho'o.lele kī.** A game played only at Malama-kī, Puna, Hawai'i. A player would hold a ti leaf in his hand, chant 'O kēlā kī, 'o kēia kī, na Ka-moho-ali'i ka'u kī, lele! That ti, this ti, my ti is for Ka-moho-ali'i, fly! If the wind was right and the chant correctly rendered, the ti would fly off and return to the sender. *Lit.*, make the ti fly.
- lele koa'e.** 1. nvi. Flight of tropic birds; to fly like a tropic bird. *Fig.*, sheer, steep. See *koa'e* 1. 2. n. Name for *kauā*, outcasts.
- lele koali.** v. To swing; to jump rope; swinging on a *koali* vine rope, an ancient sport.
- lele koke.** vi. To leap suddenly, immediately. *Fig.*, short-tempered, excitable, quick to fight.
- lele kolu.** See *lele* 7.
- Lele-ku'i-lua.** n. Name of a strong, wintry wind.
- lele lā.'au.** nv. Pole vaulting; to pole vault.
- lelele.** Redup. of *lele* 1; to beat swiftly, as the heart; to frisk, hop about, romp, caper; inconstant, promiscuous; at intervals, here and there. *Lelele i ka hau'oli*, to leap for joy. *Lelele ka 'ō'ili i ka mea hou*, the heart leaps at the news. *Holo lelele i ka lio*, to bounce, bump on a horse. *Lelele wāwae kahi*, to hop on one foot.
- ho'o.lelele.** Caus/sim. (PEP *lelele*.)
- lele.lele.** Same as *lelele*. (PPN *lelelele*.)
- lele leo.** See *lele* 1.
- lele lima.** See *lele* 7.
- lele loa.** vs. Completely severed, as a part of the body in fighting. (FS 99.)
- lele lua.** 1. vi. An interval of a second in music. Cf. *lele* 7. 2. vi. To leap twice.
- lele lupe.** vi. To rise and fall, as the forepart of canoe outrigger (*lupe*). *Fig.*, the rise and subsidence of emotion.
- lele lupe. ho'o.lele lupe.** To fly kites.
- lelemu.** nvs. A slowpoke; slow, sluggish, disinclined to get up. Cf. *lemu*.
- lele.mū.** vt. To seize victims for sacrifice.
- lelena.** Redup. of *lena* 1, 3. (PPN *rengarenga*.)
- leleo.** Redup. of *leo*.
- lele.'oi.** vi. Excessive, very great. *Lit.*, excessive leap. *Ua lele'oi ka loa'a mamua o ka mea i mana'o 'ia*, the gain went beyond expectations. *Ua lele'oi i kona na'auao i loko o ka papa*, his knowledge is way beyond that of the class.
- lele 'ō.'ō.** vi. To leap or plunge into water feet first. *Lit.*, piercing leap.
- lele 'opu.** v. To dive feet first into water without making a splash. Also *lele ā 'opu. Fig.*, unfavorable (For. 6:59).
- lele.'opuhi.** vi. To leap obliquely into the water from a height. (UL 192.) Same as *lele pāhi'a*. See *pāhi'a*.
- lele.pā.** nvt. One who jumps over a fence; to fence jump. *Fig.*, nonconformer; one who cannot be restrained, especially regarding the opposite sex; wanton; to hurdle. 'O kō pā lā, 'o lelepā (FS 221), your sty there is one easily vaulted.
- lele pā-** n. Singing intervals in music (*pā* is followed by a number). Cf. *lele* 7.
- lele pahū.** vi. To leap into water with a splash; as this was considered poor diving, the expression may refer figuratively to any poor performance; to leap and land with a thud.
- lele pai.lani.** vt. To praise, exalt, extol extravagantly or excessively (stronger than *pailani*, to praise).
- lele pali.** v. To leap or fall off a cliff; to practice the ancient sport of leaping from a precipice into water.
- lele.pau.** vt. 1. To trust completely. 2. To apply oneself to, concentrate wholly on.
- lelepe.** n. 1. Toothed, sharp-pointed design, as in tapa. 2. Same as *lepelepe* 2, wattles.
- lele.pī.** vi. To fly into a rage at the slightest provocation; to lose one's temper; hot-tempered. *Lit.*, jump [at a] drop.
- lele pī.na'i.** vi. To run with a rope around a coconut tree, and when going very fast, to lift the feet off the ground. *Lit.*, repeated leaps.
- lele.pinao.** vi. To swing on a *koali* vine. *Lit.*, dragonfly leap.
- lele.pinau.** Game said to resemble *kōnane*. (AP.)
- lele pio.** v. To run away in defeat; to avoid capture, as a thief. *Lit.*, to flee capture.
- lele pi'o.** vi. To fly or jump in a curve; to fly as a comet through the sky.
- lelepo.** 1. Same as *lepelepe*, dirty. 2. n. Probably another species of *Padina*, similar in appearance to 'a'ala-ula, a seaweed.
- lele.pō.** n. A species of night-flying (*lele pō*) *mālolo*, flying fish.
- lele.po'i.pū.** vt. To pounce upon.
- lele.poni.** vi. To die suddenly, as by stroke or accident. Cf. *kā'iliponi*.
- lele pono.** vi. To jump carefully. *Fig.*, to live a happy life; to transact business justly; to rise rapidly to success.
- lele.po'o.** v. To dive headfirst.
- lele.puni.** n. 1. A musical interval of an octave. Cf. *leo lelepuni*. 2. A game said to resemble *kōnane*.
- leleu.** Name of a fruitful tree (no data). (And.)
- lele.ū.** Word said to describe sexual relations. (AP.)
- lele ua.** n. Windblown rain.
- Lele-uli.** n. Name of a gusty, wintry wind.
- lele uli.** v. To dispel darkness; to purify or cleanse, as in a religious ceremony.
- lelewa.** 1. Redup. of *lewa* 2. (PEP *lelewa*.) 2. n. Hangers-on about a chief; parasitic persons. 3. (*Cap.*) Var. of *lewalewa* 3, Gilbertese.
- lele.wa'a.** n. A shark listed by Kamakau, perhaps the friendly shark that was said to lean (*kālele*) on canoe outriggers for food and company.
- lele wa'a.** v. Transferring at sea from canoe to canoe or
